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



Component and Button Description

Moving and Lifting the Monitor

When moving or lifting the monitor, follow these instructions to prevent the monitor from being scratched or damaged and to ensure safe transportation regardless of its shape or size.

- As much as possible, avoid touching the monitor screen. This may result in damage to the screen or some of the pixels used to create images.
- It is advisable to place the monitor in the original box or packing material before attempting to move it.
- Before moving or lifting the monitor, disconnect the power cord and all cables.
- Hold the top and bottom of the monitor frame firmly. Do not hold the panel itself.



 When holding the monitor, the screen should face away from you to prevent it being scratched.



- When transporting the monitor, do not expose the monitor to jolts or excessive vibration.
- When moving the monitor, keep it upright, never turn the monitor on its side or tilt it sideways.


- Avoid touching the monitor screen as much as possible.
 - This may result in damage to the screen or some of the pixels used to create images.



Installing the Monitor

Assembling the Stand Base


- 1 Place the screen face down.
- 2 Rotate the **Stand Body** 90° counter clockwise.



Stand Body

- To protect the screen from scratches, cover the surface with a soft cloth.
- To avoid scratching the head, make sure that when rotating the Stand Body, the stand body does not make contact with the head.

3 Align the hole on the **Stand Base** with the **Stand Body** and push it all the way up.Turn the screws on the **Stand Base** to the right.




 Applying excessive force when tightening screws may cause damage to the monitor. Damage caused in this way will not be cov-ered by the product warranty.

Detaching the Stand Base

1 Place the screen face down.

- To protect the screen from scratches, cover the surface with a soft cloth.
- 2 BodyTurn the screws on the Stand Base to the left to detach the Stand Base from the Stand Body.




- The components in the illustrations may differ from the actual product.
- Do not carry the monitor upside down, as this may cause it to fall off its stand and result in damage or injury.
- To avoid damaging the screen when lifting or moving the monitor, only hold the stand or the plastic cover. This avoids putting unnecessary pressure on the screen.


Installing on to a Table

1 Lift the monitor and place it on the table in an upright position.

Place at least **10 cm** away from the wall to ensure sufficient ventilation.



2 Connect the **Power Cord** to a wall outlet.




3 Press the 𝔄 (Power) button on the bottom of the monitor to turn it on.


 Disconnect the power cord first, and then move or install the Monitor set. There is risk of electric shock.

Adjusting the Stand Height


- 1 Place the monitor mounted on the stand base in an upright position.
- 2 Push the **Head** downward and pull out the **Locking Pin**.



- Once the pin is removed, it is not necessary to reinsert it to adjust the height.




3 Certainly catch a monitor with the both hands and control.








Adjusting the Stand Height

- 1 Place the monitor in an upright position, mounted on the stand base.
- 2 Adjust the angle of the screen. The angle of the screen can be adjusted forwards or backwards from -5° to 35° for a comfortable viewing experience.



· Do not put your fingers or hand between the screen and the base (chassis) when adjusting the screen's height.




· Be careful not to touch or press the screen area when adjusting the angle of the monitor.




Tidying Cables

1 Use the screw provided to attach the cable holder to the stand body as illustrated.




Gather and bind the cables with the supplied 2 cable Holder.




Pivot Feature

The pivot feature allows the monitor to rotate 90 clockwise.



3 Rotate the monitor clockwise as shown in the figure.




4 Complete the installation by rotating the monitor 90° as shown below.



- To avoid scratching the stand base, make sure that when rotating the monitor using the pivot feature, the stand does not make contact with the monitor.
- 1 Raise the monitor up to the maximum height.



2 Adjust the angle of the monitor in the direction of the arrow as shown in the figure.






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- Auto Pivot feature of the display is not supported.
- The screen can be rotated easily using the screen pivot shortcut key provided with your Windows operating system. Note that some Windows versions may use different settings for the screen pivot key or may not support the pivot key at all.
- Supported Windows versions: Windows 7 and Windows 8
- Windows screen pivot shortcut keys
 - 0°: Ctrl + Alt + Up arrow key (↑)
 - 90°: Ctrl + Alt + Left arrow key (←)
 - 180°: Ctrl + Alt + Down arrow key (↓)
 - 279°: Ctrl + Alt + Right arrow key (\rightarrow)

- Take care when rotating the monitor if the cable is connected.
- To avoid injury when rotating the display, do not place your fingers between the display and the stand base.





