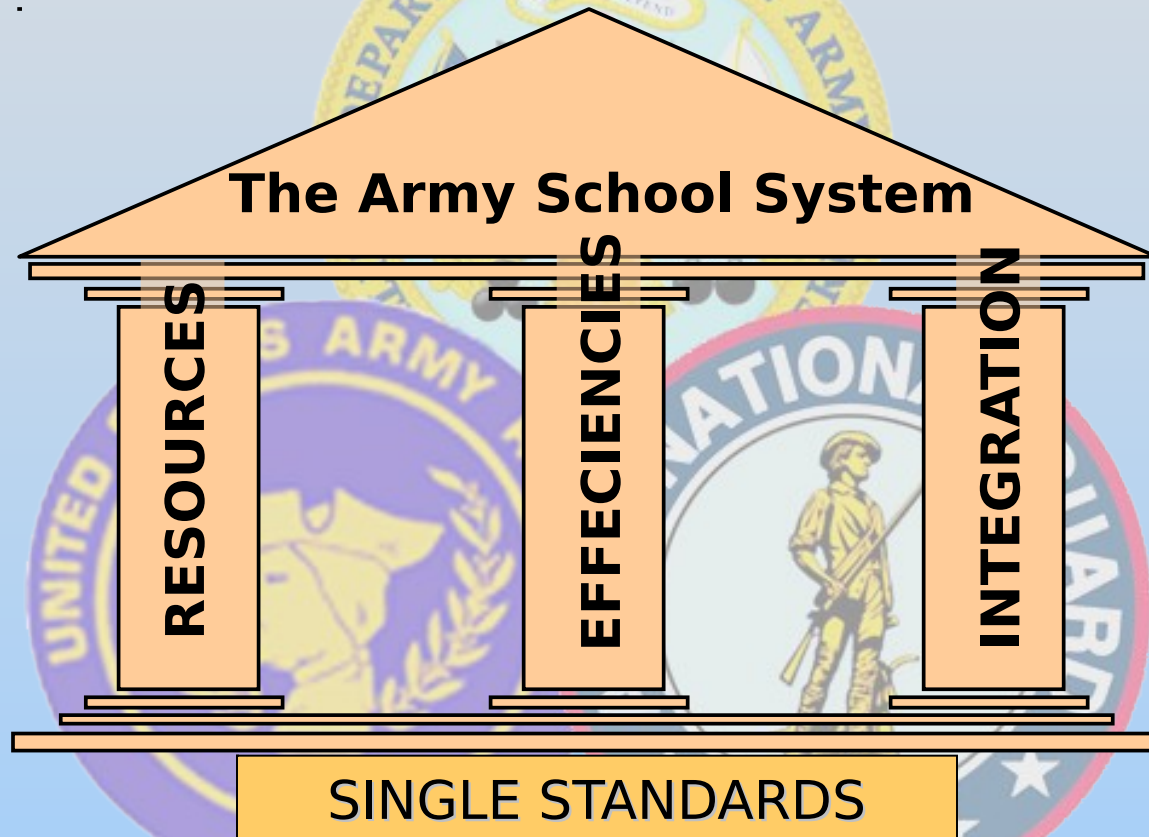

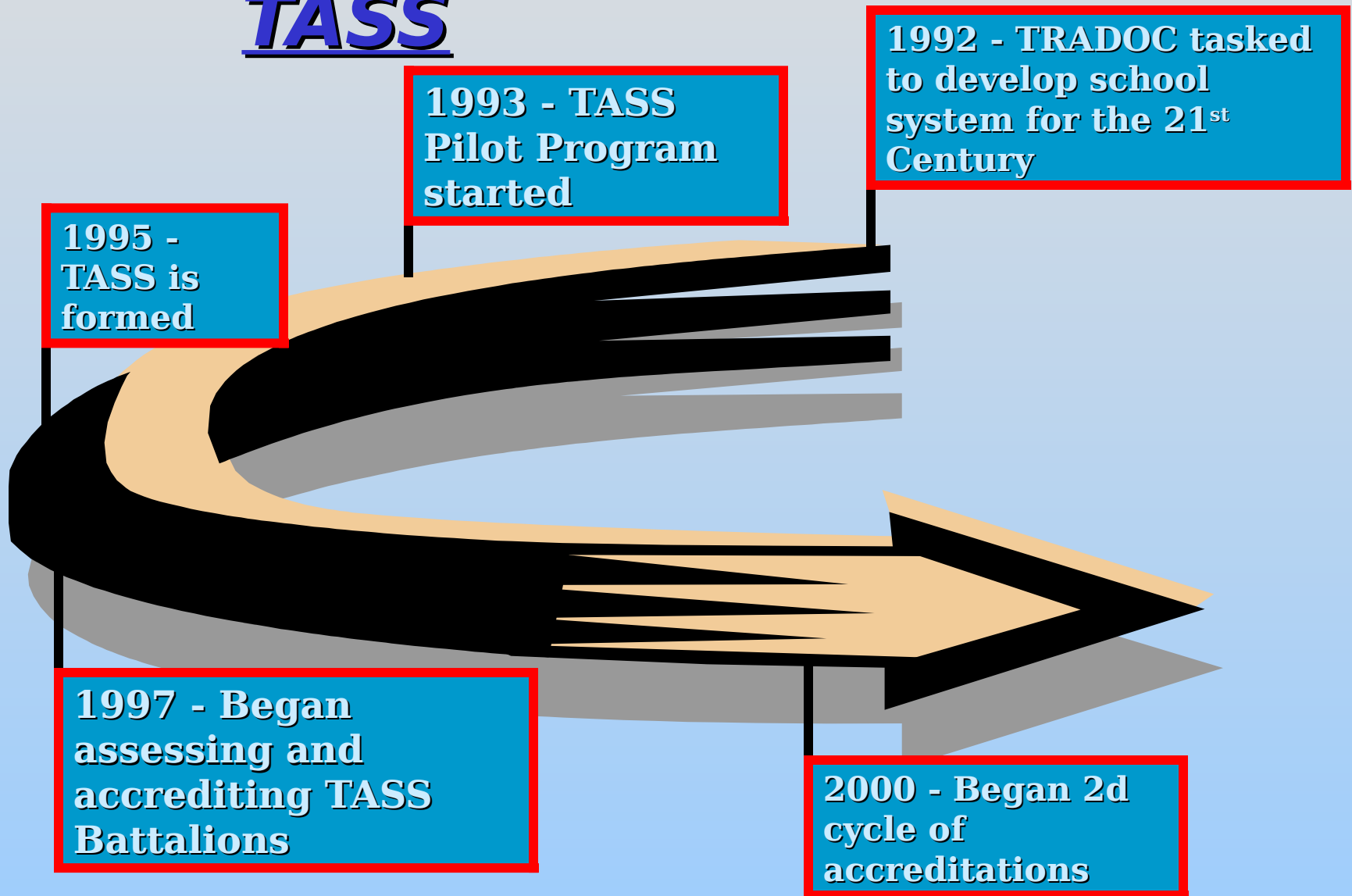


The Army School System MISSION

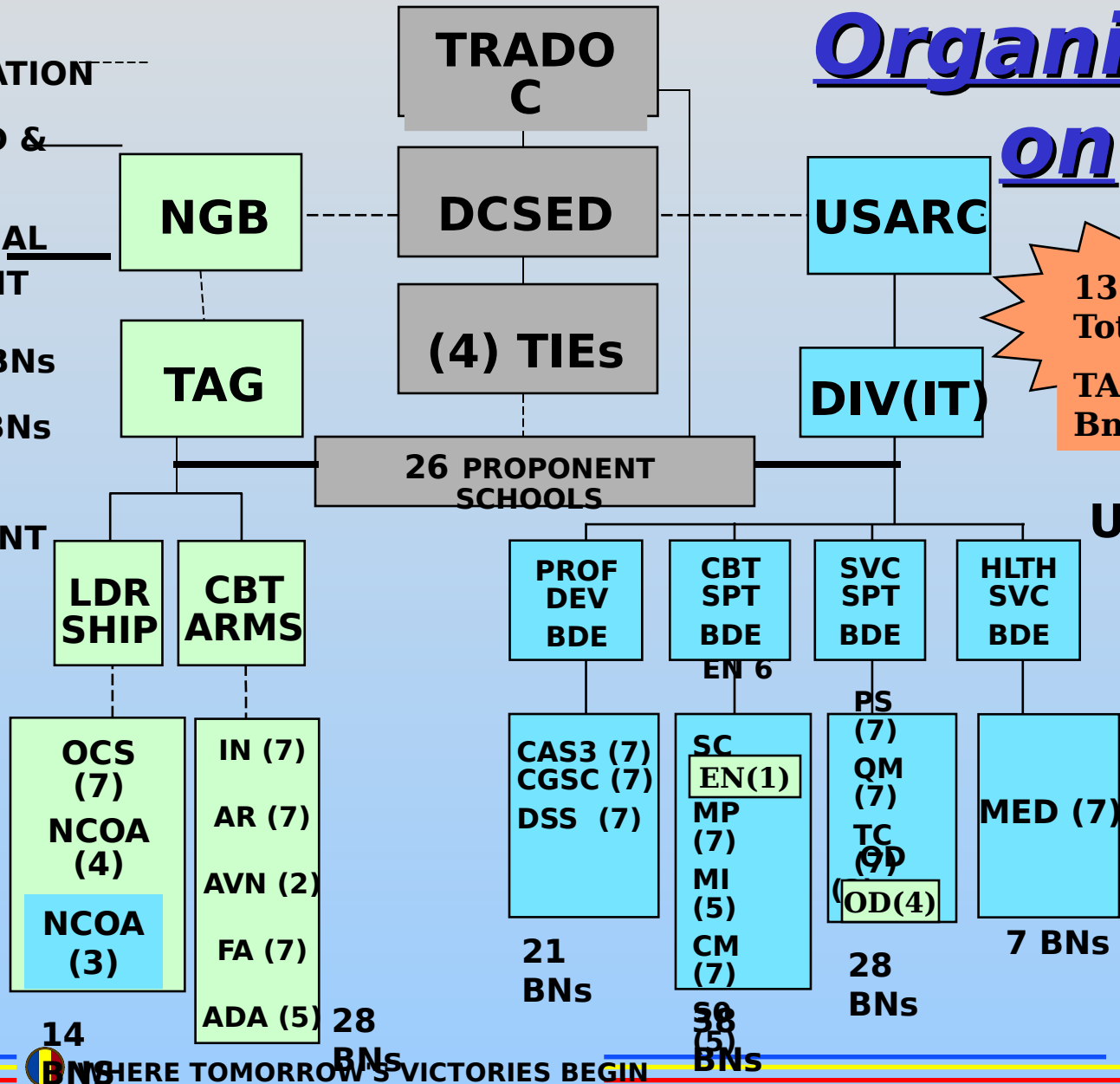

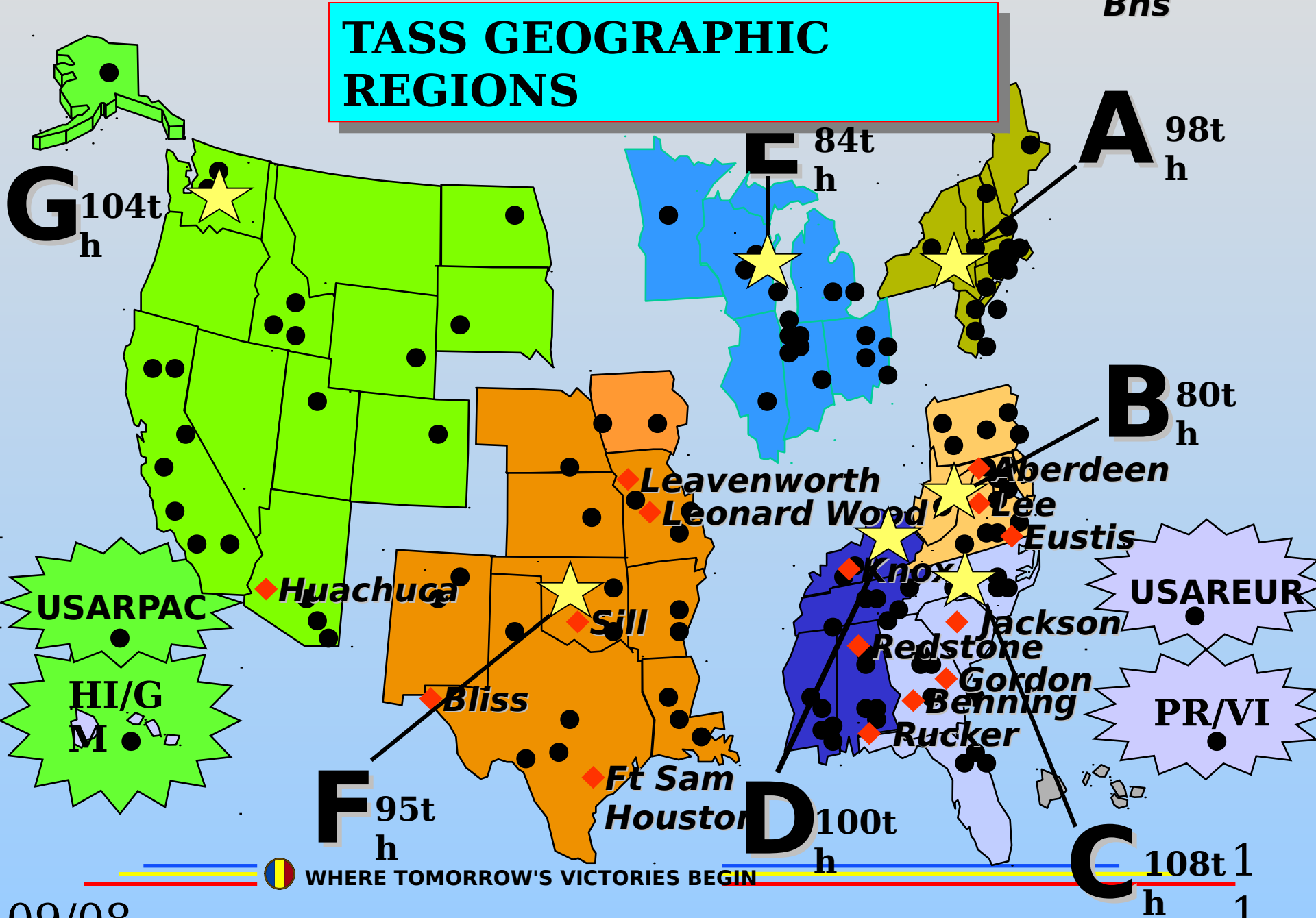

Why TASS?

- **TASS trains to ONE standard**
- **TASS brings the training resources of The ARMY together (AC/USAR/ARNG)**
- **TASS improves training availability...
more instructors, more training locations**

WHERE TOMORROW'S VICTORIES BEGIN

EQUIVALENT **CREDIT**

- Recent DA policy (HQDA msg. 20 NOV 00) allows AC/AGR soldiers to receive credit for attending courses taught at TASS Battalions
