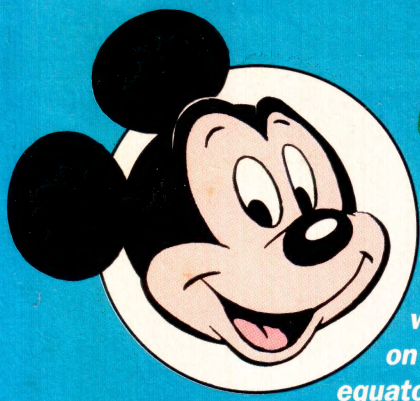

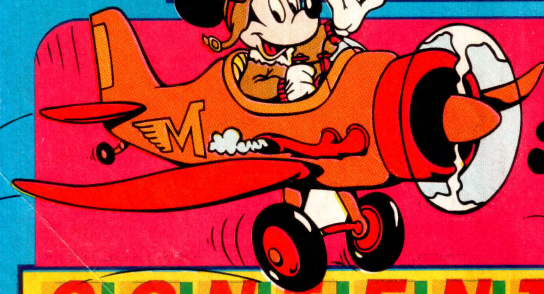
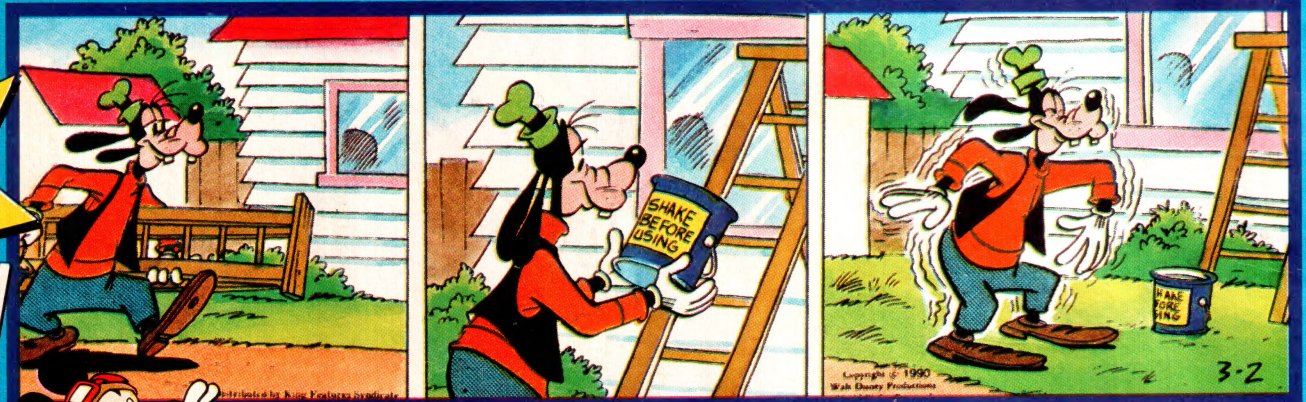




# Hi, everyone!

authorities try to get the children back, Jack is forced to take them on the run in an action-packed cross country car chase.



### Give Me A Break

## WHO MADE THAT AWFUL NOISE?

Now look at the message, or the picture you've drawn, through the coloured plastic. It's vanished! Why? Because the white paper and the message are seen as the same colour as the plastic.



Detectives can make use of this trick. Write a secret message with a thin pencil, then scribble all over it with a thick red or blue crayon. Now look at it through a red or blue piece of thin plastic and the coloured scribble will disappear, leaving the thinly pencilled message underneath clearly readable!

... Morty swirled the cards about again, having already noted a new one and keeping his little finger on it. This trick, performed quickly with your accomplice, looks very impressive to an audience!



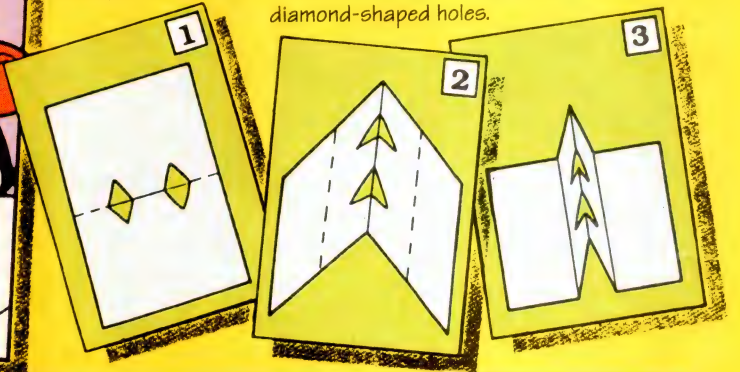
# CHIEF O'HARA CALLING ALL COPS!

