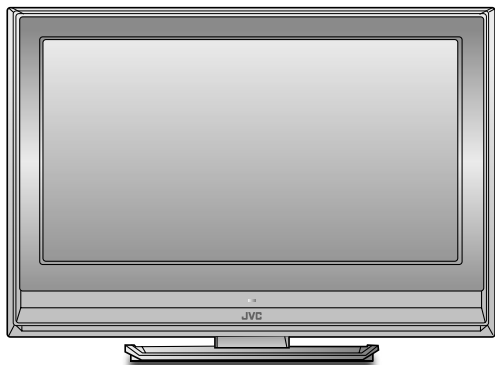

The illustrations of LT-32EX17 is used in this instruction manual for explanation purpose. Your TV may not look exactly the same as illustrated.

Thank you for buying this JVC colour television.

To make sure you understand how to use your new TV, please read this manual thoroughly before you begin.

**Follow this manual regarding setup!**

- Connect only to a 110-240 V, 50/60 Hz AC outlet.  
(Except China, Russia : connect to a 220-240 V, 50/60 Hz AC outlet)

**Do not allow the TV to fall!**

- Do not rest your elbows on, or allow children to hang from the TV.  
There is a risk that the TV will fall and cause injuries.

**Never place anything on the TV!**

- Placing liquid, naked flames, cloths, paper, etc. on the TV may cause a fire.



**Make enough room for inserting and removing the power plug!**

**Place the TV as close to the outlet as possible!**

- The main power supply for this TV is controlled by inserting or removing the power plug.

**Never cut or damage the power cord!**

- If the AC plug is not the right shape, or the power cord is not long enough, use an appropriate plug adapter or extension cable. (Consult your retailer.)



**Never try to repair the TV yourself!**

- If the problem cannot be solved in "Troubleshooting" (P.17), unplug the power cord and contact your retailer.

**If the TV is damaged or behaving strangely, stop using it at once!**

- Unplug the power cord and contact your retailer.

**Never expose to rain or moisture!**

- To prevent fire or electric shock, never allow liquids to enter the unit.



**Never insert objects into the cabinet openings!**

- It may cause a fatal electric shock. Take care when children are near.

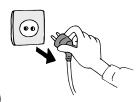


**Never listen to headphones at high volume!**

- It may damage your hearing.

**Unplug the power cord when going out!**

- The power buttons on the remote control and the TV unit cannot completely turn off the TV.  
(Make appropriate arrangements for bedridden people.)



**When attaching the TV to the wall, use the optional JVC wall mounting unit!**

- Consult a qualified technician.
- See the included manual on mounting procedures.
- JVC assumes no responsibility for damage due to improper mounting.

**Never dismantle the rear panel!**

- It may cause an electric shock.

**Never obstruct the ventilation holes!**

- It may cause overheating or a fire.

**Handle LCD panel with care!**

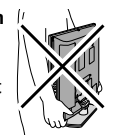
- Use a soft, dry cloth when cleaning.

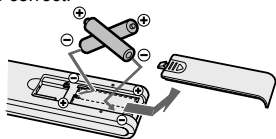

### Care when setting

#### ■ Power requirements

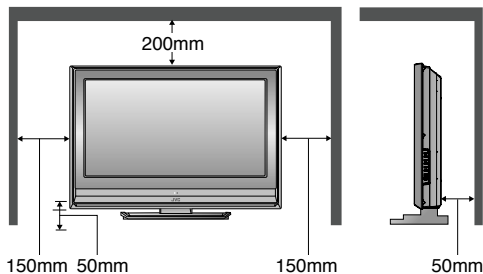
- Connect the power cord only to a 110-240 V, 50/60 Hz AC outlet.  
(Except China, Russia : connect to a 220-240 V, 50/60 Hz AC outlet.)

#### ■ When attaching the TV to the wall, use the optional JVC wall mounting unit.

- Consult a qualified technician.
- JVC assumes no responsibility for damage due to improper mounting.
- 200 mm x 200 mm mount which conforms to VESA standards.

