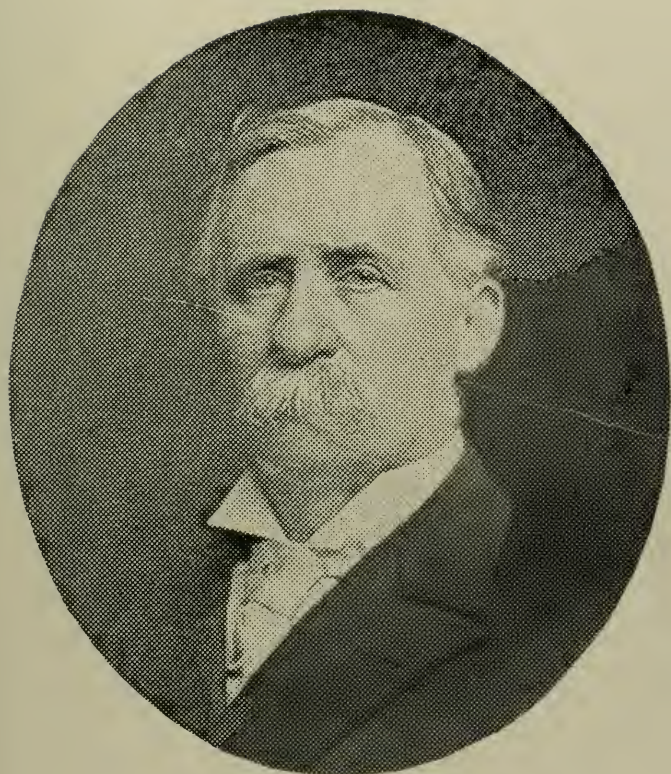

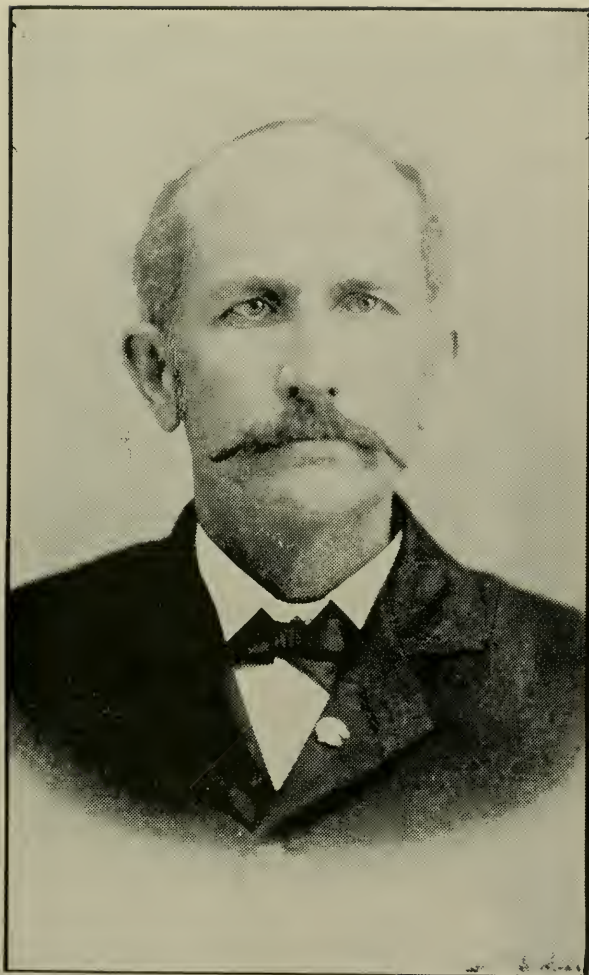

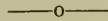

APPENDIX I.

EDUCATION—REPORT OF BOARD OF

FATHERS AND BRETHREN:—

The Board of Education (Educational Society) of the Cumberland Presbyterian Church, in submitting this, their Twenty-Seventh Annual Report, do first of all gratefully acknowledge the presence of the Divine Hand which has guided the Church, her Boards and Agencies during the year, and do also hereby express our thanks to the entire membership of the Church for their patience, co-operation and, under existing circumstances, liberality to the cause of education. Not one word of complaint or criticism has been heard from any quarter during the year.

BOARD MEETINGS.

The Board has held three meetings since the last Annual Report was submitted. At the first meeting after the adjournment of the General Assembly in May last, the instructions of that body to the Board of Education were duly noted, and the necessary steps were taken to meet the requirements of the same.

SCHOOL ASSISTED.

In looking over the field the Board found that Bethel College, located at McKenzie, Tenn., a school under the control of the Synod of West Tennessee, was the only institution at that time in the Cumberland Presbyterian Church, that was not dominated by the unionists. The members of the Board of Trustees of said institution, who remained loyal to the Church, took the necessary steps for the continuation of the school, and with that end in view, elected the faculty. The former president of the institution, who was occupying the college buildings at the time he left the Cumberland Presbyterian Church and went into the Presbyterian Church U. S. A., refused to

give up the buildings and declared his purpose to hold the same for said Presbyterian Church. On this account the Board of Trustees were compelled to rent and furnish other buildings in which to run the school, or abandon the work until by legal process the property could be taken from the usurping Church and the former president ejected from the buildings. The buildings were rented and furnished at a cost of \$821.23.

The Board of Education, realizing the importance of the school to the entire Church, and seeing the financial pressure on the Board of Trustees of said institution, aided the same to the amount of \$800.

In view of this aid to Bethel College, a special call was made to the Synod of West Tennessee for large offerings to the cause of education. The Synod responded with offerings which amounted to \$615.91. In addition to this amount, friends of the College, who live beyond the bounds of the Synod, gave \$130 to the Board for Bethel College. Thus it will be seen that the school has been aided by the Synod of West Tennessee and a few friends out side of the Synod to the amount of \$745.91.

PRESBYTERIAL REPRESENTATIVES.

The Board of Education fully appreciates the importance of having a representative in each presbytery, who shall specially care for the interest of the Board as recommended by the last General Assembly. Owing to the imperfect directory of the Church until late in the year it was impossible for the Board to secure such representatives in the various presbyteries.

THE INCORPORATED BOARD.

The General Assembly instructed your present Board of Education to take such steps as were necessary to have such members of the "Incorporated Board" as declared their allegiance to the Presbyterian Church in the United State of America, removed from said Board, and the names of those now recognized as the members of the Board of Education, incorporated in their stead. The Board made official demand upon said "Incorporated Board" as instructed by the last Assembly, but the demand was ignored. The Board has under advisement the future steps necessary to carry out, in full, the recommendations of the General Assembly.

THE NUMBER OF PROBATIONERS FOR THE MINISTRY INCREASING.

Two years ago the whole Church was sad. About that time almost seventy-five per cent of our licentiates and candidates for the ministry withdrew from our communion. Those were days of unleave-

ened bread. While we have not been able to get the exact number who have offered themselves for the ministry this year, enough has been learned to show quite an increase in the number over that of last year. The only explanation we offer for this increase is, it is God's answer to the earnest prayers of the Church. A large per cent of those offering themselves for the ministry come from that class of the membership which in the history of the Cumberland Presbyterian Church have proven to be the very best material from which to make ministers.

FINANCIAL REPORT.

We are pleased to report that the offerings for the cause of Education this year are more than tenfold greater than they were for the previous year. Eleven Synods, thirty-eight Presbyteries, one hundred and eight Churches, and sixty individuals and societies have sent offerings to the Board since the last Annual Report, May 1, 1907. It has been the policy of the Board to curtail expenses. The members and officers of the Board have served without pay, only their traveling expenses have been paid, and some of the members have even declined to receive that.

We present the following suggestions and recommendations for your consideration:

1. That the Board of Education and all others Boards and

Agencies of the Church, which are under the direction of the General Assembly, should be controlled by the Assembly. We therefore request that you outline the policy of the Board of Education for the next twelve months.

2. Just now the Church is in need of a school for the training of her probationers for the ministry. We suggest that steps should be taken to open a school in which the English Bible, Distinctive Doctrines, Confession of Faith and History of the Cumberland Presbyterian Church are taught. Such a school, we believe, would meet present demands.

3. We believe the suggestion made by the last General Assembly a good one, and request that you direct each presbytery to appoint a suitable person to represent the interest of the Board of Education in the bounds of their respective presbyteries and that the Stated Clerks of presbyteries be directed to report the name of the party appointed to the Corresponding Secretary of the Board.

4. Possibly some of our presbyteries, under the great pressure for ordained ministers, have exercised undue haste in ordaining men to this high position. It might be well for you to advise the presbyteries to be cautious in their ordinations, and that only such be inducted into the ministry as give evidence of having been called to the work by the Holy Spirit and are duly qualified to teach.

5. That the General Assembly make such recommendations relative to collections, the time for collections, a day of prayer and the delivery of sermons upon a call to the ministry as shall impress these important matters upon the mind and heart of the whole Church.

REPORT OF THE BOARD OF MINISTERIAL RELIEF.

To the General Assembly of the Cumberland Presbyterian Church,
Corsicana, Texas.—

In behalf of the cause committed to your Board of Ministerial Relief, the following brief outline of facts is most respectfully submitted.

Our Pensioners.

Since civil governments bestow medals of honor, promotions in rank or office, and, for the disabled, pensions, as a mark of appreciation for services rendered to the government, so the Church of Jesus Christ, in recognition of the fact that faithful and honorable service deserves by having earned some recompense, devises and distributes pensions in this life to some at least of those to whom "the Lord, the righteous Judge," and "the Chief Shepherd" shall come with decorations of a crown of life, a crown of righteousness, and a crown of glory when He shall say to them, "Well done, good and faithful servant, enter thou into the joy of thy Lord."

Gone Before.

But of these the Revs. J. J. Armor, B. K. Taylor, and A. W. Saye have entered into rest. "And I heard a voice from Heaven saying unto me, Write, Blessed are the dead which die in the Lord from henceforth; Yea, saith the Spirit, that they may rest from their labors; and their works do follow them." Several others are greatly enfeebled by age and sickness.

One Unfaithful.

As in the Apostolic Band, exalted and honored by the Master, one proved to be unworthy, so the patience of the brethren, who recommended him to the care of the Board, has been sorely tried by the acts of Rev. H. J. Ray contradictory of his former and even very recent professions of devotion to the Cumberland Presbyterian Church. We do not know the peculiar temptations which beset him; but we do know the way was made possible for him to escape from the power and delusions of tempter. Two articles in his name in the former Cumberland Presbyterian paper at Nashville, Tenn., are so filled with sophistry and evasions of truth as to make him an object of pity. But all this is far more than offset by the

Devotion to Principles so Sacred

to our cause and the willingness to suffer all things earthly on

the part of the remaining eighteen, so that it becomes comparatively easy to ignore one repudiator and all the annoyance and humiliation which his acts can give us.

