
Minutes of the Fifth Annual Session of the North Carolina Convention of The Pentecostal Holiness Church



Held at Durham, N. C. Nov. 23-26, 1915



MINUTES.

First Day - Morning Session.

The Fifth North Carolina Annual Convention of the Pentecostal Holiness Church met in Durham, On Tuesday morning, November 23, 1915, at 9 o'clock.

Convention was called to order by the Superintendent. After singing, "He Was Nailed to the Cross for Me," the Superintendent read a Scripture lesson from the 13th of First Corinthians, following which the Convention was led in prayer by Bro. W. H. Kennedy.

On motion of W. J. Noble, it was decided that this Convention shall neither license nor ordain any one who has not the baptism

of the Holy Ghost.

The hour having arrived for devotional services, the committee announced that Bro. F. A. Dail will preach.

Convention adjourned.

First Day-Afternoon Session.

On motion of S. D. Page, the time for business was extended fifteen minutes to finish the reports from churches.

Convention adjourned to meet tomorrow at the appointed

time.

Benediction by Bro. G. F. Taylor.

Second Day - Morning Session.

Convention met in regular order at 9 a.m., and was called to order by the Superintendent. The congregation sang a song, after which prayer was offered by Bro. J. H. Capps.

The roll of preachers and mission workers, also of the churches was called again, following which, the minutes of last session were

read and corrected.

Reports were heard from churches as follows:

The decision of the Official Board concerning Tarboro, Woodard's Grove and Rock Hill churches was brought before the Convention as follows:

We recommend:

1st. That in the case of Tarboro, the case is dismissed on the

grounds that there is no charge.

2nd. That in the case of Woodard's Grove, we decide that they are worthy of censure for their rejection of pastors sent by this Convention.

3rd. That in the case of Rock Hill, we recommend that the action of the church in dismissing J. T. Crumpler, be sustained.

On motion, the above decision was accepted by Convention.

New churches were called for, and the following received: Emmanuel, Mt. Calvary, Moore's Chapel, Greenwood, Shiloh, Newton, St. Luke.

Mission points: Hendersonville, Rosemary, Siloam, Ebenezer. By motion of G. F. Taylor, Dillon church was received, on the grounds that it be transferred to Convention No. 3 at once.

A telegram containing greetings from Sister Mattie Perry,

was received and read by the Superintendent.

The hour having arrived for preaching, the Committee on Devotional Exercises announced that Rev. G. F. Taylor will preach.

After singing the doxology, Convention was dismissed by Bro. A. G. Canada.

Second Day - Afternoon Session.

Convention met at 2 p. m., and after singing "The Promises of God," was led in prayer by Bro. R. L. Scarce.

Minutes of the morning session were read and corrected.

The name of Bro. Willie Pope was recorded as delegate from St. Luke Church, which had just been received.

The report of Thunder Swamp Church was here given by Bro.

Ira Parker.

The report of the Official Board was taken up as follows:

REPORT OF THE OFFICIAL BOARD.

1st. We recommend that Bro. Harvey Spain be reinstated to full fellowship to this body.

The action of the Official Board was accepted by Convention,

and on motion, his character was passed.

2nd. We recommend that Dennis Jenkins be suspended from

the ministry for one year for erroneous teaching.

Bro. Jenkins appealed to the Convention, whereupon the Superintendent presented the charges against him. After a lengthy discussion was had, and the vote was taken by ballot, it was found that fifty-five members sustained the Official Board, and thirty-eight objected.

Committee on Devotional Exercises reported that Bro. W. H.

Kennedy will preach tonight.

On motion, Convention adjourned to meet at the appointed hour tomorrow.

Benediction by Bro. G. W. Gray.

Third Day - Morning Session.

Convention met in regular order at 9 o'clock a. m., and after singing "At the Cross," was led in prayer by Bro. Jesse Crocker.

The Superintendent read a Scripture lesson from the four-

teenth of St. Luke.

Minutes of last session were read and approved.

The following preachers who had come in were enrolled: H. W. Rhodes, J. C. Daniels, Mrs. Nora Scarce.

(Other business was done here of which the reader will take

notice in the minutes of next session.)

The time having arrived for preaching, the Committee announced that Bro. G. W. Stanley will preach at 11 o'clock.

Convention adjourned.

Third Day - Afternoon Session.

Convention was opened by singing "Will Jesus Find Us Watching?" Prayer was offered by Bro. S. D. Page, after which business was begun.