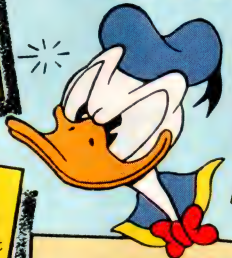


## SEVEN WAYS OF KILLING TIME!

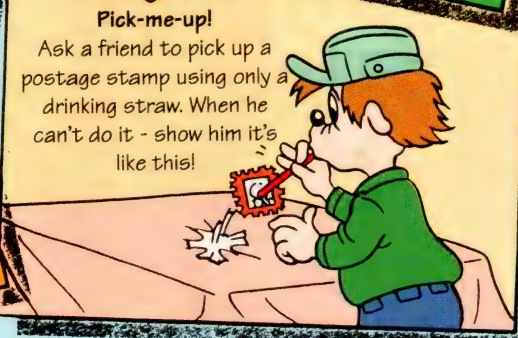
**Just like you ...**

Draw a map of your route from home to school. When you've got it right, draw a scale map of your area of town. Not so easy as it seems!

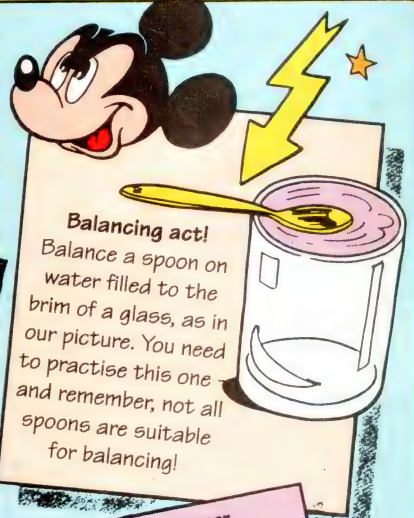
**Guess what?**

Ask a friend to pick up a postage stamp using only a drinking straw. When he can't do it - show him it's like this!

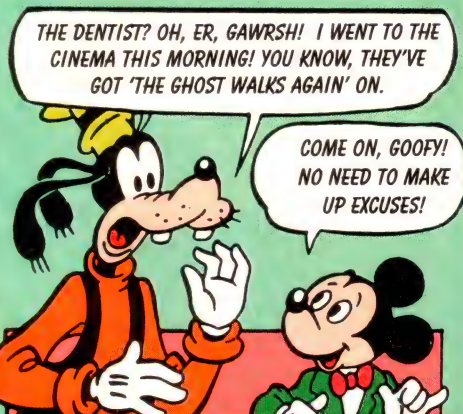
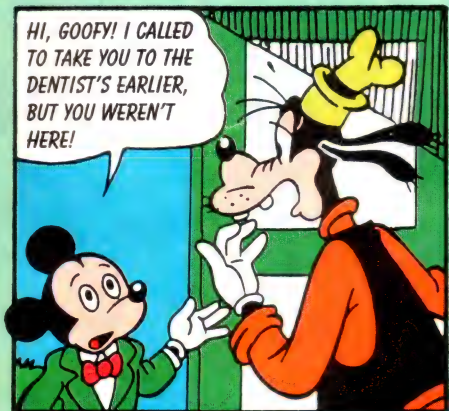
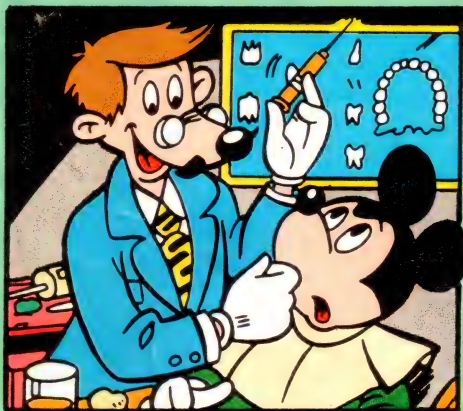
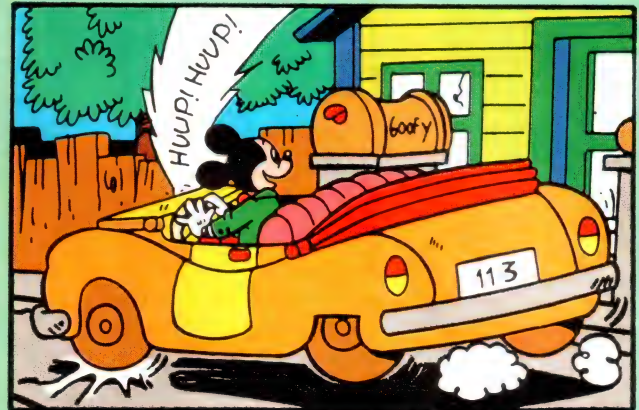
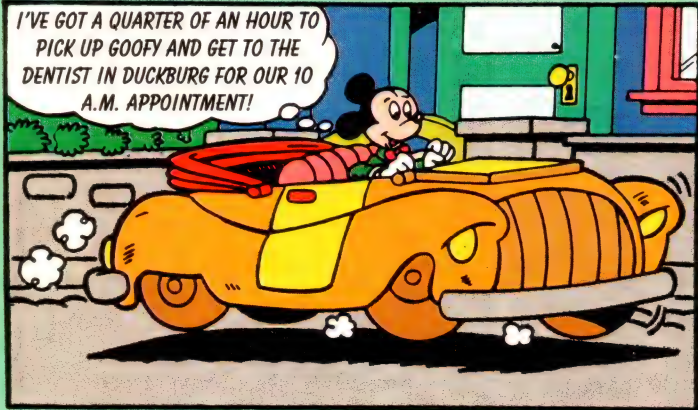
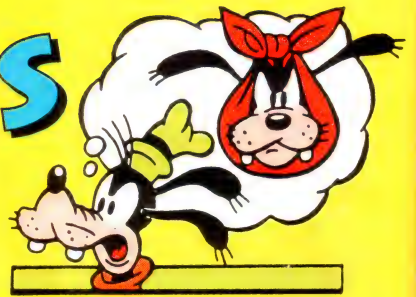