Tardiness and Lack of Information.

The Secretary of the Board hereby freely confesses to tardiness in presenting our cause last fall to the Church through the Cumberland Presbyterian Banner and which lack it is feared has left our income less than it would otherwise have been. Certainly, whatever the cause the offerings have not been equal to the needs of those dependent upon this fund.

The Informal Conference.

Held at Nashville, Tenn., by representatives and friends of the various enterprises of the Church has resulted in considerable discussion, some singular misunderstandings of the object and the plan proposed, but also in an increase of offerings.

The Thornton Home.

On October 3, 1907, a formal legal demand was made upon "the former Secretary and Treasurer of this Board," "Mr. S. B. Sansom and all whom it may concern" for "all money, mortgages, notes, books, bonds, papers, the possession and control of the property known as the Thornton Home, and all other property, documents or assets, including the Endowment Fund, which has been contributed for the use and to be under the control of the Board of Ministerial Relief of the Cumberland Presbyterian Church."

In January, 1908, the Thornton Home was destroyed by fire and from indications it seemed to be the purpose of those who had abandoned the Cumberland Presbyterian Church, by having renounced the communion of this church, in having acknowledged the jurisdiction of the Presbyterian Church, U. S. A., and as their plans were developing, to collect the six thousand and three hundred dollars (\$6,300) of insurance money and invest it in a new location and deed the property to the Presbyterian Church, U. S. A.

And, since no reply has been made to the demand of the Board in October last for possession of our Church property, and since all of that property was still being illegally and wrongfully withheld from our Board of Ministerial Relief, Therefore, in February, 1908, a formal legal notice was served on the insurance company through their agent in Evansville, Indiana, to restrain the company from paying that insurance money to any person or organization except to the Board of Ministerial Relief of the Cumberland Presbyterian

Church or to their duly accredited representative. At first the Insurance company declined to pay that fund to either side to the controversy until the civil courts shall have decided which claimant is legally entitled to that money.

Then notice was received from the insurance company that the money would be paid to those now holding the policies, unless legal process shall be instituted before April 2, 1908, to restrain that company from such payment.

Therefore, on March 10, 1908, Dr. W. G. Ralston, the President of the Board, (or if need be, Rev. J. H. Milholland, Secretary or J. M. Wyckoff, Treasurer of said Board) was empowered to employ legal counsel and institute proceedings before the civil court at once for the possession, control and use of all funds and property which from any source or any person or persons may have at any time been committed to this Board in accordance with the aim, intentions and plans of this Board by appointment and direction of the General Assembly of the Cumberland Presbyterian Church.

Accordingly, through Judge William Reister the legal proceedings were instituted and the case filed and awaits a hearing.

There seems to be a phase of incongruity in that the former officials of this Board should go before the civil court with a plea upbraiding us for a failure to manage that Home or to distribute the funds of the church for the benefit of those entitled to a place in the Home, while they themselves usurp the management of the home and collect and use the interest on our endowment fund and the rentals as well, of other property belonging under the care of the Board.

Terms of Service and Election of Members of the Board.

According to precedent, the members of the Board were divided into the following three groups:

Dr. W. G. Ralston, J. H. Milholland and J. M. Wyckoff to serve three years; E. M. Johnson, G. W. May and Dr. J. L. Goodknight to serve two years; and J. A. Hill, R. D. Miller and W. M. Freeze to serve one year; and each one of any group to serve until his successor is elected.

If it has been the custom for the General Assembly to nominate persons to fill these vacancies this is the time for such nomination so that the Board may elect during the annual June meeting; and if it is for the Board to nominate and the Assembly to elect, then the nominations are Rev. A. C. Biddle of Kentucky, to succeed Rev. W. M. Freeze; Judge William Reister to succeed Rev. R. D. Miller; and Rev. J. A. Hill to succeed himself.

This Finances and Bonds of Officers.

By an oversight the report last included the offerings received up to the time of the meeting of the General Assembly instead of closing with January as required, and as the Corresponding Secretary failed to place an itemized statement of offerings from congregations, the report this year goes back to February 1, 1907, and closes with January 31, 1908.

Of the expenses nearly fifty dollars had to be used, not for fees, but for the incident cost of preparing and filing the case in the civil court..

The decision of the Board is that the bonds for five thousand dollars each, which the General Assembly required of the Treasurer

and the Corresponding Secretary, shall be taken in a trust company, the expense of which will be from \$35 to \$45 annually.

And for our pensions we have needed and now need more than double the amount of funds received by the Board; and it is not extravagant to affirm that five times the offerings which have been sent to us for this sacred cause would be a credit to our entire Church and bring to us the blessings promised to those who give rather than to those who receive.

Cannot this General Assembly devise ways and means for all of these needs?

REPORT OF THE BOARD OF MISSIONS.

To the General Assembly of the Cumberland Presbyterian Church, at Corsicana, Texas, May, 1908.

As President of the Board of Missions, I deem it proper to make some observations on the work of the year. The state of the Church is known to all, in so far as its struggles with the Unionists are concerned.

These matters have effected both the Board in its plans, and in the efficiency of the plans, or want of plans under which we have worked. The litigation and the adverse claims to the property of the congregation has diverted the attention of the members from the general enterprises of the Church, to the more immediate and the more pressing personal local and individual needs of the Church.

Where we have a congregation, that were self sustaining before the disturbance, now these are divided, perhaps lost possession and control of the Church house, and so many of their members gone into the union as to leave them unable, not only unable to aid the Church at large, but unable to have the regular ministration of the word. Many we have found in this condition, so that they constitute the proper Mission fields themselves, rather than a support for the ordinary places of Missions.

We have made no attempt to resume the attention to the Foreign Missionary field, but instead and as a substitute for that we have given encouragement and aid to Gam Sing Quah, on the Pacific coast and with the co-operation and consent of our Woman's Board. We have secured for Brother Gam the especial efforts of that Board to care for him and direct his efforts.

We look forward to the action of the Woman's Board to give us a full account of their hopes, their aspirations as to the best way to enlarge his usefulness to the Church, to his own race and the world at large.

The accounts of the Secretary and of the Treasurer will give a detail of our collections and expenditures.

The city of Memphis, Tennessee, has appeared to us to be a place well worthy of special attention and the expenditure of some means. We have co-operated with that Presbytery in all we have done.

We learn that the Mission Church there has not the most favorable physical environments, and while a goodly number of the Church there are not entirely satisfied with their relationship toward the Union, our expectation of them coming to us would be much brighter if we could assure them of a permanent church home.

We have given aid to Brother J. D. Lewis to help establish our church in Birmingham, Alabama, which was quite successful.

The disbursements for Memphis, Tennessee, have been made through Brother A. S. Johnson.

We have sent G. W. Crutcher to the extreme northwest of Texas, to try and organize the scattered remnants in that section, and he has lately been called to his final rest, leaving his task incomplete in Amorilla Presbytery.

Brother E. M. Johnson has acted for us in Indiana and in conjunction with his Synod.

Brother C. M. Zwingle acted for us at Columbus, Mississippi, for a short while, and at McCurtain, Indian Territory, now Oklahoma, we had Brother J. S. Lish to go from place to place, especially among the white people there, and keep them alive to their Christian duty which work we expect to do much good when we can send regular Missionary workers there to assist and thoroughly organize the work.

We have also aided Dr. W. D. Marlow at Colorado Springs, and Brother H. G. Nicholson at Pueblo, Colorado, trying to save the small but zealous bands we have there as a nucleus for future work.

Our own just criticism is that our work has been crude and unmethodical. Without fear of justly incurring the imputation or presumption, we state that the money received has been well expended.

The collections have been comparatively small, so small as to perhaps suggest criticism to the casual observer, but on behalf of the Church as we know it, we believe that the critic would be disarmed were he to take up and consider each Congregation with its trials and difficulties and its existing burdens.

Brother Collins of our Board lives so far away from the domicile of the Board that we have not had the pleasure of his presence, nor the aid of his counsel.

Brother Frank Y. Hall, who was our treasurer, finished his earthly labors and went to his reward in September, 1907, beloved, regretted and missed by us all.

We selected Brother H. C. Jaquish, of Marshall, Texas, as his successor, a man in every way worthy, and we hope it will meet with your approval.

**PUBLICATION, REPORT OF BOARD OF
TO THE SEVENTY-EIGHTH GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE CUM-
BERLAND PRESBYTERIAN CHURCH.**

REVEREN FATHERS AND BROTHERS:—

Your Board of Publication, which was duly and legally elected by the 77th General Assembly which convened at Dickson, Tenn., in May, 1907, was duly organized on June 10th, 1907, by the election of J. H. Zarecor of Nashville, Tenn., as president, and R. L. Baskette of Nashville, Tenn., as secretary and treasurer.

The instructions of the last General Assembly were carefully considered and the Board of Publication elected J. H. Zarecor, Hons. Jos. H. Fussell, S. A. Cunningham, Rev. A. N. Eshman and R. L. Baskette as a legal committee and empowered them to employ legal counsel and take all necessary steps, legal and otherwise, to secure full possession of all property and assets of this Board.

Acting under this authority, our legal committee secured the services of W. C. Caldwell of Trenton, Tenn., as chief counsel, and Lamb, Carter & Lamb of Fayetteville, Tenn., Nolen & Slemmons of Nashville, Tenn., and Felix W. Moore of Union City, Tenn., as associate counsel.

A bill in chancery was prepared asking for full possession of the property and assets of the Board of Publication and same was filed before Hon. John Allison, Chancellor, at Nashville on Dec. 5th, 1907. The defendants filed an answer and demurrer to our bill and suit is now pending.

In order to meet expenses necessarily incurred, the Board of Publication issued a call for funds through Cumberland Presbyterian Banner and by circular letter. Below we give a financial showing up to April 3rd, 1908.

We closed contract with T. A. Havron for the printing and mailing out of 12,000 circular letters calling for funds and the liberal and prompt response is a testimony of the wisdom of such a course.

The Sunday School literature is now being published and circulated by a committee on publication appointed by Synod of Tennessee at its annual session at Lewisburg, Tenn., in October, 1906. This committee appointed a sub-committee composed of R. L. Baskette, chairman; Frank Slēmmons and J. H. Zarecor, with full authority to act. This sub-committee secured the services of Rev. J. R. Goodpasture as editor and business manager.

