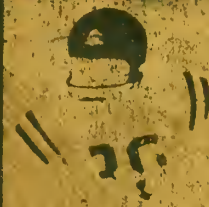
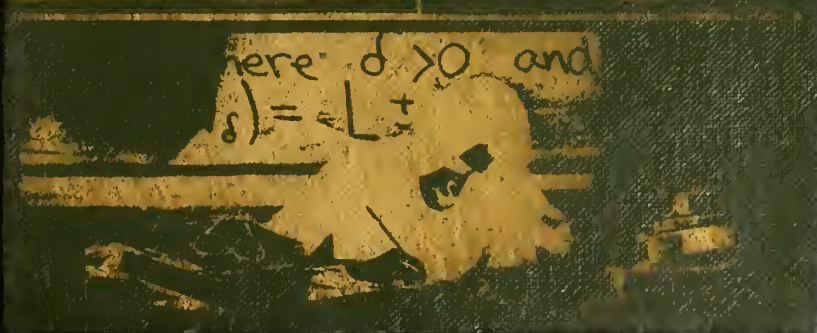


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## *Dedication*

or hide in altocumulous images.

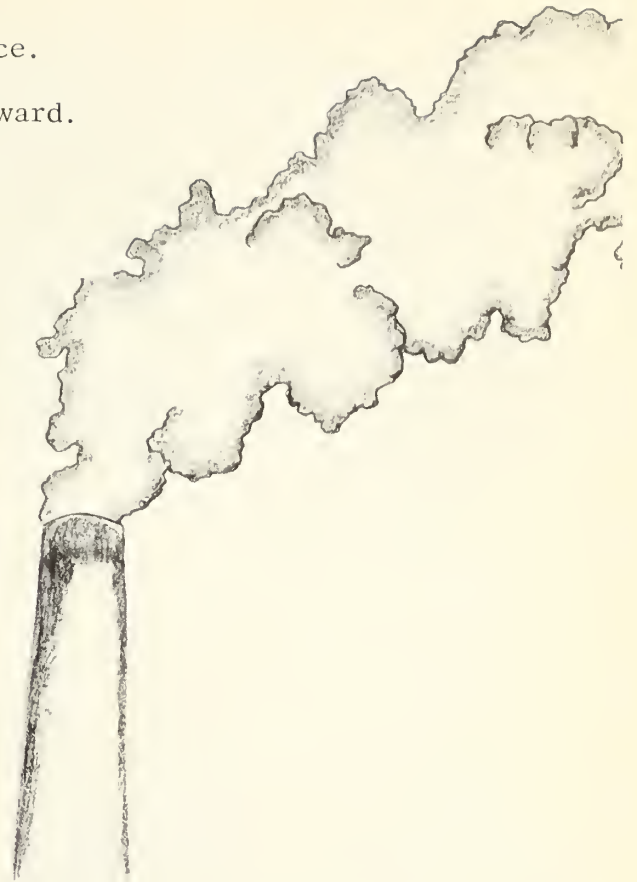
but don't let me fall into the shadowed

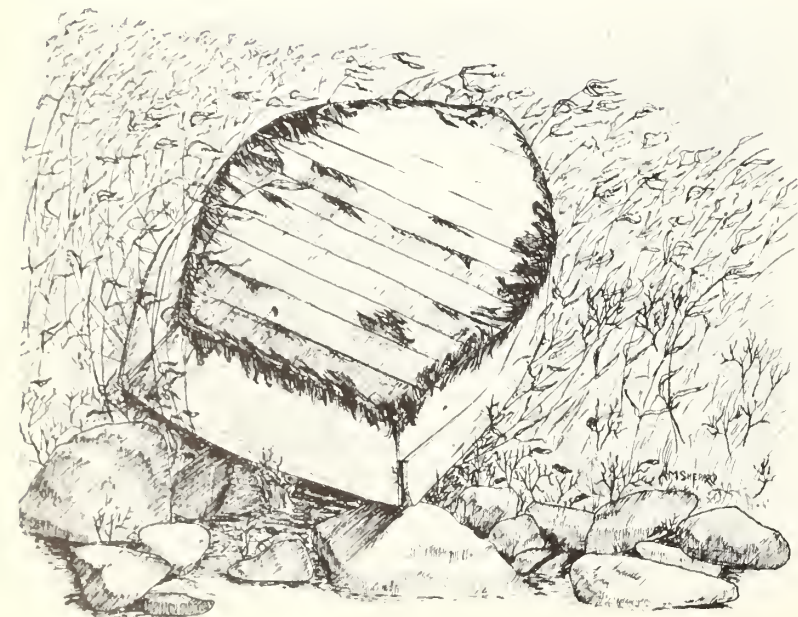
moffat's skiff

To hide his skiff 'til winter passed.