#### ■ Installation requirements

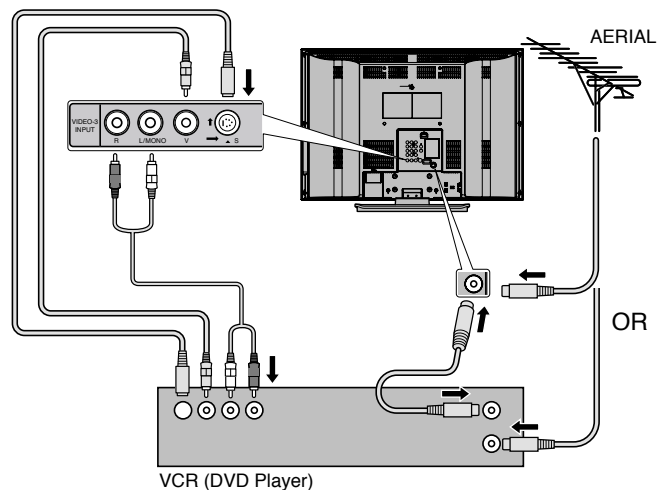
- To avoid overheating, ensure the unit has ample room.



Please read the user manuals of each device carefully before setup.  
It is necessary to connect an aerial to watch TV.

### Connect an aerial and VCR / DVD Player

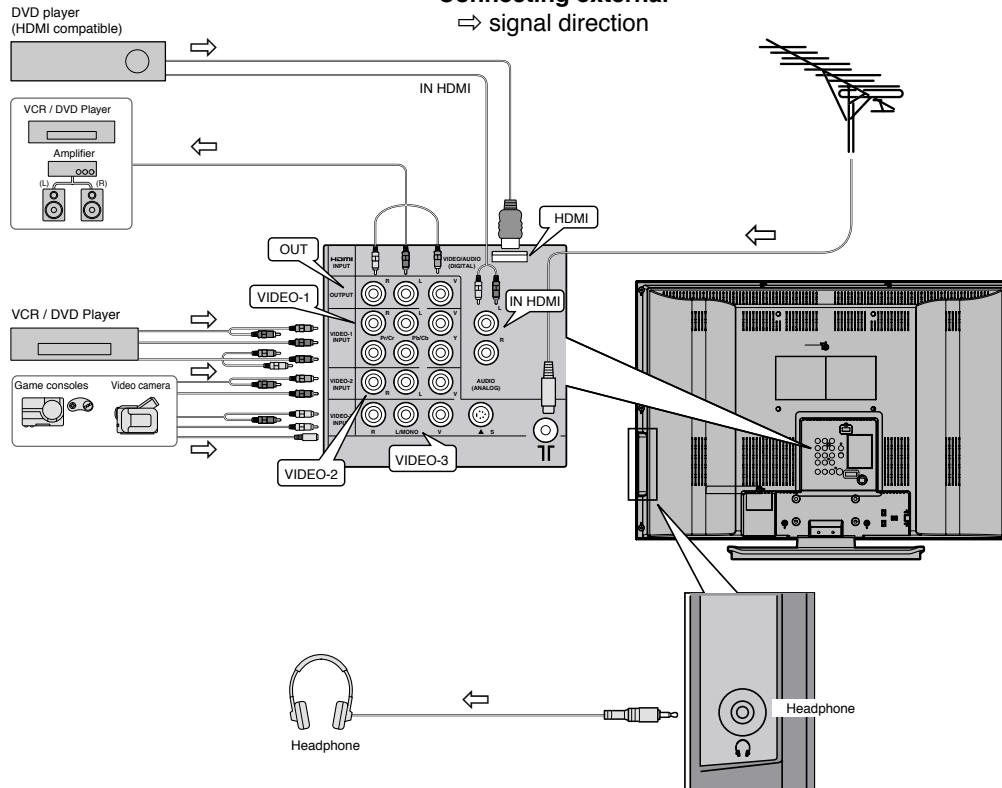


- After all the connections have been made, insert the plug into an AC outlet.
- If both composite and S-VIDEO cables are connected, S-VIDEO will be enable.