Using the Kensington Lock





Adjusting the Angle

This monitor meets the specifications for the wall mount plate or other compatible devices.


- 1 Place the screen face down. To protect the screen from scratches, cover the surface with a soft cloth.
- 2 Place the wall mount plate onto the monitor and align it with the screw holes.
- 3 Tighten the four screws to fix the plate to the monitor using a screwdriver.



- The wall mount plate is sold separately.
- For more information on installation, refer to the wall mount plate's installation guide.
- Be careful not to apply too much force while mounting the wall mount plate as it may cause damage to the screen

Installing on the Wall

Install the monitor at least 10 cm away from the wall and leave about 10 cm of space at each side of the monitor to ensure sufficient ventilation. Detailed installation instructions can be obtained from your local retail store. Alternatively, please refer to the manual for how to install and set up a tilting wall mounting bracket.




To install the monitor to a wall, attach a wall mounting bracket (optional) to the back of the monitor.

Make sure that the wall mounting bracket is securely fixed to the monitor and to the wall.

- 1 Use the screws and wall mounting bracket that conform to VESA standards.
- 2 If you use screws longer than the standard length, it may damage the inside of the product.
- 3 A non-VESA standard screw may damage the product and cause the monitor to fall. LG Electronics is not liable for any accidents relating to the use of non-standard screws.
- 4 VESA compatible only with respect to screw mounting interface dimensions and mounting screw specifications.
- 5 Use the wall mount plate and fixing screws that conform to VESA standards as specified below.
 - 784.8 mm or less
 - * Thickness of the wall mount plate: 2.6 mm
 - * Fixing screw: Diameter 4.0 mm x Pitch 0.7 mm x Length 10 mm
 - 787.4 mm or more
 - Use the wall mount plate and screws that conform to VESA standards.



- The wall mount kit includes the installation guide and all necessary parts.
- The wall mounting bracket is optional. You can obtain optional accessories from your local dealer.
- The length of the screw may differ for each wall mounting bracket. Be sure to use the proper length.
- For more information, please refer to the user manual for the wall mounting bracket.

- Unplug the power cord before moving or installing the monitor to avoid electric shock.
- Installing the monitor on the ceiling or on a slanted wall may result in the monitor falling off, which could lead to injury. Use an authorized LG wall mount and contact the local dealer or qualified personnel.
- Applying excessive force when tightening screws may cause damage to the monitor. Damage caused in this way will not be covered by the product warranty.
- Use the wall mounting bracket and screws that conform to VESA standards. Damage caused by the use or misuse of inappropriate components will not be covered by the product warranty.
- To prevent injury, this apparatus must be securely attached to the wall in accordance with the instrallation instructions. (This only pertains to Australia and New Zealand.)
- When measured from the back of the monitor, the length of each installed screw must be 8 mm or less.



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USING THE MONITOR

- Do not press on the screen for a prolonged period of time. This may cause image distortion.
- Do not display a still image on the screen for a prolonged period of time. This may cause image retention. Use a screensaver if possible.


- When connecting the power cord to the outlet, use a grounded (3-hole) multi-socket or a grounded power outlet.
- The monitor may flicker when turned on in an area of low temperature. This is normal.
- Sometimes red, green, or blue spots may appear on the screen. This is normal.

Connecting to a PC

 This monitor supports the *Plug and Play feature.
 *Plug and Play: A feature that allows you to add a device to your computer without having to reconfigure anything or install any manual drivers.

HDMI Connection

Transmits digital video and audio signals from your PC to the monitor. Connect your PC to the monitor using the HDMI cable as shown in the illustration below.



- Connecting your PC to the monitor using the HDMI cable may cause device compatibility issues.
- Using a DVI to HDMI / DP(DisplayPort) to HDMI) cable may cause compatibility issues.





Connecting AV Devices

HDMI Connection

HDMI transmits digital video and audio signals from your AV device to the monitor. Connect your AV device to the monitor using the HDMI cable as shown in the illustration below.



