


DIVISION (Institutional Training) MISSION

PRE-MOBILIZATION AND MOBILIZATION:

PROVIDE THE EXTENSION OF THE PROPONENT SCHOOL TO TRAIN THE ARNG, USAR, AND AC SOLDIERS WHICH INCLUDES IET, ROTC MISSION AND USMA SUPPORT. DURING FULL MOBILIZATION PROVIDE OSUT BASE EXPANSION.

MANAGE THE TASS BATTALIONS TO REGULATORY AND PROGRAM OF INSTRUCTION STANDARDS WHICH INCLUDE ANCOC, BNCOC, PLDC, CAS3, CGSOC, MOSQ





DIVISION (Institutional Training)

- **ARMY RESERVE COMPONENT OF THE ARMY SCHOOL SYSTEM (TASS)**
- **SCHOOLS ARE FUNCTIONALLY ALIGNED TO INSTITUTIONAL TRAINING PROPONENTS**
- **TRAIN AN ESTIMATED 8,100 INITIAL ENTRY SOLDIERS ANNUALLY AT TRADOC INSTALLATIONS**
- **NCOAs HAD REQUIREMENTS TO TRAIN 7,722 NCOs FOR FY 2000 AND HAVE REQUIREMENTS TO TRAIN 8,139 NCOs FOR FY 2001 AT FORT McCOY, FORT DIX, FORT LEWIS**
- **SUPPORT ROTC BASIC, ADVANCED CAMPS AND ROTC ALTERNATE STAFFING**



TIERED RESOURCING

- DIVs (IT) ARE RESOURCED AT TIER 2C THRU 5A
 - TPU MANNING STRENGTH - 100% THRU 90%
 - FULL-TIME STAFFING STRENGTH -70% THRU 50%
 - EQUIPMENT RESOURCING - AS FUNDING AVAILABLE
- TIERED RESOURCING LIMITS THE AMOUNT OF POP-UP COURSES THE DIVs (IT) CAN HANDLE





DIV (IT) FUTURE

- AC and AGR soldiers will receive credit for attending TASS TATS-C courses taught by the Divs (IT)
- Use of ITRR to drive training requirements
- Low Density MOSs consolidated for national Missions or form coordinated RTS.
- Use of the Instructor Database provides enhancement to year round training and Distance Learning training
- Acquiring more diversified missions
- Army National Guard Division Redesign (ADRS) requirements



ISSUES

- Divs (IT) are not structured to teach Officer Basic, Advanced, or Officer Career Courses
- Approved TATS-C POIs exceed the regulatory requirements for for MOSQ. Some courses take 2 years to complete
- IDT Phases of POIs were developed with equipment intensive needs. Creates problems with procurement, space, electrical wiring, and systems administration
- IET missions keeps increasing every year
- Proponents continue to develop courseware requiring unique systems not compatible with Distance Learning Labs
- RST-E Ft. Dix, Camp Dawson, Ft. Leonard Wood, Devils Lake
