 Provide seed funding to web-enable the InterService Material Accounting and Control System (IMACS) resulting in increased efficiencies to users, customers, and upgrade support, improved security, and decrease process cycle time

Current Situation

- **Problem statement:** Current system is client-server based and needs significant technology upgrade and data standardization.
- IMACS has a multi-Service steering group that validated the process change and proposed enhancements
- IMACS budget line within Services and Agencies not sufficient to support legacy system and make upgrades/deploy transformed processes and system




Instructions

- For initial concept phase briefing, board lead or champion presents only <u>slide</u>
 <u>1</u>, unless more information is appropriate or available
- For developing phase briefing, board lead or champion presents <u>slides 1-4</u>
- For **planning phase** (IP approval) briefing, the champion presents **slides 1-6 +** (as needed). Insert the milestone and metrics slides before slide 4 (Assessment).
- For **status reviews**, the champion or Lead BIC Executive Director presents **slides 1 & 7** and other slides (2-6) as appropriate
 - Ratings based on the following:
 - Green adequate performance metrics, on schedule, within cost
 - Yellow performance, schedule, or cost has problems; but the implementation team has an approved recovery plan
 - Red -- performance, schedule, or cost has problems; and BIC ED or higher intervention is needed to remove implementation roadblock
 - Champion must address reasons for all **yellow or red ratings** and provide any recovery plan actions (if required)
 - Champion must provide recommended BIC actions
- Board lead or champion will inform the JIST of all changes in status and provide color-rating updates to BIC EDs, at the next meeting
 - Accurately reflect the opinions/positions of board members
 - Milestones will be briefed by exception to the BIC EDs
