MISCELLANEOUS REGULATIONS.

I. The Assembly's Stated Clerk.

Besides discharging the duties named in Form of Government, the Assembly Stated Clerk is required:

1. To discharge the duties of Engrossing Clerk, appointing such Temporary Clerks at each meeting of the Assembly as may be needed for his assistance. Minutes 1872, p. 31; 1873, p. 34.

2. To furnish proper statistical blanks to the Stated Clerks of the lower Church Courts. Minutes 1873, p. 34; 1897, pp. 24, 26. 3. To report inefficient Stated Clerks to their Presbyteries and Syn-

ods. Minutes 1889, p. 52; 1891, p. 15; 1898, p. 51.
4. As far as he can do so, consistently with other duties, to visit Church Courts and congregations and give encouragement and direction toward the general welfare of the Church, being permitted to use also the title "General Traveling Secretary." See Minutes of 1901, p. 115.

5. The Stated Clerk's salary is \$900 per annum. See Minutes, year

1919, page 104.6. He shall also employ such press reporters during the sessions of the Assembly as may be necessary to give the Assembly news publicity. See Minutes of 1916, p. 35.

The Stated Clerk of the General Assembly was instructed not to publish in the Minutes of the General Assembly any communications or reports unfavorably considered by the Assembly. (See page 27,

Minutes of 1917 Assembly.)

8. We recommend that the printing of the Minutes of the General Assembly (until further ordered) be done by our own printing plant, the New Cumberland Press, and that it be paid a price of not exceeding ten per cent above cost. (See page 103, Minutes of 1917 Assembly.)

II. The Assembly Treasurer.

The Stated Clerk shall also act as the Assembly's Treasurer for the collection and handling of Contingent Tax. See Minutes of 1900, p. 47.

III. The Assembly's Contingent Tax.

The Assembly's Contingent Tax shall be five cents per resident member, due July 1, each year. Minutes, 1914, p. 146; 1908, p. 99. Statement sent by Stated Clerk July 1, based on resident members, to each Presbyterial Treasurer. Minutes, 1998, p. 63; 1903, p. 7.

The Assembly's Stated Clerk is not authorized to remit the tax of a Presbytery. And Presbytery regarding itself as, from any cause, entitled to relief from this tax or any portion thereof, may, by the counsel of and direction of its Synod, petition the Assembly to that effect. Minutes, 1898, p. 73.

IV. The Assembly's Minutes.

The Assembly Minutes will be sent, free of charge, to ordained ministers, clerks of sessions, the various Boards, and schools of the Church, such Synodical and Presbyterial Stated Clerks and Treasurers as are not ministers or session clerks, to those appointed by the Assembly to serve on committees in the interim of Assembly meetings, to the Stated Clerk's Exchanges, to all members of each Assembly, and a copy is to be sent to any probationer requesting it and sending ten cents to cover postage. Others desiring the Minutes can secure them by addressing Rev. D. W. Fooks, Paducah, Ky., and enclosing 50 cents. Minutes, 1897, p. 46; 1903, p. 66; 1904, p. 66.

V. Presbyterial and Synodical Meetings.

The Assembly directs that every Presbytery shall hold a "spring meeting," and as early as possible; that the Stated Clerks of Presbyteries shall have their reports in the hands of the Assembly's Stated Clerk not later than May1; also that summer meetings of Church Courts shall be held late in the season, in order that there may have been sufficient time to become familiar with the deliverances of the Assembly. See pp. 39, 67; Minutes, 1898, p. 52.

VI. Stated Clerks of Presbyteries.

1. The Assembly recommends that, as a matter of convenience and efficiency, Presbytery shall select the same person to serve as its Stated Clerk and Treasurer where this is practicable. Minutes, 1897, p. 63.

2. This Assembly makes it a standing order that the Stated Clerks of the Presbyteries are to have their statistical, financial, and other reports in the hands of the General Assembly's Stated Clerk by May 1 of each year, that there may be no delay in publishing the Minutes of the General Assembly.

3. The Stated Clerk of the General Assembly has been directed not to delay the publishing of the Minutes on account of any delay in Presbyterial reports; and, in default of report from the Stated Clerk in any Presbytery, he shall publish the report as given the year before.

Minutes of 1909, p. 91.

4. That this General Assembly require all Stated Clerks of Presbyteries, Synods, and sessions to faithfully perform all duties entrusted to them. All such clerks who will not discharge their respective duties shall be ordered to resign by the court having jurisdiction over them.

(See minutes for year 1918, pages 24, 113.)

5. In order to bring about a more uniform system of Church work and statistics, it is order that the ecclesiastical year begin April 1 and close March 31, and that all statistical blanks be made to conform thereto. (See minutes of General Assembly, year 1919, page 104.)

VII. Examination of Assembly Minutes.

The Asembly directs that each Church Court, from session to Synod, at its first meeting after the appearance of the Assembly Minutes, shall conduct in open meeting a careful examination on the Minutes, as a means of discovering whether there be errors and omissions in the same and who is responsible therefor, so that the Clerks of Church Courts may be held to rigid account for the discharge of their official duties. See Minutes for 1901, p. 77.

VIII. Report of Board and Permanent Committees.

1. All the Assembly's Boards, Permanent Committees, and Stated Clerks of Presbyteries are ordered to close their books promptly on or before April 1, and to have their annual report in the hands of the Stated Clerk not later than April 1, in order that he may print the same and send them to commisioners in advance of the Assembly's meeting. (See Minutes for 1901, p. 117; 1903, p. 66; 1917, p. 29.)

2. When the books and papers of any Board of this General Assembly, receiving and paying out money for any purpose, are submitted to a special auditing committee prior to the meeting of the Assembly, such books, papers, receipts, stubs, etc., together with report of said special committee shall be submitted to the Assembly's regular auditing committee. See Assembly Minutes for year 1916, page 121.

IX. Assembly's Standing Rules.

In 1901 and 1915 the General Assembly adopted the following: Resolved: 1. That popular meetings shall be held on successive evenings as follows, beginning at eight o'clock:

Thursday-Home Missions.

Friday—Tithing.

Saturday—Sunday School and Young People's Work.

Sunday-Education.

Monday—Foreign Missions. Tuesday—Ministerial Relief. Wednesday—Publication.

These popular meetings shall be under the direction of the Boards and Committees, respectively having these interests specially in charge.

2. Friday forenoon—Assembly business:

Appointment of committees.

Stated Clerk's Report.

Communications and Overtures.

Reports of Boards and Permanent Committees, etc.

The Boards and Committees are each to occupy not exceeding thirty minutes and in the following order:

Education.

Missions and Church Erection.

Publication.

Ministerial Relief. Assembly Trustees.

As a rule, papers that are in print and in the hands of the mersbers shall be accepted as having been read, those presenting them having opportunity for making remarks within the limits named.

3. Friday afternoon. For so much of this period as may be neces-

sary, the order of the forenoon is to be continued.

4. Assembly business in the forenoons of Saturday, Monday, Tues-

day, Wednesday, Thursday, and Friday.

5. There shall be no business session of the Assembly on the afternoons of Saturday, Monday, Tuesday, the time being devoted to committee work.

6. Reports of all standing and special committees shall be considered

in the order in which they are filed with the Stated Clerk.
7. All resolutions touching the general enterprises of the Church must be referred to appropriate standing committees for consideration before they can be taken up by the body.

8. No item of business in conflict with this Standing Rule shall be

considered except by suspension of the Rule by a two-third's vote.

9. In all cases not provided for in its own Rules or Order, the As-

sembly is to be governed by Robert's Rules of Order.

10. That we believe it would be wise for arrangements to be made for preaching services at eleven a. m. on Saturday and Monday and on Saturday and Monday afternoons for the benefit of the visitors or the Commissioners who are not engaged in the committee rooms, these

arrangements to be made by the pastor-host.

11. No money shall be paid out of the General Assembly's treasury, coming from the Presbyterial Contingent Fund of five cents per resident member, for purposes other than that of the defraying of the regular running expenses of the office of Stated Clerk and Treasurer and General Traveling Secretary, except by a vote of two-thirds of the Assembly.

MEMBERS OF CHURCH BOARDS.

(Original resolution of 1910 as amended in 1912.)

To the Moderator and Members of the Eighty-Second General As-

Whereas, there is no uniform number which constitutes the Boards

of our Church; therefore be it Resolved: 1. That in no case should there be more than nine members; and where there are nine members in the Board, three new members should be elected each year.
2. That where the Board is constituted of a less number than nine,

that one-third of the members should be elected each year.

3. That no individual shall be a member of more than one Board. 4. That each Board so adjust itself as to comply with these rules

after 1910 General Assembly.

5. That each Board may nominate to the General Assembly persons to fill the places of the one-third going out each year.-F. A. Brown.

MINUTES OF THE EIGHTY-NINTH GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE CUMBERLAND PRESBYTEERIAN CHURCH IN ANNUAL SESSION AT FAYETTEVILLE, ARK.. MAY 15-21, 1919.

First Day, Thursday, Forenoon, May 15, 1919, 11 O'clock.

The General Assembly of the Cumberland Presbyterian Church convened in its eighty-ninth session, in the city of Fayetteville, Ark., May 15, 1919, at 11 o'clock a. m.

Opening Session.

The General Assembly was called to order by the Moderator, Kev. C. H. Walton, of the Los Angeles Presbytery, who preached the opening sermon from the text, Luke 19:10, using as a subject: "The Earthly Mission of the Son of God." The Assembly was led in the constituting prayer by Rev. J. H. Zwingle, of the McMinnville Presbytery.

Recess.

Recess was taken to the hour of 2:30 o'clock this afternoon. Prayer and benediction by Rev. T. L. Wood, of the Birmingham Presbytery.

FIRST DAY, THURSDAY—AFTERNOON SESSION.

May 15, 1919, 2:30 O'clock.

Recess being out, the Assembly was called to order by the Moderator and was led in prayer by Rev. S. A. Berrie, of the Chickasaw Presbytery.

REPORT OF THE BOARD OF TRUSTEEES OF THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY.

To the General Assembly of the Cumberland Presbyterian Church, Fayetteville, Ark.:

Brethren: The Secretary of your Board of Trustees submits the following report for your consideration:

At the regular meeting of your Board in June, the same officers were re-elected for the coming year-namely: E. W. Beck, President; J. W. Goodrum, Vice President; M. R. Graham, Secretary; and W. J. Denhardt, Treasurer. The forenamed officers constitute the Executive Board. I will further say that the business of the Board, during the past year, has centered almost exclusively in an effort to obtain for the Church the money bequested to our denomination by the will of the late Cynthia A. Smith, of Decatur, Ill. I regret to say that although we have made every effort to satisfy the executor of the will as to being the proper persons to settle with, yet we have failed to do so. The executor demands that the individual members of the Board of Trustees sign a bond for double the amount of the bequest, binding themselves, their heirs, their executors, and administrators, jointly, severely, and firmly to secure said executor absolutely and forever free from any reliability whatever and that said Trustees furnish him a certificate from their bankers as to their ability to pay the same if called upon to do so. This, your Board promptly declined to do. We then sent your Stated Clerk, Brother Fooks, to Decatur, Ill., with a copy of the minutes of the meeting of every General Assembly from 1906 to 1918, and also with prepared affidavits as to our being the proper legatees of the will, but it seems to be of no purpose. We further made application to several bonding companies to secure bondsmen, but have failed in every effort. A competent firm offered to secure the legacy for us and relieve us of all the responsibility for the stipulated sum of ten percent. This your Board did not feel authorized to pay. We now, appeal to your body, the General Assembly, for advice and instructions as to how to proceed to collect the money long since due the Church; but, it seems, un-M. R. GRAHAM, Secretary of Board of Trustees. necessarily kept from us.

