PREFACE.

To the traveler, the apparent height of Mt. Blanc could scarce be more deceptive than the vast magnitude of the labor which has been exacted in the preparation of this little book. For nearly two years we have been, as it was said of John Foster, "hard at it, at the rate of a sentence a week." The labor grew in magnitude, and when we hoped it done, it was really but just begun. Had space permitted, it would have been our pleasure to have even greatly enlarged upon part first and part second, and to have added another part, giving the occasions which led the authors to write some of the hymns now dear to all Christians.

With the faultiness of the many indexes which we have carefully examined, it would be presumptuous to expect that no imperfections would be found in this, yet it may, with truth, be asserted, that with arduous labor and much care we have sought the greatest accuracy.

But few changes have been made in the names of writers of hymns, and these only where the strongest authorities sided against the work of the General Synod's Committee.

We acknowledge the valuable aid of Rev. Edwin M. Long's "Illustrated History of Hymns and their Authors;" Hezekiah Butterworth's "Story of the Hymns;" the service of Mr. Guyon Buehler, of Gettysburg, in alphabetically arranging "the first lines of each verse, after the first verse," and the suggestions and kind interest of Rev. M. Sheeleigh, and Rev. W. C. Cattell, D.D., President of Lafayette College.

Addison, Joseph, born at Milston, England, in 1672; the son of an Episcopal clergyman; his poems to King William secured him a pension of \$1,500 a year; this gave him time and leisure for study and travel, which he used to his great improvement, and to the rendering of his name familiar to every scholar; when dying, he sent for his step-son, the Earl of Warwick, saying: "I have sent for you that you may see how a Christian can die;" died at Holland House, June 17, 1719; Ch. Eng. Hys. 68, 73, 75, 81, 479.

Alexander, Rev. J. Addison, D.D., born 1809, died 1860; U. S.; Pres.; Hy. 295; translated 130 from Gerhardt.

Alford, Dean Henry, born 1810, died 1871; Eng.; Ch. Eng. Author of "The Greek Testament with Notes." His tomb is inscribed, by his request, "The Inn of a Traveler on his way to Jerusalem." Hys. 308, 552.

Auber, Miss Harriet, born 1773, died 1862; Eng.; Ch. Eng. Hy. 220.

Aquinas, Thomas, born 1227, died 1274; Italy; R. Catholic. Hy. 268.

Bacon, Rev. Leonard, D.D., born 1802; U. S.; Congregationalist. Hy. 214.

Bakewell, Rev. John, Eng.; born 1721, died 1819; Methodist. Hy. 150.

Barbould, Mrs. Anna L., Eng.; born 1744, died 1825; Unitarian. Hys. 279, 426, 481, 549.

Barton, Bernard, Eng.; born 1784, died 1849; known as the "Quaker Poet;" during a clerkship of some forty years in a bank he composed several "volumes of verse." Hy. 390.

Bathurst, Rev. William H., Eng.; born 1796; Ch. Eng.; Hy. 357.

- Baxter*, Rev. Richard, born at Rowton, Shropshire, Eng., Nov. 12, 1615; after a life of persecution, he died in peace, Dec. 8, 1691; Presbyterian. Hy. 374.
- Beddome*, Rev. Benjamin, born in Eng. in 1717; his entire ministerial life of fifty two years was spent as pastor of the Baptist church at Bourton, Eng.; died in 1795. Hys. 83, 200, 421.
- Bernard*, St. of *Clair Vaux* ("The Bright Valley"), born 1091, died 1153; he was called "the Mellifluous Doctor." Peter the Venerable said he "had rather pass his life with Bernard than enjoy all the kingdoms of the world;" Luther pronounced him "the best monk that ever lived." Hys. 176, 177, 267.
- Berridge*, Rev. John, born 1716, died 1793; a co-temporary of Whitefield and Wesley; while these latter wrought without, Berridge evangelized within the Church of England; so great were the crowds that flocked to hear him that often he had to resort to the open fields, and spoke to ten and fifteen thousand at a time. - Bethune*, Rev. George W., D.D., born in New York in 1805, died in Florence, Italy, in 1862; Reformed Dutch Church. Hy. 466.

