- 1. Before operating your DVD and TV system, please read these instructions carefully.
- 2. Retain this manual for future reference.


Output (RCA) to other AV Equipment:

Connect Power:






7. Basic Functions:

- 1. POWER indication LED on unit turns RED in color indicating power is connected.
- 2. Press the ON/OFF button on control panel or power button on remote, the POWER indication LED on TV front control panel will turn GREEN in color.



Mode:


- Press MODE button on remote or on control panel to select from the various mode settings.

Press the "VOL-/+" button on control panel or "VOLUME \land / \lor " on remote to adjust the volume level.






Channel Search:


TV Channel Setting:

When select TV Channel setting, press ▼/▲ button on remote or <CH. ▼/▲ > button on control panel, Each time when Scan Channel/TV Source setting is selected, the TV Channel Symbol and the words will highlight in RED color, then press < ▶ > button on remote or <VOL. +> button on control panel to adjust the settings.

Scan Channel: When Scan Channel is selected, press < ▶ > button will make the monitor start to scan channel. Press MENU button again will stop the scanning.



TV Source: When TV Source is selected, press < ▶ > button to select source CABLE or AIR.



7. Basic Functions:

OSD Control Setting:

When select OSD Control setting, press ▼/▲ button on remote or <CH. ▼/▲ > button on control panel. Each time when V PositionH Position/Duratuion setting is selected, the OSD Control Symbol and the words will highlight in RED color, then press < ▶ > button on remote or <VOL. +> button on control panel and then press < ◀ > button on remote or <VOL. -> button on control panel to adjust the POSITION of OSD MENU. V Position is for VERTICAL adjusting, H Position is for HORIZONTAL adjusting, Duration is for adjusting remain menu displayed minutes.




Utility Setting:

When select OSD Control setting, press ▼/▲ button on remote or <CH. ▼/▲ > button on control panel. Each time when Sleep Timer/Dimmer/Speaker setting is selected, the OSD Control Symbol and the words will highlight in RED color.


Sleep Timer: When Sleep Timer is selected, press < ▶ > button can adjust Sleep Time setting, <0/30/60/90/120/150>.



Dimmer: When Dimmer is selected, press < ▶ > button will adjust Dimmer On/Off.





Playing DVD/CD:

- 1. Press POWE button on control panel or on remote to switch on the unit.
- 2. Press MODE button on the remote control repeatedly until DVD mode is displayed.
- 3. Insert the DVD into the DVD player as shown in the illustration below.

NOTE: To avoid damageing discs, insert the into the slot with the disc parallel to the slot.



- 4. Disc will automatically play
 - -- If the DVD does not comes with Menu/Title, the Play will continue.
 - -- If the DVD comes with Menu/Title, Menu Options will be shown on the screen, press "Left/Right/Up/Down" (◀ / ▶ / ▼ /▲) buttons on the remote control, to select the chapter for playing, press the "Enter" button on remote to begin play.
 - -- If the message "NO DISC" is displayed on the screen, check the format of the disc being used and ensure that the disc is being loaded with the label facing you <see illustration above>.
 - -- If the message "WRONG REGION" is display on the screen, it means the player does not support the regional code for that DVD.
- Press the "Left/Right/Up/Down" (✓ / ✓ / ▲) button on remote to select the chapter to be played.
- 6. Press the "PLAY/PAUSE(CH ▼)" button on control panel or the Play/Pause"(►/π) button on remote to begin play. (You can also use the "ENTER" (←) button on the remote.)

Ejecting DVD/CD Disc:

When in " DVD " mode, Press the "Eject" (▲) button on the remote or on the control panel to eject the DVD disc from the player.

DVD Navigation Keys:

The remote control's [LEFT], [RIGHT], [UP], [DOWN] & [ENTER] allows the user to navigate the DVD MENU or DVD TITLE MENU or DVD SETUP MENU.

Stop Playback:

Press remote control's [STOP] or the front panel's [STOP] to stop DVDC playback.

Play/Pause:

Press the "PLAY/PAUSE" (\blacktriangleright / ι I) button, during playback. The player will be placed in the pause mode.

Press the "PLAY/PAUSE" (►/II) button again, the player will return to normal playback.

DVD Playback:

- (1) Press the "MODE" button on remote or on control panel to select the DVD mode.
- (2) When DVD playback commences. The disc will start to play if the disc does not have any menu setting recorded on it. If the disc has one or more titles recorded on it, a menu screen will appear on the monitor. (* The monior will display "NO DISC" if there is no disc in the case.)
- (3) Press **◄** / **▶** / **▼** / **▲** on the remote to select the preferred title.
- (4) Press the ENTER or PLAY button, the selected item will now start playing.