- Message states: “Active Army and AGR personnel will receive credit for attendance at TASS battalion schools providing the following conditions are met:”
 - Institution is accredited by the course proponent
 - The POI has been reconfigured into TATS-C format

Increase Army Readiness

- **Improve student fill rate to 85% in FY01 and 90% in FY02**
- **Improve class conduct rate to 80% in FY01 and 85% in FY02**



Structure Manning Decision Review (SMDR) Process

- Designed to validate total Army training requirements
- Reconcile those requirements to an executable training program
- MACOMs and TASS BNs meet regionally (RTCC), then nationally (NTCC) - looking four years out

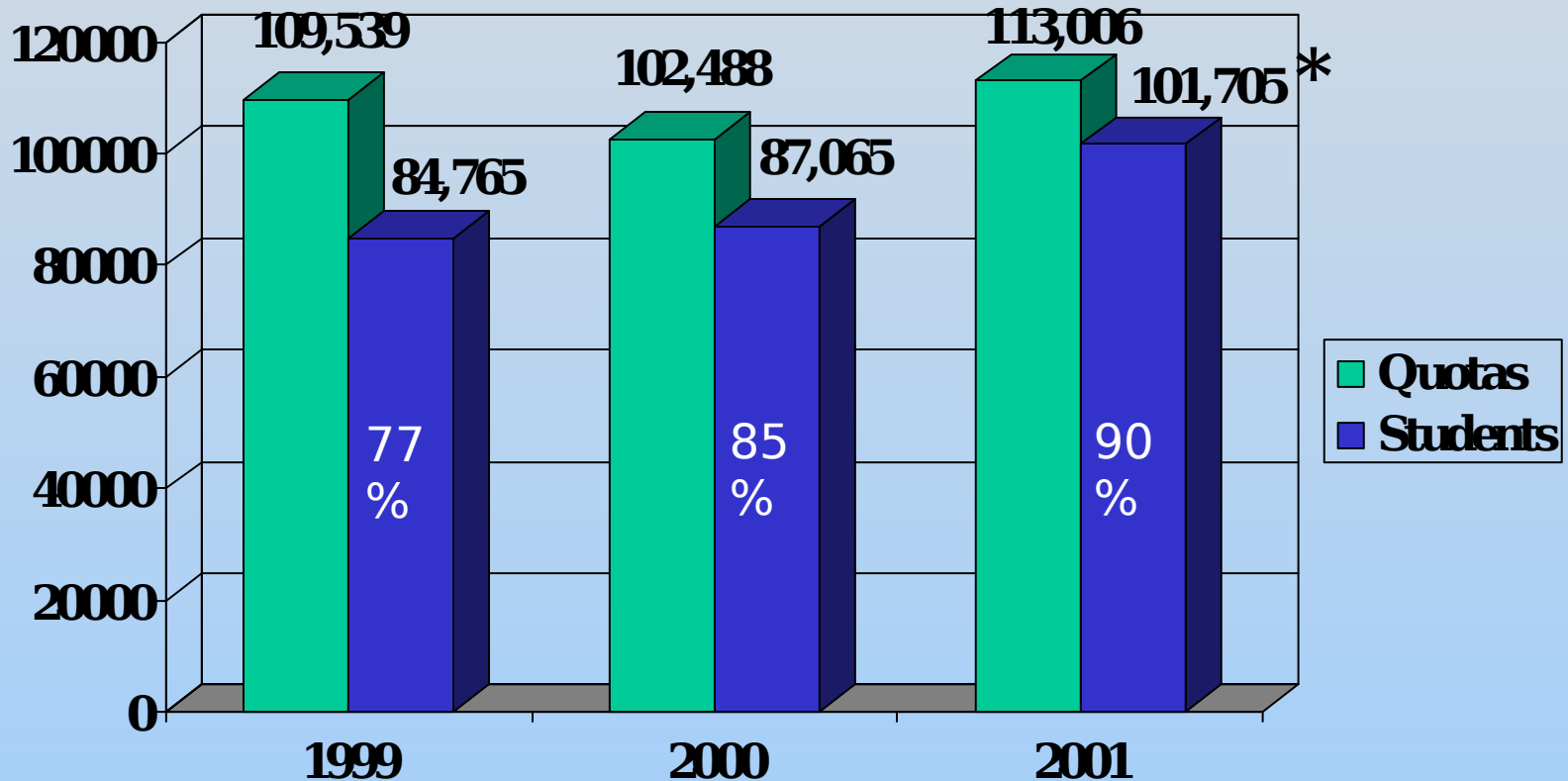


Structure Manning Decision Review (SMDR) Process

- SMDR convened to determine and confirm training requirements then compare against institutional capabilities - focus on validation four years out
- Publish Army Program for Individual Training (ARPRINT) - published two years out
- Adjustments at the Training Requirements Arbitration Panel (TRAP) - adjusted one year out