The high character and excellence of this literature need no comment here, while your Board of Publication is authorized to take into its hands at any time the management of this business, we deem it best to leave this important branch of our general denominational work in its present hands until we enter into full possession of our publishing plant at Nashville.

The following is an exhibit of affairs of the Committee on Publication of Tennessee Synod of the Cumberland Presbyterian Church, which is furnished us for publication by its chairman, R. L. Baskette, who audited and checked the accounts of Rev. J. R. Goodpasture, editor, on April 1, 1908. Period covered by this exhibit is from January 1, 1907, to April 1, 1908.

TRUSTEES, REPORT OF BOARD OF

Bowling Green, Ky., April 7th, 1908.

To the General Assembly of the Cumberland Presbyterian Church at Corsicana, Texas. Brethern:—

All the newly elected members of the Board of Trustees of the General Assembly of the Cumberland Presbyterian Church met in Bowling Green, Kentucky, on June 24, 1907, and qualified by taking the oath of office, which was administered by the County Court Clerk of Warren County, Kentucky. After this the Board was called to order by Dr. J. F. Hendricks, and the meeting was opened with prayer by Rev. S. H. Eshman.

The Board then proceeded to organize by electing the following named members to serve as its officers for the ensuing year, Dr. T. W. Stone, President; E. W. Beck, Vice-President; Henry H. Denhardt, Secretary; Dr. W. E. Lundy, Treasurer. Dr. J. F. Hendricks, M. R. Graham and T. F. Lewis, Members of the Executive Committee.

This Board having been instructed by the General Assembly to take steps to secure from J. M. Hubbert, the former Treasurer of the General Assembly, the funds in his possession, belonging to the Cumberland Presbyterian Church; the funds, property and all assets collected for the Church Erection Fund of the Cumberland Presbyterian Church, which are now in the hands of the former members of this Church, and to secure and get possession of all other funds of Boards, which might properly come before the Board, and wherever legal action has not been provided for by the General Assembly

the Secretary was, therefore instructed to communicate with the legal committee, and request said committee to advise this Board as to how and when to proceed to carry into effect the instructions of the General Assembly relative to these matters.

The Secretary communicated with Mr. J. H. Zarecor of the legal committee, and the following correspondence was had, which is self-explanatory, and makes clear why this Board has not been more aggressive in carrying into effect the instructions of the General Assembly.

Bowling Green, Ky., 7-3, 1907.

Mr. J. H. Zarecor, Nashville, Tenn.

Dear Sir: I desire to advise you that the Board of Trustees appointed at the recent meeting of the General Assembly of the Cumberland Presbyterian Church met in this city on June 24th, and organized by electing Dr. T. W. Stone, Chairman, and the undersigned Secretary. Among other matters brought before the Board, was the fact that there is now in the hands of J. M. Hubbert, the former treasurer of the Cumberland Presbyterian Church, the sum of \$4515.78, and that the Church Erection Fund in 1906, as shown by the records of the Decatur Assembly showed a balance in that fund of \$71255.27. Both these sums of money we believe rightfully belong to the Cumberland Presbyterian Church, and I was instructed by the Board of Trustees to request you to take steps at once to recover these sums of money from the ones now holding same. I enclose copy of extracts from the minutes of the Dickson Assembly bearing on these matters.

I will thank you to give this matter your attention, and to advise me if the Board can be of any assistance in the matter.

The following letter was received in reply:

Nashville, Tenn., 7-30, 1907.

Mr. H. H. Denhardt, Bowling Green, Ky.

Dear Sir: Your favor of the 3rd inst. reached my office in due time but on account of matters that have been pressing me since that date, and especially on account of the fact that I desired to answer definitely whether I should be in position to take charge of the case for the Board of Trustees, my answer has been delayed. I now feel that I can take the matter up for the Board and suggest as a first step to be taken would be to formally notify Mr. Hubbert of the demand made by your Board. I therefore request that you send me a verified copy of the resolution passed by the Board at its meeting June 24th, touching this matter. I can use the certified copy of the Assembly's action which you sent me in appointing this Board

and when I get copy of your resolution, I will at once notify Mr. Hubbert of our demand.

You are aware of the fact that we are to have the final argument and shortly thereafter the Court's opinion in what we know here as the Fayetteville case, on the 25th of this month, when Mr. Gaut and Judge Caldwell are expected to present final argument in that case before the Chancellor who has agreed to come to Nashville for convenience. Our side is very hopeful of the results of this lawsuit and we think that we will get a written opinion from the Chancellor and believe that it will give the Cumberland Presbyterians an uplift throughout the Church. If we are not disappointed in what the Chancellor may decide, we believe that this decision will aid us very greatly in adjusting matters all over the Church. On this account our policy has been to await this decision before beginning any new suits. I should be glad for you and such other Cumberland Presbyterians as may be able to come, to be present and hear the argument of Mr. Gaut and Judge Caldwell on the 25th. If the date is changed I will notify you.

Early in the year 1907, Mr. Z. P. Smith, an earnest and devout member of the Cumberland Presbyterian Church, died in Simpson County, Kentucky. He bequeathed to the Cumberland Presbyterian Church a tract of land lying in Simpson County, Kentucky, containing about two hundred and forty-seven acres, and valued at about \$5,000. Sometime previous to his death he had leased the land for a period of five years, and by the terms of the lease, agreed to keep the house, barns, fences in repair, and to furnish half of the stock and seed necessary to make the crops. The Board, of course, was not in a position to carry out its part of this contract, and on account of the condition of the rental contract, it was hard to find a buyer. The party to whom the farm was leased asked \$1500.00 to surrender the contract, but offered to give \$3,500.00 and take the place. After a careful investigation of the matter, several members of the Board having visited the farm, and made reports to the Board concerning the condition of the land and improvements, it was decided to sell the place to the party who held the lease, and to accept \$3,500.00 in payment therefore. The deed was made on December 21, 1907, and the property conveyed to George W. Wilson. \$1,490.00 was paid in cash, \$10.00 being retained by the purchaser to pay for a survey of the land, and four notes, each for \$500.00 were given for the remainder. The notes bear 6 per cent interest and one becomes due each year for four succeeding years, the last becoming due on December 21, 1911.

The Board respectfully requests the approval of its action in this matter.

For the benefit of all concerned a copy of the charter under which the Board of Trustees of the General Assembly is acting is submitted to the General Assembly as part of the report of said Board.

An act to amend the charter of Cumberland College, and to incorporate the Trustees of the General Assembly of the Cumberland Presbyterian Church.

Whereas, "An act to amend an act, entitled, an act to amend the charter of Cumberland College, and for other purposes," approved February the 16th, 1841, was passed for the benefit of "Cumberland college association" and the General Assembly of the Cumberland Presbyterian Church, by which act the entire control and management of said college was given up to the General Assembly; and whereas, by said act the board of trustees of said college and general assembly were made; and whereas, said general assembly has dissolved its connection with said college; and whereas, the board of trustees of said college and said general assembly are two separate and distinct bodies, although acting under the same charter, and whereas, much difficulty has been experienced by said board of said general assembly by reason of deficiencies in their said charter in collecting donations, bequests, and other charities given to said church. Therefore,

1. Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Kentucky, That George D. McLean, Will H. Miller, Silas N. Davis,

T. J. Duncan, M. Dudley, Thos. Hunter, John P. Rascoe, H. W. Champion, R. H. Lander, Reuben O'Hara, Wm. H. Barnett, J. H. Miller and their successors, shall be and they are hereby declared and constituted a body corporate and politic, by the name and style of the Trustees of the General Assembly of the Cumberland Presbyterian Church, and by that name and style shall sue and be sued, plead and be impleaded, and possess all the powers and rights of a corporate body, and shall continue in office until the annual session of said General Assembly in 1856, and until their successors are duly elected and qualified according to law.

2. That the board of trustees of the General Assembly of said church shall have full power and authority to receive in trust for the said general assembly any donation, bequest, or other charities, which may be or have been hitherto made to said church, or to said general assembly, or to said board for the use and benefit of said church or assembly, for educational, religious or charitable purposes, under the direction of the said general assembly.

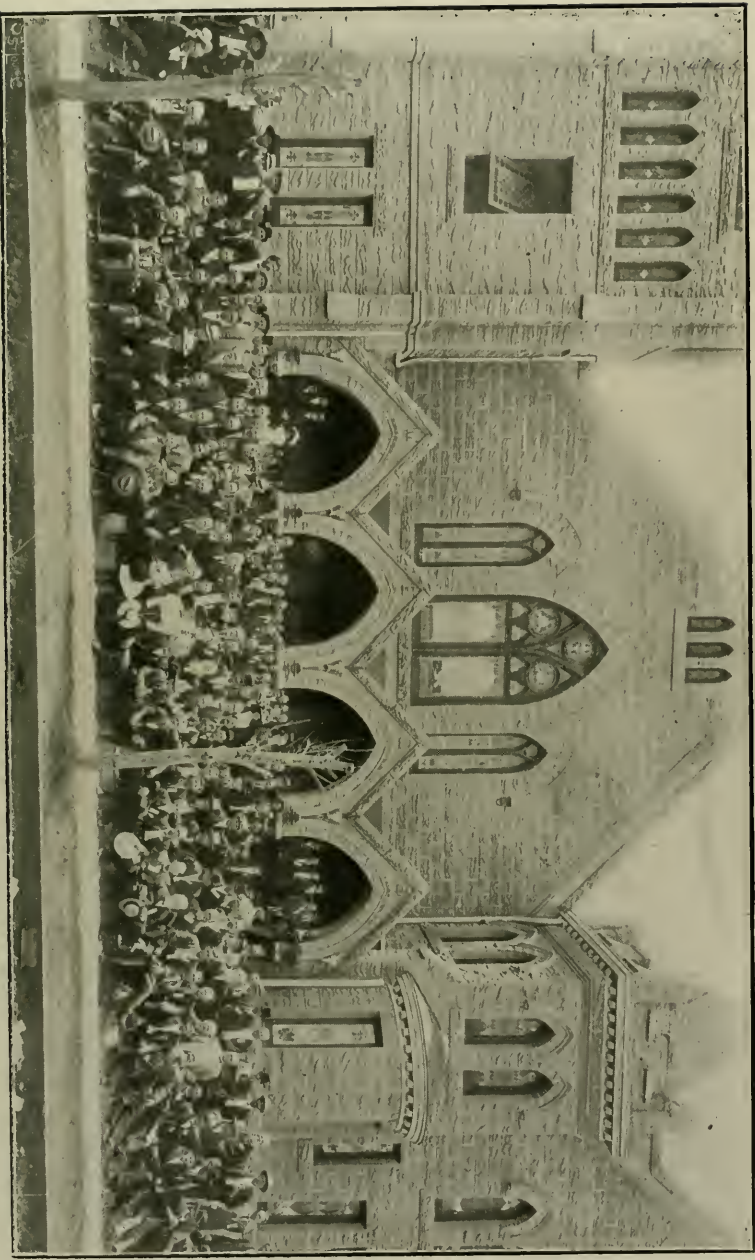
3. That all moneys and other estates, of every description, which may be vested in said board of trustees, by virtue of their office, shall forever be held in trust for the use of the Cumberland Presbyterian Church, the interest alone of which shall be devoted to religious, charitable or educational purposes, as the said assembly may direct.

