MINUTES

-FOURTEENTH & ANNUAL & SESSION-

OF THE

Dea River Baptist Association.

The Pea River Baptist Association met in its 14th Annual Session on the first day of November, 1890, with Bluff Springs Church. The Introductory Sermon was preached by Elder John Bradley.

After one hour for refreshments, the Association was called to order by the Moderator, J. W. Brooks, Singing and prayer by C. L. Eilands.

Pleasant Church from Covington by her delegates Nelson Barnes, with J R Spurlin proxy, which was received, together with the bearers, and the right hand of fellowship extended by the Moderator in behalf of the Association.

Committee on Divine Services reported to preach Saturday night, A. J. Brooks; Sabbath 11 a. m., R. W. Davis; 2 p., m., C. L. Eilands; at night, D. B. Mills. After singing and prayer by Elder J. W. Bullard, then adjourned until Monday 9 o'clock a. m. On Sabbath ministers preached to large and attentive congregations.

MONDAY MORNING-NOVEMBER 3, 1890

The Association assembled with singing and prayer by Elder R. W. Davis. Read minutes of Saturday. Renewed the invitation to visiting ministers, Called for correspondence: From Salem Association, Bros. E M Burks, D B Mills, C M Logan responded. From Zion Ass'n——; from Newton Ass'n——; from Geneva Ass'n——; from Alabama Ass'n——; from Haw Ridge Ass'n——; from New Providence Ass'n Bros C L Eilands and R W Davis responded.

On motion, dispensed with reading Rules of Decorum. Called for report on Missions, which was read and adopted. See appendix A. Report on Documents was read and adopted. See appendix B. Report on Nominations was read and adopted, See appendix C. Report on Sabbath schools was read and adopted. See appendix D. Report of Executive Committee. See appendix E. Report on Temperance read and adopted. See appendix F. Report on Periodicals read, amended and adopted. See appendix G. Report on Finance read and adodted. See appendix H. Treasurers' report read and adopted. See appendix I.

The Clerk was instructed to have churches supplied with minutes

out of the minute funds, after taking out his salary of \$750.

Resolution of thanks offered by J. D. Parkman was adopted. On motion, one half of the Sabbath collection was to be applied as

set out in the report on Missions. On motion, a Minister's and Deacon's meeting was appointed to meet with White Water church Saturday, before 5th Sabbath in May, 1891. A. J. Brooks to preach the introductory sermon. Alternate, Jno. Bradley. A committee consisting of A. J. Wise, Jr., L. F. Jernigan and W. T. Everett, were appointed to draft a programme for the ministers meeting.

Adjourned to meet with Union Grove Church, 6 miles south of Clintonville, on Saturday before the lst Sabbath in November, 1891.

APPENDIX "A."

We, your committee on Missions, beg leave to make the following report: That pastors preach to their churches the necessities of the various missions. That the deacons take up the collections from the several churches and report quarterly to their pastors the amount collected, and the efforts put forth by such deacons in collecting said funds. And the distribution of the funds will be at the discretion of the donor, and in case there is no choice, then we recommend that one-half go to domestic missions and the other half to State Board, to be equally divided between State Board, Home Board and Foreign Board, and that the deacons turn over at the end of each quarter their report to the executive committee and the amounts collected by them to

the treasurer of the association, to be held subject to the order of the executive committee, and one-half to be forwarded to their respective boards for

their final disposal.

In conclusion, we recommend that every member who claims the name of Missionary Baptist do something for the cause, and that whatever amount is given be paid quarterly. Our concluding words to each and every member is to work for co-operation in our State Board.

We sometimes hear Baptist say, when approached on the subject: We pay our money and we expect to drink when we please, and its nobody's business but our own, we know when to stop. Now, we are not so sure it is their money, for we believe that the Lord has given every christian some missionery money and no doubt that the very money given for missions is often spent for whiskey instead of going into the missionary box. Unfaithful stewards, God will hold you to a strict account for all such acts. Now, as to the quit drinking when they please. We simply say, that the quit drinking when they please sort of to-day is the drunkards of to-morrow. No person in commencing drink ever expects to die a drunkard. Now, let us appeal to churches to enforce a rigid discipline against tippling

members. Such members should be watched and when an opportunity presents its self—that is when they get drunk, which is as sure to follow as night is after day—be promptly expelled, without a free and full acknowledgement and a good promise to do better is made. For such members of a church brings more reproach upon the cause of our Master than any other class. All of which is respectfully submitted.

RULES OF DECORUM.

RULE 1. The Moderator shall fill the chair and preserve order in the Association, which shall be opened and closed by prayer.

RULE 2. The privileges and authority of the Moderator shall be respected by all the members; he shall decide all questions of order and propriety.

RULE 3. The Moderator shall vote in no case, unless there is a tie in the Association, then he shall give the casting vote. He shall have the same privilege of speaking as other members, provided he shall appoint some member to fill the chair.

RULE 4. But one member shall speak at a time, who shall rise from his seat and address the Moderator, and keep the subject; and he shall not speak more than twice on the same subject without leave from the chair.

RULE 5. No member shall leave the body while on business, except by permission from the chair.

RULE 6. When a qustion is taken up, after allowing time for deliberation, the Moderator shall take the voice of the body by calling for the yeas and navs.

RULE 7. All motions in order must be disposed of by the body, unless

withdrawn by him that made it.

RULE 8. A list of the names of the delegates shall be called and absentees marked.

RULE 9. The Clerk shall enroll the names of the delegates, and keep a regular record of all the buisness of the Association.

RULE 10. The minutes of the Association shall be read and corrected before the body rise.

Rule 11. This decorum may be altered, or amended, by twothirds of this body.