Quota Utilization

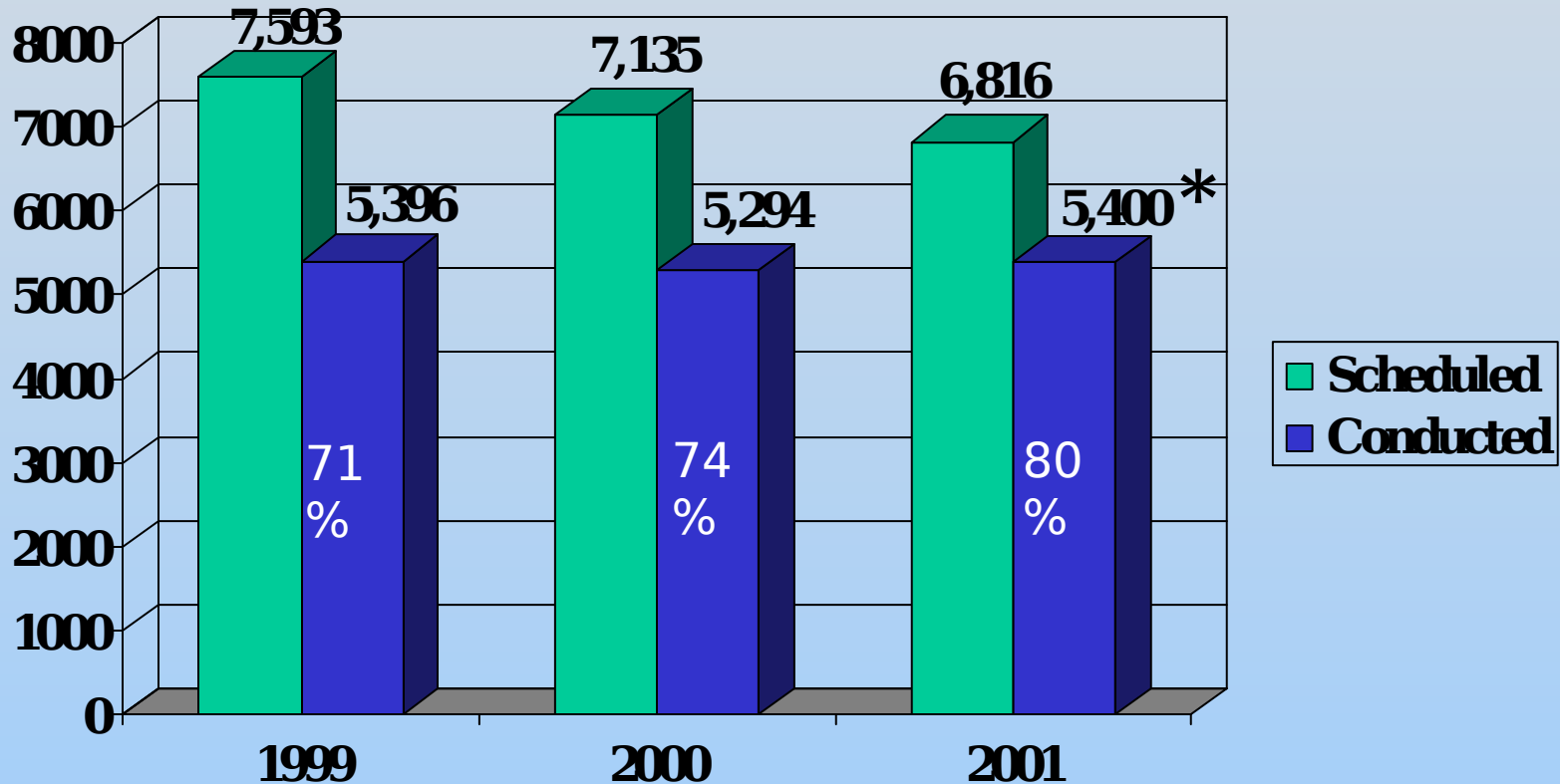


* 2001 quota

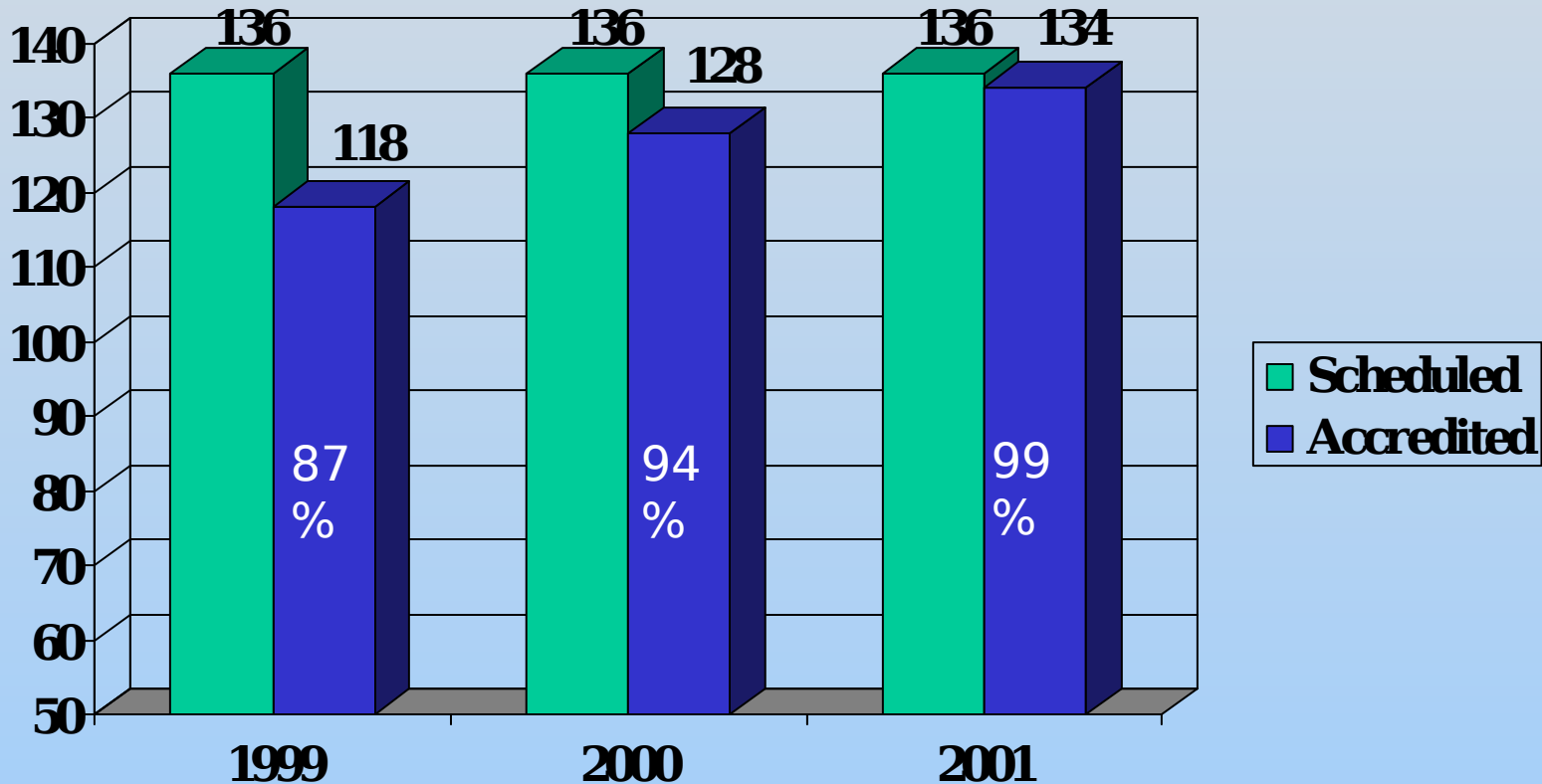

SYSTEMIC PROBLEMS

- **Not Training to Standard or in Compliance with POI**
- **Unsafe Training Practices
(Vehicle Speed, Range Safety, Unsafe use of
Pyrotechnics)**
- **Security, Inventory, and Storage of Test Materials**
- **Students Not Meeting Prerequisites of Course
(Ht/Wt, APFT, Security Clearance, PULHES)**



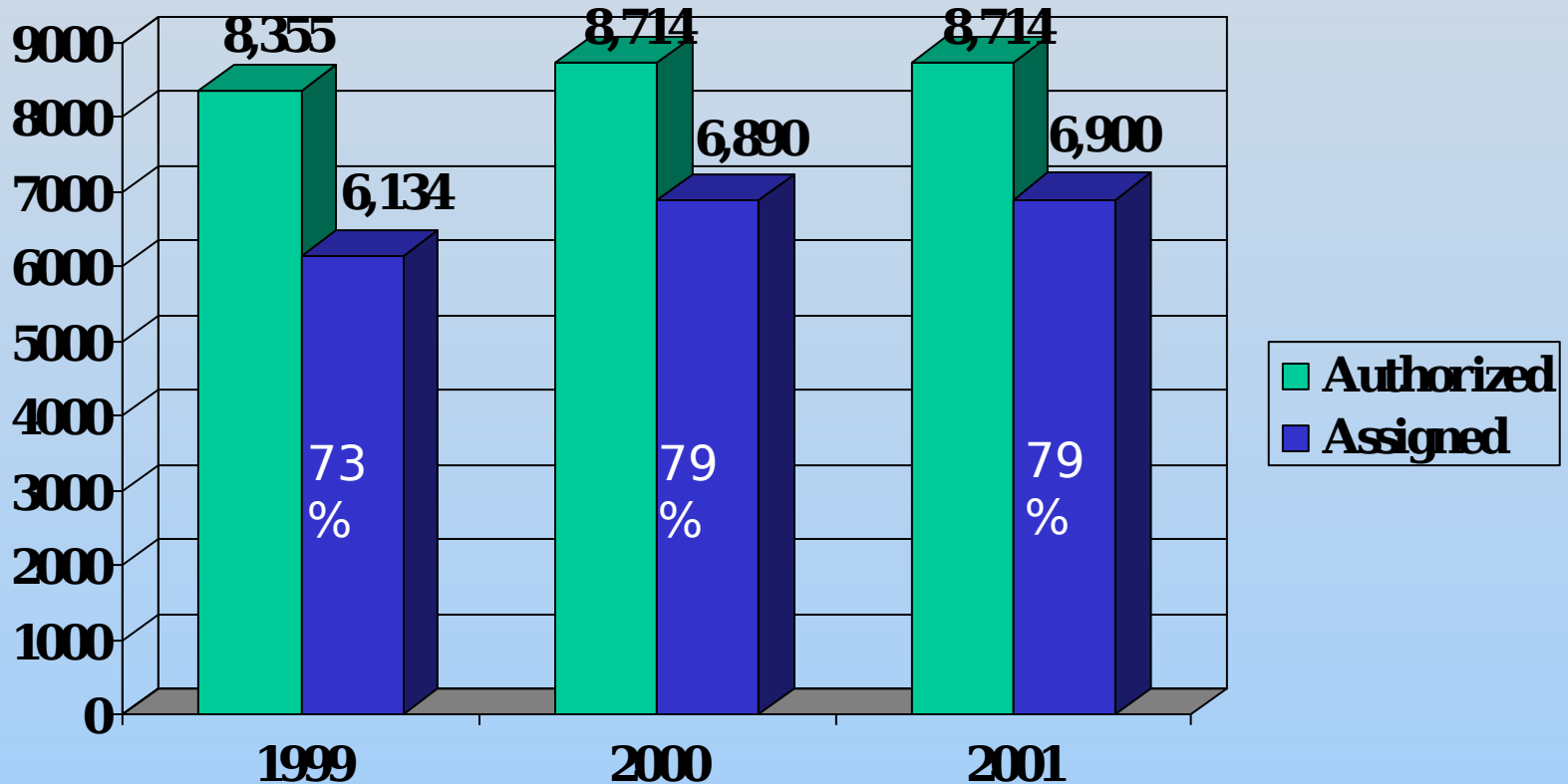
Pre-Execution

Checklist

- **Current “paper-based”**
 - Filled out at the unit level