**Balancing act!**

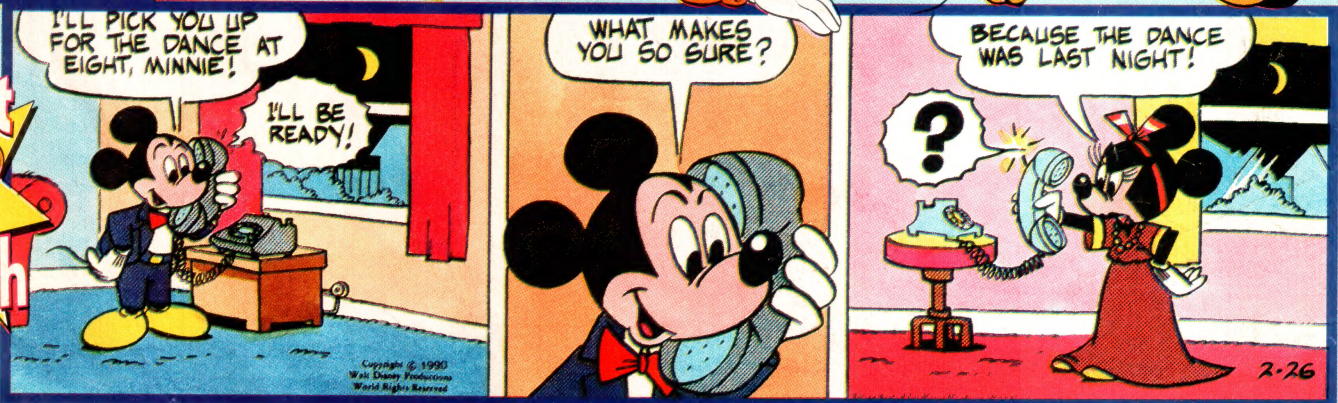
Here's a poem about a day out for Mickey and Donald, sent in by **Bleddyn Taylor** of Swansea:

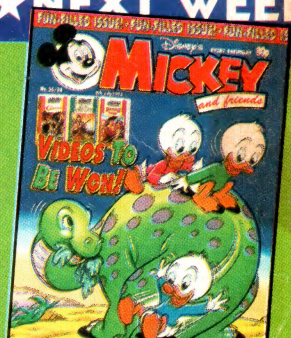