- Borthwick*, Miss Jane (1858); translator of 380th hymn, by Gerhardt.
- Bowring*, Sir John, LL.D., born 1792, died 1872; Eng.; Unitarian. Hys. 62, 115, 133, 217.
- Bridges*, Matthew (1860); Eng.; Catholic. Hy. 412.
- Brown*, Mrs. Phœbe H., born at Canaan, N. Y., May 1, 1773, died 1861; Congregational Ch. Hy. 395.
- Browne*, Rev. Simon, born 1680, died 1732; during the closing years of his life he had a malady that led him to imagine that he could not think, and yet at the same time, as Toplady remarks, "Instead of having no soul, he wrote and reasoned, and prayed as if he had two;" Eng.; Congregational. Hys. 45, 181.
- Bruce*, Michael, born 1746, died 1767; the same age, when he died, of Henry Kirk White (twenty-one years); there was much resemblance between them; Scotland; Presbyterian. Hy. 227.
- Bryant*, William Cullen, born 1797, died 1878; U. S.; Unitarian. Hy. 386.
- Bulfinch*, Rev. Stephen G., born 1809, died 1870; U. S.; Unitarian. Hy. 40.

- Burder*, Rev. George, author of 8 vols. of "Village Sermons;" one of the founders of the Religious Tract Society of London; Congregationalist; born 1752, died 1832. Hys. 53, 183.
- Campbell*, Thomas, died 1844. Robert, died 1868; Scotland; Presbyterian; R. Catholic. Hys. 472, 506.
- Cary*, Miss Phœbe, born in the Miami Valley, Ohio, Sept. 4, 1824; she and her sister Alice wrote much pleasing verse; aided Rev. Charles F. Deems, D.D., in compiling a volume of hymns for the Church of the Strangers in New York; she was a Universalist; died at Newport during the summer of 1871. Hy. 468.
- Caswall*, Rev. Edward, born 1814, Eng.; left the Established Church in 1847 and united with the R. Catholic. Hy. 233.
- Carwood*, Rev. John, born 1775, died 1832; Eng.; Ch. of Eng. Hys. 229, 592.
- Cennick*, Rev. John, born at Reading, Eng., in 1717; in 1739 he began teaching and preaching among the colliers at Kingswood, and subsequently accompanied Wesley and Whitfield in their preaching tours; in 1745 he became associated with the Moravians; died in London in 1755. Hys. 425, 444.
- Chandler*, Rev. John, born 1806; has translated many hymns from the Latin; Eng.; Ch. Eng. Hy. 487.
- Cleaveland*, B., born 1790; U. S.; Baptist. Hy. 398.

- Collyer*, Rev. William B., D.D., born 1782, died 1854; Miller says: "For half a century Dr. Collyer was one of the most popular Dissenting ministers in London;" his last text: "How will thou do in the swellings of Jordan?" Hy. 284.
- Conder*, Rev. Josiah, born 1789, died 1855; Eng.; Congregationalist. Hy. 59.
- Cotterill*, Rev. Thomas, born 1779, died 1823; Eng.; Ch. Eng. Hys. 33, 37, 179.
- Cotton*, Nathaniel, born 1707, died 1788; Eng.; Ch. Eng. Hy. 462.
- Cowper*, Rev. William, the son of a clergyman; born at Berkhamstead, Eng., Nov. 15, 1731; during much of his life he was under the cloud of insanity; after removing to Olney, in 1767, he became intimately associated with Rev. John Newton, and to meet the needs of the prayer-meeting, Cowper and Newton began the writing of hymns, which, after six Years, in 1776, were sent forth to the world, bearing the title of the "Olney Hymn Book;" his biography is entertaining and eventful; died in 1800. Doane, Rev. George W., D.D., born 1799; in 1832 he was consecrated Bishop of the Protestant Episcopal Church of New Jersey; died 1859. Hys. 106, 531.

