Report of missionary work of Bro. Wingo:

REPORT OF MISSIONARY.

Traveled in the work 361 miles. Preached 59 sermons. Delivered 12 Sunday School lectures. Organized: 3 prayer meetings, 1 church and 4 Sunday Schools. Baptized on the mission work 26, attended 4 funerals, and had prayers at 3 sick Was actively engaged 51 days. Paid out as traveling expenses \$4.40; received nothing from Association. I went to work under instructions of the Executive Board. From the last of January continued solidly in the work until the first of April, when, seeing that the times were growing so hard that the churches could not support the work, I was forced to stop and do such missionary work as I could, and not hold the Association under obligation any longer; but continued to pastor the church I had organized, and where I baptized the number above referred to. I also baptized 12 for Mineral Springs Church, and served them as pastor the balance of the W. C. Wingo. year,

On motion, the money due Bro. Wingo will be devided between the churches of this Association.

Report on Education was adopted:

REPORT ON EDUCATION.

We, your Committee on Education, beg leave to report as follows:

We believe that upon the education of the youth of the country depends our future moral and material welfare.