Supplimentary Report of Board of Trustees of General Assembly.

Bowling Green, Ky., May 8, 1919.

The following supplementary report was unanimously adopted by the Assembly's Board of Trustees convened this day in called session:

That the clerk of the Board report to the General Assembly that the Board is unable, by all efforts, to make the bond as required by the executor of Cynthia A. Smith for the collection of the funds bequeathed to the General Assembly of the Cumberland Presbyterian Church by the said Cynthia A. Smith and now ask the General Assembly to devise some means by which the bond may be given.

REPORT OF STATED CLERK AND GENERAL TRAVELING SECRETARY OF THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE CUMBERLAND PRESBYTERIAN CHURCH.

To the Eighty-Ninth General Assembly of the Cumberland Presbyterian Church, in session at Fayetteville, Ark., May 15-21, 1919:

Reverend and Beloved Brethren: Once more we are called to assemble in a national gathering of our beloved Church. The dark clouds of war, which hung so heavy when we last met in the Assembly work at Dallas, Tex., May, 1918, have rolled away. The rift in the clouds shows us once more the smiling face of a divine providence that has wisely guided our destiny during the months past. To Him we give the praise for His Fatherly care.

Prebsyterial and Synodical Lines.

So far we are advised, all Presbyterial and Synodical lines remain as they were upon our last meeting.

Presbyterial Meetings.

It is with regret that we must report to you, because of health conditions in the teritory covered by our Church, many of the Presbyteries found it impracticable to hold their fall meetings; and those of them who braved the epidemic, which seemed to be nation-wide, had very poor attendance. We are glad however to note the fact that the spring meetings have been almost universally very fine. Many have pronounced them the best ever held.

Because of unavoidable conditions, last fall we had the privilege of attending but one sitting of Presbytery—Logan. We have attended the following spring meetings, offering encouragement and rendering such other help as was possible: Morrillton, Madison, Ewing-McLin, Lincoln-Decatur, Foster, Lebanon, McGready, Logan, Mayfield, Little Rock-Burrow, West Prairie, Illinois, Richland, and Elk. In order to reach these several Presbyteries we have traveled a distance of more than six thousand miles, which has been done at a very small expense—perhaps less than eighty-five dollars—to the Assembly fund. However, it should be said that Morrillton, in Arkansas, and Ewing-McLin, in Illinois, bore the full expense of the trip to these fields. In addition to the Assembly work, in this itinerary, we have received fifty-five new subscribers and renewals for The Cumberland Presbyterian and thirty-eight subscribers for the Cumberland Presbyterian Digest.

Statistics.

One of our heaviest duties, and one at which we seem to have made the poorest progress, is that of gathering correct and dependable statistics for the year book. This seems to be the one duty that some of our Presbyteries and many of our congregations are the most neglectful.

We plead that your reverend body, if possible, will devise some means of remeding this defect.

Permanent Meeting Place.

In keeping with your orders, as outlined on page 113 of the minutes of the General Assembly of 1918, we sent to each Presbyterial clerk a prepared ballot upon which they were to submit their approval or disapproval of the permanent meeting place of the Assembly. The following Presbyteries endorsed the measure: Foster, Greer, Los Angeles, McMinnville, Roswell, and White River-Mississippi voting in favor of the plan conditionally. The following Presbyteries voted against the measure: Austin, Birmingham, California, Chattanooga, Chickasaw, Cookeville, Corsicana-Waco, East Eennessee, Ewing-McLin, Cherokee, Gregory, Hopewell, Iowa, Knoville, Leitchfield, Lexington, Logan, Little Rock-Burrow, Madison, Mayfield, Memphis, Morrillton, New Hope, Obion, Ozark, Porter, Princeton, Robert-Donnell, Richland, Talladega, Texas-Greeneville, and Weatherford. The following Presbyteries sent no ballot to this office: Amorilla, Bartholomew, Brownwood, Choctaw, Clarksville, Columbus, Cumberland, Dallas-Bonham, Denton, Elk, Florida, Fort Smith, Illinois, Indiana, Lebanon, Lincoln-Decatur, Louisiana, Marshall, McGee, McGready, Mound Prairie, New Lebanon, Oklahoma, Owensboro, Platte, Springfield, Springville, Sweetwater, Tulare, West Plains, West Prairie, and Yazoo.

Official results to May 5, 1919, show six voting favorable, thirty-two opposed, and thirty-two from which no action has been received.

We deplore the fact that many Stated Clerks of Presbyteries have failed to send the result of their vote, though to our certain knowledge such votes have been cast. These ballots are in our hands ready for an official count by the proper committee appointed by your reverend body.

No Commissions Received.

We regret to be forced to call attention to the neglect of the Stated Clerks of the following Presbyteries to send us prior to the meeting of your reverend body properly prepared credentials of the election of commissioners to this meeting; this seems to be a growing evil, and we feel that your reverend body should deal with it kindly, yet very firmly: Birmingham, Columbus (defunct), Cookeville (no commissioners elected), Elk, Florida, Indiana, Iowa, Louisiana, Roswell, Sweetwater, Texas-Greenville, Tulare, West Plains, and West. Prairie.

Financial Exhibit.

By reference to our financial report, which is appended hereto, it will be seen that our balance shown in the bank this year is somewhat less than that of 1918. This is due to the fact that we close our books five days earlier than last year. Hence, some of the stronger Presbyteries failed to get their Presbyterial dues to us in time to be shown in this report. In giving our financial exhibit, it is our purpose to make plain to the Assembly just what disposition is made of its funds. So we have given a full itemized statement of money received, money paid out, to whom,

and for what. We respectfully ask that this exhibit go into the hands of your Auditing Committee for their review.

Finally, brethren, pray for us, that we may as your servant give our very best effort to this work.

REPORT OF THE BOARD OF TRUSTEES OF THE CUMBERLAND PRESBY-TERIAN THEOLOGICAL SEMINARY.

Fathers and Brethren: The following report is respectfully submitted for your consideration:

Unusual conditions have confronted us, and we have felt the great changes going on in the religious and business world. We have been unable to accomplish the work we desired because of existing conditions. We trust that the new plan for raising our Educational Endowment will succeed and that by the time of the meeting of the Eighty-Ninth General Assembly your Seminary will have an endowment exceeding the \$100,000 mark, and that our Seminary will be placed on a better financial basis and properly equipped in the near future for the most efficient service that has hitherto been known in our Church.

We have loyally tried to observe the spirit of the Eighty-Eight General Assembly and to carry out the plan adopted. The Board met in Nashville, Tenn., June 4, 1918, and organized by re-electing Rev. T. C. Newman President and Ruling Elder D. M. McAnulty Secretary and Treasurer. The Treasurer's bond was renewed in the sum of ten thousand dollars and placed in the keeping of the President. The same Loan Committee—namely, Rev. J. L. Hudgins, W. T. Marshall, and D. M. McAnulty—*was continued for the Assembly year.

Faculty.

Arrangements were completed for opening the Theological School in connection with Bethel College, in rooms provided by the Trustees of Bethel College, with Rev. 1'. F. Johnson, Dean, and Rev. S. H. Braly, assistant. The salaries were fixed at \$1,000 and \$800 respectively for the Seminary year. The Board recommends the reelection of Rcv. P. F. Johnson, Dean, and Rev. S. H. Braly, assistant, for the Seminary year 1919-20.

Location of Seminary.

Your Board has taken no steps toward the permanent location of the Seminary, pending the time when the joint school provided for shall be established. The Board of Trustees of Bethel College extends an invitation to our Board to continue the use of rooms at Bethel College for the year 1919-20.

Change in Charter.

Rev. J. L. Hudgins and Rev. G. W. Burroughs were made a committee to arrange to have the Charter amended to conform to work suggested by the report of the Committee on Theological Seminary.

Second and Third Meetings.

The second meeting was held in McKenzie, Tenn., November 12 and 13, 1918. At this meeting a pleasant and profitable conference was held with the faculty and students of the Seminary. The third and last meeting was held in the First Cumberland Presbyterian Church at Nashville, Tenn., on April 17, 1919.

The sale to be made after the conference and in conformity to suggestions from Dr. Perkins, the donor. The Radnor property has been sold for \$5,000 and the funds loaned at six per cent interest. We still hold the Birmingham property.

Members Term Expires.

It will be noted that the term of Rev. B. J. Reagin, Loudon, Tenn., D. M. Mc-Anulty, Bolivar, Tenn., and Rev. A. D. Rudolph, Birmingham, Ala., expires with this sitting of the Assembly. We recommend the re-election of these brethren.

ANNUAL REPORT OF THE CUMBERLAND PRESBYTERIAN BOARD OF EDUCATION.

To the Moderator and Brethren of the Eighty-Ninth General Assembly of the Cumberland Presbyterian Church, in session at Fayetteville, Ark., May 15-20, 1919:

Dear Fathers and Brethren: Your Board of Education are glad to report progress during the past year. Nothwithstanding the heavy drain upon the resources of us all, because of war conditions, offerings received by our Board for the past year exceed, very substantially, the amount of offerings reported one year ago. We believe that this better year's record indicates that our love for our Master's kingdom and our denominational loyalty are not to be relegated, if we are carrying increased weights of responsibility for our country's good, in a time of war. We are hoping, too, that this better spirit of co-operation, when conditions seemed unfavorable, is an indication that Cumberland Presbyterians have gotten a clearer vision of responsibility in this great new day. As a denomination, it is profoundly important that we be conscious of our larger obligations in this new era of tremendous world events. Educationally, and in every other way, we are expected to make larger our program if we keep pace in the mighty rush of things all about. Sister denominations are planning the raising of millions for the promotion of Church enterprises, and we must enlarge our plans proportionately.

Our denomination is to be congratulated on the Endowment Campaign provided for last year by action of the General Assembly. Our educational interests will be very much furthered by the success of this undertaking. The completion of this big task will give to us an inspiration and a courage which will make possible the achieving of things greater than we have accomplished before; and the one splendid school, strictly our own, will be an object of pride to our entire Church.

During the past year, we have made loans to the following: G. H. Bailey, Welburn Black, R. P. Bryant, H. J. Burroughs, Letie Clement, E. E. Coleman, H. C. Cooper, B. W. Covington, G. E. Danley, E. L. Freeman, C. W. Hays, E. W. Johnson, Veachel Jones, Katherine King, Dixie Powers, W. R. Reid, Elmer Richardson, Artie Robey, Maybelle Robinson, Mattie Sanders, Luther Suiter, Russell Tatum, Hallie White, B. O. Wolf, and Kittie Wood.

You will notice that the amounts of assistance vary from a few dollars to a few hundred dollars. Some of our beneficiaries ask for only an occasional loan to help them through a time of need, while others are regular beneficiaries who are aided every month of the school year. The maximum allowed any beneficiary is \$17.50 per month or \$175 per school year. You will notice in our report below several have received an amount in excess of the maximum. These have been the beneficiaries of special offerings sent to them individually, as a gift, through the Board of Education. The Board has loaned no one more than the maximum mentioned above.

