

Hispanic Population in the US US Census 2000 Report


- 1990 Total US population: 249 million
 - Approx 22.4 million Hispanics
 - 9.0% of total population
- 2000 Total US population: 281 million
 - Approx 35.3 million Hispanics
 - 12.5% of total population
- 1990 to 2000 Hispanic change:
 - Approx 12.9 million

 - ¹ 38.9% proportional increase since 1990




Hispanic Population in the DoD Active Duty Military and DoD Civilian

- 1993 Total DoD population: 2.6 million
 - Approx 140.5 thousand Hispanics
 - 5.4% of total population
- 2004 Total DoD population: 2 million
 - Over 171 thousand Hispanics
 - 8.5% of total population
- 1993 to 2004 Hispanic change:
 - Increased by over 31 thousand
 19.3% increase since 1993
 - ¹ 49.3% proportional increase since 1993




DoD End Strength Changes *From 1993 to 2004*



- Overall DoD cuts far exceeded those taken by the Hispanic population
- Over this period, the Total DoD end strength decreased from 2.6M to 2M but the Hispanic DoD population increased by 27K

Race-Ethnic Distribution




- In 2004, Total DoD is more diverse than US Labor Force and US population
 - DoD force: 32% minority (non-White)
- Hispanics are fastest growing minority group within DoD


Hispanic Educational Levels



- DoD Hispanic force is better educated overall than the US Hispanic Labor Force
- The percent of Total DoD Hispanics with:
 - A High School degree or above grew slightly from 94.7% to 95.0%
 - A Bachelor's degree or above increased from 11.6% to 12.9%



Hispanic Share of DoD Civilian Workforce




- Hispanic share rose in every pay grade level, in spite of an actual net decrease in all categories except GS 1, 13, 14 and 15
- Hispanic Civilian leaders showed greatest share growth
- In 2004, 24.9% of all Hispanic GS workers were GS-12s or above (19.4% in '93)
 - All DoD: 37.6% in 2004 and 32.6% in 1993

DoD Civilian Occupational Areas



- The FY04 "Hispanic" and "All DoD" breakouts are similar
 - Over one-third are "Prof & Tech" careers
 - Over one-half are either in "Admin" or "Blue Collar" careers
- The share of Hispanics in "Blue Collar" & "Clerical/Other" jobs decreased between FY92 to FY04


Hispanic DoD Civilian Leaders *Location of the GS 15 and SES Workforce*



- 59% of the US-based GS 15 and SES workforce located in the Wash, D.C. area
- 4.4% of the total Hispanic GS 15 & SES population outside the mainland US (Top 2: Puerto Rico & Germany)
- Census 2000 reports the Top 10 States by Hispanic population are, in order: CA, TX, NY, FL, IL, AZ, NJ, NM, CO and WA.

Hispanic Share of Active Duty Population




- Proportion of Hispanics rose in every pay grade group
 - Overall net increase for Hispanics of 43.3%, while All DoD decreased 16.2%
- Largest Hispanic share growth in:


 - ☆ Company Grade Off: 94%
- Share of Hispanic military leaders increased

Active Duty Occupational Areas




Hispanic Share of Coast Guard Population



- Proportion of Hispanics is greatest in the Enlisted ranks
- Largest percentage of Hispanics:
 - First Term Enl (12.7%)
 - Company Grade Off (6.8%)
- Proportion of Hispanic military leaders is less than 'Total' Coast Guard proportion (7.1%)
 - Senior Enlisted (4.9%)
 - Flag Officers (0.0%)

Coast Guard Race-Ethnic Distribution




- US Labor Force and US population more diverse than Coast Guard
- Hispanics are the largest minority group within the 'Total' Coast Guard (7.8%)
 - At 8.5%, Hispanics are also the largest minority group in Enlisted force
 - Hispanics at 6.0% rank second, following Blacks (7.7%), within the Officer population

US Census 2000 Report

- <u>Top 3 Occupation Categories for Employed Males</u>:
 - Hispanic:
 - * Operators, Laborers 29%, Precision Production 22%, Service - 15%
 - Non-Hispanic White:
 - * Executive, Managerial, Professional 31%, Technical, Sales, Administrative - 21%, Precision Production - 19%
- <u>Top 3 Occupation Categories for Employed Females:</u>
 - Hispanic:
 - * Tech, Sales, Admin 38%, Service 26%, Exec, Mng, Prof 18%
 - Non-Hispanic White:
 - * Tech, Sales, Admin 42%, Exec, Mng, Prof 35%, Service 15%

Census Estimates and Projections



- Hispanics are expected to be the fastest growing US race-ethnic group over the next 20 years
 - Projected share growth of 46% by year 2025
 - Will be the largest minority group (Black population will be five points lower, at 13%)
- If current trends continue, almost half of the US population will be non-white by 2050

Summary of Key Findings

 The net population of Hispanics in the Department of Defense (Active Duty & DoD Civilians) rose 19.3% between FY 1993 and FY 2004, while the Total DoD end strength fell 20.1% in that

time.

- Hispanics are the fastest growing minority group in the US and DoD, increasing 70% faster than any other group
- Hispanic representation in the Armed Forces has grown steadily during the past 11 years. Representing 9.9% of the enlisted force and 4.7 percent of the officer corps. In contrast, Hispanics make up 16% of the 18 to 24 year old US population
- The Hispanic share of DoD leaders is growing. In 2004:
 - 4.4% of all GS-12s and above are Hispanic.
 - 2.7% of all General Officers are Hispanic.
 - 7.4% of all Senior Enlisted are Hispanic.