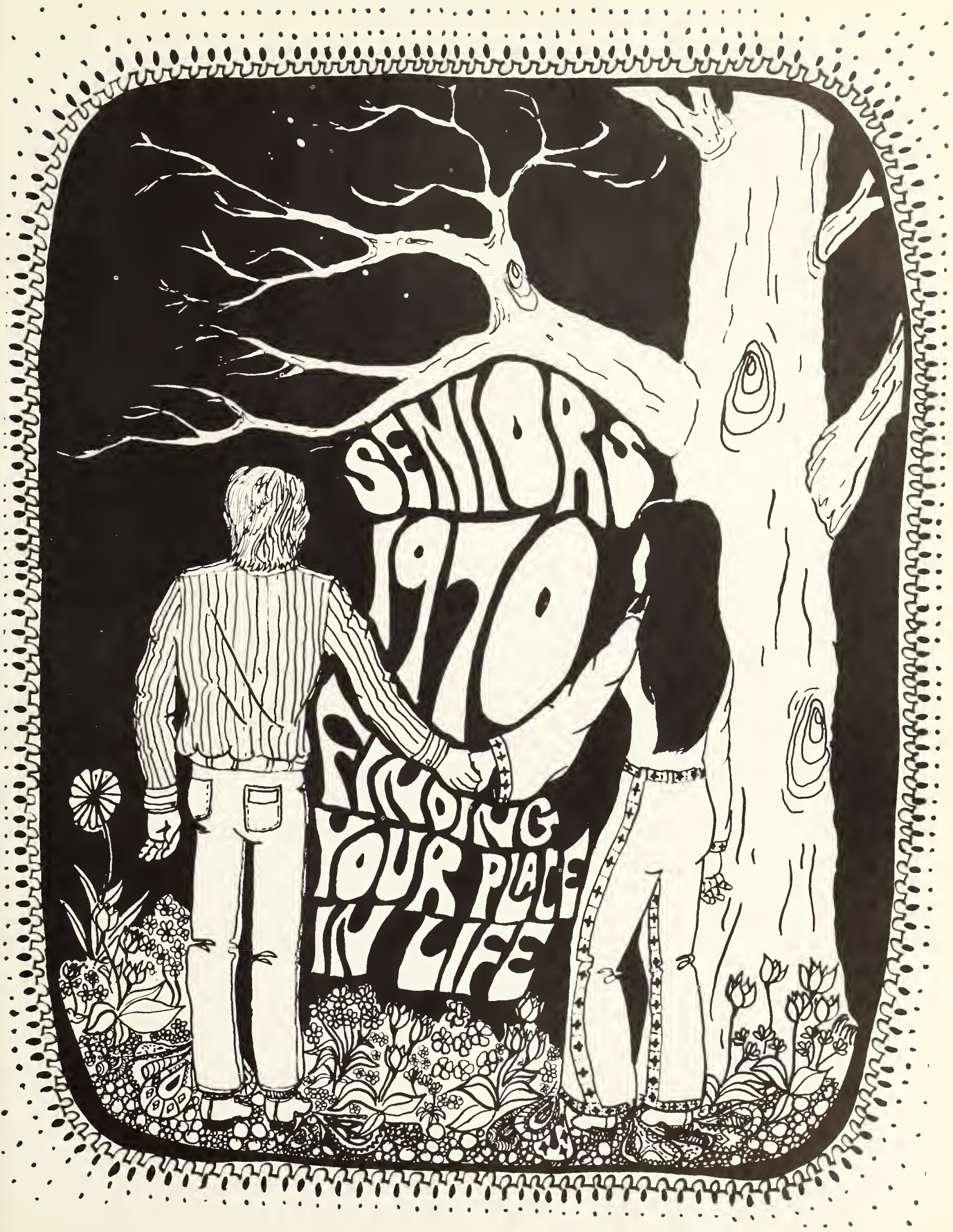
'Twas overturned in Moffat's field,

## *Kiss Me Kate*

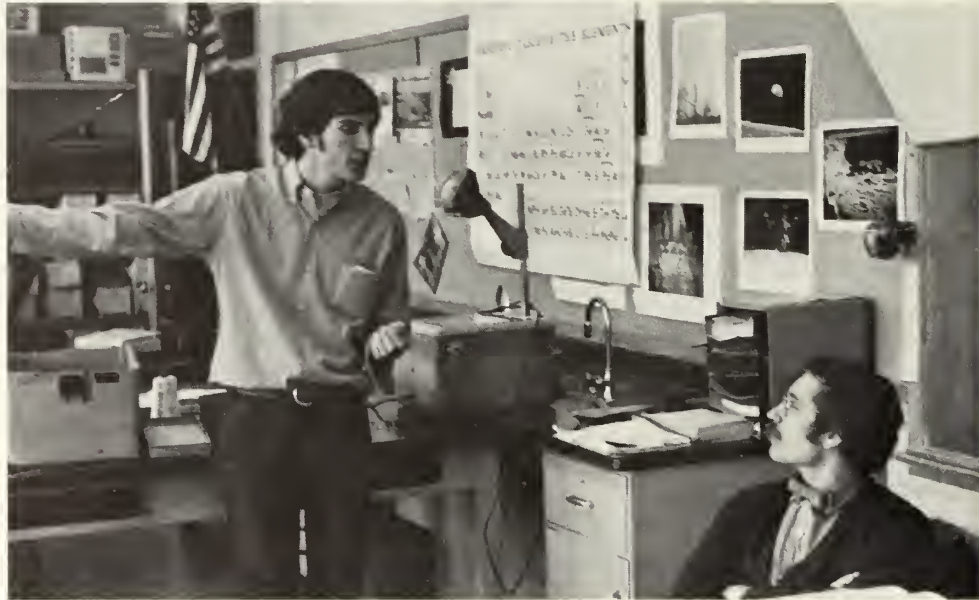

Miss Jean Jarvie is commended for a truly great stage