4. That said general assembly shall be empowered to elect her said trustees at her regular and stated meetings, any five of whom assembled at a regular meeting, or by a constitutional call, shall constitute a quorum to do business.

5. That said board of trustees may appoint an executive committee, to consist of the secretary, treasurer, and three other members, to manage the fiscal concerns of said board, and three of whom shall constitute a quorum to do business.

6. That said board of trustees shall meet annually on the fourth Monday in June, in each year, at which time they shall elect a president, vice-president, secretary, and treasurer, who shall continue in office until their successors are elected and qualified; the said board shall also meet semi-annually, or oftener, on its own adjournments, or by a call of the president, to transact business; to make all necessary arrangements for carrying into effect the views of said general assembly; to manage and invest the funds collected, or any other property or estate; and said board shall report to said assembly of said church at her regular meetings.

7. That the president of said board shall preside in all the meetings of the same, call special meetings at the request of any two members; and the vice-president, in the absence of the president,

shall preside and possess similar powers, and in the absence of both president and vice-president, then said board may choose a president pro tem., who shall preside for the time being.

8. That the secretary shall keep a full and fair record of all the proceedings of said board, and carry on all its correspondence.

9. That the treasurer shall take charge and dispose of all funds according to the directions of said board, and report when called on.

10. That the treasurer shall give bond, with approved security in such penalty, to said board, as the same may, from time to time direct for the faithful performance of his duties: Provided, that none of his sureties shall be members of said board.

11. That all vacancies created by death, resignation, or in any other manner, shall be filled by the ensuing general assembly of said church, unless said board find it absolutely necessary to do it themselves, in which case the appointment to fill any vacancy shall continue only until the vacancy shall be filled by the said assembly.

12. That in case of the failure of any officer of said assembly, the board shall have power to elect a suitable person to such office, according to said requisitions, and to remove delinquents in office.

13. That should the time ever come when any religious body, claiming to be the successors of the present general assembly of said church, and should hold and maintain doctrines and sentiments different from those now held by said church, then the powers and privileges granted to the general assembly of said church, shall enure to and be vested in that body of people professing and preaching the doctrines of the said church, as now set forth in her confession of faith.

14. That said board shall have authority, by law, to collect all such sums of money, all legacies, bequests, donations, and estates, of every description, as have heretofore been or may hereafter be subscribed, devised, bequeathed, or donated by individuals, or for which any persons may heretofore or hereafter execute their notes or bonds, to said church, assembly, or board.

Approved March 8, 1854.

GREETING:—

The Commission, through its Moderator and Clerk, desires to submit the following report:

The Commission was called to meet in Evansville, Indiana, on July 9th, 1907, and was convened in the office of Judge Wm. Reister, Evansville, Indiana. Rev. J. H. Milholland was chosen Moderator, and Rev. E. M. Johnson appointed Clerk. The session was formally constituted with prayer by Rev. J. M. Wyckoff. The following well-known Cumberland Presbyterians being present, were invited to seats as brethren in council, viz.: Rev. J. M. Wyckoff, Ruling Elders Hon. Wm. Reister, Dr. A. W. Varner, H. J. Graf, A. C. DeForest and John A. McLean.

On motion a committee of three was appointed to look after the interests of the Synod of Indiana. The committee consists of Rev. E. M. Johnson, Rev. G. W. May and Ruling Elder A. C. DeForest. Brother DeForest being present a ruling elder in Jefferson Avenue Cumberland Presbyterian Church, Evansville, Indiana, and agreeing to serve on said committee.

On motion there was appointed a committee of three to look after the interests of the Synod of Iowa; the committee consisting of Rev. R. D. Miller, Rev. W. L. Collins and Ruling Elder M. E. Vanice.

After the discussion of the various interests involved the Commission adjourned, having instructed the Committees to report to the Moderator and Clerk of the Commission and that said Moderator and Clerk formulate a report of facts to the General Assembly convening at Corsicana, Texas, May 21st, 1908. Dear Fathers and Brethren:—I submit you the following report: During the year there have been the following changes in the Presbyterian lines of the various Synods herein specified:

Synod of Arkansas.—The Presbytery of Arkansas has been made a part of Fort Smith Presbytery.

The Synod of Illinois: The Presbyteries of Chicago and Rushville have been made a part of Sangamon Presbytery.

The Synod of Indianola: The Presbytery of Cherokee has been made a part of Choctaw Presbytery.

Synod of Mississippi: Bell Presbytery has been made a part of New Hope Presbytery; and Oxford Presbytery has been made a part of Yazoo Presbytery.

Synod of Missouri: Chillecothe Presbytery has been made a part of Platte Presbytery; Kirksville and Saltriver Presbyteries have been

made a part of McGhee Presbytery; St. Louis Presbytery has been made a part of Springfield Presbytery; Neosho made a part of Ozark.

Synod of Oregon: Sacramento Presbytery has been made a part of Tulare Presbytery of Pacific Synod.

The following Synods have had no Presbyterial representative to the General Assembly: Synod of Kansas, save on part of a single visiting minister, H. G. Nicholson, of Rocky Mountain Presbytery; and the Synods of Ohio, Oregon and Pennsylvania.

The Stated Clerk made settlement with former Stated Clerk and Treasurer Rev. T. H. Padgett. The books of your present Stated Clerk and Treasurer will show all funds received and expended by Rev. Padgett. He turned the following amount to me as Secretary and Treasurer: \$598.53.

Also I desire to offer the books, checks and receipts of the Stated Clerk and Treasurer as a part of my report to this Assembly, and ask that they be audited by you. The amount of cash now in hand and unpaid dues will make an aggregate of some \$1250.00. All bills and a note of \$250.00, have been paid, to date. I paid to the Board of Publication \$100.00, on the account of T. A. Havron; the other \$150.00, instructed to be paid by General Assembly of 1907, was not paid because no funds to do so, as your Stated Clerk and Treasurer had to borrow \$250.00 to carry the business for the years 1907 and 1908.

SUNDAY SCHOOL LITERATURE, REPORT ON

Nashville, Tenn., May 18, 1908.

To the 78th General Assembly of the Cumberland Presbyterian Church,
Reverend Fathers and Brethern:

I herewith submit correspondence which I have had relative to our Sunday School literature. This literature is now being issued by a committee appointed by Tennessee Synod in Oct. 1906. When this committee was appointed by Synod it especially instructed its committee that at any time the Board of Publication of the Cumberland Presbyterian Church was ready to take charge of the publication of the Sunday School literature and supplies that this committee was to turn the matter over to the General Assembly's Board of Publication without further action on the part of the Synod. We believe that the time has come when this denominational enter-

prise of the Church should be in the hands of the General Assembly's Board. We, therefore, respectfully request that the General Assembly give their Board of Publication instructions in regard to taking charge of the publication of all Sunday School literature to be issued in the name of the Cumberland Presbyterian Church, and that we be authorized to carry out the contract which Tennessee Synod has entered into with the Rev. J. R. Goodpasture, Nashville, Tenn.

The question of improving our Sunday School literature in some way has had the careful thought and attention of the President and Secretary and Treasurer of your Board of Publication. In fact we have commenced to negotiate for the publication of a young peoples' paper, which will serve not only as a Sunday School paper, but will serve as a paper for the young people's societies, and a paper which would be acceptable in all of the homes of our denomination. We have under consideration a plan to issue a paper of eight or ten pages. Serial stories of high literary merit, nicely illustrated will be published. In connection with this, there will be a page devoted to matters that will interest the boys, a page of matter that will interest the girls, one page will be devoted to senior society work, one page to junior work, and one page to the international lessons with the best commentary we are able to secure. We will have an editorial page and will allow one or more pages to our correspondents. We expect to invite the various Sunday Schools and young people's Societies to send us news notices for publication in the paper. We believe that we can produce this paper and put it before the Church at 60c per year for single subscriptions, and 50c per year in clubs of five or more. If we can produce the paper at less cost, it is our intention to do so; but the main question now before the officers is the subject of publishing a denominational young peoples' paper that will be an equal, if not a superior, to any young peoples' paper now in the country. We cannot do this without taking full charge of the Sunday School literature being issued by Tennessee Synod. This paper, of course, will be a substitute for the "Cumberland Boys and Girls." It will be issued under a new name. We can start out with the present subscriptions to the "Cumberland Boys and Girls" and it will be a nucleus around which we can build. This matter is submitted to your venerable body for your consideration and ratification.

EDUCATION, REPORT OF COMMITTEE ON.

Perhaps at no time in the history of the world, did God demand of men more than today. This we believe to be the greatest age of the world, an age in which God demands more of his people than perhaps at any other time. To us were never given before such glorious opportunities as today. Perhaps not since the days of King, McAdoo and Ewing was God's precious presence more fully manifest to us and in us, than today.

We rejoice today, because our God has not allowed our enemies to triumph over us. We rejoice today because God, we believe, is leading us; unfolding to us the great possibilities of helping bring the world to God.

This age of the world demands equipped men. Men must be qualified for efficient work in any and all avocations of life.

While to some of us, the way has been seemingly dark, with all of our schools in the enemy's possession; yet we believe that the God of Abraham, Isaac and Jacob, yea, the God of King, McAdoo and Ewing, is still with us.

For years past the Minutes of your Assembly show a decrease in candidates for the ministry. We believe that this was brought about by having in our church too many men that were self-called and self-designing. We had gotten our eyes off God; we were trusting men and ignoring God. We had lost the love for God that we had as an inheritance, given to us by our fathers. Our love and zeal for our church had cooled while we, like Israel, had fallen into the hands of

the Babylonians, until they cried out: "Sing us a song!" And that song the funeral dirge of our church.

Not until then did we hang up our harps. Perhaps at no time in the history of the world, since Israel was led captive, was there so many sad hearts as when the enemy cried out unto us: "Sign your death warrants."