Doddridge, Rev. Philip, D.D., born in London, June 26, 1702; widely known by his books: "Family Expositor," and "The Rise and Progress of Religion in the Soul;" the latter is among the most useful books of the Nineteenth Century; his mother taught him Scripture history by the aid of some Dutch tiles by the side of the old fire-place; subsequently left an orphan; entered the ministry at the age of twenty; in his last sickness, when advised to try the warmer climate of Lisbon for the winter of 1751, he says: "I can as well go to heaven from Lisbon as from my own study at Northampton;" he was but two weeks in Lisbon when his happy spirit took its departure; he was a Congregationalist. Dwight, Rev. Timothy, D.D., born in Massachusetts in 1752; his mother was a daughter of the celebrated Jonathan Edwards; in 1795 he became President of Yale College; published his "Theology" in five vols. in 1809; died in 1817. Hy. 202.

Edmeston, James, a London architect, but a great lover of sacred song, of which he wrote many; born 1791, died 1867; Ch. Eng. Hy. 520.

Elliott, Charlotte, born 1789, died Sept. 22, 1871; she was much engaged in writing hymns and sacred poetry; the hymn "Just as I am" would alone have rendered her name memorable; Eng.; Ch. Eng. Hys. 146, 311.

- Enfield*, Rev. William, D.D., born 1741, died 1797; Eng.; Unitarian. Hy. 117.
- Evans*, Rev. Jonathan, born 1749, died 1809; Eng.; Congregationalist. Hy. 138.
- Faber*, Rev. Frederick W., born 1815, died 1863; Eng.; author of 150 hymns; became a Roman Catholic in 1846; his hymns are well reputed among Protestants. Hys. 60, 502.
- Fawcett*, Rev. John, D.D., born at Lidget Green, Eng., Jan. 6, 1739; he was a convert of Whitfield's preaching; in May, 1765, was ordained as pastor of the Baptist church at Wainsgate; in 1782 he published a volume containing 166 of his own hymns; his little book upon "Anger" so pleased George III. that he offered to grant him any request; this was declined, until one day the son of one of Fawcett's most intimate friends was sentenced to death for forgery, when Fawcett interceded and secured his pardon; died 1817. - Fitch*, Rev. Eleazer T., D.D., born 1790, died 1871. Hy. 601.
- Flowerdew*, Alice, born 1759, died 1830; Eng.; Baptist. Hy. 550.

- Gerhardt*, Rev. Paul, born in Saxony in 1606; next to Luther his hymns excel in grandeur and force; he wrote one hundred and twenty-three hymns; Duke Christian gave him a pension because of his unjust deposition from the Nicholas Church of Berlin; died in June, 1676; was a Lutheran. Hys. 82, 130, 380, 401.
- Gibbons*, Rev. Thomas, D.D., was an intimate friend of Whitefield, and wrote the "Memoir of Dr. Watts;" was pastor of a Congregational church for forty-two years; Eng.; born 1720, died 1785. Hys. 216, 427.
- Gilbert*, Mrs. Ann, born 1782, died 1866; Eng.; Congregationalist. Hy. 559.
- Gill*, Thomas H., born 1819; Eng.; Ch. Eng. Hy. 535.
- Grant*, Sir Robert, Scotchman, born 1785, died 1838; author of "Sacred Poems;" English Governor of Bombay; Ch. Eng. Hys. 5, 226, 237.
- Grigg*, Rev. Joseph, born in 1728, and when but ten years old wrote the well-known hymn, "Jesus, and shall it ever be;" subsequently while engaged at work as a mechanic he composed nineteen hymns, which were published in pamphlet form; finally he became a Presbyterian minister and preached in Silver street, London; after a useful life he died at Walthamstow, near London, in 1768. - Guyon*, Jeanne Marie Bouviers de la Motte, born near Paris, April 13, 1648; her life was full of imprisonments and suffering, yet she bore them all with Christian fortitude and pa-

- tience; died in banishment in June, 1717; her poems, hymns and other writings fill five octavo volumes; most of her hymns now in use were translated by Cowper. Hy. 349.
- Hammond*, Rev. William, Eng.; died 1783; a Calvinistic-Methodist preacher, and afterward a Moravian. Hys. 12, 26.
- Hart*, Rev. Joseph, born in London, Eng., in 1712; after writing a book entitled, "The Unreasonableness of Religion," he became deeply convicted of sin, and was converted in 1757; in 1760 he was settled over a large congregation in the "Old Wooden Meeting-house," in Jewin street, London; died May 24, 1768. Hys. 172, 244, 274, 324, 325.
- Hastings*, Thomas, born 1784, died 1872; widely known as a musician; U. S.; Presbyterian. Hys. 205, 241, 290, 300, 385, 433, 556.

