VILLAGE OF BROOKLYN.**ABSTRACT****OF THE ACTS OF INCORPORATION.**

Boundaries.—That part of the town of Brooklyn which, by their act of incorporation, is now called the “VILLAGE OF BROOKLYN,” is comprised in the following limits, viz: “Beginning at the public landing south of Pierpont’s distillery, formerly the property of Philip Livingston, deceased, on the East river; thence running along the public road leading from said landing, to its intersection with Red Hook lane; thence along said Red Hook lane, to where it intersects the Jamaica turnpike road; thence a north-east course to the head of the Wallabought mill-pond; thence through the centre of the mill-pond, to the East river; and thence down the East river, to the place of beginning.

The freeholders and inhabitants are declared to be a body corporate, and “are by law capable of purchasing, holding, and conveying, any estate, real and personal, for the use of the said village, (provided the said estate be within the limits of the said village) and of erecting any public buildings for the use of the said village, and of raising money by tax for erecting such public buildings, purchasing such real or personal property, or making any necessary repairs or improvements, procuring fire-engines and other implements for extinguishing fires, and for making a reasonable compensation to the officers of the corporation.

Powers of the Board of Trustees.--The Trustees, or a major part of them, are empowered "to make, ordain, constitute, and publish, such prudential by-laws, rules, and regulations, as they from time to time shall deem meet and proper; and such in particular as relate to the public markets, streets, alleys, and highways, of the said village; to draining, filling up, levelling, paving, improving, and keeping in order the same; to slaughter-houses, houses of ill fame, and nuisances generally; relative to a village watch, and lighting the streets of the said village; relative to restraining geese, swine, or cattle of any kind; relative to the better improvement of their common lands; relative to the inspection of weights and measures, and assize of bread; relative to erecting and regulating hay-scales; relative to the licensing of public porters, cartmen, hackney coachmen, gauger, weigh-masters, measurers, inspectors of beef and pork, of wood, of staves and heading, and of lumber; relative to public wells, pumps, and reservoirs or cisterns of water, to be kept filled for the extinguishment of fires; relative to the number of taverns or inns to be licensed in said village; and relative to any thing whatsoever that may concern the public and good government of the said village; but no such by-laws shall extend to the regulating or fixing of the prices of any commodities, or articles of provision, except the article of bread, that may be offered for sale."

The Board of Trustees may order the pitching, paving, and altering of streets, and the cleansing and amending of vaults, and cause equitable assessments to be made on all houses and lots benefitted thereby, for the payment of such improvements.

The Board of Trustees are (on application in writing of the persons who are intended to be benefitted thereby, or whose property shall be assessed for the payment of the expense attending the same provided a *majority* of the persons interested do not remonstrate against it.) empowered to widen and alter streets already laid out in the village, and also to lay out and make streets and roads, as they shall think necessary. Lands and houses of any person may be taken, on making reasonable satisfaction for the same, in the manner prescribed. An assessment must be made of the value of the lands and buildings so taken, and also of the benefits to the owners of houses and lots in the village, and such assessments are obligatory on all persons concerned.

If a tax on any property in the village is unpaid, and the owner cannot be found, or has not personal property whereon to levy, then a sale of the said property can be made for the lowest term of years at which any person will take it and pay the tax and charges.

The village may be divided into pump and well districts, and pumps and wells may be made on application to the Trustees of a majority of the persons owning property to be benefitted thereby, or whose property will be assessed for the payment of the same.

Every white male inhabitant between the ages of 21 and 60, who possesses a personal estate of \$150 value, and is not exempted from serving on juries, shall be liable to serve as jurors within the village.

The Trustees of the village for the time being, are constituted a Board of Health, with power to appoint a Health Physician whose duty it is to visit and inspect all vessels coming to the wharves or landings, which are suspected to have on board any pestilential or infectious disease, and stores and places having any unsound or damaged goods, &c.