 - Verified by the unit commander
 - Hand carried to training sites by soldier
 - Required by the training battalion for in-processing
- **Future “automated”**
 - Merged with the ATRRS application process
 - The application process will validate the soldier meets the course prerequisites listed in ATRRS
 - Eliminates requirement to provide routine prerequisites directly to training battalions

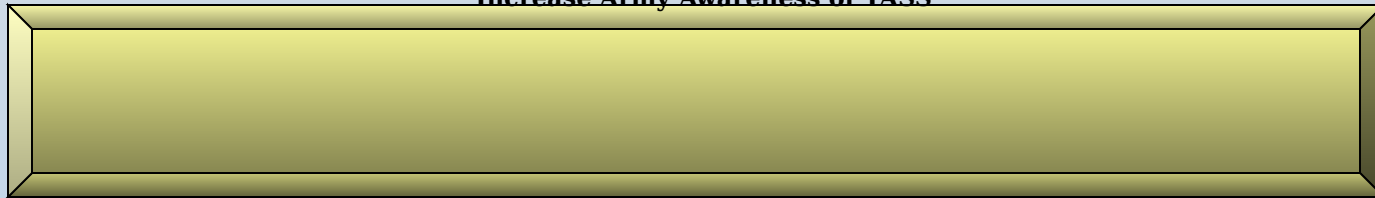

- **Ensure ADRS requirements out to FY05 are addressed in the SMDR**
- **Develop/implement an effective and efficient process to coordinate ADRS**