NOTE

- The maximum data transmission rate of each port is 20 Gb/s.
- Make sure to use a Thunderbolt (£) certified cable. Otherwise, this may cause the device to malfunction.
- Thunderbolt (\$) is supported in such environments as Windows 7, Windows 8 and New Mac Pro (Mac OS 10.9).
- To use the Thunderbolt (*f*) port, the ASM driver in the User Manual CD must be installed.
- Dual monitor connection using Thunderbolt (\$) daisy-chain may not be supported depending on performance of the graphics card.

 Using a DVI to HDMI / DP(DisplayPort to HDMI) cable may cause compatibility issues.

Connecting Peripherals

USB Cable Connection - PC

The USB port on the product functions as a USB hub.


NOTE -

- Make sure to install the most recent Windows OS service pack before using the product.
- · Peripheral devices are sold separately.
- A keyboard, mouse, or USB device can be connected to the USB port.

- · Cautions When Using a USB Device
- A USB device with an automatic recognition program installed, or that uses its own driver, may not be recognized.
- Some USB devices may not be supported or may not work properly.
- It is recommended to use a USB hub or hard disk drive with power supplied. (If the power supply is not adequate, the USB device may not be recognized properly.)

HDMI/DP (DisplayPort) Connection

To use USB 3.0, connect the A-B type USB 3.0 cable of the product to the PC. Peripheral devices connected to the USB IN port can be controlled from the PC.





INSTALLING LG MONITOR SOFTWARE

Insert the Software CD included in the product packaging into your PC's CD drive and install the LG Monitor Software.

The installation screen images are for reference only. The actual installation screen images may vary depending on the model.


1 Set the default Web browser to Internet Explorer.



2 Click the "LG Monitor Software" on the CD's main screen. When the file download window appears, click the Run button. (The file download window may vary depending on the operating system and the Internet Explorer version, but the installation procedures are same.)

4 Check "I accept the terms of the agreement" on the License Agreement screen and then click the [Next] button.



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
- Screen Split: This program automatically splits the program window as desired.

- 6 The LG Monitor Software installation starts as shown below.




7 If the ASM driver has not been installed, the driver will be installed automatically.



8 If the TUSB3410 driver has not been installed, it will install automatically. Select "Install this driver software anyway (I)" if the Windows security message is displayed as below.



9 The program you selected on the Select Features page will install automatically.



10 When the installation is complete, restart your system.



When you run the True Color Finder/ True Color Pro software, the True Color Finder/ True Color Pro icon [] appears in the system tray at the right bottom of the PC screen.



Right-click the True Color Finder icon and select "Start Program" to start the program.

 Once you have completed the monitor calibration with the True Color Finder/ True Color Pro software, remove the calibrator from the monitor and store it at room temperature away from direct sunlight or put it in the box.

- If the calibrator's measuring part is exposed to direct sunlight for a long time, this may cause damage to the calibrator.

- Do not store it in an environment with too low/ high temperature and high humidity.

 If any third-party calibration application is already installed on your PC, the image quality may be affected by a conflict between the two applications.
 For the best performance, it is recommended to uninstall the other calibration application.

- To use the True Color Finder/ True Color Pro function, you must purchase the supported calibrator.
- For details on supported calibrators and graphic cards, see the True Color Finder/ True Color Pro user guide.
- If you have changed the input port, it is recommend that you calibrate the monitor's picture quality again.

If you run Screen Split, the Screen Split icon [1] appears in the system tray at the right bottom of the PC screen.



Right-click the Screen Split icon and select a layout you want.





• Vertical Frequency: In order to display an image, the screen must be refreshed dozens of times per second like a fluorescent lamp.

The number of times the screen is refreshed per second is called vertical frequency or refresh rate and is represented by Hz.

• Horizontal Frequency: The time it takes to display one horizontal line is called the horizontal cycle. The number of horizontal lines displayed in one second can be calculated by dividing one by the horizontal cycle. This is called horizontal frequency and is represented by kHz.

- Check if the video card's resolution or frequency is within the range allowed by the monitor and set to the recommended (optimal) resolution in Control Panel > Display > Settings.
- Failing to set the video card to the recommended (optimal) resolution may result in blurred text, a dimmed screen, a truncated display area or misalignment of the display.
- The configuration procedure may differ depending on your computer and/or operating system. Also, some video cards may not support certain resolutions. If this is the case, contact the manufacturer of the computer or video card for assistance.
- Some video cards may not support 2560 x 1440 resolution. If the resolution cannot be displayed, contact the manufacturer of your video card.