You can select the appropriate colour system when the picture is not clear or no colour appears.

(MENU) ➤ (PICTURE menu) ➤ (FEATURES) ➤ (COLOUR SYSTEM)

### PICTURE MODE

You can choose the desired picture setting.

(MENU) ➤ (PICTURE menu) ➤ (PICTURE MODE)

BRIGHT	Heightens contrast and sharpness.
SOFT	Softens contrast and sharpness.
STANDARD	Standard picture setting.

### WHITE BALANCE

You can change the white balance of the picture to better match the type of video being viewed.

(MENU) ➤ (PICTURE menu) ➤ (FEATURES) ➤ (WHITE BALANCE)

WARM	Reddish white
COOL	Bluish white
MID	Normal white balance

### BACK LIGHT

You can change the backlight brightness.

(MENU) ➤ (PICTURE menu) ➤ (BACK LIGHT)

Choose ◀ : Darker ▶ : Brighter

### CONTRAST

You can change the contrast of the picture.

(MENU) ➤ (PICTURE menu) ➤ (CONTRAST)

Choose ◀ : Lower ▶ : Higher

### BRIGHT

You can change the brightness of the picture.

(MENU) ➤ (PICTURE menu) ➤ (BRIGHT)

Choose ◀ : Darker ▶ : Brighter

## Picture setting (continued)

### SHARP

You can change the sharpness of the picture.

(MENU) ➡ (PICTURE menu) ➡ (SHARP)

Choose ◀ : Softer ▶ : Sharper

### COLOUR

You can change the sharpness of the picture.

(MENU) ➡ (PICTURE menu) ➡ (COLOUR)

Choose ◀ : Lighter ▶ : Deeper

### TINT

You can adjust Tint only in NTSC.

(MENU) ➡ (PICTURE menu) ➡ (TINT)

Choose ◀ : Reddish ▶ : Greenish

### DIGITAL VNR

You can cut down the amount of noise in the original picture.

(MENU) ➡ (PICTURE menu) ➡ (FEATURES) ➡ (DIGITAL VNR)

ON Reduce the picture noise.

OFF Function is turned off.

Note: For component progressive and HDMI signal, the DIGITAL VNR function cannot operate.

### DigiPure

You can set the picture for a natural-looking outlines.

(MENU) ➡ (PICTURE menu) ➡ (FEATURES) ➡ (DigiPure)

ON Set to a natural-looking picture.

OFF Function is turned off.

### PULL DOWN

You can set the picture for smooth cinema film.

(MENU) ➡ (PICTURE menu) ➡ (FEATURES) ➡ (PULL DOWN)

ON Function is always on.

AUTO Automatically adjusts.

OFF Function is turned off.

### ECO MODE

You can adjust TV screen contrast according to the brightness of your room.

(MENU) ➡ (FEATURES menu) ➡ (ECO MODE)

OFF Function is turned off.

ECO-1 Mild contrast (recommended)

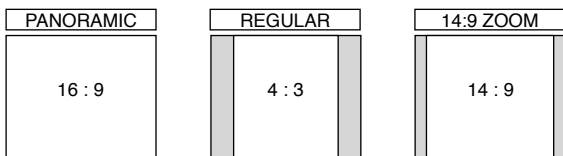
ECO-2 Even contrast.

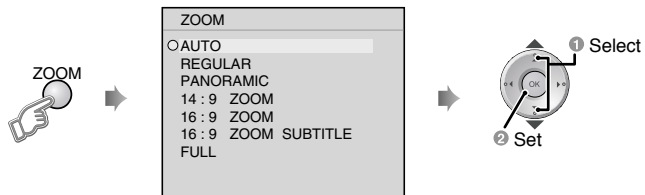
### 4:3 AUTO ASPECT

You can change the aspect ratio.