But thank God, we cried, "How shall we sing the Lord's song in a strange land!" We hanged our harps up and then we cried with our hearts broken and bleeding: "If I do not love Thee, O Lord, above my chief joy, if I prefer not the Church of my Fathers, if I do not proclaim this blessed Whosoever Will Gospel from every hilltop and on plain; if I am not willing to spend and be spent for her, then, O Lord, let my right hand forget her cunning and my tongue cleave to the roof of my mouth!"

God has humbled us since then. Our prayers day and night have been, "O God, help! O God, touch the hearts of our young men! Call them out, O Lord, to help us bring this old world back to Thee!"

Results.

Thank God, he is calling men all over our bounds. Perhaps at no time in fifty years has so many young men been received under the care of your Presbyteries as now.

The future is bright, because God would not call men unless there was a place to fill.

Our Needs.

FIRST—We need Schools for training our young men for work. We believe that we will have our school property in our hands by the beginning of next scholastic year, but we are surrounded on almost every side with splendid public schools and each state seems to be trying to keep in front on this important line. And we recommend that our young men avail themselves of these God-given opportunities until we can get possession of our own schools.

We are gratified at the work being done by our Self-Sufficient Board of Education. We feel that under the existing circumstances they have done nobly.

We feel the great need just now, of having a school opened up for the benefit of our young men, where we can have them trained for the great work of soul-saving and would recommend to you that, if possible, by September 1st, you open up a school where you can teach the English bible, the history and doctrines of the Cumberland Presyterian church. We feel that such a move would find in the heart of every Cumerland Presbyterian, a hearty endorsemnt.

We appreciate the feelings of the Board of Education in that it realizes that it is only a creature brought into existence by you and we recommend that you concur in its recommendation where it asks you to outline its work for the coming year.

We Also Recommend

FIRST—That you empower a Board of Education to arrange for a place and secure a suitable faculty for the purpose of training our young men for the ministry, that they may be the better prepared for the Master's work. For while we feel the need of an Educated Ministry, we feel the greater need of a Called Ministry, that is thoroughly consecrated. A Ministry that is filled with the love for souls, a Ministry that depends on God, a Ministry whose souls are set on fire with zeal, a Ministry who can say, like Paul, "for me to live, is Christ."

SECOND—That you place this work in the hands of your Board of Education, that they may do the best they can to bring into existence a school that will meet the present demands.

THIRD—Also that you adopt the following recommendation of the Board of Education: In that you direct each Presbytery to appoint a suitable person within its bounds to represent its interest, and that said Presbytery report the name of such person as soon as appointed, to the Corresponding Secretary of the Board, Rev. P. F. Johnson, of Dyer, Tennessee.

FOURTH—Concerning the Ordination of men to the Gospel ministry in your Church by your Presbyteries, that they follow as best they can, your Confession of Faith.

FIFTH—That you reappoint the time already given by you for the purpose of taking collections for Education, and that each Presbytery set apart some special day of prayer for God to call men into the work of the Ministry. And that the Presbyteries require their pastors to preach a sermon on the Gospel Ministry.

We learn that your present Board of Education at your request, did make a demand of the old Board who went into the union, for the possession of our school property, but they were ignored, and the Board has under advisement, steps to carry out in full your recommendation of a year ago.

We would insist that all persons doing evangelistic work in our Church secure the endorsement of these boards.

FINANCIAL REPORT.

Brother Moderator and Brethren of the 78th General Assembly of the Cumberland Presbyterian Church:—

We, your Committee on Finance, respectfully report that we have carefully examined the Financial Statement and Report of Hon. J. J. McClellan, treasurer of your Legal Board (or Fund), and find that he has received the sum of seven thousand, three hundred and eighty-one dollars and eighty-seven cents (\$7381.87) and has expended the sum of seven thousand, three hundred and sixty dollars and forty-one

cents (\$7360.41), leaving a balance in his hands of twenty-one dollars and forty-six cents (\$21.46). In view of the fact that now seems to be a crucial point of time in our loved Church's history, and we cannot afford to let anything come between us and victory, therefore we would recommend that a greater effort be put forth to collect the balance due of this Fund pledged at Dickson, Tennessee, in 1907, aggregating some \$11,360.04; leaving some \$3,977.17 still due.

We have had placed in our hands Memorials from the Presbyteries of California and Los Angeles, asking that the Permanent Committee on Missions of the Pacific Synod of the Cumberland Presbyterian Church, shall be given an apportionment of the Legal Fund. Also that Ruling Elder T. E. Clark be appointed on the Legal Board.

We would recommend as to first, viz.: The apportionment of Legal Fund, that, while we recognize the depleted condition of the Pacific Synod, and the heroic fight that has been and still is being made by our brethren for their cause, yet, we, your Committee are of the opinion that our Legal Board has taken into consideration all these facts and as far as their means of relief will afford, is giving aid where it is most needed and would recommend that it be left in their hands with the request that they give due consideration to this need.

As to the Memorial for the appointment of Ruling Elder T. E. Clark to the Legal Board, we believe this to properly belong to some other Committee, so return to Assembly for recommittal. (Referred to Legal Board on motion.)

We also had referred to our Committee the vouchers of expenses of J. W. Taylor on account of Commission to Evansville, Ind. We have examined same and find them correct and recommend that the Stated Clerk and Treasurer be ordered to pay the amount, \$13.10, to Brother Taylor out of funds in his hands.

We have had referred to our Committee a correspondence between Hon. J. H. Fuzzell, Rev. J. L. Goodknight, Stated Clerk, and Rev. H. G. Nicholson, the only minister in the Rocky Mountain Presbytery or Kansas Synod, relative to his expenses in attending this meeting of the General Assembly. We have had a consultation and find his traveling expenses to be \$41.00. The Board of Missions has volunteered to pay him this amount, which provides for it, and which we endorse.

REPORT NO. 2 ON FINANCE.

Brother Moderator and Brethren of the 78th General Assembly of the Cumberland Presbyterian Church:—

We, your Committee on Finance, would respectfully report, that we have carefully examined the books, vouchers and checks of Stated

Clerk and Treasurer, J. L. Goodknight, and find them in splendid shape; he having received the sum of two thousand, one hundred and ninety-nine dollars and eighty-five cents (\$2199.85) and expended as shown by books and vouchers, the sum of twelve hundred and sixty-seven dollars and ninety-three cents (\$1267.93), leaving on hand a balance of nine hundred and thirty-one dollars and ninety-two cents (\$931.92), and leaving an estimated balance of uncollected dues of three hundred and forty-eight dollars and eight cents (\$348.08.)

SECOND—We have examined the accounts of Rev. A. C. Biddle for expense on commission to Evansville, Ind., of \$5.50, and we recommend that it be paid by your treasurer.

JUDICIARY, REPORT OF COMMITTEE ON.

Your Judiciary Committee respectfully submit the following report:

I.—We have had under careful consideration the report of the Commission appointed by the General Assembly last year, to look after the interests of the Synods of Iowa, Illinois and Indiana. We find that the Commission did a great work in the Synods of Illinois and Indiana, and that effective work can be done in the Synod of Iowa. We therefore recommend, that this same Commission be continued with instructions to centralize their efforts in the Synod of Iowa, and report their proceedings to the next General Assembly. We further recommend that the work reported by this Commission be approved by this body.

II.—We have carefully examined the report of the Board of Trustees of the General Assembly, and we recommend:

FIRST—That said report be approved by the Assembly.

SECOND—That the sale and conveyance of real estate deeded to our church by Z. P. Smith, be confirmed by the Assembly, and that

said Board of Trustees be authorized to invest the proceeds of such sale of the best interest of our beloved denomination.

III.—In the matter of Memorial from Foster Presbytery, in construing our constitution, Sections 9, 31, 57, and Rules of Discipline, Sections 7, 30 and 98. We, your Committee, fully agree and we recommend that the General Assembly affirm and approve the construction as contained in the following preamble and resolutions adopted by that Presbytery:

Whereas our own Church teaches that, "The office of the ministry is the first in the Church, both for dignity and usefulness." Also that "The Presbytery has power * * * to receive, ordain, dismiss, install remove and judge ministers," and also, in the ordination of a licentiate in any Presbytery, all "the ministers of this Church present shall, by prayer led by the presiding minister, and with the laying on of hands, according to the apostolic example, solemnly ordain him to the holy office of the gospel ministry." and also that "Original jurisdiction in relation to ministers pertains exclusively to the Presbytery, and in relation to other church members to the church session." And also, that only the Presbytery or the Synod is authorized to issue a letter of dismissal and recommendation to a minister of the gospel in the Cumberland Presbyterian church. Therefore, be it

Resolved: First, That is it the sense of this Presbytery that an ordained minister in the Cumberland Presbyterian Church cannot leave and that no church session is authorized either to receive such ministerially be a member of any local congregation or "particular church" ministers to membership or to grant letters to ordained ministers, as church sessions have no jurisdiction over them.

Resolved: Second, That the words, (57) "the ministers of this church," mean and were intended to mean, that all of our ordained ministers in good standing are members of the Church by virtue of their office; and, (R. of Dis. Sec. 30,) that the words: "Any member of the Cumberland Presbyterian Church," include, and were intended to include, any ordained minister, licentiated candidate, ruling elder, deacon, or any private member within the membership, fellowship and communion of the entire Cumberland Presbyterian Church.

MINISTERIAL RELIEF, REPORT OF COMMITTEE ON.

To the General Assembly of the Cumberland Presbyterian Church, in session at Corsicana, Texas, May, 1908:—

Your Committee on Ministerial Relief would beg to report the following.

We have had before us the report of your Board on Ministerial Relief, and find that the work has been done in a most commendable manner, for which the Church should be grateful for this unselfish labor.

We would commend the effort of the Board in striving to save the interest of the church in Thornton Home, and we trust that they shall succeed in saving this Home for our needy ones.

We would recommend that the Bonds of the Secretary and of the Treasurer be taken in a Trust Company and that the money of the Board pay expense for the same.

We would further recommend that the following persons who have been recommended by the Board be hereby elected by this Assembly to serve the term of three Board years, viz.: Rev. A. C. Biddie of Kentucky, to succeed Rev. W. M. Freeze, Judge William Reister of Indiana, to succeed Rev. R. D. Miller, and Rev. J. A. Hill to succeed himself.

We would urge that the Board be very careful in their investigations as to the merits of the claims of her pensioners so as to have as much for the worthy as possible.

We find that with this Board as well as all other Boards, that the greatest need is more money to be placed in the hands of members of this Board, so that they may be able to take care of the needy ones.

We therefore recommend that this cause be put before our congregations by the Board through various devices, so as to inform our people of the needs of this worthy cause.

