Creeping without creaking!

If you ever have to creep up (or down) an old staircase without being heard, remember to walk as close to the wall as possible. Why? Because that's where the stairtreads are most strongly supported and therefore less likely to creak, giving your presence away. Disappearing message

This method of conveying secret information was voted "Trick of the Year" by the Congress delegates. Wet a sheet of white paper and press it against the bathroom mirror or similar hard, smooth,

Lay a dry piece of white paper on top of the wet one on the mirror. Write your secret message with a biro pen on this dry piece of paper. Press firmly on the pen.

Throw away the dry paper you wrote on. Your message should be impressed on the piece of wet

paper. Allow it to dry. The message will slowly disappear.

Now give the paper to your colleague, and tell him that when he needs to read your secret instruction, all he has to do is make the paper wet again and the message will reappear!

At the scene of the crime and other places where you need to do some quick measurements you don't need a ruler - you can use your own body. Just get to know the distances between parts of your body, as in the diagram below. Measure the distances on your body first, then try to memorise them. You'll be surprised how this trick will speed up your work!

What the suspect wrote You can find out what a suspect has written by slipping a piece of carbon paper cut to size under the third or fourth page of his



notebook, where it won't be noticed. When he's torn off his note, go to the notepad and tear off the sheet immediately below the carbon paper. There you'll find a carbon copy of the suspect's message just as plain as he's written it!

to communicate secretly . You don't have to worry about your enemies getting hold of the Follow these instructions and with this special coding equipment you and your friends will be able nessages - they won't be able to make head nor tail of them!

Before you use your Decoder, you need a piece of paper measuring 75mm square to write your number-coded message on. Carefully open out your Secret Agent Pass and tear off section 1. 1. Fold your piece of paper in four (first in half, then in half

again). 2. Find the corner of the folded paper that becomes the centre when the paper is unfolded.

3. Cut a small piece off the corner so that when the paper is unfolded, there is a small hole in the centre.

4. Pop up the four small tabs in the middle of the white circle on section 3 and place the paper over them so that the tabs come through the hole. 5. Secure the four corners of the paper in the coloured cut out slots 1, 2, 3 and 4.

6. Remove the Decoder Disc from section 1 and place on top of the paper, over the four tabs. Secure by pressing the tabs down. 7. Remove the Decoder from section 1 and put it through the slots next to the disc in section 3 so that the alphabet key shows through the windows.

TO WRITE YOUR SECRET MESSAGE

L Your message will be in four parts. To do the first part of your message, turn the disc until the pink band lines up with the pink slot.

Write your message in the normal way from left to right, line by line. Using the Decoder to see what each letter stands for in number code, write a number in each hole, starting with the top left hole and finishing with the bottom right hole. You should be able to read your message from left to right.

To write the next part of your message, turn the disc until the green band lines up with the green slot. Continue your number-coded message by writing in the holes as before.
Complete your secret message by turning the disc so that the red areas match up, then the purple areas.


HOW TO READ A SECRET MESSAGE

 Place the paper with the message on in the disc as before
 Line up the pink areas and read the message, using the Decoder to crack the code.


3. Match up the green, then red, then purple areas to read the rest of the message.