MENU → PICTURE menu → FEATURES → 4:3 AUTO ASPECT



Select a default aspect ratio for Auto in “ZOOM”



- Using “AUTO” : Auto in “ZOOM”
- When 720p (750p) or 1080i (1125i) signal is received, the signal will be displayed as “FULL”. The zoom menu will not be displayed.

### BLUE BACK

You can set the TV to automatically change to a blue screen and mute the sound if the signal is weak or absent, or when there is no input from an antenna or connected devices.

MENU → FEATURES menu → BLUE BACK

ON	Function is turned on.
OFF	Function is turned off.

### COLOUR MANAGEMENT

You can set the picture for a natural-looking pictures.

MENU → PICTURE menu → FEATURES → COLOUR MANAGEMENT

ON	Maintain a natural colour balance.
OFF	Function is turned off.

### PICTURE MANAGEMENT

You can fix the brightness and the darkness of the pictures.

MENU → PICTURE menu → FEATURES → PICTURE MANAGEMENT

ON	Make it easier to view bright / dark pictures.
OFF	Function is turned off.

### DEMO MODE

You can confirm the effect of “PICTURE MANAGEMENT”.

Hand icon pointing to the **MENU** button → Press **(Yellow)** to “DEMO MODE”.

The other hand, you can display “DEMO MODE” by press **MENU/OK** and **+ VOLUME** of TV buttons at the same time.

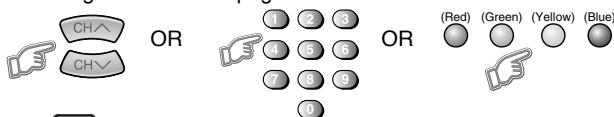
## Original features for picture

### TELETEXT

You can watch the Teletext broadcast channel with TEXT function.



2 Selecting other Teletext pages.



3 to return to the TV mode.

You can also operate the teletext using the following buttons:

(Hold)	Hold a teletext page. To cancel, press the button again.
(Reveal)	Display the hidden information (example: answers to a quiz). To cancel, press the button again.
(Size)	Enlarge the teletext display.
(Cancel)	Watch TV programme while waiting for a teletext page. When the teletext page is found, a page number appears at the upper left of the screen. Press the button to view the teletext page.
(Index)	Return to the index page instantly.
MODE and  (LIST MODE)	Bookmark your favourite page, press MODE button then select a coloured button to save your page to (red, green, yellow and blue). Enter the number of the page to save. Then press  to save your favourite page. Recall your favourite page, press the coloured button.
(Sub-page)	Sub-page numbers are displayed at the bottom of the screen. To cancel sub-page function, press the button again.

## Sound setting

### BASS

You can adjust the low tone of the sound.

(MENU) ➡ (SOUND menu) ➡ (BASS)

Choose ◀ : Weaker ▶ : Stronger

### TREBLE

You can adjust the high tone of the sound.

(MENU) ➡ (SOUND menu) ➡ (TREBLE)

Choose ◀ : Weaker ▶ : Stronger

### BALANCE

You can adjust the volume balance between the left and right speakers.

(MENU) ➡ (SOUND menu) ➡ (BALANCE)

Choose ◀ : Turn the left speaker's volume level up.

Choose ▶ : Turn the right speaker's volume level up.

### AI VOLUME

You can prevent sudden increase or decrease of sound when changing channels.

(MENU) ➡ (SET UP menu) ➡ (AI VOLUME)

ON Set to prevent sudden increase or decrease of sound.

OFF Function is turned off.

### STEREO / I•II

You can enjoy the stereo and bilingual broadcasted programmes.

(MENU) ➡ (SOUND menu) ➡ (STEREO / I•II)

○ Select to MONO sound.

⊞ Select to STEREO sound.

I Select to bilingual sound. (SUB I)

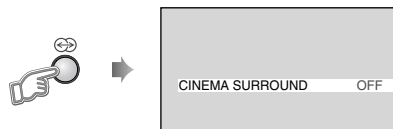
II Select to bilingual sound. (SUB II)

MONO Select to MONO sound.