The term of office of class three expires with the sitting of the Assembly. The ones composing this class are: Rev. R. H. Jackson, R. C. Denny, and Rev. W. B. Cunningham. The place of Rev. J. A. Deaver, deceased, of class two, is also to be filled. The following resolution was adopted at the last regular meeting of the Board:

"To the General Assembly of the Cumberland Presbyterian Church in session at Fayetteville, Ark., May 15-20, 1919:

Fathers and Brethren: It has not been the policy of the Board of Education to suggest the personnel of the Board, but, whereas, Rev. W. B. Cunningham has made a most efficient Corresponding Secretary and Treasurer of the Board; and, whereas, a change of Corresponding Secretary and Treasurer causes some confusion, it taking a year or two for treasurers of congregations to learn where to send offerings, we

THIRTY-EIGHTH ANNUAL REPORT OF THE BOARD OF MINISTERIAL RE-LIEF OF THE CUMBERLAND PRESBYTERIAN CHURCH.

To the Eighty-Ninth General Assembly of the Cumberland Presbyterian Church, in session at Fayetteville, Ark., May 15-21, 1919:

Dear Fathers and Brethren: Your Board of Ministerial Relief herewith submits its thirty-eighth annual report to your reverend body:

We have reached another mile stone in the history of our beloved Church, and we as servants of the Church must render an account of our stewardship. Your Board comes to you again with that implicit faith in Him who is the author and finisher of all things and through whom it has been made possible for your Board to be able to again report that success has attended our efforts in the cause entrusted to us.

It is indeed a great pleasure to report that while many of our congregations have not been able to carry out their plans during the year that has gone into the past on account of the epidemic that has swept our country, yet your Board is pleased to report quite an increase in offerings over last year for the support of our dear old soldiers of the cross, their widows, and the orphan children of our beloved Church.

On Our Rolls.

There have been thirty-three beneficiaries on our roll during the year which it has been a great pleasure to your Board to help and strengthen through the funds which you have placed in their hands for that purpose.

There have been eleven in the Home during the year, two ministers and nine children, who have had and are having every care that can be given them.

We have now at the present time twenty-eight beneficiaries and nine children in the home at Bowling Green, Ky., on our roll of beneficiaries.

Entered into Rest.

During the year five of our dear old ministers have passed into their eternal home:

Rev. W. S. Winkler, of Owensboro Presbytery, Kentucky Synod, August, 1918.

Rev. Hilary Copeland, of Cookville Presbytery, Tennessee Synod, May, 1918. Rev. L. H. Holcomb, Texas-Greenville Presbytery, Texas Synod—date not known. Rev. Dr. J. H. Hendrick, Dallas-Bonham Presbytery, Texas Synod, March 16,

1919.

Rev. J. B. Lowey, Princeton Presbytery, Kentucky Synod, March 4, 1919.

"And I heard a voice from heaven saying unto me, Write, blessed are the dead which die in the Lord from henceforth: Yea, saith the Spirit, that they may rest from their labors; and their works do follow them."

Emergency Calls.

During the year we have answered ten emergency calls aggregating \$253.90.

Audit.

The books and accounts of the Corresponding Secretary and Treasurer were audited by the Board at its February meeting and found the same to be in excellent condition and well kept.

Endowment Fund.

On account of the epidemic which swept over our country and a great many of the churches were closed, your Board was not able to carry out its plans with reference to this fund. We are pleased to report, however, that since last report this fund has doubled, and we now have \$600 in Liberty Bonds, the interest of which is used for the support of our beneficiaries.

One of the aims of your Board is to launch a campaign in the interest of this fund in the near future when all may have an opportunity to give something to this permanent fund, the interest only to be used in the support of the beneficiaries of the Board.

Vacancies by Expiration of Term of Office.

The term of membership of Ruling Elder C. E. Cooper, of Charleston, Ill., Elder R. B. Shaver, of Greenville, Ky., and Rev. John A. McLane, Bethany, Ill., expires with the meeting of this General Asembly.

The Board at its February meeting recommended to your reverend body that Ruling Elder C. E. Cooper, of Charleston, Ill., and Rev. John A. McLane, of Bethany, Ill., be elected to succeed themselves and that Rev. J. E. Cortner, of Evansville, Ind., be elected to succeed Ruling Elder R. B. Shaver.

Rules.

The General Assembly has set apart the months of December and January as special periods for offerings to be made by Churches, Sunday schools, Young People's Societies, and individuals for the support of our aged and infirm ministers, ministers' widows, and the orphan children of the Church.

The Presbytery has the sole power of making a minister, minister's widow, or orphan children beneficiaries of the Board.

The application must be filled out and signed by the Moderator and Stated Clerk of the Presbytery and forwarded to the Corresponding Secretary and Treasurer of the Board.

Simply reporting names of persons in need is not making them beneficiaries of the Board. They must be made beneficiaries in the regular order to receive help from the Board.

Presbyteries which have beneficiaries of the Board who have become able to resume active work, thus providing for themselves, should notify the Corresponding Secretary and Treasurer to drop their names from the roll.

The Home will not receive any person who has any form of contagious disease or who is insane.

A widow, should she marry, ceases to be a beneficiary of the Board.

The Corresponding Secretary and Treasurer shall make a full report of all finances handled during the year and submit his books, vouchers, and papers for the inspection and auditing of the Board at its February meeting.

The Home at Bowling Green, Ky.

The reports of C. V. Oakley, President of the Local Board of Control, and J. G. Denhardt, Treasurer of the Board of Managers of the Home, are herewith submitted and made parts of this annual report.

Report of C. V. Oakley, President.

To the Board of Ministerial Relief of the Cumberland Presbyterian Church:

I am, as President of the Local Board of Control of the Cumberland Presbyterian Widows' and Orphans' Home located in Bowling Green, Ky., advised that it is an annual custom to report to your Board the conditions of the Home and the happenings of interest during the past twelve months.

Therefore it gives your local Board pleasure to report to you that in our judgment the Home and its affairs are in very good condition generally. Mrs. C. G. Chick is in charge of the Home's affairs, she being ably assisted by her husband, Rev. C. G. Chick, at a salary of \$45 per month—no help being furnished. In view of the fact that Rev. and Mrs. Chick are in charge we feel as if the spiritual interests of the Home were well guarded.

At present we have nine children in the Home. They are: Annie Delesline Vanhook, Margurete Vanhook, Paul Howery, Harry Howery, Mayme Leeper, Clanton Clampitt, Johnie Clampitt, Mytie Rese Clampitt, and Finis Clampitt.

We are further glad to report health conditions in the Home have been very good during the past twelve months with the children. Dr. T. W. Stone, the Home's physician, has been very faithful in looking after the health of those connected with the Home. Just at this time we have three cases of measles, but we expect no bad results.

We are sorry to report the death of Dr. J. H. Hendrick who died at the Home on the morning of March 16, 1919, after a lingering illness of several months. The matron, Board, and every one connected in any way with the Home did all in their power to relieve the sufferings of Dr. Hendrick. We kept a nurse with him day and night for more than five months at a cost of from \$30 to \$60 per month. A part of this expense has been paid by the sons of the deceased. The funeral services were conducted by Revs. C. A. Galloway and C. G. Chick from the Cumberland Presbyterian Church at this place, and the burial took place in the Fairview Cemetery by the side of the remains of his wife.

It might be of interest to your Board to know that since our last report the two older children in the Home, Anna D. and Margurette Vanhook, have made bright professions of religion and united with the local Church.

All the children of school age are in school and doing nicely. Mrs. Chick is assisting them in their studies as best she can.

At present two of the rooms in the home are being occupied by students and bring into the Board a monthly income of about \$20.

As you will observe from Treasuler Denhardt's report, which follows, our expenses have ran a little high for the past twelve months, but we have done the best we could under existing circumstances. We are quite sure the Board will understand the high cost of living and the added expense on account of illness.

Too, we wish to thank Rev. John A. McLane, Treasurer of your Board, for his promptness and kindness in the matter of furnishing us the necessary funds with which to meet expenses.

Finally, your Board wishes to thank the Board of Ministerial Relief for their hearty co-operation and splendid support in the care of this institution, which, in our opinion, is one of the noblest and Christ-like undertakings of the Board and Church at large.

REPORT OF THE BOARD OF MISSIONS AND CHURCH ERECTION.

Dear Brethren: The earth has made another circuit around the sun, and the time has come for us, your servants, to report what we have done. We have neither been inactive nor uninterested, but have tried to arouse every Church and every Cumberland Presbyterian so that he or she might see the need of our Church and the great opportunity that is ours. We have talked, we have written, we have printed, and we have sent an appeal to most of the churches stating the Board's needs. We have published quarterly reports in the Church paper, hoping the congregations which had not done anything for missions would see they were not represented and would send an offering; some of them did; and some congregations, which had remitted, doubled their offering. By telling the Church sessions how much money we needed, as a result, we have received more money since our last report than we have in any year we have been members of the Board. Some of our churches are beginning to see we can do and are able to do. Your Board blieves the Church is on the eve of a great awakening on the subject of missions.

The Board of Missions has not been indifferent to any of the many calls for assistance coming from all parts of the Church; neither has it been uninformed as to the needs and the great demand upon our denomination, especially in the home field, since 1906, when a large number of members whose names were on our roll went out from us, leaving a large number of our congregations too weak to employ a minister regularly. This state of things is so generally and vividly before our membership in each of our seventy or more Presbyteries that the Board often becomes perplexed to know where to use the small amount placed in its hands. It is very evident that a large percent of the membership of the Church does not and cannot understand the

many hindrances and great difficulties which must be overcome by the Board of Missions in the prosecution of its work. These worthy and very important points needing help are so numerous and so generally distributed over the entire bounds of the Church where our people see and understand their condition, and because the Board does not help them, a number of our Synods and some Presbyteries have organized their own Board of Missions in order to help those directly under their care. The Assembly's Board has never complained at this; we understand the situation. Many of our good people have never understood the fact that the Board has spent the greater part of its strength to save the Church organicallly—that is, we have supplemented the salary of a minister, partly to perputuate the life of a Presbytery or a Synod. Thus it will be seen how easy it is for some to feel like the Assembly's Board may be made up of men incompetent or unqualified to fill the very important position they occupy.

Again many of our people have no means of knowing how very difficult it is to secure men just suited for these various fields, for the salary we could offer. Since our people are beginning to more thoroughly understand the situation, they are more co-operative, contributing a much larger amount during the last year than for a number of years before. The work has been more satisfactory than any year since the effort was made to destroy our denomination. The Board is now planning for an advance movement, with the hope and expectation of doing a much greater work in building up than we have been able to do during all of these reconstructing years.

WHAT THE BOARD IS DOING.

Synod of Alabama.

The Board is supplementing the salary of Rev. T. B. Nation, ten dollars a month, who is preaching at Oneonta one-fourth of his time. Oneonta is a county seat and a place of importance to the Springville Presbytery. Brother Nation found the church building in a dilapidated condition and the members disheartened. The church has been repaired and made a respectable place of worship. The congregation is growing slowly, but surely.

Synod of Arkansas.

De Queen.—Rev. George E. Greer is the faithful missionary at this place, whose salary we supplement—ten dollars a month. Brother Greer reports that the congregation is growing. Several of the members have died during the last year, but the additions have been more than the deaths.

Synod of Mississippi.

The two missionaries, whose salaries we were supplementing—ten dollars a month—have resigned. On March 5, 1919, there was a conference of representative men in this Synod who requested the Board to help on the salary of two missionaries for one year—\$340. These missionaries are to give all their time to Yazoo Presbytery. The Board granted the request.

Synod of Missouri.

Springfield Church.—Rev. J. B. Eshman is the efficient missionary pastor of this Church. The Board is supplementing the salary of the missionary—fifteen dollars a month. Brother Eshman is doing a good work in Springfield and should be helped by the Board until the Church is able to support the pastor.

Pacific Synod.

