
- The player is equipped with composite A/V outputs at the rear of the player. Your TV will require at least one set of A/V inputs. The patch cord supplied with the player will connect your player's A/V output to your TV's inputs.
- Please remember to push the "Line" or "Input" or "Video/TV" button on your TV remote to view the DVD signal. Depending on your brand of TV, this button will have a different name for the same function, as per the examples above.

That function will allow the TV to be switched from broadcast reception mode to one of the A/V signals, your TV should have more than one A/V Input.


The player is equipped for stereo playback. To fully realize 2 channel sound, a Stereo TV or A/V receiver is necessary. However, a Mono TV may be used providing the TV one set of A/V Inputs. The A/V inputs on a Mono TV will only include one Audio Input for Mono sound. You may connect either the Left or Right audio channel from the DVD Composite audio out to the mono TV audio input.

#### Digital audio connection to a digital Amplifier




## GETTING STARTED

- Unpack the unit.
- Read through this owner's manual before installation and use.
- Load batteries into the remote control unit.
- Connect the system, make sure the connectons are secured.
- Connect the power plug to the AC power outlet.

Loading batteries to the remote control

- Remove the battery compartment cover.
- Load two AAA (UM-4 or R03) batteries into the battery compartment.
- Make sure that the batteries have been inserted in the correct polarities matching to the symbols +,- marked in the battery compartment. Close the battery compartment cover.
- When replacing batteries, replace both batteries. Do not mix new and used batteries operating together, otherwise, the operation lifetime will be much shorter than normal.
- Remove the batteries if the unit will not be used for a prolonged period of time.

#### Switch on the player

Press the main power switch on the DVD player. Power on the TV set, and the amplifier if connected.

Set up the system

Select the corresponding setting of the TV set (AV1, AV2, S-Video, DVD etc.).

For connectional through a RF modulator, select the corresponding channel until the DVD screen appears.

If amplifier has been connected, select the corresponding output mode.

#### Load a disc

Press OPEN/CLOSE button ② on the remote control (or front panel) to eject the disc tray. Load a disc, label side up, onto the disc tray and press OPEN/CLOSE button.

#### Automatic playback

The unit will take a few seconds to load the disc`s initial data, display the disc type logo on the left upper corner on screen, and then start playing back automatically.

NOTE Normally, when a MP3 disc is loaded, the player will take longer time to load.



## Problem disc messages

The following message will display on screen when there is a format problem with the loaded disc:

#### "WRONG REGIONAL DISC"

Region code of the disc is not matching to the player's region code (region 1 to region 6).

#### "WRONG PASSWORD"

The rating level of the disc is higher then the rating level setting of the player. The player will not play the disc.

#### "WRONG DISC"


The player is equipped with automatic disc quality detection software. When the played detects a problem disc or a damaged disc, the player may keep playing the disc at lower quality or stop playing, depending on the damaged level of the disc.

Production qualities of DVD discs vary, some discs might deviate from the industrial standard. Some incorrectly formatted discs may playback on the player. However, the playback and operational quality of those disc may be substandard.

## Power management

If the player will not be in use for a long time, unplug the player for personal safety.



## **TROUBLE SHOOTING**

# Should your DVD player develop a problem, please check below before requesting service:

Symptom	Check and Action
No Power	<ul> <li>Check if the power cord has been properly connected to the power outlet.</li> <li>Check if the main power button on the DVD player has been switched on.</li> </ul>
Remote Control	Make sure that the Main Power button on the DVD player has been switched on.
Does not play	<ul> <li>No disc, load a disc.</li> <li>Disc has been loaded upside down. Place the disc with the label side up.</li> <li>Disc's region code does not match to the player.</li> <li>Disc's rating level is higher than the player's rating level setting</li> <li>Disc is not correct type for the player.</li> <li>Disc is damaged or dirty, clean the disc or try another disc.</li> <li>Moisture may be condensed inside the player. Remove the disc and leave the unit power on for one or two hours.</li> </ul>
No Picture	<ul> <li>Check if the TV set has power on, use TV remote to select A/V signal for DVD rather than broadcast.</li> <li>Check if the system connection is proper and secure.</li> <li>Check if the connection cables are damaged.</li> <li>Clean the disc.</li> <li>Please press OPEN button, then press PROGRAM and ZOOM button to return factory default status.</li> </ul>
Picture noise / distorted	<ul> <li>The disc is dirty or damaged. Clean the disc or try another disc.</li> <li>Reset the color system of the TV set.</li> <li>Try by connect player direct to the TV set, without via a VCR for example.</li> </ul>
Picture not full screen	<ul> <li>Select the screen format from the player's SETUP MENU, see "SETUP MENU" of this manual.</li> <li>Select the screen format from DVD disc menu.</li> </ul>
Problem message display on screen	<ul> <li>Following message will display when there is a problem with the loaded disc:</li> <li>"WRONG REGIONAL DISC.": Disc's region code dose not match to the player.</li> <li>"WRONG PASSWORD": The player refuse to play a disc with rating level higher than the player's rating level setting.</li> <li>"WRONG DISC.": The player is equipped with automatic disc quality detection software. When the player detects a problem disc or a damaged disc, the player may keep playing the disc at lower quality or stop playing, depending on the damage level of the disc.</li> </ul>
Malfunction	<ul> <li>Press and hold the standby button (if any) for about 5 second to power off.</li> <li>Should the player develop a malfunction, unplug the player for 30 minutes. After 30 minutes, power on the player and the restore function should reset the player.</li> </ul>
