- Army Commercial Item Description
 (CID) is still in negotiation
 over specification requirements
- DESC produced specification for initial solicitation using OEM requirements (Detroit, Cummins, Caterpillar, Stanadyne, John Deere, International, etc)
- Presently only virgin soybean feedstock is acceptable





- In order to expand the feedstock to include animal fats and recycled oils:
 - Collection of scientific data to support its use in extreme weather conditions
 - Review of long term storage stability data
 - Data on particulate testing contamination





- DESC is reviewing data from UMR on long term use in transformers
- DOE is funding a project with the Navy to look at recycled vegetable oil use in Hawaii

 The Navy is testing small marine vessels using biodiesel





SUMMARY

 This is only the first step for the purchase of biodiesel

 Specifications can be modified as scientific data is generated to support these changes





- Solicitation Background: Requirements were submitted by Department of Defense and Federal Civilian Agencies during March and April of 2001.
- Solicitation was issued April 18, 2001 with an original closing date of May 18, 2001.
- Solicitation was amended to extend the closing date to June 5, 2001. Closing date extended to allow time for firms to submit offers on additional B-20 requirements.





 Requirements Support: Air Force, Marines, Department of Interior (National Park Service), Department of Agriculture (Beltsville Agricultural Research Center), NASA and United States Postal Service.

• Total estimated annual quantity solicited is 1,961,150 gallons of B-20.





• Contract for B-20 Awarded to World Energy on 19 October 2001.

• Estimated Dollar Value \$1,539,750

• Estimated Annual Quantity: 1,526,475 gallons





• World Energy contract supports 17 ground fuel locations throughout the United States.

• DoD and Federal Civilian Agencies supported: Marines, Air Force, Postal Service, Department of Agriculture, Department of Interior and NASA.





 Pending Biodiesel Requirements: DESC will purchase on an as needed basis for Department of Defense requirements. Federal Civilian Agencies (FEDCIV) have local purchase authority up to \$100,000 annually per requirement.





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