The General Superintendent rose and declared the motions of the morning session out of order, and asked that they be

stricken from the minutes.

On motion, the assertion of the General Superintendent was declared in order.

The General Superintendent ordered that the case of the State Superintendent and M. D. Sellers be taken up where it was begun at the morning session.

Bro. M. D. Sellers then withdrew from the Convention.

At the request of Bro. F. M. Britton, a motion was offered that the charges which he had made against Bro. M. D. Sellers be read before Convention. Motion passed, and the vote was taken as follows: fifty-eight in fovor of reading, and fifty-three against reading.

On motion, these charges were set aside after being read. The case of the charges of the General Superintendent against

Bro. J. E. Holmes was next taken up.

CHARGES.

First. He has brought uncalled-for and unnecessary division among the members of certain Pentecostal Holiness churches. According to Rom. 16:17, and 1 Thess. 3:6, he has violated Rule 3 of the General Rules of our Discipline.

Second. He has violated Rule 6 of our General Rules by reporting as backslidden the following preachers of The Pentecostal Holiness Church: (1) A. H. Butler, State Supt. (2) J. H. King, State Supt., Memphis Convention; (3) F. M. Britton.

Third. He has violated Rule 3 of our General Rules in con-

nection with Eph. 4:29, by using corrupt language.

Fourth. Again, he has violated Rule 3 of our Discipline in connection with Col. 3:9, and James 3:13-18, in that he has denied a single word or charge of any kind against him in our Convention since he has been in it.

Bro. Taylor, General Supt., then made his defense of above

charges, which was followed by Bro. Holmes' of himself.

Bro. Holmes begged pardon for saying that he had accused Bros. Britton, Butler and Taylor of lowering the standard and compromising. Pardon was granted.

He also made apologies for the charge concerning the use of

corrupt language.

On motion, the time for business was extended thirty minutes. The previous decision of the Official Board in the above case was then read.

DECISION.

In the case of Bro. Holmes, we recommend that he be asked to return his credentials until such time as he gives evidence that he has so changed his methods of conducting services as to be conformed to the rules of this church.

The time for business was again extended fifteen minutes.

On motion, the above decision was sustained by Convention. Bro. W. R. Crow was excused by Convention to return home.

On motion, it was decided that the Convention shall meet for business tonight at 7 o'clock, instead of the usual devotional services.

After singing the doxology, Convention adjourned. Benediction by Bro. Jerry Howell.

Third Day - Evening Session.

Convention met at 7 p. m., and after singing "I am So Glad," was led in prayer by Bro. A. G. Canada.

Business was then taken up.

Minutes of afternoon session were read and corrected.

Reports from the preachers were then called for.

Bro. Taylor offered a motion that each preacher be allowed only two minutes to report, and that unless objections were raised, their character stand approved by Convention. Motion passed.

Reports were heard as follows:

The name of J. T. Crumpler was then called, following which he made his report, and on motion, he was dropped from the roll, on the grounds that he had been dropped from the roll of membership in his home church, said action having been sustained by the Official Board.

3rd. We recommend for Ordination: A. R. Correll, M. R. Scarce, A. B. Kanipe, Benson Jones, W. H. Turner, James F. Epps, C. W. Bass, J. G. Crocker.

On motion, all those who were recommended by the Official

Board were received.

Those who had been recommended for Ordination were asked to come forward, and the Ordination Service followed.

Next the General Superintendent brought up the matter of dividing this Convention into two Conventions.

On motion, his suggestion was accepted, and Convention No.

2 shall be divided.

The General Superintendent then announced that the dividing line shall be the Seaboard Air Line Railroad, from Richmond to Hamlet.

The question of the names of the two Conventions was then brought up, and on motion, it was decided that the original Convention shall be called The North Carolina Convention, and the other The Western North Carolina Convention.

On motion, Convention adjourned, to meet tomorrow at 9

o'clock, a. m.

After singing the doxology, the benediction was pronounced by Bro. A. H. Butler.

Fourth Day - Morning Session.

Convention met at 9 a. m., and sang, "Just Because He Loved Me So." Bro. W. H. Kennedy then led in prayer.

Business was then taken up, and the minutes of last session

were read and corrected.

Bro. Taylor, who was acting as Superintendent pro tem, then called the Assistant Superintendent to the chair while he read his annual mission report. See report elsewhere in this journal.