Press the MENU or TITLE button, MENU screen will appear on the monitor.

NEXT Track or Previous Track:

Press Next Track (▶) during playback

MP3, Audio CD

The player will skip forward to the next track each time the button is pressed. "NEXT TRACK" will be displayed on the TV screen.

DVD

The player will skip forward to the Next Title / Chapter each time the button is pressed.

8. Optional DVD System Basic Functions :

"dd" will be displayed on the TV screen.

Press Previous Track (◄) during playback

MP3, Audio CD

The player will skip to the beginning of the previous track each time the button is pressed. "PREVIOUS TRACK" will be displayed on the TV screen.

DVD

The player will skip to the beginning of the previous chapter each time the button is pressed.

Stop:

- (1) During Audio CD playback, when "STOP" () button is pressed, the CD playback will stop.
- (2) During DVD playback, when "STOP" () button is pressed, press "PLAY/PAUSE (▶/II)" button to continue. The player records the point where the "STOP" () button is pressed (Resume playback function). Press the PLAY/PAUSE (▶/II) button again, the play will resume from this point.

If "STOP" (■) button is pressed. "OP " will apppear and the resume playback function will be cleared.

Note: Resume playback function is not available for Audio CDs.

Repeat Mode:

For DVD/CD/MP3:

When REPEAT button on the remote is pressed, the OSD will appear on screen. The Repeat setting will cycle each time the Repeat button is pressed.

Camera Angle:

Some DVD discs may contain scenes, which have more than one viewing angle. For these discs, the same scene can be viewed from a different angle by using the "ANGLE" button.

(1) During DVD playback, press the "ANGLE" button on remote. " (2) x / y" will appear <see illustration right>, x represents the current camera angle, and " y " represents the total available camera angle.




(2) Press the ANGLE button on remote until the preferred angle is selected. The ANGLE selection will cycle through all available camera angle.

Note: This function will only work on discs where different camera angles have been recorded.

Subtitle:

During DVD playback, you may change the subtitle language from the one selected at the initial setting to a different language, if available.

(1) Pressing "SUBTITLE ON / OFF" button, the following will appear as below:



(2) During DVD playback and SUBTITLE ON, press the "SUBTITLE" button until the preferred subtitle is selected. The SUBTITLE selection will cycle through all available subtitles.

Note: (1) The "SUBTITLE" works only for discs that have multiple subtitle.

(2) In some cases, the subtitle will not changed immediately to the one selected.

DVD Menu:

Most DVD discs have unique menu structures call DVD menu. The DVD menu's contents and operation may differ from disc to disc.


- (1) During DVD playback, press the MENU button. The DVD menu available on the disc will be displayed.
- (2) Use ◀/►/▼/▲ to select the preferred item or use the numeric button(s) to make a selection.
- (3) Press "ENTER" or "PLAY" button, the selected item will start playing.

Display Function:

- (1) Press"DISPLAY" button enables you to view the Title/Chapter/Title Play Time/Audio/Subtitle/Angle/Sound setting.
- (2) Use ◀ / ▶ / ▼/ ▲ button or Number button to select the preferred item, and press Enter button to save setting.

Note: (1) The "DISPLAY" works only for discs that have multiple display function.

(2) In some cases, the display will not changed immediately to the one selected.



Title Setting :	Display the current Title number and the total number of the disc titles.
	User can jump to the title number desired.
Chapter Setting:	Display the current chapter number and the total number of the disc
	chapters. User can jump to the chapter number desired.
Title Play Time	Display the disc playing time that has elapsed. You can directly input
Setting:	the desired time from which you want to start your playback.

DVD Typical Setup menu and Configuration:

When the player is in stop mode, pressing "SETUP" button will allow you to modify some of the player's basic settings, you can use "UP< ▲ >/DOWN< ▼ >" buttons to enter a maternal selection, then press "RIGHT< ▶ >" button enter sub-selection and press "UP< ▲ >/DOWN< ▼ >" buttons again to enter the setting preferred, and press "ENTER" button to confirm the selection. Press "LEFT< ◀ >" button will exit the subselection or press "SETUP" button will exit Setup OSD Menu directly.

Note: Some DVD menu settings do not apply to this system, since it is specifically engineered for automotive use. Changing the state of some settings can cause apparent system failure. If you try to perform an action that is not permitted (such as accessing the Preferences menu while a disc is playing), the On-Screen-Display will appear as left chart.