Los Angeles.—Rev. C. H. Walton is our missionary in this one of the most important cities on the coast. The Board pays fifteen dollars a month on his salary. Brother Walton and Charles E. Bott, the treasurer of the congregation, report that the Church is active in all departments of Church work. These brethren think there is a bright future for this Church. By the order of the General Assembly we have paid on the church debt \$125.

Merced.—Rev. J. D. Lewis, the pastor of the Merced congregation, is slowly and surely building up this Church. The Board pays \$25 a month on his salary. Brother Lewis has resigned, to take effect April 1. The session has called Rev. W. M. Freeze, and he has accepted the call. The Church at Fresno has called Rev. W. M. Bennett, and he has accepted. These Churches will not be vacant, for as soon as the retiring

pastor leaves the pastor-elect will take charge. It is the intention of the Board to continue to supplement the pastor's salary at Merced as we have been doing.

San Francisco.—Rev. B. H. Baker was the pastor of the San Francisco Church until January 1, 1919, when he resigned. We were paying \$25 a month on his salary. We need a house in San Francisco and must have one, if we keep up a church in that city. If we are going to occupy the cities, we must have large sums of money. We must think in thousands of dollars and not in cents.

Synod of Texas.

Dallas.—In obedience to the order of the General Assembly in session at Dallas, Tex., in May, 1918, we paid \$1,293 on the Dallas Church debt, for which we hold a deed to the Dallas Church.

Gainesville.—On the recommendation and by the request of Denton Presbytery, the Board is supplementing the slary of Rev. W. B. Andress—\$25 a month—who is the pastor of the Gainesville Church.

China.

This Assembly should select not less than two of the safest and wisest men to go to China and organize a Presbytery there. The Assembly should provide for the expenses of these men and their salaries for not less than three years, or for sufficient time for them to do the work. It will take from two to three years to get the Presbytery in good running order. We ought to start the brethren in China right. At the end of three years, if the Assembly should think best, the men could return to America. We need these men in China as soon as we can get them there to indoctrinate the brethren.

Bequests to the Board.

The living know they must die, therefore while in health they should make their wills; and if they think best to do so, they should leave a part of their estate to the Cumberland Presbyterian Board of Missions and Church Erection. All money left to the Board will be used in preaching the everlasting gospel to the people of earth, while the donors will be praising the Lord with that innumerable multitude, gathered from all nations of the earth, around the throne of God.

Terms of Office Which Expire at This Assembly.

The time for which Revs. A. M. Buchanan and J. W. Duvall were elected expires at this meeting. We recommend that these men succeed themselves.

ANNUAL REPORT OF THE BOARD OF PUBLICATION, SUNDAY SCHOOL AND YOUNG PEOPLE'S WORK.

To the General Assembly of the Cumberland Presbyterian Church in session at Fayetteville, Ark., May 15, 1919:

Dear Fathers and Brethren: We herewith submit the report of the Board of Publication, Sunday School and Young People's Work, April 1, 1918, to April 1, 1919.

This Board has held several meetings during the year and have sought to be faithful stewards of the trust committed to them.

There have been obstacles which have prevented your Board from accomplishing all her members would liked to have seen done; however, we think our report will show an encouraging degree of progress and profit.

The world-war has had its influence to prevent the largest degree of progress; and in view of the state of the mind of the people we have sought to be conservative in the work.

All branches of the work have been looked after as the judgment of the Board indicated from time to time should be done.

The step taken by the Board of greatest interest to the Church at large was the purchasing of The Cumberland Presbyterian Banner with all the machinery and equipments belonging to it. Your Board was moved to make this purchase more to bring about a consolidation of the publishing interest of the Church than for any other reason, the Board understanding from the spirit of the last meeting of the General Assembly that it was the will of the denomination that such union should be brought about. The Board believes that this union makes possible great improvements in our publishing interest; and if the Church will stand by the Board in this important step it is believed that not only greater prosperity in this department of Church work will be attained but that all denominational interests will be promoted because of the harmony brought about throughout the denomination.

The Board is expected to be able to give the Church a better weekly paper and to increase the merit of the Sunday school literature. It also hopes to be able in the future to do more in publishing and handling books than it has been able to do in the past.

A limited amount of field work for Sunday School and Young People's Work has been done during the year, with very satisfactory results. In addition to the work done by the field man at large, a number of persons in various Presoyteries have done faithful service in this line. Especially has been most encouraging the increased number of conventions and institutes which have been held. There is a marked increase in improved methods and plans of work in many parts of the Church—among our Sunday schools.

The Young People's Work has not grown as rapidly as we had wished, owing to the absence of so many young men in government service and the craze for worldly

amusements. As many of our young men are now returning to civil life, we are expecting better things in this department in the future.

Much correspondence has been carried on during the year in striving to develope this work and to furnish a bureau of information concerning the various problems of this department of work.

Our people are taking our own Sunday school literature in a most encouraging degree, and they seem to appreciate it. But few adverse criticisms ever come to the office on the merit of it, but many words of appreciation we hear from verious sources. Now, since the publishing interests of the denomination have been united, we are expecting to make some recognized improvements.

The Church has showed her interest in this department of the work by liberal offerings for its support.

An excellent program for Children's Day exercises has been gotten out, which will help our Sunday schools in the observance of Children's Day. More should be made out of these special days in Sunday schools. They not only offer an opportunity for rallying the interest of the school, but make possible the emphasizing of the great things for which the days stand from time to time. The Church should, in all ways possible, foster the interest of Sunday schools and young people's organizations. The need for this is greater to-day than ever before.

It is the desire of the Board that this meeting of the General Assembly shall more clearly define the duties of the Board's work in employing those who are to do the work of the Board, especially as it relates to the Board's part in the employment of its employees. The Board ask this that it may fully understand her duty to the Assembly and to the Church at large.

Furthermore, when the money was being raised for the purchasing of the machinery for the present publishing work of the Church, it was announced that the Board would arrange for the Church at large to locate the publishing plant at whatever point the Church thought best.

The publishing interest has now reached the point, in the judgment of the members of the Board, when the plant should be moved from Radnor, where it was located when the machinery was bought. Its inconveniences from the post office and material for work, as well as far from constituency, make it necessary. It is believed that if it is to remain near Nashville, Tenn., where it is now located, it should be moved into the city; and if it is ever to be removed to some other point than Nashville, that time is now. The Board ask that this General Assembly take such steps as it thinks wise to permanently locate the plant.

The General Assembly will observe that the time for which F. A. Seagle, W. H. McLeskey, and T. Ashburn, members of the Board, were elected to serve expires at this meeting of the Assembly and that it becomes the duty of this Assembly to elect them or others in their places for the next three years.

The financial report of the Treasurer is herewith attached as a part of this report.

REPORT OF THE BOARD OF TITHING.

This Assembly year, just closing, has been a good year for the great and important work of our Tithing Board.

First, we call attention to the past. It will surely be of interest to recall some of the deliverances of the past Assemblies through the reports of their respective Committees on Tithing.

The Past.—The 1913 Assembly said: "We believe that tithing has ever been, is, and ever will be God's plan of financing his visible Church."

The 1914 Assembly said: "We believe tithing to be one of the most important subjects before the Church, and the only Scriptural way by which the present financial problems may be solved."

The 1915 Assembly said: "The Bible teaches tithing as the financial system of the kingdom of God. Our denomination will do well to continue to preach and practice this Biblical plan for financing the Church."

The 1917 Assembly said: "Perhaps no movement has been put on foot in recent years, by any Church, of greater importance to the cause of the Master than that of the organization of a Tithing Board of the Cumberland Presbyterian Church. It marks the beginning of a new era in the history of the Church. We are glad to

note the fact that this great movement possesses the elements of progress and success along Scriptural lines. The outlook is brighter every day."

The 1918 Assembly said:

- "1. God's plan of financing his Church, as is set forth in the Holy Scriptures, is tithing. 'The tithe is the Lord's.'
- "2. All should pay a tithe of their net income, or a tenth, to the support of the Lord's cause."

It is a fact worthy of consideration, that ten different States are represented in the personnel of these different committees.

Our people will be interested to know that four members of our Board, and our former president, have seen service with our army and navy—Rev. J. J. Cobb, Rev. M. L. Clemens, and H. M. Baker, over seas; and Rev. J. G. Stewart and Rev. W. Y. Durrett in the home-land.

The Present.—Never before has there been such an encouraging interest in the subject of tithing. In these days we, as patriots, are being called upon for fabulous sums of money to help our government do its big business. Now, beyond doubt, is the day when we as Christians should be doing bigger things than ever before for the Church

It is a glad day, when on every hand men are seeing the worth of the so-called "Almighty Dollar" as an agency for glorifying Almighty God.

We count the Cumberland Presbyterian Church fortunate in having the continued capable services of our Treasurer, Mrs. Daisy Bray Freeman. Her present report of the finances of our Board in an inspiration to all loyal Cumberland Presbyterians.

The Future.—That what we have gained may not be lost, but increased many fold, we ask for the full co-operation of all our membership for the days to come.

We recommend: 1. That every minister in our Church preach at least one tithing sermon to his congregation every year.

- 2. That every minister in our Church preach a sermon on tithing during every revival he conducts,
 - 3. That every Presbytery elect or appoint a Presbyterial Tithing Secretary.
- 4. That a congregational Tithing Secretary be elected or appointed in every congregation throughout the Church.
- 5. That every congregation take an offering for the Board of Tithing either in the month of March or July of every year.
- 6. That every member of our Church be asked to pay one-tenth of his or her net income to the support of the Lord's cause, remembering that "the tithe is the Lord's" (Lev. 27:30) and that we have no moral or religious right to use for our own personal purposes that which does not belong to us.

REPORT OF COMMITTEE ON REVIVAL WORK,

Your Committee on Revival and Evangelistic Work reports as follows:

We would impress the fact that our Church is in imminent danger of getting into the whirlpool with other denominations and being swallowed up, or rather down, into the horrible depths of formality, where a partial reformation is agreed to instead of a deep-felt conviction and Godly sorrow for sin, and where signing a card or "hitting the trail" is substituted for the new tirth and Holy Ghost religion is almost entirely disbelieved in.

Former General Assemblies have passed the reports of this committee by with a cold, indifferent reading and then proceeded to give honors of enthusiastic consideration to less important subjects and questions that were necessary. Certainly so, but why almost ignore the great question, the fundamental question, that concerns the very life of human souls and also the very life of the Cumberland Presbyterian Church.

We are far from the belief that the Church is about dead to the doctrine of the new birth, Holy Ghost religion, and old-time revival work. We have much of the same heavenly fire that burned into the very souls of multitudes in the early days of our Church. We have many preachers proclaiming the precious gospel as our fathers did, but it is generally admitted that there is a sad decline in these very important things in all the Churches—our own not excepted. When did a Presbytery, a Synod, or a General Assembly ever give time and due consideration to "Holy Ghost Revival Work" and the necessity of the new birth even equal to minor subjects? If any do so, some of us do not witness the glorious work, nor even hear of it.

We recommend that this report go into the hands of a special committee, and said committee make its report on same, suggesting an appropriate hour for the General Assembly to enter into prayerful consideration of this Bible, soul-saving question.

We also recommend that this Assembly press upon each Presbytery the very urgent necessity of an efficient committee being appointed to bring before the churches and people the great necessity of revival work in every church, and that revival work is worse than none when the regeneration of the souls of men, women, and children is not accomplished.

We recommend that you recommend to the several Presbyteries to have said committees make their report to their respective Presbyteries and that the whole Presbytery enter into a whole-soul consideration of the subject.

