

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Storing pictures on an SD or MMC card

Your camera has internal memory. You can purchase an SD or MMC card to conveniently store more pictures/videos (www.kodak.com/go/m883accessories).

CAUTION:

A card can only be inserted one way; forcing it may cause damage. Inserting or removing a card when the camera is accessing the card may damage the pictures, the card, or the camera.

2 Taking pictures/videos

Taking a picture



1 Slide the Mode switch to Auto 🚺.




- **2** Press the On/Off button
- **3** Compose the picture. Press the Shutter button halfway to focus and set exposure. When the framing marks turn green, press the Shutter button completely down.
- NOTE: You can repeatedly press Display 🔺 to turn on/off status icons, histogram, and framing grid.

Using the framing marks to take pictures

Framing marks indicate the camera focus area. In Auto mode (and in SCN modes designed for pictures of people), the camera attempts to focus on faces.





1 Press the Shutter button **halfway**.

When the framing marks turn green, focus is accomplished.

- 2 If the camera is not focusing on the desired subject (or if the framing marks disappear), release the Shutter button and recompose the scene.
- **3** Press the Shutter button **completely down** to take the picture.

NOTE: Framing marks do not appear in Landscape or Video mode. When you use Focus Zone and set Center Zone, the framing marks are fixed at Center Wide.

Taking a video



1 Slide the Mode switch to Video



2 Press the Shutter button **completely down**, then release it. To stop recording, press and release the Shutter button again.

Reviewing the picture/video just taken

After you take a picture/video, the LCD displays a quickview for approximately 5 seconds. (To exit the quickview sooner, press the Shutter button halfway.)



To review pictures/videos anytime, see page 13.

Using optical zoom

Use optical zoom to get up to 3X magnification. You can use optical zoom during picture taking or before taking a video.




- Use the LCD to frame your subject.
- **2** To zoom in, press Telephoto (T).
 - To zoom out, press Wide Angle (W).

The zoom indicator shows the zoom status.

3 Take the picture.

NOTE: For focus distances, see page 55.



Using digital zoom during picture taking

Use digital zoom in any picture-taking mode to get up to 5X beyond optical zoom.

- **1** Press Telephoto (T) until the slider is at the top of the optical zoom range. Release Telephoto (T), then press it again.
- 2 Take the picture.
- NOTE: You may notice decreased image quality when using digital zoom. The slider pauses and turns red when the picture quality reaches the limit for an acceptable 4 x 6-in. (10 x 15 cm) print.



Using the flash



Press the flash button repeatedly to scroll through flash modes.

The current flash mode is shown in the LCD status area.



- 1 Press the Review button.
- **2** Press **4/** for previous/next picture/video.

Magnifying a picture



- **1** Press T to magnify 2X–8X.
- 2 Press / to view other parts of a picture.
- 3 Press OK to return to 1X.

Playing a video

Press 🔻 to play a video. Press OK to pause/unpause. During playback:



Press \checkmark to adjust the volume.

Press b to play at 2X speed; press again for 4X.

Press < to reverse at 2X speed; press again for 4X.

Press and hold **//** for 4 seconds to jump to a bookmark (see page 18).

Deleting pictures/videos

- 1 Press the Review button.
- 2 Press **4/** for previous/next picture/video.
- 3 Press the Delete button.
- **4** Follow the screen prompts.

NOTE: To delete protected pictures/videos, remove protection before deleting. (See Protecting pictures/videos from deletion.)

Using the undo delete feature

If you accidentally delete a picture, you may be able to use Undo Delete to retrieve it. This feature is only available immediately after you delete a single picture.

Protecting pictures/videos from deletion

- 1 Press the Review button.
- 2 Press **4**/**>** for previous/next picture/video.
- **3** Press the Menu button, then highlight the Review tab.
- **4** Press **A v** to highlight Protect, then press the OK button.

The picture/video is protected and cannot be deleted. The Protect icon \bigcirc appears with the protected picture/video.

Press the Menu button to exit the menu.

CAUTION:

Formatting internal memory or an SD or MMC card deletes all (including protected) pictures/videos. (Formatting internal memory also deletes email addresses and album names. To restore them, see EasyShare software Help.)



Cropping pictures

You can crop a picture so that only the desired portion of the picture remains.



- 1 Press the Review button, then **√** to find a picture to crop.
- 2 Press the Menu button, then **√** to highlight the Edit tab. Highlight Crop, then press the OK button.
- 3 Press Telephoto (T) to zoom in, or ◀/▶ ▲/▼ to move the crop box. Press the OK button.
- 4 Follow the screen prompts.