Language Setup:

When select LANGUAGE setup, press "UP< ▲ >/DOWN< ▼ >" buttons to highlight Menu Language/Disc Audio/Disc Subtitle/Disc Menu selection, then press "RIGHT< ▶ >" button to enter the setting, and then press "UP< ▲ >/DOWN< ▼ >" buttons again to highlight the setting preferred, press "ENTER" button to confirm the selection. The OSD Menu will change as below chart:





Audio Setup:

When select Audio setup, press "UP< ▲ >/DOWN< ▼ >" buttons to highlight Dolby Digital/DTS/Sample Freq./Digital Output selection, then press "RIGHT< ▶>" button to enter the setting, and then press "UP< ▲ >/DOWN< ▼ >" buttons again to highlight the setting preferred, press "ENTER" button to confirm the selection. The OSD Menu will change as below chart:

Lock Setup:

When select Lock setup, press "UP< \blacktriangle >/DOWN< \blacktriangledown >" buttons to highlight Rating/Password/Country Code selection, then press "RIGHT< ▶ >" button to enter the setting, the OSD menu will request to input the password first. After the password is entered correctly, the parental control Rating level can be changed.

Rating:

* When pressing wrong code before press ENTER button, press LEFT< ◀ > button can clear the wrong nember and enter the correct number again to enter the setting. The OSD Menu will change as below chart:

* After password is entered successfully, press Up< ▲ >/Down< ▼ > button to change the parental control rating level. Including the Unlock level, there are total of 9 levels in the parental control rating levels. The parental control function is only valid after the disc eject.

* Enter Password

* The Factory original Password Code is "1234". You can use "1234" when you forget the new password.

Password:

The Password item is used to set the new password or change the old password. Before enter the item, the system will request to input OLD PASSWORD first. After press ENTER, the system will request to input NEW PASSWORD, after input new password, the system will request to VERIFY the new password again. Then press ENTER to save setting. The OSD Menu will change as below chart:

Country Code:

Country code item is used to set the national code. It is a prerequisite that the setting of the parental control level is only valid when the country code of the unit is matched with that of the disc. Country code item provides two alphabetical letters for changes.

Before user can enter into the country code item, the system will request to input the password first. The country code can be changed only after the password is input successfully.

Press Up< ▲ >/Down< ▼ > to select the first letter. And press Right to move the highlight. Press Up< ▲ >/Down< ▼ > again to select the second letter. Then press ENTER to confirm the selection of the country code. The OSD Menu will change as below chart:

Disc Maintenances and Cleaning:

Precautions:

- 1. Do not touch the surface of the play side of the disc. And do not scrape paper or tape to discs.
- 2. Do not put tapes and glue on the surface of the disc, which will cause the image and sound deterioration. Wipe the disc from the center outwards with a soft cloth.

 Always keep the disc clean.
- 3. Do not put the disc under the sunlight or near the heating radiator. Recommend to put the disc inside the disc storage box to keep it under normal temperature after the disc playback is ended.

Disc Cleaning: Before the disc playback, wipe the disc from the center outwards with a soft cloth. Please do not use any type of solvent, such as benzine, commercially available cleaners or antistatic spray for vinyl LPs. It may damage the disc.

LCD Monitor Care & Cleaning Tips:

To avoid possible shock hazard, be sure the LCD TV is turn off and unplugged from the main electrical outlet before cleaning.Do not use any form of solvents on the LCD monitor.

Cleaning the LCD Monitor:

- 1. Use a soft, clean & dry cloth to gently wipe off the dust on the LCD monitor.
- 2. Use a clean cloth dampened with water to wipe off the dirt.
- 3. Do not exert force when cleaning the LCD monitor.

Cleaning the Enclosure:

- 1. Use a soft, clean & dry cloth to gently wipe off the dust on the LCD monitor.
- 2. Use a clean cloth dampened with water to wipe off the dirt.
- 3. Do not exert force when cleaning the LCD monitor.

Troubleshooting:

If the unit fails to operate normally, try solving the problems using the guide below. If the problem persists, switch off the unit and ask the dealer or technical services for assistance. Do not attempt to repair the defective unit yourself. Do not endanger yourself as high voltage is involved.

1. No Picture:

- a. Check that the power cord is plugged into the main socket and the power supply is turned on.
- b. Check the contrast and brightness setting.
- c. Check the Antenna connection to see if it is properly connected to the LCD TV Input Terminal.
- d. Be sure you have selected the correct source mode.