Next the report on missions was called for and read.

REPORT ON MISSIONS.

We, your Committee on Missions, beg leave to submit the

following report:

We are glad that despite the depressed financial conditions during the past year we have not fallen behind in our total offerings for missions, but we feel we should put forth greater efforts during the coming year, especially in consideration of the facts that our missionaries have been in sore need of additional help financially, and that others acceptable to the General Mission Board could be sent if funds were available.

Therefore, we urge each pastor to see to it that a regularly organized Missionary Society be insisted upon in each church, to hold meeting at least once a month, in which information regard-

ing the mission field shall be brought before the people.

We also repeat the recommendation of the Committee on Missions last year, That each member be urged to give at least one cent per day for missions.

In conclusion, we urge upon all our members to pray earnestly for our missionaries, and the extension of the mission work.

The Report on Finance was called for, read, and discussed.

REPORT OF COMMITTEE ON FINANCE.

We your, Committee on Finance, beg leave to report that, after hearing the reports from the various churches, we deprecate the fact that the pastors are so poorly provided for, and we as your Committee, recommend,

1st. That each member of The Pentecostal Holiness Church be required to adhere to the Rules in Section 4, Article 11, Page 17, of the Discipline; as it is, in a number of places there are just a few who have to bear the burden financially, and we would suggest that each member be required to contribute something to the support of the church and pastor, unless he himself, is an object of charity.

2nd. We recommend that at the first of the Convention year each member be asked to assess himself or herself the amount he or she think they can pay into the Church Treasury weekly, and when it is not possible to pay weekly, then as often as possible, and that said assessment be considered a legal obligation; and it shall be the duty of the Official Board of each local church to see that each member be given a privilege to assess himself or herself.

3rd. We recommend that when an Evangelist goes into the church of a pastor and holds a meeting, the pastor assisting, the pastor shall have a certain per cent of said collection, to be agreed

upon by said pastor and evangelist.

4th. We recommend that each local church be required to contribute an amount for the State Superintendent, to be given him at the time he shall visit said church; at least sufficient to pay

railroad fare to and from said church.

5th. We recommend that each ordained or licensed preacher and mission worker be required to assess themselves to the Official Board of Convention, the amount they will pay for the support of Superintendent of the Annual Convention. Said amount to be paid monthly if possible.

6th. We recommend that each local church shall put in operation Section 5, Article 6, on page 18 of Discipline, in regard to

mission work.

7th. We recommend that a free-will offering be taken in each local church every three months for the Falcon Orphanage.

8th. We recommend that each local church organize a Home Mission Society for the relief of those in distress.

Article eight was changed so as to read: We recommend that each local church arrange for a Relief Fund for helping those in distress.

This change being made, the report was accepted by Cenvention.

The Report on Sunday Schools was next called for, and adopted after being read.

REPORT ON SUNDAY SCHOOLS.

We, your Committee on Sunday Schools, beg leave to submit the following report:

1st. We recognize that the future of this Pentecostal movement rests with the children who are now growing up, therefore, it is absolutely essential that we instill their minds and hearts with the doctrines we hold in reverence.

2nd. There is probably no place where this can be done to better advantage than in the Sunday School, especially if the officers and teachers have the Pentecostal baptism, and care is taken to use literature which does not conflict with our teaching.

Therefore, we recommend that each pastor in this Convention see that a properly organized Sunday School is in operation in each church under his care, and that he give the Superintendent his hearty encouragement in this work.

We also recommend that the deacons give their encouragement

to this worthy work.

We further recommend the use of the Sunday School literature published by The Falcon Publishing Company, which is entirely in harmony with our teaching.

REPORT OF COMMITTEE ON PROHIBITION.

We, your Committee on Prohibition, beg leave to submit the following report:

Whereas, we as a church believe that the use of intoxicating

liquors is a sin and a curse to the human race, therefore be it resolved,

1st. That we, as a church, do oppose the manufacture, sale or use of intoxicating liquors in any form, moderately or immoderately, not even as a beverage, or to be used in the food we eat. Prov. 23:32.

2nd. That we oppose the drinking of such things as Coca-cola, Pepsi-cola, and all other such drinks as are injurious to the body.

3rd. That we, as a church, do all we can by ballot and in-x

fluence to bring about national prohibition.

4th. That we also urge each pastor to preach at least one sermon at each of his appointments on the subject of temperance once a year.
