MINUTES.

The ministers and delegates composing the twenty-sixth annual session of the Rock Mills Association met with Macedonia church, Randolph county, Ala., Oct. 20-22, 1896.

Rev. G. F. Weaver stated that he was physically unable to preach the introductory sermon. Rev. Motley proceeded to conduct the services, at Rev. Weaver's request, from the 11th chapter and 2nd verse of 1st Corinthians and the 11th chapter and 17th verse of the Acts, using the latter clause of each verse.

After an intermission of one hour, and after singing and prayer by Rev. Allen, the body proceeded to business.

Appointed preaching committee—Brethren P. M. Gross, Wm. Weathers and James Pierce, together with the delegates and pastor of this church.

Read statistical letters and enrolled names of delegates as follows:

Election of officers to serve for the ensuing year in regular order. Rev. G. F. Weaver was elected moderator. He stated he belonged to another association. On motion Bro. P. M. Gross was elected by acclamation, and R. L. Brumeloe clerk.

PERMANENTLY ORGANIZED.

Invited ministering brethren to seats with us.

Called for petitionary letters.

Called for correspondents from other associations and received W. J. Layton from the Central Western.

East Liberty—F. M. Handley, G. F. Weaver, J. W. Green and F. A. Weaver.

Cary—R. M. Allen, J. C. Motley, J. A. Dunn, W. M. Worthy, and W. R. Rolton.

On motion the body adjourned until tomorrow morning at 9 o'clock.

The committee appointed Rev. R. M. Allen to preach at the church at early candle lighting. According to arrangements Rev. Allen preached at the church from the 18th chapter and the latter clause of the 18th verse. Rev. J. A. Dunn prayed.

SECOND DAY.

Appointment of standing committees as follows:

On motion the appointment of a brother to preach the introductory sermon was omitted until the next session of the body.

On motion Bro. Wm. Weathers was appointed to lecture on Sunday schools at the next session of the body.

On motion Brethren Wm. Weathers, T. J. Embrey, and E. O. Kitchens were appointed to arrange time and place for general meetings.

On motion the next session of the body will convene with high Shoals Friday and Saturday before the 1st Sunday in Oct., 1897, embracing Sunday.

On motion the regular order of business was suspended and the call was renewed for correspondents and received Brethren H. M. Mitchell and J. H. Stewart from the East Liberty.

On motion the regular order of business was suspended and Rev. W. J. Layton being appointed to lecture on Sunday schools, introduced Rev. J. A. Dunn, who delivered a lecture.

On motion an adjournment of 10 minutes prevailed.

According to appointment Rev. H. R. Moore preached the missionary sermon at the church from the 28th chapter and 19 verse of Matthew, and Rev. J. A. Dunn at the academy from the 1st and latter clause of the 11th verse of Ephesians. The collection amounted to \$5.27.

After an intermission of one hour the body reassembled, and after prayer by Rev. Wm McCarter, proceeded to business.

Called for reports of standing committees and received and adopted reports from the committees on publications, Sunday schools, missions and temperance.

On motion, the body adjourned until 9 o'clock tomorrow morning.

THIRD DAY.

After singing and prayer by T J Embrey the body proceeded to business.

On motion the appointment of correspondents was deferred to miscellaneous business and was to be in the form of a resolution.

MISCELLANEOUS BUSINESS.

On motion a resolution was adopted allowing the members of our body to represent us in sister associations without appointment.

Read, received and adopted the report on general meetings.

On motion the delegates agreed to vouch for their respective churches the amount in connection with their names:

Heard and adopted the report on finance.

On motion the amount of money for missions was ordered sent to the state board, asking them to direct it as they think best except the \$6.65 contributed to Brethren Camp and Nail, secured by collection.

On motion Rev. Moore was appointed as delegate to the state convention.

On motion the clerk is to have the minutes printed and retain the balance of fund for his services.

Read and adopted the minutes.

Adjourned to time and place.