No vessel subject to the examination of the health officer of New-York, shall approach Brooklyn nearer than the Quarantine at Staten-Island, without a permit from him. Vessels having permits shall, in six hours after their arrival, deliver it to the President of the Board, under a penalty of fine and imprisonment.

Any vessel lying at or near any of the wharves or landing places, which the Board of Health believe to be dangerous to the health of the inhabitants, may be ordered off to the distance of at least 500 yards. If the order is disobeyed, the offending party may be fined and imprisoned.

Persons practising physic are required to report to the Board every patient under their charge, laboring under malignant or yellow fever.

Persons keeping boarding or lodging houses, shall, between the 1st June and 15th of November, within six hours after any sea-faring man or sojourner shall be sick in such house, make report in writing thereof to the Board. And masters of vessels and others may not, between the days aforesaid, remove any sick person from a vessel into the village, without obtaining a permit for that purpose from the Board of Health.

The Board have power (by the consent and advice of the inhabitants, in a public meeting held for

the purpose) to issue their proclamation prohibiting or regulating intercourse by land between the village and any other place.

All persons in the village, not being residents thereof, sick of a pestilential or infectious disease, and all things deemed infected, may be removed to the hospital of the village, or to any other place which the Board think fit.

Putrid and unsound beef, pork, fish, hides, or skins, may be destroyed by order of the Board.

ABSTRACT

OF THE CORPORATION LAWS OF THE VILLAGE OF BROOKLYN.

Guns, Pistols, Crackers, and Fireworks—not to be fired in the village, under the penalty of five dollars; and the master, guardian, or parent, made liable for the penalty—(military reviews are excepted.)

Horses or Carriages—not to be driven in the streets faster than five miles an hour—penalty five dollars; parents, guardians, masters, and mistresses, liable for the penalty.

Streets—not to be obstructed by goods, lumber, or carriages, longer than one hour, (except where building or repairing houses) nor holes dug, or heaps of dirt left in the streets, or horses shod therein, or sod dug therefrom, or from the open grounds, under the penalty of five dollars; nor fires made therein under the penalty of ten dollars.

Cartmen—to be licensed—no unlicensed person to drive for hire; cartmen refusing to employ their

cart, unless then engaged, forfeit three dollars—asking more than allowed by law, or guilty of fraud, forfeit five dollars and their license; any cart or wagon may be hired by the day, to remove dung, earth, &c.

Nuisances.—Any Trustee or Inspector, in the day time, may enter into, and inspect places, &c. and report the state of them to the Trustees, who may order them so altered as to prevent nuisances; no offensive water or substance to be kept on any place—butchers must wash and keep their slaughter houses free from noisome smells, and destroy their offals—no person may cast or leave a dead carcase in any street or lot—inspectors must report places where putrid beef, hides, &c. are kept, and Trustees may order them removed or destroyed—no tubs removed or sinks cleaned, except between ten o'clock at night and four in the morning; in all breaches of the foregoing laws, penalty ten dollars; and five dollars a day for not complying with a written order, &c.

Cleaning Streets.—No dirt or rubbish to be put in a paved street, and left there six hours, except where building or repairing. Occupants of houses fronting paved streets, must, on certain prescribed days, cause all rubbish on their lots to be laid in a pile in the streets, and must clean their gutters, and sweep all the dirt from the middle of the street in front of them to such pile, to be removed by the person appointed by the Trustees—penalty two dollars. Persons building must remove dirt and stones cast in any street, within twenty-four hours, unless licensed by the Trustees—penalty two dollars. No trade or business may be carried on in

the street, or on a side-walk—penalty two dollars; persons not cleaning the paved street, forfeit two dollars; and the person employed by the Trustees may do it, and recover double the value of the work, besides the penalty.

Bathing.—No person is permitted to bathe, between sun-rise and sunset, in any of the waters of the East River, between the foot of Jay-street and Pierpont's distillery, under forfeiture of five dollars.

Dirt.—No dirt or earth can be taken from any street or public highway—penalty five dollars.

Weights and Measures.—All weights and measures are required to be sealed by the Village Sealer.
