Troubleshooting

If a problem occurs when you are using the TV, check the below troubleshooting guide before calling for repair.

Problem	Actions	Page
Severe noise or snow	Check the aerial cable and TV connections. Check the direction of the aerial. Check the aerial or its cable damaged or not.	- - -
Patterns, stripes or noise	Interference caused by devices such as an amplifier, personal computer, or a hair drier. Move it away from the TV.	_
Ghosting (Doubling of images)	Interference occurs caused by signal reflecting from mountains or building. Try to adjust the aerial's direction or use another antenna.	_
Cannot turn it on	Ensure the power cord is connected to the AC outlet correctly.	_