We recommend also that each Presbytery appoint a day of fasting and prayer for the Holy Ghost revival and soul-saving power to come on our Church to such a glorious extent that our preachers will preach the gospel with a new zeal and our members everywhere have the holy fire kindled afresh in their hearts. Our Church sessions and Presbyteries and Synods should all become live wires. Then our General Assemblies will be composed of Holy Ghost men and our Boards made up of the same heaven-filled material; and then, yes, then, we will love each other with the pure Christ love; jealousy, envy, and unholy suspicions will crop out no more; unkind and unchristian thrusts will find a place in our Church papers no more, and then the Cumberland Presbyterian Church will be filling its mission, and God will use it in saving vast multitudes. You may call this a day-dream if you will, but one thing must be admitted by all: it is God's will for it to be realized.

Your committee reports that the handbook on revival work, setting forth the plan of salvation, etc., has been unavoidably delayed, but is now ready for distribution. The expense of publication and distribution is met by the chairman of this committee.

REPORT OF THE COMMITTEE ON PROHIBITION.

Dear' Fathers and Brethren: Your committee feels that they need not at this time try to make a lengthy report on this important question so often brought before us; but, yet, it requires "line upon line, precept upon precept, here a little and there a little."

By our faithful effort and prayers to the cause of prohibition for our entire beloved nation, year in and year out, we have at last almost reached the goal. Therefore let us take courage and press on till we have fully accomplished that great task which God has committed to his believing sons and daughters.

As you are well aware, every stillhouse and browery and saloon are to be closed on the first of July by government order. More than three-fourths of the State legislatures have ratified the proposed constitutional "amendment to the United States Constitution."

This therefore confirms national prohibition; yet we must remember that catching the lion and the bear is only a part of the work of the hunter; he must then be killed or caged so securely that he never can break out. If we have now caught the demon liquor traffic, if we have put to silence this destroyer of life—this miserable blight on the human race—then it must be kept in subjection so that it never can again break forth to curse our men, women, and children again. So if we have won the fight, then let's keep it won.

The foregoing is written because that we know from observations and past experiences that the old demon liquor never takes a vacation. "The United Liquor Association" is now at work to get a repeal of the proposed amendment to the Federal constitution. They are also at work to defeat the measure in some of the States by declaring that the State constitution provides that any amendment must be submitted to the people for a popular vote and hereby they hope to defeat the measure in enough of the States to break the three-foruths majority of the vote of the legislatures.

So we must still be on guard; we must still be up and doing, for the devils never all sleep at one time. They are pleading now, as they have for time past, that the closing of the traffic will put so many thousand men out of work, that the whole country will be flooded with tramps and beggars, that our towns and cities will be bankrupt and that even our government will go broke because of the lack of revenue which will be cut off by the closing of the stillhouse, the brewery, and the saloon; that our people will be burdened with taxation to make up the \$325,000,000, which is about the revenue the government has been getting from them. But we know that the revenue from the whiskey traffic is the most exorbitant taxation that ever was put on a nation of people. It not only takes a heavy toll of money out of the pockets of our men and women, but it takes the heaviest toll of life, both for time

and eternity to come, that any other one industry that has ever been known to humanity. "What shall it profit a man if he shall gain the whole world and lose his own soul?"

Note the following startling facts:

We have been spending in one year \$2,000,000,000 for booze.

We have been spending in one year \$2,000,000,000 for bread and clothes.

We don't need booze, but we do need bread and clothes.

Wage-earners employed in each industry: intoxicating liquors, 62,620 people; bread and clothes, 493,825 people, many times as many wage-earners as the liquor interests employ. What a vast difference between the costs of the two industries, and what a vast difference between the number of people employed in the two! The one we need, and the other we do not need.

The executive powers of the United States and of England, France, Russia, and Germany have each acknowledged that liquor cannot be tolerated in time of war; then why should it ever have been tolerated in time of peace? If these leading governments cannot allow their soldiers to drink, much more they cannot afford to let their civilians drink.

There will come into your Assembly at this meeting a communication from the "Inter-Church Movement of North America," with headquarters in New York, calling for a special convention to be held this coming summer, to make out some plans to safeguard our interests and to advance the cause in every way possible. We beg this Assembly to give this communication due consideration and to elect one or more delegates to the coming said Convention. It is important that our Church should be represented in this national Convention.

REPORT OF COMMITTEE ON HISTORICAL SOCIETY.

To the Moderator and Brethren of the General Assembly in session at Fayette-ville, Ark.:

Dear Fathers: Your Secretary of the Historical Society would report as follows: We have been from time to time reporting that we had had no meeting, because no funds were at hand to defray the expenses of the members to such meeting, and the members were scattered so very much that it was impossible to attend such meeting. We now suggest the possibility of beginning the work of writing the history of our Church as it has been so very long since anything of a nature to reflect credit upon our Church has been written as a lasting history. We think that we should begin to write now, so that much that has been transpiring in the last decade should not be forgotten.

We would suggest that your honorable body create a society or committee of such character as to be capable of overseeing the writing of this history and give into their hands the work of parceling out to the different men of our Church the different chapters of said history.

We would suggest that one chapter for instance should be given to some man capable of dealing with the history of the legal phases of the past few years, another the spiritual work, and another the revising of the early history. A committee of the proper men could do this and not be at any great amount of expense. Should this meet the approbation of the Assembly, we suggest that you proceed at once to appoint the committee, giving to the Secretary and Treasurer the right to collect funds to meet the necessary expenses of at least one meeting of the committee.

WAR WORK COMMISSION.

To the Eighty-Ninth General Assembly of the Cumberland Presbyterian Church:
Brethren: The report of your War Work Commission must necessarily be brief.
It was at your last meeting we received from you our charter for the special work committed to us. And while we are glad the special emergency for which your Commission was created practically passed away with the signing of the armistice last November between the belligerent nations, including our own government; yet we are not unmindful of the momentous nature of the work committed to us. We

only regret that we have not been able to meet the needs and opportunities as fully as we have felt their importance required.

Being commissioned with the special work of securing appointments of ministers from our Church to chaplaincies in the army and navy of the United States, in the then pending great war involving nearly all the civilized nations of the world, and giving them such financial aid and other encouragement as might be at our disposal, as your reverend body is aware, the work and duties imposed came when much of the opportunities had passed. Yet we are glad to report that we found the Church ready to supply your Commission with whatever funds that might be needed.

Those of our Church who received appointments to chaplaincies, in either the army and navy, some oversea and others in the home camps, were as follows:Rev. I. K. Floyd, Rev. L. M. Clemens, Rev. A. C. Stribling, Rev. W. Y. Durrett, Rev. T. S. Wood, Rev. Thomas Dyer, Rev. J. G. Stewart, and Rev. J. A. Deaver. As all have been apprised, one of the number, Rev. J. A. Deaver, fell in an offensive movement somewhere on the battle front in France last October. Rev. M. L. Clemens, near the same time and in a similar movement, received severe wounds, but from which, we assume, he has recovered.

Offerings.

We have received in offering, from individuals and congrgations, for the support of the work the sum of \$1,131.64. As these offerings were published from week to week as they were received, credited to the several individuals and congregations, we do not deem it advisable to encumber this report with each separtely.

It will be noted that several of the chaplains received no help from the Commission. While greatly regreted, this was because of the fact that in each such instance appointment and the over-sea trip had been made either prior to the appointment of your Commission or before any funds had been received for the particular purpose. We feel that had this Commission been appointed by your reverend body at the session prior to your last much more might have been accomplished in its field. However, thi sis only a human estimate of our efforts or lapses in our efforts. As to whether we have done well, or might have done better under conditions seemingly more favorable, we must leave to the unerring judgment of the Infallible One whose kingdom we have sought to serve in our humble and limited way.

As the particular purpose for which we as a Commission were appointed to serve has passed away, at least in its most real and tragic nature, we leave any question of our further continuation as an agency of service to your judgment. And in event it is your judgment that an occasion no longer exists for our continuation, we would recommend that the funds on hand be converted into the treasury of your Board of Missions, with special instructions that any portion of it be used as far as practicable in aiding chaplains from our Church still in the service.

In concluding this report, we should not overlook one painful experience that eame to us in the death of one of our members, Ruling Elder J. J. Keaton, of Milan, Tenn.

REPORT OF THE BOARD OF TRUSTEES OF BETHEL COLLEGE.

To the General Assembly of the Cumberland Presbyterian Church, in session at Fayetteville, Ark., May 15, 1919:

Fathers and Brethren: Inasmuch as the General Assembly has taken Bethel College under its fostering care, and as the Synod of West Tennessee at its meeting in McKenzie, Tenn., November 12, 1918, has instructed the Board of Trustees of Bethel College to again offer the General Assembly of the Cumberland Presbyterian Church Bethel College, according to the order of the Board of Trustees of Bethel College in session in McKenzie, Tenn., May 1, 1919, we submit the following report and the offer made by the Synod. (See minutes of Synod of West Tennessee, 1918, page 23.)

Report of Board of Trustees of Bethel College.

Sec. 1. We thank you for taking Bethel College under your fostering care and for giving the college the proceeds arising from the Cynthia Smith bequest. We regret to report that we have received nothing from this bequest.

Sec. 2. For the last three years it has been a great task to try to run the college, as nearly all of the male students entered the army. Last year the Board of Trustees asked the Church for one thousand dollars. With this amount added to the proceeds from the Cynthia Smith bequest, we felt sure we could maintain the school.

As previously stated, we have not received anything from the Cynthia bequest, and the Church has given us \$625.30. We have been able to continue the school only because our three literary teachers, Prof. N. J. Finney, Prof. J. R. Garrett, and Miss Grigsby have been true and loyal to our school's interest. They have tault reardlessg of salary. Our enrollment is fifty-three pupils for the year 1918-19. Ministerial, and missionary students and children of preachers have been charged only half tuition. We owe on teachers' salaries for years 1917, 1918, and 1919 \$601.75. This amount has been borrowed by the Board of Trustees of Bethel College, the property being responsible for the debt.

Sec. 3. We recommend, in case you continue your fostering care, that the Assembly provide at least twenty-five hundred dollars for the maintenance of Bethel College. If this amount is guaranteed, we can pay off our indebtedness for teachers' salaries and offer free tuition to all missionary and ministerial students. All they will need to pay will be the incidental fee of four dollars per annum.

Sec. 4. If you continue your present relation to Bethel College, we would suggest that you either appoint a committee to look after the Assembly's interest; or, as your Board of Education meets at McKenzie, you might give some authority and instructions concerning the college. This, of course, is not germane, if you accept the offer of West Tennessee Synod.

Sec. 5. The Board of Trustees has elected the Faculty for 1919-1920, and is as follows: N. J. Finney, President; J. R. Garrett, A. M.; Miss N. E. Grigsby, M. A.; Miss Ethel Fisk, Expression; Mrs. W. D. Kelley, Piano; Miss Willodine Curtis, Voice.

Sec. 6. Prof. N. J. Finney kindly offered to raise a fund for laboratory equipment. He has raised about three hundred and twenty dollars, and said sum has been used for the pupose designated. This equipment is to go to the school to be established by the General Assembly for both Literary and Theological Departments and will be delivered to the "one" school when organized.

Value of Bethel College.

Sec. 7. One building on four acres of ground, well situated; building in front is three stories high, in back, two stories; front has six class rooms, two on each floor, and back consists of study hall seating capacity 200, and two class rooms. Auditorium on second floor, 40 x 70 feet; domitory with sixteen rooms on second and third floors, dining room and kitchen in basement. With an expenditure of five thousand dollars, the building used only for teaching purposes, could accommodate three hundred students. The value of building and grounds for school purposes is, perhaps, about twenty thousand dollars—that is, a building similar to the college

would cost at the very least twenty-five thousand dollars. As real estate, it is worth eight thousand dollars.