presentation, as is Mr. Robert Morse and Mr. Wayne Killian for their indispensable contributions.







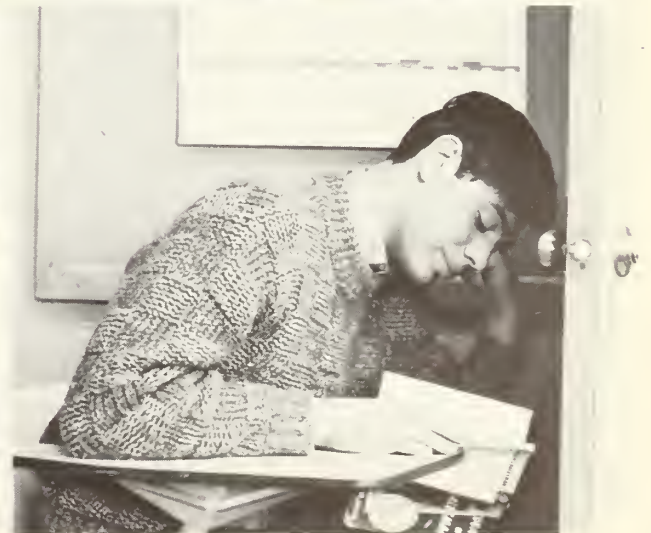




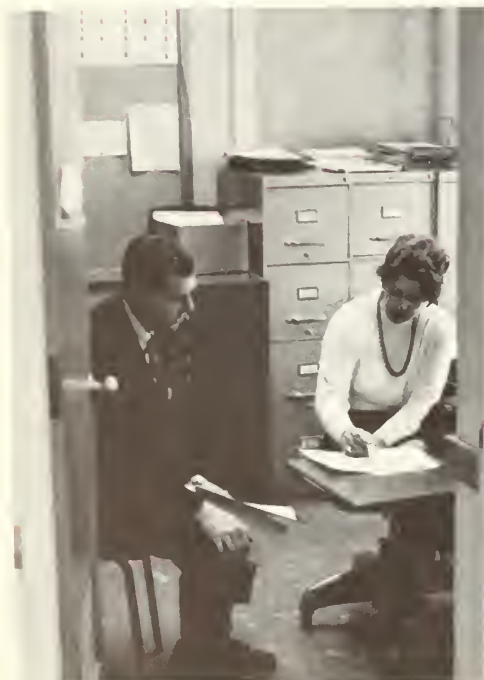