And we urge that this Assembly direct that her Synods and Presbyteries have her ministers and elders take an offering for this cause, as we believe that the cause is not only a most worthy one, but also we believe our people will respond if the subject is judiciously put before them.

We trust that some budget plan for the interest of all the Boards will be adopted by this Assembly, so that the offerings from the people may be gathered in a business as well as a Christian-like manner, so as to get the best results for all concerned.

WOMAN'S MISSIONARY MEETING R. P. CHURCH 1908—CORSIKANA

MISSIONS, REPORT OF COMMITTEE ON.

To the Moderator and Members of the 78th General Assembly of the Cumberland Presbyterian Church:—

Your Committee on Missions, after having made the most careful and searching inquiry possible, in the work of Missions done in your bounds during the past year, in presenting to you its report, desires first of all to declare that taking cognizance of the great and far-reaching difficulties presented to a church just emerging from the most destructive conflict of modern times, the work done and the results accomplished, cannot, we think, be otherwise regarded than as most creditable. Under ordinary circumstances the amount of money raised in your Presbyteries, Synods and by your Board, would not be regarded as satisfactory, but the year past has been for us no ordinary time. The preservation of the Church and that for which it stands, has been the great duty; and splendidly has it been performed. The battle has been fought, the victory largely won. With earnest thanksgiving to God for His blessings upon us, we turn now with gladness from the strife of years; and facing the future filled with brightness and great promise, we shall build again our shattered walls.

It seems unnecessary to your Committee to spend any time endeavoring to establish the immense importance of Missions. We declare that it is the great, the supreme work of the Church, and are persuaded that the affirmation of this finds a responsive echo in the heart of every member of the Church. We congratulate the Presbyteries and the Synods upon the splendid showing they have made during the last year. We urge them to greater efforts, larger plans and greater liberality for the next. Your Board of Missions and Church Erection has done nobly with the funds they had. They have directed their work with care, prudence and fidelity, and they richly deserve the thanks and confidence of the Church, and for them we raise the cry for the new year, \$60,000 for Missions and we pray you to send that cry ringing throughout all the bounds of the Church, and we believe that our loyal and fire-tested people will respond and fill the treasury of the Board, and then when we have amply sustained them, that Board will, under God, do such work as will mark an epoch in the history of the Church.

We urge you to direct the Board that, while keeping within their means and shunning debt, their policy shall be as broad as our bounds; and that their plans be, not for the city against the country, nor for the country against the city, but shall be so comprehensive that it shall be known that every Cumberland Presbyterian, whether in city, village or country, is dear to the great heart of the

church, to every one of them aid shall be given, the moment it becomes possible.

Your Committee finds it impossible to bring to your attention all the fields which require assistance, but we submit the following recommendations covering what seems to us to be the most urgent, but which also seems to be the most inviting fields, promising the largest results.

FIRST—We recommend that you instruct the Board to proceed with plans to place a Synodical Missionary in Indianola Synod at the earliest possible moment that they have funds.

Your Committee feels impelled to say that this Synod is without doubt, the mission field of the Church, for excellence, and we strongly urge that it be not left longer to struggle along supporting our great interests there unaided. Yet, so pressing are the demands from other fields, that we suggest that you name \$1200.00 as the maximum appropriation for this year.

SECOND—We recommend that you instruct your Board to take up the matter of entering Kansas City, Mo., with the Committee on Missions of Lexington Presbytery and to fully protect our great interests there as soon as it can be done.

THIRD—Your Committee strongly endorses the position of your Board in reference to the Memphis Mission, and we recommend that they continue to aid this important point.

FOURTH—Your Committee endorses the work done by your Board in Colorado and we suggest that the entire matter of further work be left to the discretion of the Board.

FIFTH—Your Committee learns with sorrow of the death of Mr. Y. Hall, formerly Treasurer of the Board, and we recommend that you approve of the selection of Mr. H. C. Jaquish as his successor.

SIXTH—Rev. A. A. Collins has tendered his resignation as a member of the Board. We recommend that you accept his resignation and that you select Rev. F. A. Brown as his successor.

SEVENTH—We recommend also that you congratulate the Presbyteries and Synods upon the splendid work they have done during the past year, and urge especially upon them, the great importance of placing in their fields Missionaries, and of amply sustaining them. We believe that, as never before in the history of the Church, there must be aggressive, forward movement all along the line.

EIGHTH—Finally, in order that all of this policy may be fully carried out, and that the great cause of Missions shall be looked after

with care and adequately presented to the people in the interest of a more complete organization, we recommend that you ask each Presbytery that has not already a permanent Committee on Missions to appoint such a Committee at its next meeting, and that you suggest that where practicable, that the Chairman of each Presbyterial Committee shall constitute the members of the Synod's Committee on Missions, provided, that where it does not at this time, for any reason, seem to be best to change the personnel of the Synod's Committee, then that these Chairmen shall be corresponding members of said Committee.

And that the Chairmen of the Synodical Committees shall be corresponding members of the Board of Missions. And we further recommend that the Board of Missions shall be directed to work out the details of this plan, and to communicate them to each Presbytery, at the earliest moment.

SUNDAY SCHOOL AND YOUNG PEOPLE'S WORK, REPORT OF COMMITTEE ON.

We, your Committee, believe that when the time is ripe, that we, as Cumberland Presbyterians, should have a distinctive denominational organization for our young people. We feel that the time is not yet, so we continue as we have been, the Christian Endeavor Society, and that this Assembly appoint some one to fill the vacancy caused by our former trustee of the united society of Christian Endeavor going into the Presbyterian Church, U. S. A.

We recommend that the Treasurer of the Board of Sunday School and Young People's Societies, be used by the Board of Sunday School and Young People's Work, be authorized to receive all funds contributed by our Sunday Schools and Young People's Societies, and that all former actions conflicting with this recommendation be rescinded.

We recommend that the money contributed by our Sunday Schools and Young People's Societies, be used by the Board of Sunday School and Young People's Work, for the support of one or more missionaries among the white congregations in Choctaw Presbytery, Indianola Synod.

We recommend that our Board secure suitable missionaries for said field, and that said Board be authorized to devise plans for raising needed funds.

We, your Committee, do most heartily express our appreciation of the earnest efforts of our faithful editor, J. R. Goodpasture, and we recommend that this General Assembly urge all Cumberland Presbyterians to give him their hearty co-operation, by using exclusively our own Sunday School literature.

We have examined the report of our Board of Sunday School and Young People's Work and heartily endorse the report; but we deem it best to call attention to a few things in this report, lest we be misunderstood.

First, Decision Day. "Today is the day of salvation," sayeth the

Lord of hosts. We know not but that some of our boys and girls may be taken in their sins before Decision Day comes, and furthermore true religion means decision and infinitely more than Decision. "Ye must be born again" sayeth Christ Jesus, unto the learned ruler of the Jews, and we trust that we as Cumberland Presbyterians may always stand for the teachings of God's word.

We, your Committee, recommend that this Assembly heartily endorse the paper (Boys and Girls), now edited by Rev. J. R. Goodpasture, and that we endeavor to place this paper in all our homes.

PUBLICATION, REPORT OF COMMITTEE ON.

Your Committee on Publication beg leave to submit the following report:

We are unanimous in the belief that the Publishing interest is of very great importance. Upon this we depend largely for our growth and success as a denomination.

The world, judging us by our literature, we need and must have the very best; we are amply able in every sense, to produce as good literature as any people in the world. We say thank God for your splendid Board composed of ten as good men as can be found in the Church. They are scholars, they are business men, and we believe they are Christian men who have the glory of God and the good of the Church at heart. We therefore recommend that no change be made in the personnel of that Board for the present.

Your Committee is delighted with the progress already made and the success attained, and we are unanimous in the belief that all of this is largely due to our splendid paper, "The Cumberland Presbyterian Banner." No paper was ever loved by any people as the Banner is loved by our people.

It has met our enemies in open field, and silenced their guns and put them to flight. They are now hiding from the red-hot, hissing

missels as they come pouring from the "Cumberland guns." It is the opinion of your Committee, and we so recommend:

FIRST, That no cessation of hostilities be declared until the enemy has laid down his weapons, and the white flag is hoisted.

SECOND, That you urge all your ministers to present the claims of the paper from their pulpits, and call for subscriptions. We also recommend that splendid little monthly paper published by Rev. A. M. Buchanan, called the "McGee Observer," which costs only twenty-five cents per annum, as being worthy of the patronage and support of the whole Church.

Your Committee has had under consideration the following papers:

FIRST, A communication from R. L. Baskette, Secretary and Treasurer of the Board of Publication, with statements from J. H. Zarecor, the President of this Board, also a letter from J. R. Goodpasture, with reference to the propriety of transferring the matter of publishing the Sunday School literature, which is now being published by a Committee under the direction of the Synod of Tennessee, to the Board of Publication.

In accordance with the information and facts set forth in these papers, your Committee would recommend that the Board of Publication be authorized and instructed to take charge of the publication of all your Sunday School literature, and that it be issued in the name of the Cumberland Presbyterian Church.

We further recommend that the Board of Publication be instructed to consider the propriety of publishing a paper which will not only be suitable for the Sunday School, but suitable also for our Young People's Societies as well.

SECOND, The memorial from the Corsicana Presbytery asks that the General Assembly appoint a committee to prepare and publish a catechism, setting forth the doctrines of the Confession of Faith suitable for use in our Sunday Schools. We recommend that this matter be referred to the Board of Publication, with instructions to act as it may deem best.

THIRD, A communication from Rev. W. T. Dale, D. D., in regard to a new Song Book, called "Cumberland Hymns," has been placed in our hands.

According to your former request, Brothers Dale and Horton have, at considerable labor and expense, prepared this book with the view of meeting the present necessities of the Church.

We regard this book as the best book in print now, for general

use in our Churches, and we believe that only the best is good enough for the Cumberland Presbyterian Church.

SECOND, That the Committee be especially requested to confer with the officers or Committee of Woman's Board of Missions of the Cumberland Presbyterian Church, with a view of fixing the hours of their meetings at such a time when the General Assembly is not in session; and especially, if at all convenient, that the hour for the Missionary Consecration meeting, and for the Assembly's Communion service shall not be at the same hour.

THIRD, That any standing rule which interferes with this plan be and is hereby repealed.

FOURTH, That a sufficient number of copies of Assembly Program be printed to send to all of our Presbyteries for information, not later than March 30th, of each year.

SABBATH OBSERVANCE, REPORT OF COMMITTEE ON.

Your Committee on Sabbath Observance will report that after

on other days; and also as much as possible, from worldly thoughts and conversation.

