REPORT ON TEMPERANCE.

Another noble soul takes opium once, twice, it gains strength and he is himself no more :-not so good as a machine, for he cannot act a part assigned him with regularity, and that divine power, thought is utterly banished.

We, your committee on Sunday Schools make the following report:

We find that seven of the churches report Sabbath Schools; two of the number report Sabbath Schools only twice a month. We find a small increase in the Sabbath Schools over last report. Before looking over the statistics of the Association we find the church members number 718 and only 375 total of pupils in Sabbath Schools contributed to missions \$41 20. We recommend that every church in the Association endeavor to establish a Sunday School in their respective churches, and attend and take their families with them, then the report will be larger at the next meeting.