Army Division Redesign Study (ADRS) Training

- **DCSED Designated as TRADOC's Executive Agent**
 - **Phase I FY 00-05**
 - **Approx. 6,500 Soldiers to train (on track)**
 - **11 MOSs Comprise 86% of Reclass Requirement**
 - **Phase II FY 03-07**
 - **Approx. 8,000 Soldiers to train**
 - **14 MOSs Comprise 81% of Reclass Requirements**
 - **Phase III & IV**
 - **Dependent on Army Transformation Initiatives**

Current TRADOC Position on Proposed Title XI Position Reductions

- FORSCOM recommended to CSA that TRADOC reduce Title XI authorizations by 162, effective FY03
- TRADOC submitted a reclama to CSA through FORSCOM requesting retention of all proponent school Title XI authorizations



Current TRADOC Position on Proposed Title XI Position Reductions

- **Based on TRADOC reclama, DA-DCSOPS restored
101 authorizations (50 titled/51 nontitled)
for a net loss of 61 positions**
- **DCSED developing COA's for redistribution of
positions to meet TASS mission requirements**

Multi-Component NCO Academy

• These NCOA's will provide a potential model for inter-component cooperation in sharing resources and responsibilities for conducting Leader Development at the Primary, Basic and Advance levels of NCOES



Multi-Component NCO Academy

- Will evolve into a model for the 21st century NCOES
- Will provide means to test Army Transformation leader development initiatives and incorporate them into the NCOES



Operational **Concept**

- One institution able to employ multiple methods of delivery to teach a given POI
- The chosen method is based on the need of the target audience
- One academy would be able to teach AC PLDC, RC PLDC and Stand-Alone Common Core for all 3

A/BNCOOC Stand-Alone **Common Core**

- **Previous policy required proponents to infuse A/BNCOOC Common Core in with their technical MOS phases, while RC implemented Common cores in A/BNCOOC in two separate and distinct phases**
- **Such policy created separate and unequal standards of implementation within AC & RC NCOAs**



A/BNCOOC Stand-Alone **Common Core**

- **A multi-component, single standard TATS ANCOOC and BNCOOC will improve scheduling flexibility, will reduce TDY travel, and proponent course development requirements**
- **Can be used as a foundation for the formation of multi-component academies where AC/RC academies coexist**



Goals and Objectives

- **Leverage and optimize utilization of all allocated resources**
- **Provide regional Common Core Training of A/BNCOCC to AC, USAR, and ARNG soldiers**
- **Provide a flexible, customer-based approach, with multiple methods of delivery to meet the training needs of target audiences**



Goals and Objectives

- Establish the ability to provide on time, on demand regional functional training with Plug and Play capability for the 1SG and the BSNCO courses
- Increase component and branch awareness by training all soldiers in the same classroom