- Harweis*, Rev. Thomas, author of "Carmina Christo;" Eng.; Ch. Eng.; born 1732, died 1820. Hy. 378.

Reginald, D.D., born at Malpas, Eng., April 21, 1783; Bishop of Calcutta; his life was marked by early piety; being very benevolent, he once, when a boy, gave away all the money which was given him for spending money at boarding school; after three brief years among the heathen, having committed to his hands, as Bishop, more than the whole of India, he sank under excessive work, April 2, 1826. "A monument was erected by his friends in Ceylon, in memory of his labors in this island as on the Peninsula." Ch. Eng. Hys. 170, 221, 246, 478, 554, 507.
- Heginbotham*, Rev. Ottiwell, born 1744, died 1768; Eng.; Congregationalist. Hy. 405.
- Hill*, Rev. Rowland, born at Hawkston, Eng., Aug. 23, 1744; when a student at Cambridge he was much scorned and ridiculed by the students; the conduct of the students toward him eventually caused six different bishops to refuse him orders as deacon; through Dr. Wills, an aged bishop, he was finally ordained in the Church of England; Whitefield and Berridge were his personal friends, and in early life encouraged him during his trials in college; he became a very noted preacher, full of life, and spoke with aptness of illustration and great directness; he often spoke to ten and occasionally to twenty thousand people at one time, in 1783 Surrey Chapel was built for him in one of the worst quarters of London; died April 19, 1833. - Kelly*, Rev. Thomas, one of Ireland's most prolific hymn-writers; the son of Judge Kelly, born 1769; preached in an Independent church in Dublin for sixty-three years; he erected quite a number of churches at his own expense; was a good linguist and musician, as well as a most popular preacher; died in 1855. - Key*, Francis Scott, the author of the well-known "Star-Spangled Banner;" a poet, lawyer, orator and a Christian; born in Maryland, in 1779, and died in Washington in 1843; Episcopalian. Hy. 537.

- Langford*, Rev. John, died 1790; Eng.; Baptist. Hy. 168.

Lyte, Rev. Henry Francis, born at Kelso, Scotland, June 1, 1793; educated at Trinity College, Dublin, where he struggled hard with poverty; in 1815 entered the ministry in the Established Church of England, but says of himself that he was worldly-minded and a stranger to experimental religion until three years later, when called to the death-bed of a neighboring minister, who, as death was approaching, felt "unpardoned and unprepared to die;" both set to searching for the way of life and peace, and both found peace in repentance and faith in Christ; after this, says Lyte, "I began to study my Bible and to preach in another manner than I had previously done;" the remainder of his life was spent in earnest labor for Christ; died 1847. Medley, Rev. Samuel, born 1738, died 1799; when young was in the British navy; after several battles, was severely wounded; while at his grandfather's house, receiving surgical treatment, he was brought under the influence of religion, and led to Christ by the reading of one of Dr. Watt's sermons; he left the navy and entered the ministry, preaching for twenty-seven years in the First Baptist Church of Liverpool. Monsell, Rev. J. S. B., born 1811, died 1875; Ireland; Ch. Eng. Hy. 587.

Montgomery, James, the son of a Moravian preacher, Rev. John Montgomery, born at Irvine, Scotland, Nov. 4, 1771; when he was but a mere boy he was left in care of friends, his parents having gone as missionaries to a foreign field; at