REPORT OF THE ENDOWMENT FUND.

To the Eighty-Ninth General Assembly of the Cumberland Presbyterian Church, in session at Fayetteville, Ark., May 15 to 21, 1919:

Dear Fathers and Brethren: Your Educational Endowment Committee, appointed at Dallas, Tex., 1918, begs leave to submit the following report:

After the completion of the various war work drives, your Chairman, H. S. Seagle, took up by correspondence the question committed to your committee. A meeting of the full committee was desired and a number of places for the meeting were mentioned and each member asked to name preference. A majority, however, expressed themselves as being unable to meet, but nearly all promised endorsement to any plan that your Chairman might advise. After further correspondence and personal communication with some of the members the campaign was launched.

In order to comply with the spirit of the General Assembly, with reference to the Theological Endowment, as well as the Literary Educational Endowment, your Chairman asked the special committee appointed by the Board of Theological Seminary, for the purpose of raising their \$100,000, to co-operate with your Assembly's committee in raising the whole in a single campaign.

This committee of the Theological Seminary consisted of Rev. J. L. Hudgins, Rev. T. C. Newman, and Elder D. M. McAnulty. These brethren have heartily joined with your committee, and we desire that you ratify this action, in combining the work of raising funds for our Educational Endowment, both Literary and Theological, and that the three brethren be officially recognized as members of the Endowment Committee.

Your committee in combining the work agreed on a campaign to raise \$500,000, one-fifth of same to go to the Theological Endowment or until their full amount of \$100,000 shall have been raised. No subscription to be binding until \$250,000 shall have been subscribed.

The terms are more fully set out in subscription note, a copy of which is hereto attached to be made a matter of record with this report:

In consideration of the effort of the Educational Endowment Committee of the Cumberland Presbyterian General Assembly, named at its session in Dallas, Tex., in 1918, to secure \$500,000 for Perpetual Endowment of an Educational Institution, and further consideration of other subscriptions, total amounting to not less than \$250,000, I hereby promise to pay to such fund the sum of..... dollars.

Payable to the Treasurer of said Educational Endowment Committee, one-fourth cash on demand and the balance one, two, and three years in equal installments, with interest from date at the rate of four per cent per annum.

It is agreed that this subscription is to be dated by the Treasurer of said Endowment Committee when the minimum of \$250,000 has been subscribed.

It is mutually understood that one dollar in every five of this subscription shall go to the Endowment Committee of the Theological Seminary until their full quota of \$100,000 Perpetual Endowment has been reached; the balance for Endowment of a Literary School as per terms and spirit of Assembly Resolution.

Note.—The Committee will accept Liberty Bonds at par value in payment of subscriptions.

You will observe that we did not put on the note that War Savings Stamps would be accepted in payment, as we could hold only \$1,000, hence would have to ask the donor to cash them, and this would be inconsistent with the government's saving plan.

The plan determined upon was to consider each Presbytery as a unit or zone with a quota determined by the number of members. He delivered an address, opening the campaign at Chattanooga, Tenn., on the first Sunday of February, visited Kentucky Synod, Knoxville, Greenville, Nashville, and had planned to visit many other places, giving his whole time to the work until the meeting of the General Assembly when he hoped to announce the \$250,000 mark reached and so "break the pitchers with a shout and go on to the goal of one-half million." But, alas! 'tis not so. The three addresses in Nashville early in March were his last. He contracted a severe cold which attacked his throat, developed influenza and pneumonia, and on March 22 your leader, a man with a vision, was called home ere he had finished his task.

Just here recognizing the need of the continuance of the work, and being familiar with my brother's plans, after consulting with some friends of the enterprise, the writer volunteered to follow up the work and mail out additional notes, etc., that might be called for and urged all to send the results of their work in time to give the report to you at this meeting. You will please accept my apology for seeming to be officious or forward in this matter. My only purpose was to act as a mere clerk, or secretary, until the committee or your body should fill the vacancy caused by the death of my brother.

Some of the reports are very good. Others, on account of sickness in their community and homes, were hindered, although interested. Some others have not given their reasons for not responding, hence no comment.

There was no provision made for the expenses of the committee, and we would recommend that some arrangements be made whereby men may be placed in the field at a reasonable salary and expenses to present this great cause, and organize the Presbyteries that are not already active so that this program might be pushed to a successful conclusion. Office help should also be provided for.

The traveling expenses, printing, stamps, and all other expenses of the office of your Chairman, Rev. H. S. Seagle, have been met and are not chargable to the General Assembly. May the same spirit of sacrifice and love for the Church that prompted him prompt you and the membership of our Church to do our whole duty in this very necessary undertaking.

REPORT OF MUSIC EDITOR.

2642 Caldwell Ave., Woodbine Station, Nashville, Tenn., May 12, 1919.

To the General Assembly of the Cumberland Presbyterian Church to convene in Fayetteville, Ark., May 15, 1919, greeting:

Moderator, Fathers, and Brethren: Permit me once more, as your Music Editor, to call your attention to the fact that the A. S. Barnes Company, New York, has not yet been reimbursed for the outlay of money they put into the publication of our new Church hymnal, "The Songs of Zion."

These publishers agreed to publish the hymnal for the Church on their own account, believing that the whole Church, through its congregations, would support them in the venture by patronizing the book. Many of our congregations have bought the book, and their testimonials show that they are delighted with it. But a majority of our churches have not bought the book yet, and I make a most

earnest plea that you will more earnestly urge all our churches to buy the book. If all would do this, it would be such a relief to the publishers who, to accommodate the Church, undertook to furnish the hymnal when our own Board was unable to undertake it.

The publishers not only agreed to get the book out in two notations, both round and shaped notes, which almost doubled the cost of getting out the book ,but they also agreed to get out an edition with "Scripture selections for the responsive service," all of which they have complied with. In fact, they have complied with every part of agreement. Now is it to the honor of the Church to let these men suffer loss? Will it be to the credit of the Church to permit such a thing? You cannot afford it. What has been done in the matter of having this hymnal published was with the sanction of both the Assembly and the Board of Publication.

I make my plea in behalf of the publishers who are strangers to us and have no way of getting acquainted with us and our way of doing business only through this business transaction. Do we wish them to form a favorable opinion of our Church? Then let the whole Church rally for this once and let the burden which these men have been carrying for us be removed and let us no longer try to hide behind the fact that we have heen involved in a world-war. The war is over, and now we want to get back to a normal way of doing our work and meeting our obligations as a Christian Church.

I make my plea in behalf of the publishers of our Church hymnal. I do not make a plea for myself, although I bore all the cost of preparing the book. It did not cost the Assembly nor the Board a cent. Neither did it cost any one else anything; and when the publishers wanted the Board to advance \$1,500 towards the publication of the book, to be returned to the Board in books as soon as ready, knowing that our Board was not in financial condition to do this, I proposed to advance \$500 myself on this proposition, which was accepted and the work begun; and while I have sold enough books to reimburse me for this outlay, I have never received a cent in the way of royalty, nor a cent from the Assembly nor the Board for my work on the book, and am not asking it now. What I have done I have gladly done for my Church, while other editors have been paid \$1,500 or more per annum for their work. I am living in expectation of receiving the greater part of the renumeration for my services when I get to heaven. The late Rev. V. B. Costello, missionary of Tennessee Synod, said to me a short time before his death that the Assembly should come to my relief and that of the publishers by taking definite action that would relieve the situation. He said this hymnal was the product of the Assembly and that but for the action of the Assembly, the hymnal would never have been published, therefore the Assembly should feel obligated to stand by and support the venture, inasmuch as the Assembly was responsible for the hymnal being published, which the publishers would not have undertaken and did not undertake until they were assured the book had been adopted by the Assembly and endorsed by the Board of Publica-

At my suggestion the publishers made the following proposition to the Board of Publication:

"New York, January 8, 1918.

Board of Publication, Cumberland Presbyterian Church:

Dear Sirs: At the suggestion of Dr. W. T. Dale, we herewith make you a proposition for handling "The Songs of Zion," the official hymnal of your Church." (After giving the prices of the several editions and styles of binding, they continued): "From these prices we offer you a discount of forty per cent, F. O. B. Nashville, provided you order in 200 or more copy lots, and while our present edition of approximately 3,000 copies each round and shaped note editions lasts. Of the edition with Bible readings, we have none bound at present, but could furnish quickly. Note that we have both round and shaped notes, in both bindings. We should be very glad to enter into this arrangement with you and believe that with your cooperation the book will enjoy a good sale. Yours very sincerely,

The A. S. Barnes Company, S. C. Fairley

I submitted this proposition to the Board on February 26, 1918, and the Board accepted the proposition and made an order for the books, since which time the Board has had the book on sale at The New Cumberland Press.

But I understand that the Board, at its last meeting, voted to turn the books over to me again, offering to give it free advertisement. Now I would rather for the Board to continue to handle the book, thus giving it the moral support and in-

fluence which it deserves at their hands, whether I ever get a cent out of the book or not. It is in the interest of the publishers I still plead, and I am sure that to be successful the book needs to be backed up by both the Assembly and the Board. Brethren, please don't "go back" on your unworthy servant and the publishers in this way. Stand by us until the books have been paid for.

Brother Fooks will distribute circulars at the Assembly, the same as have been appearing in the Advanced Quarterly and Cumberland Presbyterian, giving prices at which the book will now be sold, regardless of the high cost of paper; and these prices will hold good while the present edition lasts.

Now in view of the foregoing statements, will not this Assembly urge in a more earnest way that all our churches supply themselves with this, the latest and only real hymnal that has ever been produced for the Church? All others being only "second-handed" books that had been used by others before being adopted by our Church.

I would urge upon all our congregations to get first of all a good supply of "The Songs of Zion" and then get whatever other book is desirable for the Sabbath School and Young People's Work. But let the hymnal take precedence over every other book in the regular services of the Church.

Now, brthren, if the Church will only listen to these suggestions to be strongly enforced by this Assembly and a sufficient number of books shall be sold to relieve the publishers who have acted so nicely by the Church and have been so patient, you will not be bothered by me again on this matter.

May the Great Head of the Church be with you and guide you in all your deliberations is my prayer. Respectfully submitted,



REPORT OF COMMITTEE ON CREDENTIALS.

REPORT OF COMMITTEE ON TITHING.

We, your Committee on Tithing, make the following report:
(A part of this report is taken from the Board of Tithing.)

This Assembly year just closing has been a good one for the great and important work of Tithing.

First, we call attention to the past. It will surely be of interest to recall some of the deliverances of the past Assemblies, through the reports of their respective Committees on Tithing.

The Past.—The 1913 Assembly said: "We believe that tithing has ever been, is, and ever will be God's plan of financing his visible Church. The 1914 Assembly said: "We believe tithing to be one of the most important subjects before the Church and the only Scriptural way by which the present financial problems may be solved."

The 1915 Assembly said: "The Bible teachs tithing as the financial system of the kingdom of God.

"Our denomination will do well to continue to teach and practice this Biblical plan for financing the Church."

The 1917 Assembly said: "Perhaps no movement has been put on foot in recent years, by any Church, of greater importance to the cause of the Master than that of the organization of the Tithing Board of the Cumberland Presbyterian Church. It marks the beginning of a new period in the history of the Church. We are glad to note the facts that this movement possesses the elements of progress and success along Scriptural lines. The outlook is brighter every day."

The 1918 Assembly said: "First, God's plan of financing his Church, as is set forth in the Holy Scriptures, is tithing. "The tithe is the Lord's.' Second, all should pay the tithe of their net income, or a tenth, to the support of the Lord's cause."