(3) Let the provisions for the support of the family on that day be so ordered that servants or others be not improperly detained from the public worship of God, nor hindered from sanctifying the Sabbath.

(4) Let every person and family in the morning by secret and private prayer, for themselves and others, especially for the assistance of God to their Ministers, and for blessing upon his Ministry, by the reading of the Scriptures and by holy meditation, prepare for communion with God in his public Ordinances.

(5) Let the people be careful to assemble at the appointed time; that being all prepared at the beginning, they may unite with one heart in all parts of public worship; and let none unnecessarily depart until after the benediction.

(6) Let the time after the solemn services of the congregation in public are over be spent in reading, meditation, reading of sermons, catechising, religious conversation, prayer for a blessing upon the public ordinances, singing psalms, hymns, or spiritual songs, visiting the sick, relieving the poor, and in performing such like duties of piety and charity, **and mercy.**

(7) We recommend a strict observance of the Sabbath as laid down in our Confession of Faith, and that you ask your Presbyteries due consideration of the subjects in hand that we can find nothing better to bring before your Reverend body than your own Confessional Statement.

God has been pleased to appoint one day in seven to be kept holy unto him, which from the beginning of the world to the resurrection of Christ, was the last day of the week; and, after the resurrection of Christ, was changed unto the first day of the week, which in the Scriptures is called the Lord's Day.

(1. It is the duty of every person to remember the Lord's Day and to prepare for it before its approach. All worldly business should be so ordered, and seasonably laid aside as that no one may be hindered from sanctifying the Sabbath, as the Holy Scriptures requires.

(2) The entire day is to be kept holy to the Lord, and to be employed in the public and private exercise of religion. Therefore, it is requisite that there be a holy resting all the day, from unnecessary labor, and abstaining from those recreations which may be lawful

to see to it that their Pastors and Preachers deliver at least one sermon each year, upon this great and important subject.

SONG BOOK AND BOOK DEPOSITORY, REP. OF COMMITTEE ON.

Nashville, Tenn., May 21, 1908.

To the General Assembly of the Cumberland Presbyterian Church,
to meet in Corsicana, Texas, May 21, 1908.

Moderator, Fathers and Brethern:

Last year we addressed to you a Memorial concerning a Hymnal for the Church. This Memorial was referred to the Committee on Publication, and reported on favorably. Thus encouraged we went to work to carry out our design. After fully considering the condition of the Church and its needs, we decided to issue a book of 192 pages, containing 250 Hymns, believing that a book of this size would meet the demands of our people. It was our purpose to compile a larger Hymnal for the Church as soon as there seems to be a demand for such a book sufficient to justify the outlay necessary to bring out such a book. But for the present we are assured by some of our brethren who are competent to judge of the matter, that the present book is quite sufficient for present demands.

So, in keeping with this idea, we have issued "Cumberland Hymns, A Collection of Whosoever Will Songs," for use in the Churches, Revivals, Prayer-Meetings, The Sabbath School, Young People's Societies, Etc.

It has occupied much of our time and thought ever since the last meeting of the General Assembly and no pains or labor has been spared by the Compilers in the preparation of this book. Some of the finest Authors in the land are represented in this book. It contains not only Popular Gospel Songs and songs for the Sabbath School, but songs for the Sanctuary. It will do to use on all occasions where sacred song is needed as a factor in religious worship. The initial songs are specially suited to use on all the Anniversary occasions of the Church. The "Whosoever Will" idea predominates throughout

the book, making the offer of the Gospel as free as the air we breathe, or the water we drink.

The book is issued in three styles of binding, thus adapting it to the tastes of all. The book is already being rapidly introduced in our Churches, and is meeting with approval wherever it goes.

We hope that our effort to give the Church we all love a suitable Collection of songs will meet with your approval and that of the entire Churches as well, and ask that you give some formal expression on the matter.

As regards the Cumberland Presbyterian Depository, will say that four years ago it became apparent to us that some vigorous steps should be put forth to give our people our new Denominational Books that they might be thoroughly indoctrinated, and informed on all the issues then confronting the Church. And being already engaged in publishing "The Difference in Creedal Statement," and circulating it throughout the Church, we naturally fell to sending other of our books along with this one, until the Church came to look to us for all its literature on this line. And we feel grateful to God for the opportunity of thus serving our Church in this its time of sorest need, and have taken great pleasure in doing so.

But I should call your attention to the fact that some of our most important books are out of print. Dr. Beard's "Why I am a Cumberland Presbyterian," "Collingsworth's Lectures," "Blake's Hand Book." Blake's "Old Log House" will soon be brought out again. I had a new lot brought out after the last meeting of the Assembly, as the last copy to be had was sold at that meeting. But there are but a few copies on hand now. As to Collingsworth's Lectures, they can be re-issued if enough copies can be disposed of to justify the issuing of another edition. I have been in correspondence with parties who own the plates and I believe that we will be able to get out another edition.

I call your attention in this connection to the fact that I have with me the only copies of the Cumberland Presbyterian Confession of Faith to be had at all, and something should be done to supply the further demand for our Confession of Faith. I can arrange to have it brought out again, if the Assembly so desires, and will protect me against any loss when publishing House comes into possession again. The plates of the Confession of Faith are still in the hands of those in possession of the Publishing House, but they will print the book for me on my own responsibility, and not upon theirs. The present Management will not issue another edition on their own account. I make these statements that you may know the true state of the matter. If we are to have any more copies of our Confession

of Faith issued now, it must be on individual account. This I am willing to do in connection with my other work which is in the line of work I am doing. But feel that I should have your own sanction in the matter. Of course we all hope that in the "Sweet By and By" we will be in possession of our own Publishing House again, and be publishing our own literature again. But until that time shall come, we will have to do the best we can.

I ask that this communication be referred to your Committee on Publication in order that some expression of your desires may be had on all these matters.

To the General Assembly of the Cumberland Presbyterian Church in session at Corsicana, Texas.

We, your Committee on Temperance, duly appointed by your Reverent body, beg to submit the following Report:

FIRST, We recognize the fact that the Holy Bible given to us by inspiration contains those beneficent principles necessary for the regulation of our temporal as well as spiritual lives in this world. Those principles are set forth therein with great clearness and much force and are lovingly enjoined upon the entire human race, to the end that our lives in this world may be clean, bearing precious fruit, and that our home beyond the vale of death may be assured.

No speech or declaration has ever been made, nor article written which deals more thoroughly or more radically with the use of ardent spirits than does the Holy Bible, the revealed word of God. Nor has this wonderful revelation left us without example to guide us in the way of truth and right living. The awful debauchery of Noah set forth therein, is a perpetual warning to us of the danger of tampering with this awful evil.

The heroic and inspiring example of young Daniel when he refused to drink; the startling warning of Solomon in Proverbs as he arraigns the wine cup and portrays its sorrows, tears and woe; the voice of the Prophet Isaiah as he utters his woe upon those who justify the wicked for reward, and build a town with blood, and establish a city with iniquity; the Prophesy of Christ wherein he says "every

tree that bringeth not good fruit, shall be hewn down and cast into the fire"; and the Admonition of Paul when he said, "It is good neither to drink wine or anything whereby thy brother is offended," are each and all given to us by a wise and loving Father for our correction and Admonition in this life, whereby we may profit, knowing the certainty of the Calamity that will follow the use of liquor in any of its forms.

SECOND, We view the use of intoxicating liquors and the traffic in the same to be subversive of good government, a withering blight of high and Holy things. We regard it 1st, as subversive of good government, 2nd, a most prolific cause of crime, 3rd, a pirate on the high seas of Commerce, and a robber in the industrial world, 4th, it is the enemy of God, the enemy of the Church, the destroyer of home and happiness, in fact it is the reverse of all that is good and profitable to the human race, is the sword in the hands of the devil to ruin and prostitute the human race, and send the souls of men to a Devil's Hell.

THIRD, The above being true, the use of intoxicating liquors should be viewed with alarm by Church and State; and the traffic in the same should be caused to cease; and its pernicious influences should be driven from our land and country.

The conflict with this Demon is upon us. The good and the Godly people of our Country must prevail, or the liquor traffic, accompanied with all of its baneful and blighting influences must ride supremely upon the great ocean of our National Commerce.

No faltering or falling by the wayside on the part of our temperance Army should ever occur. No flag of truce should ever be recognized; no compromise should ever be made, but the fight should be pressed and all influences that are drawn to it in this Country.

We view with much pleasure the onward and upward march of the Cause of Prohibition in our land, and we report to this General Assembly the fact that the cause of temperance from every quarter of our nation is advancing. The States of Oklahoma, Georgia, Alabama, Mississippi and others have lately taken their stand upon the side of Prohibition, and the question of prohibition is now being agitated in Kentucky, Tennessee, Texas and other States. Surely and steadily the States of this Union are falling into line and well may all of the true lovers of peace, purity and Godly righteousness take courage.

As a people, believing in the undying principles of the Christian religion, and that God calls upon his people everywhere to be watchmen on the tower and soldiers of His Army, to fight the evils of this

life, and to secure to our people the greatest blessings possible, we submit that our Cumberland Presbyterian People throughout these United States are and of right ought to be valient soldiers in the Army of Prohibition, and that they at all times, and under all conditions, give their most hearty support to the cause of temperence and Prohibition. With the note of warning to the Church to avoid being dragged into the political field for political ends.

THIRD, That the Executive Committee be authorized to make any demand necessary for any property or possession of any class or kind or sort of property now in possession of others and which ought to be controlled and preserved by your Historical Society.

THEOLOGICAL SEMINARY, REPORT OF COMMITTEE ON.

The Committee on Theological Seminary report that at the present time our only Theological Seminary is under the control and management of the Northern Presbyterian Church, we therefore have no Seminary under our control, to which we can send our young men, that are studying for the ministry.

We cannot afford, as a Church, to send probationers to schools manned and taught by professors whose Theological tenents and doctrines are diametrically opposed to the doctrines of the Cumberland Presbyterian Church as presented in our confession of Faith.

We have had experience in this matter and drank of the bitter cup, in the revolution through which we are now passing. Our young men had better study Theology as they ride the Circuit with Bible in hand, as did the early fathers of our beloved Church.

The successful teachers of the young mind have a wonderful power in molding the bent of thought in that mind; whatever may be their Philosophy or Theology, and the student is most likely to imbibe it, true or false.

There are no seminaries to which we would be willing to recommend our Probationers who are now coming into the ministry.