- sixteen he sought a situation for himself, and after various struggles hired as a grocer's clerk; after a year he went to London to sell the manuscript of a volume of his poems; failing in this, he hired again as clerk in a book store; finally he found employment in the printing office of the *Sheffield Register*, a prominent weekly paper; in 1794 the editor, Mr. Joseph Gales, fearing persecution for the offense given by some articles of a political nature, fled from England, leaving Montgomery his successor; the title of the paper was changed to the *Iris*, and Montgomery continued its editor for thirty-one years; twice he was imprisoned for political articles; it was then he wrote his "Prison Amusements;" in 1833 he received a royal pension of \$1,000 a year; not until his forty-third year did he rest fully in Christ for salvation; before this he seems to have been much tossed about, and as a result of his experience, he wrote the 212th hymn; his hymns have been received with great heartiness, and many are incorporated into the "Book of Worship;" he died the 30th of April, 1854; his ecclesiastical connection was with the Moravian church. William A., D.D., a descendant of the family of revolutionary fame, born 1796, died April 8, 1877; in 1823 he was associate Rector of St. James church, Lancaster, Pa.; afterwards made Principal of St. Paul's College; then founder and Rector of St. Luke's Hospital, New York City. - Neal*, Rev. John M., born 1818, died 1866; the author of a large number of hymns; not a few for children; Eng.; Ch. Eng. Hys. 486, 491, 492, 528, 557.
- Needham*, Rev. John, a Baptist clergyman, born 1710, died 1768; Eng. Hys. 18, 293.
- Nelson*, Rev. David, born 1793, died 1844; Presbyterian; U. S. Hy. 474.
- Nevin*, Rev. Edwin H., D.D., born 1814; Reformed church; U. S. Hy. 396.
- Newton*, Rev. James, a Baptist clergyman of England, born 1733, died 1790. Hy. 256.
- Newton*, Rev. John, the son of a sea captain, born in London, July 24, 1725; his earlier years were spent upon the ocean on board a man-of-war; here he gave himself up to profligacy and vice, seeking to believe the rankest infidelity; desertion was followed by his being publicly whipped and degraded

from midshipman to the lowest position on shipboard; when returning from service on a slave trader, where he had suffered greatly, he found a copy of Stanhope's *Thomas a Kempis*; this he read to pass away the time, as he was being returned home through the influence of his father, and while perusing its pages, the thought came to him: "What if these things should be true;" the fearful storm in which the ship was nearly lost the succeeding night, and the death of the friend who was washed overboard led him to serious thought; conviction, repentance, and conversion followed; his pious mother had died when he was seven years old; but God at last answered her prayers and brought her son to preach Christ; among the converts of his ministry are Claudius Buchanan, the missionary, the author of "The Star in the East;" Thomas Scott, the renowned commentator, who was unconverted at his ordination and says himself that he was "totally ignorant of the Gospel and its saving power;" Newton was also instrumental in bringing Wilberforce to Christ—for this he prayed fourteen years; how far reaching the influence of a single individual, either for good or evil; his ecclesiastical connection was with the Church of England; Newton and Cowper wrote the *Olney Hymns*; died in 1807. Ray, D.D., born in Rhode Island in 1808; the hymn in our book, "My faith looks up to Thee," was written by him in New York in Dec., 1830, just after he left Yale College; he says: "I recollect I wrote it with very tender emotion, and ended the last line with tears;" he is a Congregationalist; formerly served a prominent church in Albany, N. Y., but more recently one in Newark, N. J. Hy. 364. Translated the 268th hymn, written by Thomas Aquinas.

Parr, Harriet (1856); Eng. Hy. 529.

Peabody, Rev. William B. O., D.D., born 1799, died 1847; U. S.; Unitarian. Hy. 551.

Pearce, John (1766). Hy. 240.

Perronett, Rev. Edward, the son of an English clergyman of the old school; in early life Edward left the Established

Church and became Methodist, being an intimate friend of Rev. Charles Wesley, in whose diary he is familiarly called "Ned"; subsequently he was one of the preachers laboring under the patronage of the Countess of Huntingdon, preaching with marked success at Canterbury, Norwich and other portions of England; he was an opponent of the union of church and state, and his anonymous poem, "The Mitre," awakened great hostility and displeased the Countess so that he severed his connection with her society; and became the pastor of a small congregation of Dissenters at Canterbury, where he died in January, 1792; his well-known coronation hymn first appeared in the "Gospel Magazine," in 1780; his dying words were: "Glory to God in the height of his divinity; glory to God in the depth of his humanity; glory to God in his all-sufficiency, and into his hands I commend my spirit." Raffles, Rev. Thomas, D.D., an eloquent preacher of the Congregational church; wrote many of his hymns for the use of his own congregation in Liverpool, Eng.; born 1788, died 1863. Hys. 141, 573.

Reed, Rev. Andrew, D.D., born 1787, died 1862; Eng.; Congregationalist. Hys. 187, 259, 399, 473.