The Present.—Never before has there been such an encouraging interest in the subject of tithing. In these days we, as patriots, are being called upon for fabulous sums of money to help our government do its big business. Now, beyond doubt, is the day when we as Christians should be doing bigger things than ever before for the Church.

It is a glad day when, on every hand, men are seeing the worth of the so-called "Almighty Dollar" as an agency for glorifying Almighty God.

We count the Cumberland Presbyterian Church fortunate in having the continued, capable services of our Treasurer, Mrs. Daisy Bray Freeman. Her present report of the finances of our Board is an inspiration to all Cumberland Presbyterians.

The Future.—That what we have gained may not be lost, but increased many fold; and we ask for the full co-operation of all our membership for the days to come.

We recommend: 1. That every minister in our Church preach at least one tithing sermon to his congregation every year.

- 2. That every minister in our Church preach a sermon on tithing during every revival he conducts.
- 3. That every Synod, Presbytery, and congregation elect or appoint a Tithing Secretary to represent the Tithing Board in their respective fields and to submit a written report of their work—congregation to Presbytery, Presbytery to Synod, and Synod to the General Assembly's Board.
- 4. That every congregation take an offering for the Board of Tithing either in the month of March or July of every year.
 - 5. That every member of our Church be asked to pay one-tenth of his or her net

income to the support of the Lord's cause, remembering that "the tithe is the Lord's" (Lev. 27:30) and that we have no moral or religious right to use for our own personal purposes that which does not belong to us.

6. That we encourage Brother McCord's great work by showing our appreciation for his efforts, not only in the cause of tithing, but also in Sunday school work, missions, obtaining subscriptions to our Church paper—The Cumberland Presbyterian— and the raising of the Endowment Fund by co-operating with him in all manner and ways we might assist him to carry out his plans.

We especially commend Brother McCord for having started the great movement for the endowment of the Hannibal Seagle Chair of Bible Instruction in our new educational institution, thus putting the Bible first as the textbook to be used.

We wish to thank Mrs. McCord and Mrs. M. L. Clemens for the mission work they did in connection with the work of Brother McCord.

We notice that Class 3 of the Tithing Board expires at this sitting of the Assembly. We recommend that the men composing this class be elected to succeed themselves. Their names are as follows: Frank McDonald, Chattanooga, Tenn.; W. E. Marrow, Warrensburg, Mo.; and Rev. J. G. Stewart, in the army.

REPORT OF COMMITTEE ON EDUCATION.

Your Committee on Education would report that we have carefully examined all papers, matters, and interests referred to us; and after careful consideration of each item contained therein, we are indeed grateful to find that in spite of adverse conditions, over which we have no control, the outlook of the work of education is indeed bright, and the work of your Board for the past year is commendable and shows a definite increase.

We believe that the time has come when the Church expects, and the world demands, the best trained men mentally and spiritually that can be produced, and we earnestly believe that each candidate for the ministry in the bounds of the Cumberland Presbyterian Church should seek the best possible training of mind and spirit for so grat a work as laboring in the ministry of our Church for the salvation of souls.

We feel very keenly the need of a more general support of Bethel College. Next year, in view of the fact that our youth very largely will have returned from France, we have faith in the membership of the Cumberland Presbyterian Church that they will show their loyalty by sending their boys and girls who go away to school to Bethel College, inasmuch as is at all practical.

We have also had before us and carefululy considered the proposition submitted to this body by West Tennessee Synod of the gift of Bethel College. Therefore, we would recommend that the General Assembly accept the offer of Bethel College made by West Tennessee Synod and that the present Board of Trustees now acting under the West Tennessee Synod be elected as the General Assembly's Board of Trustees of Bethel College, until the General Assembly shall see proper to elect a permanent Board of Trustees for the ducational institutions of the Cumberland Presbyterian Church.

We recommend further that in order to increase the student body of Bethel College for the year 1919-20 that each pastor canvass his congregation and solicit the attendance of those who contemplate taking a preparatory or a collegiate course, and that we urge all our young ministers who possibly can to avail themselves of the advantages offered by this institution.

We would also recommend that the Rev. W. H. Butler, of Jackson, Tenn., be elected to fill the unexpired term of our lamented Rev. J. A. Deaver, and that Rev.

W. B. Cunningham and Rev. R. H. Jackson be elected to succeed themselves, and that Rev. S. B. Rudolph, of the Mayfield Presbytery, be elected to succeed R. C. Denny.

BUDGET.

The Special Committee to whom was referred a communication adopted by an informal conference of commissioners and visitors to this meeting of the Assembly make the following report:

The communication adopted by the informal meeting above referred to follows mainly the recommendations made by a conference of the representatives of the various Boards of the Church held at Clarksville, Tenn., in December, 1918. We believe that the Boards of the Church have not been supported as they should have been, largely because they have not had a definite goal set before them. We confidently believe that Cumberland Presbyterians will rally to the standards of the Church, and that they will gladly undertake any reasonable task set before them and go over the top with their colors flying. We therefore recommend:

- 1. That the sum of \$90,000 be fixed as the minimum amount that should be raised by the congregations of the Church for the support of the work of the Assembly Boards for the Assembly year 1919 and 1920.
- 2. That to raise this amount, the congregations of the entire Church be requested to raise an amount equal to \$1.50 per resident member, for each congregation, and that this be apportioned to each of the congregations as their apportionment for the year for the use of the Boards and agencies hereinafterward mentioned.
- 3. That you adopt the following as the basis of apportioning this \$90,000: missions, 30 per cent; education, 20 per cent; ministerial relief, 20 per cent; Theological Seminary Board, 5 per cent; Sunday School and Young People's Work, 5 per cent; Board of Tithing, 5 per cent; Board of Publication, 5 per cent, and for paying the expenses of making the campaign to raise the apportionment of the congregations and the expense of the endowment campaign 5 per cent each, or such a part of that per cent as may be needed in carrying on the compaign.
- 4. That the Assembly appoint an executive committee to consist of one member of each of the several Boards to superintend the campaign contemplated in the above recommendation. as follows: Board of Missions, J. E. Eberts, Warrensburg, Mo.; Theological Seminary, Rev. Hugh S. McCord, Marshall, Mo.; Ministerial Relief, Rev. J. T. Coleman, Nashville, Tenn.; Publication, Hon. H. J. Graf, Evansville, Ind.; Frank McDonald, Chattanooga, Tenn.; Education, Rev. J. W. Dishman, McKenzie, Tenn.; Endowment, T. C. Callicott, Rives, Tenn.
- 5. We further recommend that Hon. Frank McDonald, of Chattanooga, Tenn., be the Secretary-Treasurer and General Director of this committee and that all collections be sent direct to him and that he send to each of the Boards their proportionate part of such collection as are received at least once each month.
- 6. We also recommend that the committee provided for above shall plan and direct the campaign for raising this budget, appointing key men in each of the Presbyteries for this purpose and, where it is necessary, to send men into the bounds of Presbyteries to encourage the pastors and people in reaching the goal as herein declared and that this matter be laid upon the hearts of the pastors and people by means of correspondence and the liberal use of the columns of The Cumberland Presbyterian.
- 7. We further recommend that the period for raising this budget extend to April 1, 1920.
- 8. We also recommend that this plan shall not in any sense affect the plans of any of the agencies or Boards already in operation, but shall be in addition to any and all pledges made to any of the Boards of the Church.
 - 9. We further recommend that the five per cent alloted to the Theological Board

be for this year only, since it is expected that by next year the Board will have sufficient income from the endowment to meet all their needs.

MISSIONS.

Your Committee on Missions would respectfully submit the following reports: The following papers have been referred to us: First, the annual report of the Board; second, the annual report of the Permanent Committee on Revival Work; third, the report of the War Work Commission; fourth, report of Gam Sing Quah.

We have carefully considered these reports and have conferred with members of the Board of Missions and the War Work Commission and others in an effort to formulate the best plans possible for your consideration, and herewith submit the results with the earnest desire that you carefully and prayerfully consider them before acting upon them. We recognize that it is our privilege and duty only to propose to your reverend body the plans and suggestions, and yours is the privilege and duty to pass upon their merits.

We have been made deeply and thoroughly conscious of the insignificance of the offerings from the Church at large to your Board, as compared with the crying needs of the field both at home and abroad. This is one of the most vital subjects that we have before us; and we need an awakened Church if we are to grasp the opportunities of this new day in world possibilities.

We feel that the Board has done well with the small offerings that have been placed in their hands; but if we are anxious to put a guarantee upon our future growth as a Church, we must bestir ourselves on the great subject of missions.

There is also complaint made that Presbyteries and Synods are dilitory about reporting to the Boards, the missionary activities and achievements of Presbyterial and Synodical Boards. Year after year the Assembly has urged, instructed, and demanded that these reports be sent the Board, only to have its entreaties ignored.

We therefore suggest that the Board of Missions be instructed to prepare report blanks and furnish them to all Presbyterial and Synodical Missionary Boards, and that these Boards be urged to make reports thereon of their work to the Board, and in those Presbyteries and Synods having no missionary Boards the blanks be sent to the Stated Clerks who shall report any missionary collections or work done in the bounds of their respective organizations.

The Board has asked that your reverend body plan for the organization of a Presbytery in China. We are convinced of the importance of this matter, but are at a loss to know just how best to go about it. We hope the offerings to your Board this year will be such as to warrant them in undertaking this important task, and we recommend that the Board plan to organize a Presbytery in China as soon as sufficient funds are available and that the Board be left to work out the plans for such organization.

We commend the War Work Commission for the success they achieved in their work. Following their suggestion, we recommend that the Commission be discontinued and the funds in their hands, amounting to \$642, be transferred to the Board of Missions.

We recommend the re-election of Rev. J. W. Duvall and Rev. A. M. Buchanan to membership on the Board of Missions. Your committee would modestly suggest that the Boards refrain from suggesting the names of members of their respective Boards in order that all possibility of misunderstanding or friction may be avoided.

We call attention to former deliverances of the Aseembly with reference to the matter of co-operation between the Assembly's Board and Presbyterial or Synodical Boards as touching missionary work undertaken within the bounds of Presbyteries or Synods, where local bounds exist, and reaffirm these deliverances of the Assembly and urge their observance. That is to.say, that the Assembly's Board shall not undertake the establishment of missions within the bounds of any Synod or Presbytery without consultation and co-operation with the Synodical Boards.

Our attention has been called to the fact that some missionary pastors neglect the important matter of taking the offerings for the Boards. We therefore recommend that no missionaries be employed who will not agree to take the offerings for all the Boards. We believe that our people need to be taught to support the general enterprises of the Church and, to this end, urge all pastors to lay these matters on the hearts of their congregations.

We have incorporated the report of the Committee on Revival Work into this report, with their recommendations, and suggest that you adopt the same, as follows:

Your Committee on Revival and Evangelistic Work reports as follows:

- 1. We would impress the fact that our Church is in imminent danger of getting into the whirlpool with other denominations and being swallowed up, or rather down, into the horrible depths of formality, where a partial reformation is agreed to instead of a deep-felt conviction and Godly sorrow for sin, and where signing a card or "hitting the trail" is substituted for the new birth and Holy Ghost religion is almost entirely disbelieved in.
- 2. Former General Assemblies have passed the reports of this committee by with a cold, indifferent reading and then proceeded to give honors of enthusiastic consideration to less important subjects and questions that were necessary. Certainly so, but why almost ignore the great question, the fundamental question that concerns the very life of human souls and also the very life of the Cumberland Presbyterian Church.
- 3. We are far from the belief that the Church is about dead to the doctrine of the new birth, Holy Ghost religion, and old-time revival work. We have much of the same heavenly fire that burned into the very souls of multitudes in the early days

of our Church. We have many preachers proclaiming the precious gospel as our fathers did, but it is generally admitted that there is a sad decline in these very important things in all the Churches—our own not excepted. When did a Presbytery, a Synod, or a General Assembly ever give time and due consideration to "Holy Ghost Revival Work" and the necessity of the new birth even equal to minor subjects? If any do so, some of us do not witness the glorious work, nor even hear of it.