This function is only available in RF mode.

### CINEMA SURROUND

You can enjoy an ambient sound.



You can also operate this function from the menu.

(MENU) ➡ (SOUND menu) ➡ (CINEMA SURROUND)

HIGH	For stereo sound
LOW	For stereo sound (when the sound distorts in "HIGH" mode)
MONO	For mono sound (emulates a stereo-like sound)
OFF	Function is turned off.

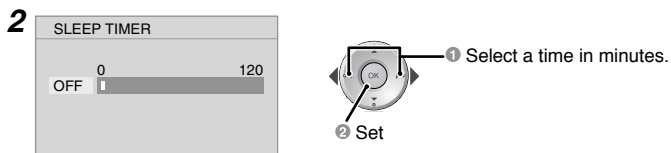

## Customized setting

### SLEEP TIMER

You can set the TV to turn off automatically to standby mode after a set time.

1 (MENU) ➡ (FEATURES menu) ➡ (TIMER) ➡ (SLEEP TIMER)



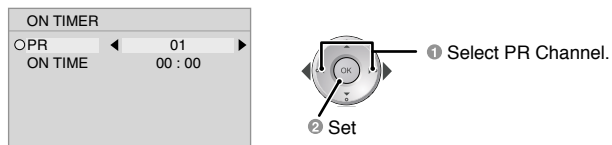
Cancel	Set the time to "0".
Remaining	You can confirm the remaining time, after repeating this process.

Note : When the remaining elapse time is one minute, "GOODNIGHT" appears on the screen.

### ON TIMER

You can set the TV to turn on automatically from standby mode at a set channel and time.

1 (MENU) ➡ (FEATURES menu) ➡ (TIMER) ➡ (ON TIMER)



2 Choose the PR (channel) that you want to watch when the TV turns on. External input and AV position cannot be chosen for PR.

3 Set the ON TIMER to your desired period of time by press the number button. When the ON TIMER is set to other than 00:00, the ON TIMER is activated. You can set the period of time to a maximum of 12 hours in 1 minute intervals.

To off the ON TIMER, set the ON TIMER to 00:00 or press <sup>(Blue)</sup> button.  
Note : If TV is not in standby mode when ON TIMER is reach the setting time, this case is not available.

### AUTO SHUTOFF

You can set the TV to turn off automatically when no signal is received for about 15 minutes or longer after the end of a broadcast.

(MENU) ➡ (FEATURES menu) ➡ (AUTO SHUTOFF)

ON	Set the power to turn off.
OFF	Function is turned off.

### APPEARANCE

You can set the format for displaying the channel number and menu screen.

(MENU) ➡ (FEATURES menu) ➡ (APPEARANCE)

TYPE A	Set to the transparent format.
TYPE B	Set to the solid format.

### CHILD LOCK

You can disable the front control buttons of the TV.

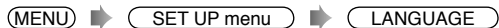

ON	The front control buttons cannot operate.

- Lock more channels by repeat step 4 and 5.
- Release a channel by press again in step 5.
- View a locked channel by use the numerical buttons to enter the channel number. When appears, press and enter your "ID No." (If you forget your "ID No.", check it in step 2.)

### VIDEO-1 SETTING

You can set the VIDEO-1 SETTING according to the video signal output from external devices connected to the VIDEO-1 terminal.

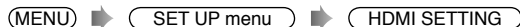

## Try changing the remote control code if you cannot operate a recorder.

### ■ Code C or 3



- Confirm the code for your recorder by checking the manual it came with.
- Some models of JVC devices cannot be operated with this remote control.
- JVC DVD recorders and HDD recorders are set to code "C" or "3" by default.

### Note:

- If the battery is removed, the remote control code reverts back to code A or 1.



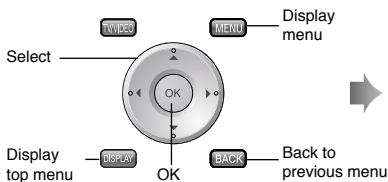
