

WORKING GROUP MISSIONS

TASK: Discuss and develop a prescribed topic with respect to the OPFOR mission/doctrine/TTP. PURPOSE:

- a. Develop a common operational understanding of current and emerging threats and how they may impact OPFOR elements.
- b. Share innovative ideas and new methodologies that OPFOR elements can implement to meet BLUFOR training objectives.
- c. Synchronize the worldwide OPFOR effort with respect to learning institutions (Schools-POIs), CTCs, Active Duty, Reserve, National Guard and Joint Forces.