Robinson, Rev. Robert; when but a lad was led to Christ through the preaching of Whitefield; being endowed with more than ordinary talent, when he had entered upon the work of the ministry he moved his large audiences, in the Tabernacle, to enthusiasm by his powerful preaching; but he was of unstable mind, going from one thing to another until finally he became irreligious and wicked; one day, while traveling in a stage-coach, a lady, not knowing who he was, called his attention to his hymn "(Come thou fount of every blessing)" in a book she was reading; he sought to change the conversation, but the lady had found great comfort in the hymn, and spoke of it again and again until he burst into tears, saying: "Madam, I am the unhappy man that wrote that hymn, and I would give a thousand worlds, if they were mine, to enjoy the feelings I then had;" found dead in bed June 9, 1790, having died as he had often wished, "softly, suddenly and alone;" Eng.; Baptist. Hy. 16.

Ryland, Rev. John, D.D., an eminent Baptist minister, born in England, in 1753, died 1825; he received the degree of Doctor of Divinity from Brown University, State of Rhode Island; like Doddridge, his earliest Bible knowledge was imparted by his pious mother, who impressed her words by the aid of the pictures on the Dutch tiles which ornamented the fire-place; In 1794, elected to the Presidency of the Baptist College at Bristol, and also accepted the pastorate of

Broadmead Chapel, and in this two-fold capacity he was laboring at the time of his death. Hy. 114.

Schmolke, Rev. Benjamin, born 1672, died 1737; Germany; Lutheran. Hy. 346.

Schmucker, Rev. Samuel D.D., the son of Rev. John George Schmucker, D.D., was born at Hagerstown, Md., Feb. 28, 1799; graduated from the University of Pennsylvania, at Philadelphia, in 1817; studied theology at Princeton, and after graduating taught the classical department of the Academy at York, Pa.; licensed at Lancaster, in June, 1820, by the Synod of Pennsylvania; in 1825 he was appointed on the Committee of the General Synod to prepare a new hymn book; the work was completed and the book published in May, 1828; the book was in unrivaled use for twenty years, and passed through about seventy editions; his first pastorate was at New Market, Va.; he was the author of forty-two different publications, and to his pen and heart the Lutheran church in this country is indebted for a prominence which it would otherwise not yet have attained; in the summer of 1826 he resigned his charge at New Market and removed to Gettysburg, Pa., to assume the theological chair of the Seminary then being located there; the rest of his life he was most intimately associated with the literary and theological institutions of the church; in 1865 he tendered his resignation of the Chair of Dogmatic Theology; he was permitted to retire from the wearisome routine of instruction, while the Trustees conferred the honor of a professorship Emeritus upon him; he died suddenly at his home in Gettysburg, July 26, 1873; no century has more than a few men so earnest, so pious, so useful as was Rev. Samuel S. Schmucker, D.D. For a fuller account of his useful life, see *The Quarterly Review*, Vol. IV, No. I, page 1. Hy. 201.

Shirley, Rev. Walter, born of a noble family, in England, in 1725; a first cousin of Lady Huntingdon and a frequent

- visitor at her London residence, where he became acquainted with Wesley and Whitefield; spent most of his life at Loughrea, Ireland; died 1786; Ch. Eng. Hys. 394, 594.
- Shrubsole*, Rev. William, born 1759, died 1829; Eng.; Congregationalist. Hy. 513.
- Smith*, Rev. Samuel, F., D.D., born 1809; U. S.; Baptist. Hys. 533, 538.
- Steele*, Anne, the daughter of Rev. William Steele, pastor of the Baptist church at Boughton, Eng.; she was born in 1716, died 1778; she wrote 144 hymns and 34 psalms; when a young lady, being affianced to a Mr. Elscourt, a young man of promise, her prospects in life were much changed by his very sudden death by drowning, shortly before the time fixed for their marriage; an accident in early life rendered her an invalid and a sufferer all her life; from the time of her father's death, in 1769, to the time of her death, she was confined to her room; she was a member of the Baptist church. Samuel, D.D., born at Exeter, Eng., 1727; he succeeded his father as pastor of the Baptist church in Little Wild street London, continuing for thirty-seven years, until the time of his death; in style his composition was much like Addison's; received his degree of Doctor of Divinity from Kings College in 1763; was greatly esteemed by his sovereign, George III; he wrote 39 hymns; died 1795. Toplady, Rev. Augustus M., born in England in 1740; converted by the preaching of an unlettered layman, in a barn, into which Toplady happened to stroll one day while on a visit to Ireland; this occurred in August, 1756; his character is well illustrated by his own declaration, when he calls himself "the happiest man in the world;" Long says: "The influence of that barn discourse has already been felt for a century, and is now echoing in all parts of the world; for through it was converted the lad who gave to the church "Rock of Ages;" it has been translated and is now being sung in almost every known tongue;" died 1778; Ch. Turner, Rev. Daniel; Baptist; Eng.; born 1710, died 1798. Hys. 307, 359.