The picture is cropped. (The original is saved.) Cropped pictures cannot be cropped again on the camera.

Press the Menu button to exit the menu.

Using Kodak Perfect Touch technology

Kodak Perfect Touch technology helps ensure better, brighter pictures.

- **1** Press the Review button.
- **2** Press **4**/**>** for previous/next picture.
- 3 Press the Menu button, then **∢**/**▶** to highlight the Edit tab. Highlight Perfect Touch tech, then press the OK button.

The enhancement is previewed in a split screen. Press \checkmark to view other parts of the picture.

4 Press the OK button. Follow the screen prompts to replace the original picture or to save the enhanced picture as a new one.

Enhanced pictures cannot be enhanced again on the camera. Kodak Perfect Touch technology can only be used with pictures, not video.

Press the Menu button to exit the menu.




Editing videos

You can do incredible things with your videos!

Making a picture from a video


You can choose a single frame from a video, then make a picture suitable for a 4×6 -inch (10 x 15 cm) print.



- 1 Press the Review button, then **4**/**>** to find a video.
- 2 Press the Menu button, then **√** to highlight the Edit tab. Highlight Make Picture, then press the OK button.
- **3** Follow the screen prompts. *A picture is created. (The original video is saved.)*
 - Press the Menu button to exit the menu.

Trimming a video

You can trim an unwanted start or end from a video, saving only the desired portion.



- 1 Press the Review button, then **4**/**>** to find a video.
- 2 Press the Menu button, then **√** to highlight the Edit tab. Highlight Trim, then press OK.
 - **3** Follow the screen prompts.


The video is trimmed. (You can save it as a new video or replace the original.)

Press the Menu button to exit the menu.

Using video bookmarks

You can set bookmarks at interesting places in your video, then jump from one bookmark to another.


Setting bookmarks



- 1 Press the Review button, then **4**/**>** to find a video.
- 2 Press the Menu button, then **√** to highlight the Edit tab. Highlight Bookmark, then press OK.
- **3** Press **v** to add bookmarks. When finished adding up to 9 bookmarks, press **a**.
 - Press the Menu button to exit the menu.

Using bookmarks


After you have set up bookmarks (see Setting bookmarks):



- 1 Press the Review button, then **4**/**•** to find a video.
- - After you jump to a bookmark, press **4/** to jump to other bookmarks.
 - To view all bookmarked video frames, press the Zoom wide angle (W) button. To return to normal view, press the telephoto (T) button.

Making a video action print

From a video, you can make a 4-, 9-, or 16-up picture, suitable for a 4 x 6-inch (10 x 15 cm) print.



- 1 Press the Review button, then **4**/**>** to find a video.
- 2 Press the Menu button, then **√** to highlight the Edit tab. Highlight Action Print, then press the OK button.
- **3** Choose an option, then press the OK button.

Auto: The camera includes the first and last frames, then 2, 7, or 14 equally spaced frames.

Manual: You choose the first and last frames; the camera chooses 2, 7, or 14 equally spaced frames. **Full Manual:** You choose 4, 9, or 16 frames.

Use Bookmarks: Bookmarked frames are used.

A 4-, 9-, or 16-up picture is created. If you have less than 4 or 9 bookmarks, equally-spaced video frames are used.

Press the Menu button to exit the menu.

Running a slide show

Use Slide Show to display your pictures/videos on the LCD.

- **1** Press the Review button, then the Menu button.
- 2 Press **√** to highlight the Review tab. Press **√** to highlight Slide Show, then press the OK button.
- 3 Press ▲/→ to highlight Begin Show, then press the OK button. *Each picture/video is displayed once.*
- To interrupt the Slide Show, press the OK button.

Changing the slide show display interval

The default interval setting displays each picture for 5 seconds. You can set the display interval from 3–60 seconds.

- **2** Select a display interval.

To scroll through the seconds quickly, press and hold \checkmark/\checkmark .

3 Press the OK button.

The interval setting remains until you change it.

Running a continuous slide show loop

When you turn on Loop, the slide show is continuously repeated.


- 1 On the Slide Show menu, press / to highlight Loop, then press the OK button.
- 2 Press / to highlight On, then press the OK button.
- **3** Press \checkmark to highlight Begin Show, then press the OK button.