In reference to the memorial referred to us concerning the action of the Board of Trustees, in regard to employing Rev. M. M. Smith to teach the Bible in our school at Bethel College, we have obtained the sad intelligence that he has just passed through a very serious operation, and that the sight of one eye is gone and the other almost so. We greatly deplore this sad affliction to our beloved brother, for his services in the Church at this time are greatly needed. His services to the Church as a Bible student, is a great loss, and we do not know of a man that we can spare from the active work of the ministry at this time to take the place to which he has been chosen.

We, therefore, recommend that the work of securing a man to teach the English Bible, the Confession of Faith, Church History etc., as recommended by the Board of Education, be referred to the Board of Trustees, and that they make the best provision in their power to meet the present demands of the Church.

We recommend that the Presbyteries, when recommending schools for the Probationers for the ministry, they always give our own and only school—now under our authority—Bethel College, the preference and urge such Probationers to attend said school.

WAYS AND MEANS, REPORT OF COMMITTEE ON.

Brethren:

We recognize the fact that both our ministers and our membership believe in our contributing to general enterprises of our regular General Assembly Boards; which Boards are the servants of our Church; and we must furnish them the means with which to do the work, otherwise we cannot hold them accountable. Furthermore, we realize that our people are not favorable to so many different calls for money, necessitating a contribution at almost every appointment, in many of our country and village congregations, therefore, we recommend, advisory, the following plan:

FIRST, That a subscription be taken in all our congregations throughout your entire bounds as early as possible after the close of this Assembly, which subscription shall cover the needs of the Assembly's regular Boards so as to avoid the objectionable feature of said frequent collections.

SECOND, That said subscriptions be paid as early as practicable, but, at such time and in such amount and in such manner as suits the convenience of the subscribers.

THIRD, That said subscriptions be collected by the sessions of the several congregations and apportioned and forwarded to the Secretary or Treasurer of the several different Boards.

FOURTH, That, in as much as the strength of any Church lies in its membership, you request, that if possible, every member of our glorious and beloved Church, to take part in this great work of paying, not merely that the needs of our most worthy cause may be supplied, but that every soul may share in the blessings that come to those who take part in thus worshipping God.

FIFTH, That you therefore call for the sum of \$100,000.00, and that said amount as collected, be apportioned as follows:

Board of Sunday School and Young People's work 5 per cent.

Board of Publication 5 per cent.

Board of Ministerial Relief 10 per cent.

Board of Education 20 per cent.

Board of Missions 60 per cent.

The Assembly will observe that the amount suggested has been reduced from \$130,000.00, for all purposes to \$100,000.00, for Benevolences alone. We therefore recommend that the Legal Committee be and is hereby authorized, to call upon the Church, through their Board of Finance, who shall have power and authority to devise ways and means through and by which a Legal fund be created to carry on all litigation pending, or that may in the future come up throughout the denomination.

REPORT NO. 2.

Your Committee to which was referred Resolutions covering certain matters relating to the Legal Committee, beg leave to report, that we have carefully considered the matter, and offer this report in lieu of the Resolutions, we recommend:

FIRST, That the Legal Board as now constituted, with Judge Joe H. Fussell, Chairman, and Hon. J. J. McClellan, Treasurer, be continued, and that the Assembly recognize with thanks the great services which they have rendered, and congratulate them upon the success which they have won.

SECOND, That the Legal Board be empowered to appoint a Committee of Five to be known as the Board of Finance, who shall have power and authority to devise ways and means through and by which, a Legal fund be created, sufficient to carry on all litigation pending, or that may in the future come up throughout the denomination.

THIRD, That all sums contributed to this fund shall be paid over to the Treasurer of the Legal Board, and that said sums shall be paid out by order of the Legal Board.

REPORT NO. 3.

Your Committee begs leave to report that we have had referred to us a communication from the Session of the Church at Dickson, Tennessee, and some citizens, asking for the establishment of a permanent tabernacle at Dickson, Tenn., in memory of the organization of the Cumberland Presbyterian Church, and we recommend that you take no action upon it at this time.

We recommend that General Assembly contingent tax be four cents per resident member, instead of three cents as heretofore.

No direct reports. Presbytery disorganized. At least fifty per cent of members remain Arkansas banded and visited presbyteries and schemed to vote them for "Union." We pulled the wool over the eyes of one gallows elders from the back woods and voted them for "Union." They did not know what they were voting." Rev. J. H. Barkwell so told Dr. Kirkland on train out of Little Rock.

XII—Miscellaneous Regulations.

I. The Assembly Stated Clerk.

Besides discharging the duties named in Form of Government, the Assembly's Stated Clerk is required:

1. To discharge the duties of Engrossing Clerk, appointing such Temporary Clerks at each meeting of the Assembly as may be needed for his assistance. Minutes 1872, p. 31; 1873, p. 34.

2. To furnish proper statistical blanks to the Stated Clerks of the lower Church Courts. Minutes 1873, p. 34; 1897, pp. 24, 26.

3. To report inefficient Stated Clerks to their Presbyteries and Synods. Minutes, 1889, p. 52; 1891, p. 15; 1898, p. 51.

4. The Stated Clerk's salary is \$500.00 per annum.

5. As far as he can do so consistently with other duties, he is to visit Church Courts and congregations and give encouragement and direction toward the general welfare of the Church, and shall be permitted to use also the title "General Traveling Secretary." See Minutes of 1901, p. 115.

II. The Assembly Treasurer.

The Stated Clerk shall also act as the Assembly's Treasurer, for the collection and handling of Contingent Tax. See Minutes of 1900, p. 47.

III. The Assembly Contingent Tax.

1. That the Assembly's Contingent Tax be four cents per resident member.

The Assembly's Stated Clerk is not authorized to remit the Tax of a Presbytery. Any Presbytery regarding itself as, from any cause, entitled to relief from this tax or any portion thereof, may, by the Council and direction of its Synod, petition the Assembly to that effect. Minutes 1898, p. 73.

IV. The Assembly Minutes.

The Assembly Minutes will be sent, free of charge, to ordained ministers, clerk of sessions, the various Boards and schools of the Church, such Synodical and Presbyterial Stated Clerks and Treasurer as are not ministers or session clerks, to those appointed by the Assembly to serve on Committees in the interim of Assembly meetings, to the Stated Clerk's "Exchanges," to all members of each Assembly, and a copy is to be sent to any probationer requesting it and

sending ten cents to cover postage. Others desiring the Minutes can secure them by addressing Rev. J. L. Goodknight, Lincoln, Illinois. Minutes 1897, p. 46; 1903, p. 66, 1904, p. 66.

V. Presbyterian and Synodical Meetings.

The Assembly directs that every Presbytery shall hold a "Spring meeting," and as early as possible, and the Stated Clerks of Presbyteries shall have their reports in the hands of the Assembly's Stated Clerk not later than May 1; also that summer meetings of Church Courts shall be held late in the season, in order that there may have been sufficient time to become familiar with the deliverances of the Assembly. See pp. 39a, 67; Minutes, 1898, p. 52.

VI. Stated Clerk of Presbyteries.

The Assembly recommends that, as a matter of convenience and efficiency, Presbytery shall select the same person to serve as its Stated Clerk and Treasurer where this is practicable. Minutes 1897, p. 63.

VII. Examination of Assembly Minutes.

The Assembly directs that each Church Court, from session to Synod as its first meeting after the appearance of the Assembly Minutes, shall conduct in open meeting a careful examination of the Minutes, as a means of discovering whether there be errors and omissions in the same and who is responsible therefore, so that the clerks of Church Courts may be held to rigid account for the discharge of their official duties. See Minutes for 1901, p. 77.

VIII. Report of Board and Permanent Committees.

All the Assembly's Records and Permanent Committees are ordered to close their books promptly on December 31 (except the Board of Ministerial Relief, which shall close books on January 31,) and to have their annual reports in the hands of the Stated Clerk not later than April 1, in order that he may print the same and send them to Commissioners in advance of the Assembly's meeting. See Minutes for 1901, p. 117; 1902, p. 65.

XXXVI. Assembly's Standing Rule.

In 1901, the General Assembly adopted the following: Resolved, That—

1. Popular meetings shall be held on successive evenings as follows, beginning at 8 o'clock:

Thursday, Home Missions.

Friday, Education.

Saturday, Sunday School and Young People's Work.

Monday, Foreign Missions.

Tuesday, Ministerial Relief.

Wednesday, Publication.

These popular meetings shall be under the direction of the Boards and Committees, respectfully, having these interests specially in charge.

2. Friday forenoon, Assembly business:

Appointment of Committees.

Stated Clerk's Report.

Communications and Overtures.

Reports of Boards and Permanent Committees, etc.

The Boards and Committees are each to occupy not exceeding thirty minutes, and in the following order:

Educational.

Missions and Church Erection.

Publication.

Ministerial Relief.

Assembly Trustees.

As a rule, papers that are in print in the hands of the members shall be accepted as having been read, those presenting them having opportunity for making remarks within the limits named.

3. Friday afternoon. For so much of this period as may be necessary, the order of the forenoon is to be continued.

4. Assembly business in the forenoons of Saturday, Monday, Tuesday, Wednesday, Thursday and Friday.

5. There shall be no business session of the Assembly on the afternoon of Saturday, Monday, Tuesday, the time being devoted to Committee work.

6. Reports of all Standing and Special Committee shall be considered in the order in which they are filed with the Stated Clerk.

7. All resolutions touching the general enterprise of the Church must be referred to appropriate Standing Committees for consideration before they can be taken up by the body.

8. No item of business in conflict with this Standing Rule shall be considered except by suspension of the Rule, by a two-thirds vote.

9. In all cases not provided for in its own Rules of Order, the Assembly is to be governed by Robert's Rules of Order.

10. That we believe it would be wise for arrangements to be made for preaching services at 11 a. m. on Saturday and Monday, and on Saturday and Monday afternoons, for the benefit of the visitors and of the Commissioners who are not engaged in the Committee Rooms; these arrangements to be made by the pastor-host.

XVI.—Statistics for 1907, Standing Order on.

(11.) That the Stated Clerk of the General Assembly be and is hereby instructed and directed to retain on the roll of this General Assembly's minutes the names of all Congregations which were reported to the General Assembly by the various Stated Clerks or otherwise, in 1906, of whatsoever Presbytery or Synod.

(2.) That the various Presbyteries and Synods be and are instructed and directed to retain all the Congregations on their rolls which were there in 1906 before and at the time of the General Assembly of 1906, at Decatur, Illinois.

(3.) That there is no report from statistics from Presbyteries and congregations the Stated Clerk of this General Assembly is instructed and directed to make up the statistics approximately from the statistics as reported to the Stated Clerk of the General Assembly for the General Assembly at Decatur, Illinois, May, 1906, and that they so appear in the minutes of this General Assembly.