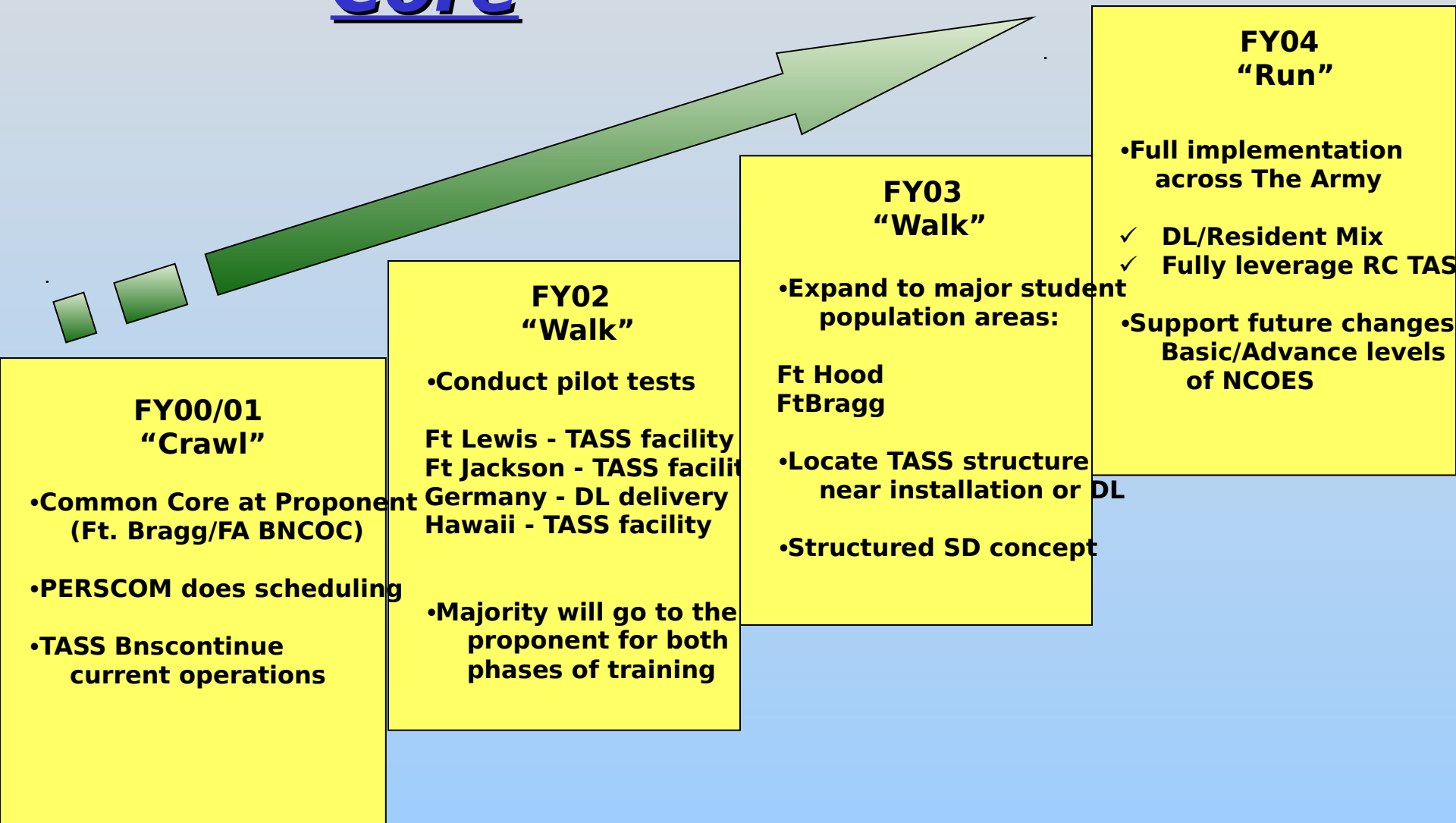

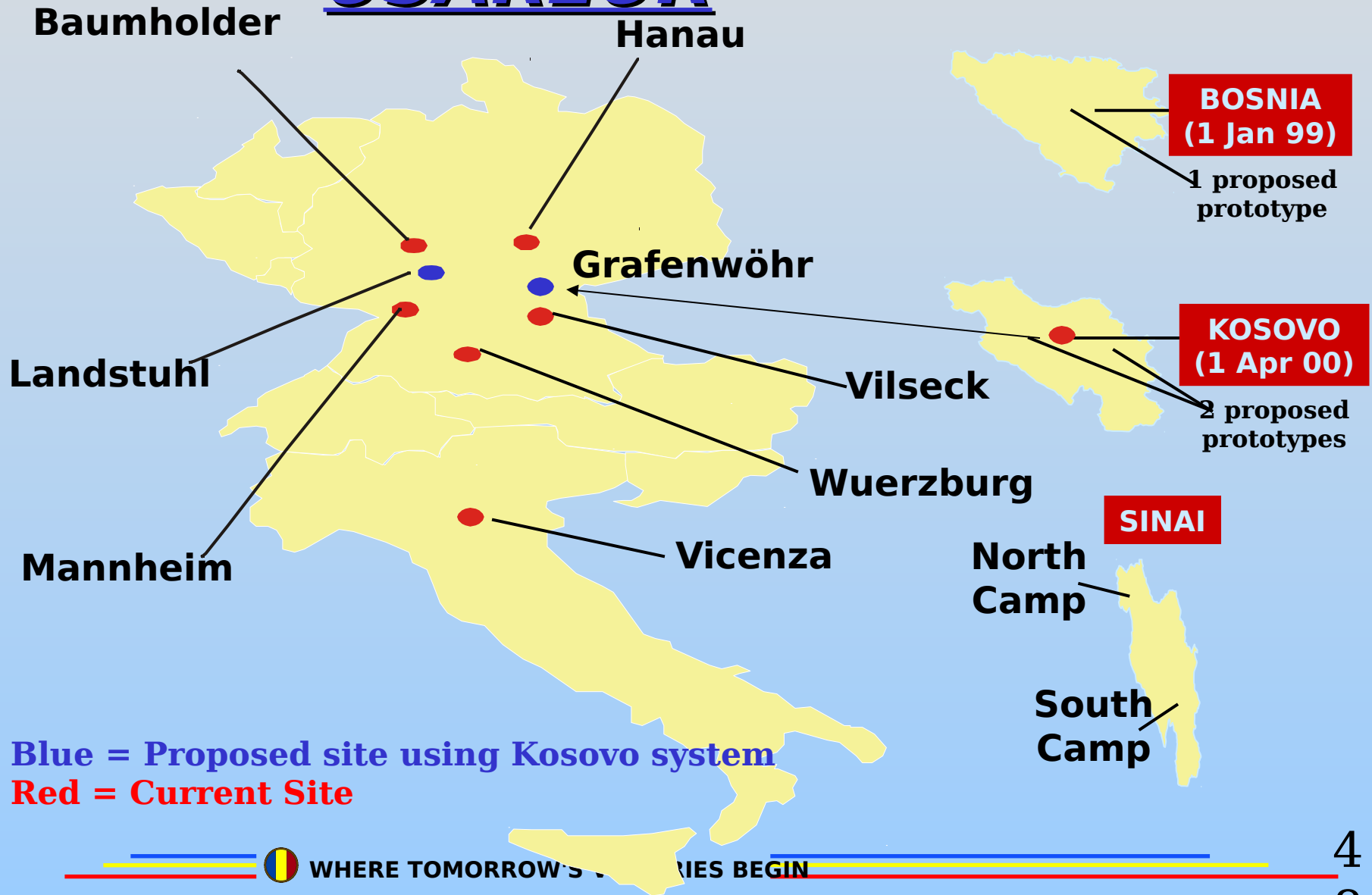

- **Train the soldiers at home station**

USARPAC

- **Execute all NCOES courses at 25th ID NCOA until the HIARNG facilities are completed (joint effort by all 3 compos)**
- **Program the execution of Phase I Common Core at the 25th ID NCOA - will not affect IDT courses**
- **The 25th ID will provide facilities and limited support for the execution of two RC PLDC classes**
- **RC Soldiers will be provided seats in the DL 1SG and BSNCO courses as required**

Implementation

Ft Jackson **Objectives**

- Training AC students in BNCOC & ANCOC common core in FY 01 and beyond
- Train AC students in 1SG course in FY 01 & beyond
- Grow to support future TRADOC transformation goals



Ft **Lewis**

- **Currently, two NCOES academies coexist at Ft Lewis -- one AC academy under I Corps and one USAR academy under the 104th DIV (IT)**
- **104th NCOA is tasked to deliver PLDC and A/BNCOC to Reserve soldiers in an ADT mode**
- **Starting Q2FY02, AC soldiers will be able to attend Phase I A/BNCOC, on the installation, at the USAR NCOA**



End **State**

- **These Army NCOES Centers of Excellence will provide seamless regional NCOES instruction to all components**
- **Modern, efficient, and effective institutions that are technologically enabled and connected 24/7 to both proponent schools and soldiers within the Region**

TASS Strategic Plan

“The Army School System is a growth industry.” DCS&D

- **Develop a long range plan for TASS that is aligned with TRADOC/Army Transformation Plan**
- **Begin “futuring” process to identify TASS Doctrinal, Training, Leader Development, Organizational, Material, and Soldier Development (DTLOMS) mission requirements**



TASS Strategic Plan

- **Ensure Reserve Component involvement in TRADOC Transformation up-front**
- **Focus on identifying strengths, weaknesses, opportunities, and impediments to TASS while reviewing goals and objectives**
- **Finalize plan by 4th Qtr FY01**



