
## Map of the Concourse

## Your guide to Rock Center underground



Beneath the "city within a city" that is Rockefeller Center, there lies a whole mini metropolis known as the <u>Concourse</u>. Lined with shops and restaurants, it also holds a box office and entrance to <u>Top of the Rock</u>, as well as ATMs, a <u>post office</u> and a <u>passport renewal counter</u>. Use the map above (and this <u>full version</u>) to help navigate 30 Rock's vibrant subterranean level, and consult with the Rockefeller Plaza map (full version here) for the above-ground layout.

The Concourse can be accessed directly from <u>47-50 Sts/Rock Center subway station</u> at Sixth Avenue, where the B, D, F and M trains stop. There are also outdoor elevator stations on either

side of the Rink (or Summer Garden in season), on 49th and 50th Streets between Fifth and Sixth Avenues. Entrances can be found as well in different Rockefeller Center buildings, including 30 Rockefeller Plaza (aka 30 Rock).

There's no shortage of coffee in the Concourse, with two <u>Starbucks</u> at either end, <u>Blue Bottle Coffee</u> near the Rink, <u>Jacques Torres</u>—with espresso, hot chocolate and combinations of the two—and a 24-hour <u>Dunkin' Donuts</u> by the subway turnstiles. Food choices abound, ranging from the new <u>Blue Ribbon Sushi Bar</u> to healthful Mediterranean fare at <u>Nanoosh</u> to soups and sandwiches at <u>Hale & Hearty</u> and <u>Pret A Manger</u>.

Shoppers can check off their lists with a new read at <u>Posman Books</u>, souvenirs at the <u>Top of the Rock shop</u>, paper crafts, cards and gifts at <u>Paper Source</u>, nifty tech finds at Brookstone, playful Japanese characters at <u>P!Qtoo</u> and crystal jewels at <u>Swarovski</u>. There are handy services as well, such as shoe shines at <u>Eddie's Shoe Repair</u>, passport and license renewal at <u>It's Easy</u> (between the central escalators), First Republic Bank ATMs (the bank is above ground) and a branch of the <u>U.S. post office</u> between the Rink and Fifth Avenue. Another lifesaver is <u>Value Drugs</u>, with its pharmacy and selection of health and beauty items, school supplies and snacks. This level also holds the <u>skatehouse entrance to the Rink</u>, and both <u>The Sea Grill</u> and <u>Rock Center Café</u>, with windows looking out to wintertime skaters.

Seating areas south and west of the Rink provide a welcome opportunity to relax, and public restrooms are available on both the north and south sides of the Concourse. Also check out the <u>Top of the Rock app</u> and its Wayfinder feature to map locations around the complex.

Now you're all set. And remember, while most people are drawn to Rock Center for its glorious outdoor sights—such as the world-famous <u>Christmas Tree</u>—those in the know frequent the Concourse for its array of excellent finds and conveniences, as well as the comfortable underground passage it provides—warm in the winter and air-conditioned in the summer.
