
Before using your PD/CD-ROM drive, check that the items shown below were packed with the unit. If any of these items are missing or defective, please contact the dealer from whom you purchased the drive



PLEASE read this instruction manual through to the end so that you can obtain in advance any items necessary for your intended applications

Parts and Functions

Front Panel



- (A) EMERGENCY EJECTION HOLE—Use this when the shutter will not open. Turn off the drive's power, and insert the emergency ejection pin (included) into this hole. When the tray moves forward, pull it out with your hands. Do not use the pin under normal circumstances.
- (B) HEADPHONE JACK—for plugging in headphones equipped with a stereo mini jack or speakers.
- (C) VOLUME CONTROL—for adjusting the volume of the sound from the headphones or speakers.
- (D) PD/CD IDENTIFICATION LAMP—this lights up orange when a PD cartridge is inside the drive; it lights up green when a CD disc is inside.
- (E) BUSY LAMP—this lights up when the drive is being accessed.

Green: CD or CD-ROM play


PD cartridge read/write when write cache is OFF

PD cartridge read when write cache is OFF


Orange: PD cartridge write when write cache is ON

- (F) EJECT BUTTON—for opening and closing the tray.
- (G) TRAY—the PD cartridges, CDs and CD-ROMs are placed on this tray.

Rear Panel




- (A) AUDIO OUTPUT CONNECTOR—for connecting the internal audio cable (included).
- (B) JUMPER CONNECTOR—for setting the drive's SCSI ID, LUN, TERMINATOR and TERM POWER.
- (C) SCSI CONNECTOR—for connecting the internal SCSI cable (included).
- (D) POWER SUPPLY CONNECTOR—for connecting the power cable.



(E) ATTACHMENT SCREW HOLES—when securing the PD/CD-ROM drive to a personal computer to other device, secure the drive with the provided attachment screws into the areas as indicated.


PD Operation

To insert a PD cartridge:



- (1) Turn on the personal computer.
- (2) Press the eject button to open the tray.
- (3) Place the PD cartridge with its label side facing up, into the tray.
- (4) Gently push the tray or press the eject button to close the tray (the PD/CD identification lamp lights up orange).


To remove a PD cartridge:




- (1) Press the eject button to open the tray
- (2) Remove the PD cartridge
- (3) Gently push the tray or press the eject button to close the tray
- (4) Press the power switch to OFF
- •DO NOT turn off the power or remove a PD cartridge while the busy lamp is lighted. The data on the cartridge may be destroyed or the data may not be saved properly
- ◆DO NOT place a PD cartridge and CD or CD-ROM on the tray at the same time. The cartridge and CD or CD-ROM may be scratched

CD and CD-ROM Operation

To insert a CD or CD-ROM disc:




- ,(1) Turn on the personal computer.
- (2) Press the eject button to open the tray.
- (3) Place the CD or CD-ROM with its label side facing up, into the tray.



In the case of an 8 cm CD or CD-ROM, align it with the inside groove.

(4) Gently push the tray or press the eject button to close the tray (the PD/CD identification lamp lights up green).


To remove a CD or CD-ROM disc:



- (1) Press the eject button to open the tray.
- (2) Remove the CD or CD-ROM.
- (3) Gently push the tray or press the eject button to close the tray.
- (4) Press the power switch to OFF.
- •DO NOT place a PD cartridge and CD or CD-ROM on the tray at the same time. The cartridge and CD or CD-ROM may be scratched.

PD Cartridge Handling

The PD cartridge is already inside its own case (which you do not remove).



- (A) Space for affixing label
- (B) Shutter
- (C) Write protect switch—this prevents data from being erased or rewritten in error

NOTE:

To safeguard against the loss of important data, make it a habit to back up data regularly as you do with hard or floppy disk data.

DO NOT leave in a dirty/dusty location.



DO NOT open the shutter and touch the disk inside.



DO NOT re-use labels.



DO NOT leave in direct sunlight, high temperatures or high humidity.



DO NOT stack any items on top of the disk.




DO NOT incinerate the cartridge. Dispose of the cartridge correctly.




CD and CD-ROM Disc Handling


To remove a disc from its case, press down on the center holder and lift the disc out.



•To put the disc back in its case, press down on the label side so that the disc will go over the center holder.



•When holding a disc, DO NOT touch the disc surface.




DO NOT scratch or mark the disc.



DO NOT drop or bend.



DO NOT leave in direct sunlight.



DO NOT write or stick paper on the front panel.