The slide show repeats until you press the OK button or until battery power is exhausted. The Loop feature remains until you change it.

Choosing a slide show transition

Choose how the slide show transitions from one picture to another.


- 1 On the Slide Show menu, press ▲/▼ to highlight Transition, then press the OK button.
- 2 Press / to highlight a transition, then press the OK button.



Displaying pictures/videos on a television


You can display pictures/videos on a television, computer monitor, or any device equipped with a video input. To connect the camera to a television, use an A/V cable (may be sold separately).

NOTE: Ensure that the Video Out setting (NTSC or PAL) is correct (see page 32). The slide show stops if you connect or disconnect the cable while the slide show is running. (Image quality on a television screen may not be as good as on a computer monitor or when printed.)



Running a slide show with the photo frame dock 2

- **2** Press W to change from single-picture view to multi-up thumbnails.
- **3** Press T to return to single-picture view.
 - To select multiple pictures/videos, see page 24.
 - Press the Review button to exit Review.

Viewing by all, date, album, image storage, favorites


- 1 Press the Review button, then the Menu button. Press **√** to highlight the Review tab.
- 2 Press \checkmark to highlight View By, then press the OK button.
- **3** Press / to highlight a choice: Date, Album, Image Storage, Favorites. (If you chose Date or Album, choose a date or album name.)
 - To view multi-up thumbnails, press the W button. To return to single-picture view, press the T button.
 - Press the Review button to exit Review. For more about albums, see page 42.

Viewing picture/video information

- 1 Press the Review button.
- 2 Repeatedly press the display D button to turn on/off status icons, histogram, and picture/video info.
 - Press the Review button to exit Review.

Selecting multiple pictures/videos

Use the multi-select feature when you have two or more pictures/videos to print, transfer, delete, etc. (Multi-select is used most effectively in Multi-Up mode, page 23.)



- 1 Press the Review button, then **1** to find a picture/video.
- **2** Press the OK button to select pictures/videos.

A check mark appears on the picture. You can now print, transfer, delete, etc. the selected pictures. You can press OK a second time to remove a check mark.

Copying pictures/videos


You can copy pictures/videos from a card to internal memory or from internal memory to a card. Before you copy, make sure that a card is inserted in the camera.

Copy pictures/videos:

- 1 Press the Review button, then the Menu button. Press **√** to highlight the Review tab.
- 2 Press / to highlight Copy To >, then press the OK button.
- **3** Press / to highlight an option.
- 4 Press the OK button.
- NOTE: Pictures/videos are copied, not moved. To remove pictures/videos from the original location after copying, delete them (see page 14). Tags that you applied for print, email, and favorites are not copied. Protection settings are not copied. To apply protection to a picture/video, see page 14.

Understanding the blur warning icons

If the feature is turned on (see page 30), a blur alert icon (1) is displayed during picture review and quickview.

Green—Picture is sharp enough for an acceptable 4 x 6-inch (10 x 15 cm) print.

Yellow—Picture may be sharp enough for an acceptable 4 x 6-inch (10 x 15 cm) print or sharpness is not determined. (You may want to view on a computer monitor before printing.)

Red—Picture is not sharp enough for an acceptable 4 x 6-inch (10 x 15 cm) print.

White—Print sharpness is not determined (displayed only in quickview).

Using the menu button to change settings

You can change settings to get the best results from your camera.

- NOTE: Some settings remain until you change them; others, until you change modes or turn off the camera. Some modes offer limited settings.
- 1 Press the Menu button.
- 2 Press **/** to choose a tab:
 - **Capture** for the most common picture-taking settings
 - **Capture plus** for other picture-taking settings
 - Video for video-taking settings
 - Setup for other camera settings
- **3** Press \checkmark to highlight a setting, then press the OK button.
- **4** Choose an option, then press the OK button.

To better understand each menu option, use camera Help. Highlight a menu choice, then press the Zoom telephoto (T) button.





Using the self-timer

- **1** Choose the desired self-timer mode, then compose the scene.
- 2 Press the Shutter button halfway, then completely down.

The camera takes the picture/pictures after the delay.

	Press until the desired self-timer icon appears in the LCD status area.

NOTE: In Panoramic modes (page 37), only the 2- and 10-second self-timer options are available.

Use the same procedure to take a video, but:

- Slide the mode switch to Video .
- Press the Shutter button **completely down**.
- NOTE: Only the 2- and 10-second options are available in video mode. The video stops when no storage space remains.

Using burst

Use burst to take up to 4 pictures in rapid succession.