Watts, Rev. Isaac, D.D.; this well-known hymn-writer was born in Southampton, Eng., July 17, 1674; he was the son of an earnest Christian father, a deacon of the Congregational church, and the principal of a flourishing boarding school, which attracted students from America and the West Indies; his early years were marked by great erudition; when just twenty-four years of age Isaac preached his first sermon, and the same year, 1698, was chosen assistant pastor of the Independent church in Mark Lane, London; four years later he became its sole pastor, and although he suffered greatly from feeble health, yet with the aid of an assistant he served this congregation for nearly fifty years; from 1712 his home was with the family of Sir Thomas Abney, at Theobalds; here he enjoyed quiet and rest, writing much in addition to his pastoral duties; a fine monument was erected some years ago by the citizens of his native town; he lived and died a bachelor; at one time he tendered his hand to Miss Elizabeth Singer, she replied that she "admired the jewel, but could not admire the casket;" the writing of the hymn, "How vain are all things here below," is ascribed to this circumstance by Dr. Belcher; he wrote 697 hymns; his hymns are more used than those of any other writer in all the hymn books in general use, except in the Methodist churches, where Wesley's hymns outnumber Watts' nearly four-fold; died Nov. 25, 1748, in his 75th year. Wesley, Rev. Charles, the third son of Rev. Samuel Wesley, Sr.; born Dec. 18, 1708; from 1738 to 1788, Charles, together with his brother, John Wesley, published thirty-nine different books of hymns and poetry; Charles Wesley is said to have written the astonishing number of seven thousand hymns; he began hymn-making at the age of 29, and continued until the time of his death; while Watts wrote in retirement his hymns of quiet, peaceful, Christian faith, Wesley wrote amid the excitement of great religious awakening; his hymns breathe of fire and fight—they are the religious battle-songs; his beautiful hymn, “Jesus lover of my soul,” was written in a spring-house, where Charles and John Wesley and Richard Pilmore had taken refuge from the fury of a mob; after striking a light with a flint-stone, Charles, taking a piece of lead, hammered it to a point and, under these inspiring circumstances wrote this hymn, now so dear to all Christians; died 1788. Wesley, Rev. Samuel, Sr., rector of the Episcopal church at Epworth, Eng.; father of Charles Wesley; born 1662, died 1735. Hy. 235.

- Winkworth*, Catherine; Eng.; Ch. Eng.; born 1829. Translated hymn 561.
- Woodford*, Rev. James R. (1852); Eng.; Ch. Eng. Hy. 303.
- Wordsworth*, Bishop Christopher; Eng.; Ch. Eng.; born 1807. Hy. 41.
- Xavier*, Francis, born at Navarre, Spain, 1506; King John III sent him as missionary to the Portuguese Colonies in the East; baptised ten thousand natives in a single month at Goa; going to Japan, he established a mission which flourished for more than a century, and until the final expulsion of Christianity from the Empire; Roman Catholic; died 1552. Hy. 332.
- Young*, Andrew; Scotland; Presbyterian; born 1810. Hy. 196.
- Zinzendorf*, Count N. L., born at Dresden, Germany, May, 1700; composed about 200 hymns; his name is intimately connected with the rise of the Moravian church; in 1732, Zinzendorf and his co-laborers commenced the mission work which has so vigorously prosecuted ever since; in 1741 he visited America, preaching at Germantown and Bethlehem, Pa.; he published 108 different books; died at Herrnhut, May 9, 1760.