Before Operation

This drive conforms to the SCSI standard. A SCSI host adapter is therefore required to connect the drive with a personal computer.

SCSI: an acronym for "Small Computer System Interface". This is a standard that governs connections between personal computers and peripheral devices.

NOTE:

No more than 7 SCSI units can be connected to a computer. Also, the total length of the SCSI cable from the personal computer to the last unit MUST NOT exceed 6 meters.



•(A) through (G) are SCSI units.

Installing the SCSI Host Adapter

The drive must be connected to a SCSI host adapter. If the SCSI host adapter is not installed inside your personal computer, you must install it by following the instructions that accompany the adapter.

After completing the connections, check that the personal computer starts up properly.



CoreISCSI for PD, the Device Driver software included with the PD/CD-ROM Drive includes an ASPI manager and supports the host adapters listed above. If a host adapter not listed above is installed, a separate ASPI manager program may be required.




Terminator Setting

A terminator refers to a terminating resistance. The terminators must be set properly when SCSI units (including the drive) have been connected to the personal computer. The factory default setting is ON.

When the drive is connected at the terminating end:

Lun Setting


The "LUN (Logical Unit Number)" is a function that causes the personal computer to differentiate between PD cartridges, CDs and CD-ROMs. It must be set according to the type of personal computer that has been connected. The factory default setting is OFF (IBM PC/AT or compatible).



SCSI ID Settings


The SCSI ID is a number for identifying each SCSI unit. These IDs must be set individually for each unit with no duplication. The factory default setting is SCSI ID 4.



Generally, the SCSI IDs are set as follows

- ●Hard Disk Drive=0
- ●CD-ROM Drive=3
- •SCSI Host Adapter=7

Check the IDs in the instruction manuals, and take care not to use the same setting as the one for the drive



TERM POWER Setting

The SCSI device at the terminating end requires a Terminator power supply. TERM POWER is a function which supplies this terminal power. (The factory setting is "ON".)

 When Terminator power is not supplied from another SCSI device: Set TERM POWER to "ON".




When Terminator power is supplied from another SCSI device:
 TERM POWER may be set to either "ON" or "OFF".




Connections

Before connecting the drive

- This drive can be used horizontally only.
- Turn off the power switch for the personal computer unit and unplug the power cord from the power socket. (Absolutely do not connect the drive while the power is on.)
- Insert the connection cables firmly.
- Attachment screw holes are located in four places on the right and left panels of the drive, and in four places on the bottom panel. When securing the drive to a personal computer or other device, secure the drive firmly in place with four attachment screws (included) in four places on the right and left panels or in four places on the bottom panel.
- •When connecting the internal SCSI cable (included), take care not to mistake the connected pin numbers. Connect the internal SCSI cable so that the protrusion on the tip is on the top.
- •Be sure to connect the specified power cable (see p. 37 of this manual).
- •Be sure to observe all operating environment restrictions as noted on p. 34 "Specifications" of this manual.



•If the personal computer is to be moved, make sure to turn the power to OFF and remove the PD cartridge, CD or CD-ROM.



 When purchasing a Sound board or MPEG board, review the product specifications thoroughly (Some board functions may be duplicated) Refer to the accompanying instructions for the connections

◆To enjoy music CDs audio

A Sound board is recommended to play CDs on stereo equipment, etc. If no Sound board is present, CDs can be played by connecting stereo mini-jack headphones or speakers to the drive's headphone connector

◆To enjoy CD-ROM audio data

A Sound board is required

Device Driver Installation

"Device driver" refers to a software routine for exchanging data between the drive and the personal computer. The device driver must be installed in the personal computer.

This drive has a device driver for DOS/Windows and Macintosh series

Install the device driver you need for your computer by referring to either of the Device Driver Installation Manuals (included)

The Device Driver software that has been included with the PD/CD-ROM drive provides a utility for playing Audio CDs and CD-ROMs. Refer to the PD Device Driver Installation manual for specific information on this subject.


Maintenance

DRIVE/DISKS

When used for an extended period of time, the drive's lens and the surfaces of optical disks may become dusty and fail to operate as designed. To avoid this, use of the optional cleaning kit is recommended to clean the lens and disks regularly.

CD/CD-ROM DISCS

•If a disc is dirty, wipe it with a soft cloth moistened with water and remove any remaining moisture with a dry cloth. Be sure to wipe the disc from its center towards its edge.



•If condensation has formed on a disc because it has suddenly been brought into a warm room, etc., wipe it off using a soft dry cloth.