- 1 In most Still modes, press the ◀ button repeatedly until 🚰 appears on the LCD.
- **2** Press the Shutter button **halfway** to focus and set exposure.
- **3** Press the Shutter button **completely down and hold it** to take pictures.

The camera stops taking pictures when you release the Shutter button, when the pictures are taken, or when there is no more storage space.

NOTE: During quickview, you can delete all pictures in the burst series. To delete selectively, do so in Review (see page 14). Burst is not available when shutter speeds are longer than 0.5 seconds.



Taking panoramic pictures

Use panorama to "stitch" up to 3 pictures into a panoramic scene.

- NOTE: For best results, use a tripod. Only the panoramic picture is saved; individual pictures are not. (Picture size is set to 5.0 MP. Exposure and white balance are set with the first picture. The flash is set to Off.)
- **1** Slide the Mode switch to SCN.
- 2 Press **∢/**▶ to highlight Panorama Left-Right or Panorama Right-Left (depending on the direction you want to pan), then press the OK button.
- 3 Take the first picture.

After a quickview, the LCD displays the liveview and an "overlay" from the first picture.

- **4** Compose the second picture. Make the overlay from the first picture cover the same portion in the new picture. (You can press the Delete button to re-take a picture.)
- **5** If you are taking only 2 pictures, press the OK button to stitch them together. *After you take 3 pictures, the pictures are automatically stitched together.*



NOTE: To use the self-timer 10-second or 2-second options, see page 35.



Using the histogram to view picture brightness

Use the histogram to evaluate the distribution of light before or after you take a picture. If the peak is to the right of the graph, the subject is bright; if it's to the left, the subject is dark. Optimal exposure is achieved when the peak is in the middle of the histogram. The flash may affect a picture's light and shadow.



To turn on the histogram in picture-taking mode mode or in Review, press the display Dutton until the histogram appears.

Using the framing grid to compose a picture

The framing grid divides the LCD into thirds—vertically and horizontally. This is helpful if, for example, you want to balance a picture between water, earth, and sky.



To turn on the framing grid in Auto/SCN mode, press the display []]button until the grid appears.

Sharing your pictures

Press the Share button to tag your pictures/videos. When they are transferred to your computer, you can share them. Press the Share button to tag pictures/videos:

- Any time. (The most recent picture/video taken is then displayed.)
- After pressing the Review button (see page 13).

Tagging pictures for printing

- **1** Press the Share button. Press **4**/**>** to find a picture.
- 2 Press / to highlight Print, then press the OK button.*
- 3 Press ▲/▼ to select the number of copies (0–99). Zero removes the tag for that picture.

The Print icon 🗋 appears in the status area. The default quantity is one.

- **4 Optional:** You can apply a print quantity to other pictures. Press **∢/** to find a picture. Keep the print quantity as is, or press **∧/** to change it. Repeat this step until the desired print quantity is applied to the pictures.
- **5** Press OK. Press the Share button to exit the menu.

* To tag all pictures in the storage location, highlight Print All, press OK, then indicate the number of copies. To remove print tagging for all pictures in the storage location, highlight Cancel Prints, then press OK.

Use Kodak EasyShare software to create an email address book on your computer. Then, copy up to 32 email addresses to the camera's internal memory. For details, see Help in EasyShare software.

NOTE: You can also use the Add Email menu choice and the on-camera keyboard to add addresses.

Second—tag pictures/videos on your camera

- 1 Press the Share button. Press **4/** to find a picture/video.
- 2 Press ▲/▼ to highlight Email, then press the OK button. The Email icon ⊠ appears in the status area.
- **3** Press / to highlight an email address, then press the OK button.

To tag other pictures/videos with the same address, press \checkmark to scroll through them. When the picture you want is displayed, press the OK button.

To send the pictures/videos to more than one address, repeat step 3. *Selected addresses are checked.*

- **4** To remove a selection, highlight a checked address and press the OK button. To remove all email selections, highlight Clear All.
- 5 Press →/→ to highlight Exit, then press the OK button. The Email icon appears in the status area.
- **6** Press the Share button to exit the menu.

Mac OS X—double-click the CD icon on the desktop, then click the Install icon.

- **4** Follow the on-screen instructions to install the software.
- NOTE: When prompted, register your camera and software. Registering lets you sign up for information that keeps your system up-to-date. To register later, visit www.kodak.com/go/register.
- **5** If prompted, restart the computer.