TASS Opportunities Supporting Army Transformation

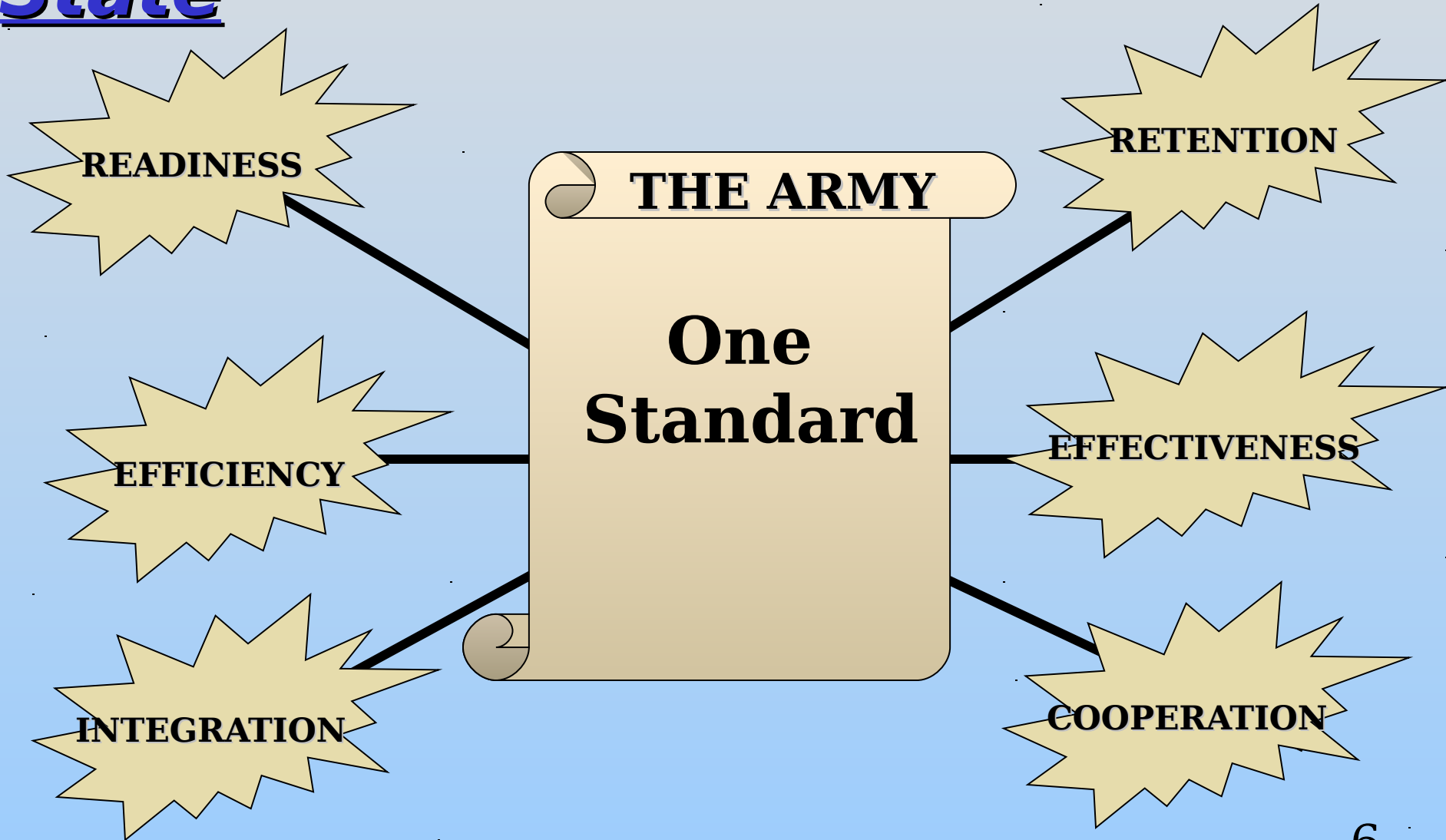

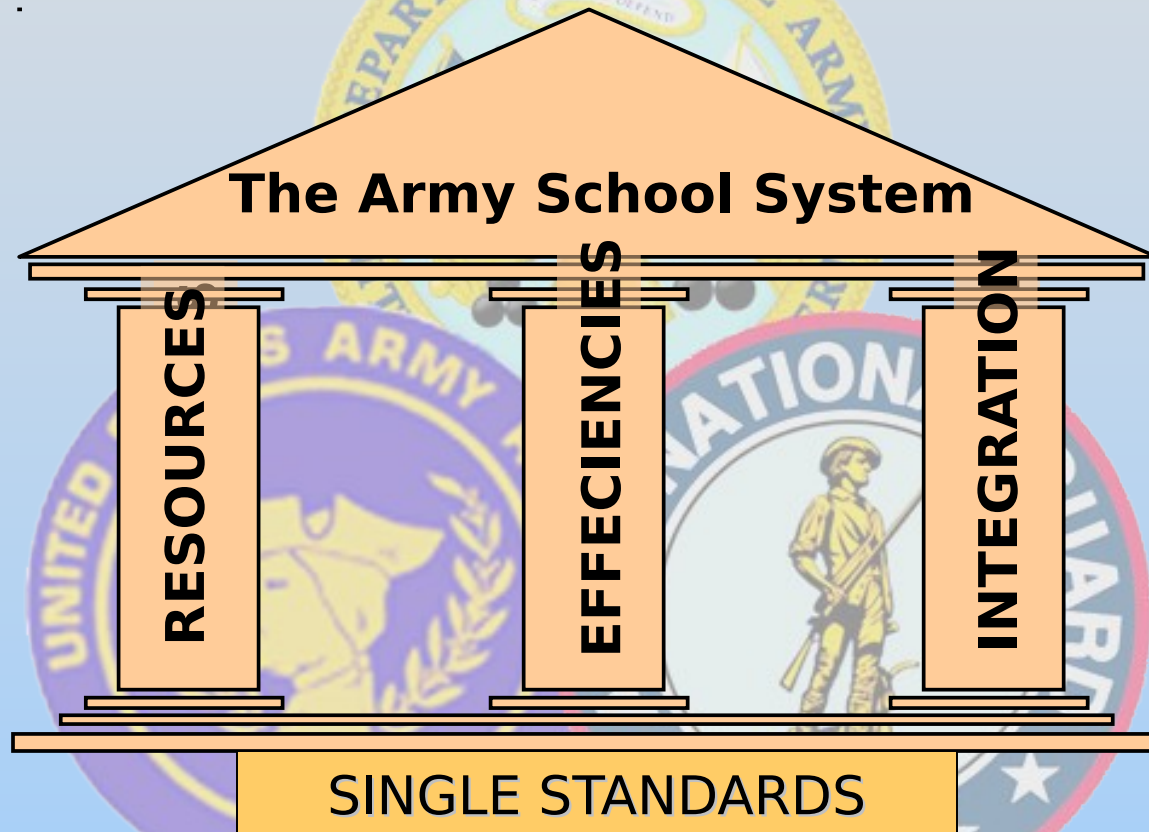