- 4. We also recommend that this Assembly press upon each Fresbytery the very urgent necessity of an efficient committee being appointed to bring before the churches and people the great necessity of revival work in every church, and that revival work is worse than none when the regeneration of the souls of men, women, and children is not accomplished.
- 5. We recommend that you recommend to the several Presbyteries to have said committees make their report to their respective Presbyteries and that every Presbytery enter into a whole-soul consideration of the subject.
- 6. We recommend also that each Presbytery appoint a day of fasting and prayer for the Holy Ghost revival and soul-saving power to come on our Church to such a glorious extent that our preachers will preach the gospel with a new zeal and our members everywhere have the holy fire kindled afresh in their hearts. Our Church sessions and Presbyteries and Synods should all become live wires. Then our General Assemblies will be composed of Holy Ghost men and our Boards made up of the same heaven-filled material; and then, yes, then, we will love each other with the pure Christ love; jcalousy, envy, and unholy suspicions will crop out no more; unkind and unchristian thrusts will find a place in our Church papers no more, and then the Cumberland Presbyterian Church will be filling its mission, and God will use it in saving vast multitudes. You may call this a day-dream if you will, but one thing must be admitted by all; it is God's will for it to be realized.

Your committee reports that the handbook on revival work, setting forth the plan of salvation, etc., has been unavoidly delayed, but is now ready for distribution. The expense of publication and distribution is met by the chairman of this committee.

Gam Sing Quah about \$2,250 and have about \$1,000 to add to this fund, and we therefore recommend that the fund of \$15,000 be equally divided between these two missions.

We recommend that you heartily commend Rev. Gam Sing Quah for the splendid work which he is doing in China and that we assure him of our prayerful and sympathetic support.

We commend the plans of the Woman's Board and record our sincere gratitude to them and the Great Head of the Church for the splendid progress they are making: We would especially commend the plan for teaching missions in the Sunday schools and would urge all our pastors to use this plan.

MINISTERIAL RELIEF.

To the Moderator and Brethren of the 89th General Assembly of the Cumberland Presbyterian Church:

Dear Fathers and Brethren: Again it becomes a pleasure to present to your attention one of the most tender and loving duties and privileges of our body—that of reviewing the work of the Board of Ministerial Relief.

Although during the past year the mind and the heart of the world, and more especially of America, have been drawn across the waves where the battling millions were in the death grapple and every energy seemed to be called into winning the war, yet we find love has not denied to this Board and to its beneficiaries the means to press forward, as it has been their best year.

We wish to commend the members, one and all, for the care and devotion shown in its work, especially the tender love shown to the aged, dying servants of God.

We are pleased to report that the Easter egg offering, proposed by the Board to the Sunday schools, instead of netting twelve hundred dollars, as expected, has netted about two thousand dollars. This will be reported to the next General Assembly.

We notice the fact that five beneficiaries passed away during the past year—namely: Rev. J. H. Hendrick, of Dallas-Bonham Presbytery, who was at the time of his death being cared for at the Bowling Green Home; Rev. J. B. Lowey, of Princeton Presbytery; Rev. W. S. Winkler, of Owensboro Presbytery; Rev. Hilary Copeland, of Cookville Presbytery; and Rev. L. H. Holcomb, of Texas-Greenville Presbytery. Tenderly God is gathering his own to himself.

We recommend that your body endorse the plan of the Board to raise an endowment for the maintenance of the Board's work and encourage them to continue their efforts.

We recommend that the Rev. J. A. McLane, of Bethany, Ill., and Ruling Elder C. E. Cooper be elected to succeed themselves and that Rev. J. E. Cortner, of Evan-ville, Ind., be elected to succeed Ruling Elder R. B. Shaver, of Greenville, Ky., as Brother Shaver is a member of the Board of Tithing, and the rules of our Assembly forbid a member being a member of two Boards at the same time.

We recommend that the Board, as fast as the offerings increase, increase the amounts allowed to its beneficiaries. Respectfully,

REPORT OF THE AUDITING COMMITTEE.

To the Eighty-Ninth General Assembly of the Cumberland Presbyterian Church, in session at Fayetteville, Ark., May 15-21, 1919:

Dearly Beloved Fathers and Brethren: We, your Auditing Committee, beg leave to report as follows: We have carefully examined the books and accounts of your Stated Clerk and Treasurer and find that his accounts are kept in a business-like and up-to-date manner, stubs of all receipts for money received being retained in his file. In the matter of disbursements, all items are carefully itemized and proper receipts for all bills paid have been filed with your Auditing Committee. We find same to be correct in all particulars.

We find that Brother Fooks has employed a stenographer since the last General Assembly at a total cost of \$49.50, and we recommend that he be allowed to reimburse himself for this amount.

In examining the records of your Stated Clerk and Treasurer and his financial exhibit we find an item of \$65 expense paid to Rev. A. C. Biddle, the compiler of the New Cumberland Presbyterian Digest, under the direction of the General Assembly.

We recommend that this action be endorsed, but we feel that in some way this fund should be safeguarded against taxing upon the Assembly's contingent fund expenses, other than those belonging to this office. We therefore recommend that the following become Standing Rule No. 11: "No money shall be paid out of the General Assembly's treasury, coming from the Presbyterial contingent fund of five cents per resident member, for purposes other than that of the defraying of the regular

running expenses of the office of the Stated Clerk and Treasurer and General Traveling Secretary, except by a vote of two-thirds of the Assembly."

We desire to commend Brother Fooks for the efficient manner in which he has kept the accounts and records of his office and for the splendid service he has rendered our Church as Stated Clerk and Treasurer of the General Assembly, and we earnestly recommend that this General Assembly increase the salary of the Stated Clerk from \$750 to \$900 per year.

The books and accounts of the Board of Missions and Church Erection, the Trustees of Bethel College, the Secretary of the Tithing Board, Ministerial Relief, and Board of Education have been submitted to your committee and same have been carefully examined. We find the accounts well kept and correct, with the exception of the books of the Secretary of the Board of Tithing, who is entitled to a rebate of one dollar.

We especially desire to commend Brother W. B. Cunningham for the businesslike manner in which the books and the accounts of the Board of Education have been kept.

We recommend that this General Assembly order the Secretary and Treasurer of each of the Church Boards and other agencies receiving money for the benefit of our Church to issue receipts in duplicate for all money received, said receipts to be consecutively numbered and that the duplicate copies of said receipts, together with all vouchers showing disbursement of money, be submitted to the Auditing Committee at each meeting of the Assembly.

We have had referred to us the report of the Board of Trustees of the Theological Seminary. Also a memorial from Owensboro Presbytery, Kentucky Synod, and a communication from the Chamber of Commerce of Memphis, Tenn., with reference to the location of the Theological Seminary. We have carefully considered the report of the Board of Trustees and would report as follows:

1. We heartily concur in and commend the action of the Assembly's Board in its meeting at Nashville, Tenn., June 4, 1918, in completing arrangements for the

opening of the Theological school in connection with Bethel College. We would also recommend that the General Assembly concur in the arrangements of the Board for the opening of the Theological Seminary in the rooms of Bethel College and also the re-election of Rev. P. F. Johnson, Dean, and Rev. S. H. Braly, assistant, at the salaries of \$1,000 and \$800 respectively.

2. We would recommend that this Assembly ratify the action of the Board in disposing of any real estate held by them for rent and the funds received from such sale or sales be placed at interest.

3. We note that the term of office of Rev. B. J. Reagin, D. M. McAnulty, and A. D. Rudolph expires with the sitting of this Assembly. We recommend their reelection.

4. We also recommend that the Board renew its investigation with reference to the Goodknight Library and dispose of the same as they see fit, at their earliest possible convenience.

5. We note with pleasure the success that has and is attending the efforts of the Committee on Endowment in the raising of five hundred thousand dollars, the goal set by this Assembly at its last meeting. It is very gratifying to your Committee to be able to report that more than one hundred thousand dollars has been raised. We would urge that this work be pushed to the limit, that the goal may be reached as early as possible.

6. With reference to the memorial from the Owensboro Presourcy, menucky Synod, and the communication from the Chamber of Commerce, Memphis, Tenn., we would recommend that this Assembly take no steps looking toward a permanent location for the Theological Seminary or school until the full five hundred thousand dollar endowment be raised.

REPORT OF COMMITTEE ON PUBLICATION, SUNDAY SCHOOL AND YOUNG PEOPLE'S WORK.

To the Eighty-Ninth General Assembly of the Cumberland Presbyterian Church: Moderator and Brethren: We, your Committee on Publication, Sunday School and Young People's Work, have had the report of the Board before us and are pleased with the manner in which said Board has conducted your publishing interests. While said report admits there are some obstacles which have prevented the Board accomplishing all that we had anticipated; yet, having everything in consideration, we are of the opinion that its service has been most excellent. We are glad to note that the Board has purchased The Cumberland Presbyterian Banner and all of the machinery and equipment belonging to it and consolidated the same with that of The Cumberland Presbyterian, thereby bringing about a better feeling of the entire Church in regard to the publishing interests of the Church.

As the Board has asked this meeting of the General Assembly to define more clearly the duties of the Board's work in employing those who are to do the work of the Board, especially as it relates to the Board's part in the employment of its employees, we would say that it is the sense of your committee that the Board is the Assembly's authorized agent and that we believe that it is fully competent to carry on the publishing interests of the Church.

We are also of the opinion that the Board has the power to employ and to control the whole working force of the publishing house from the editors down to the janitor, and we recommend that this power be granted by the Assembly.

We have had before us the Rev. B. J. Reagin in behalf of the Historical Society, and we would most respectfully recommend that he, as your authorized agent, be empowered to raise money to defray the expenses of the Committee and to purchase historical papers wherever they may be found—also to secure writers for the different chapters of the history.

The communication from Dr. Dale relative to the Songs of Zion, which was referred to your Committee, was read by us; and while we do not feel that the Church is in any way responsible to the publishers, we would recommend that the churches use the book as far as is practical and that Brother Dale be granted free space in the columns of The Cumberland Presbyterian to present its interest to the people.

We have also had for our consideration a communication from Rev. A. C. Biddle, compiler of the New Cumberland Digest, setting forth the need of just such a book at the present time and of his not being able to bring it out on account of not having a sufficient number of advance subscribers to put the enterprise over the top and, further, of his desire that this Assembly make provisions for same. We recommend that his request be granted.

Your committee has carefully considered the resignation of Mr. Henry J. Graf, and while we are sorry to lose the services of this beloved brother, yet we feel that the same should be accepted and that the Rev. J. W. Stiles, of Princeton Presbytery, be elected to fill the vacancy.

We also note that there is a vancancy in your Board caused by the death of our dear beloved brother, Hon. J. H. Zarecor. We recommend the election of Ruling Elder John P. Buchanan, over his protest, to fill this vacancy.

We also recommend that Rev. T. Ashburn, W. H. McLeskey, and F. A. Seagle, whose time expires with this sitting of the Assembly, succeed themselves.

We would further recommend that the churches throughout the bounds of our denomination stand behind our Board of Publication in the purchasing of The Banner plant and equipments and to respond to the appeal of said Board to pay off the indebtedness of same.






