



PURPOSE









The Army School System MISSION

To enhance Army readiness through an efficient, fully-integrated educational system that trains soldiers of all components to a single standard.

- Encompasses doctrine, training, leader and combat developments








Components of TASS

Why TASS?

- TASS trains to ONE standard
- TASS brings the training resources of The ARMY together (AC/USAR/ARNG)
- TASS improves training availability...
 more instructors, more training locations
- TASS guarantees that soldiers

AC Soldiers Trained in TASS Battalions

- 1,872 AC Soldiers trained in FYC 1,869
 - √ 43 % (798) trained in CGSC and CAS3

EQUIVALENT CREDIT

- Recent DA policy (HQDA msg. 20 NOV 00) allows AC/AGR soldiers to receive credit for attending courses taught at TASS Battalions
- Message states: "Active Army and AGR personnel will receive credit for attendance at TASS battalion schools providing the following conditions are met:"
 - Institution is accredited by the course proponent
 - The POI has been reconfigured into TATS-C format







SYSTEMIC PROBLEMS

- Not Training to Standard or in Compliance with POI
- Unsafe Training Practices (Vehicle Speed, Range Safety, Unsafe use of **Pyrotechnics**)
- Security, Inventory, and Storage of Test Materials
- Students Not Meeting Prerequisites of Course (Ht/Wt, APFT, Security Clearance, PULHES)

Pre-Execution Checklist

- Current "paper-based"
 - Filled out at the unit level
 - Verified by the unit commander
 - Hand carried to training sites by soldier
 - Required by the training battalion for inprocessing
- Future "automated"
 - Merged with the ATRRS application process
 - The application process will validate the soldier meets the course prerequisites listed in ATRRS
 - Eliminates requirement to provide routine prerequisites directly to training battalions



WHERE TOMORROW'S VICTORIES BEGIN

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Current TRADOC Position on Proposed <u>Title XI Position</u> <u>Reductions</u>

- FORSCOM recommended to CSA that TRADOC reduce Title XI authorizations by 162, effective FY03
- TRADOC submitted a reclama to CSA through FORSCOM requesting retention of all proponent school Title XI authorizations

Current TRADOC Position on Proposed Title XI Position

- Based on TRADOCRECUSTIONS restored 101 authorizations (50 titled/51 nontitled) for a net loss of 61 positions
- Title XI authorization at TASS Bns and OCONUS will not be affected
- DCSED and TIE Directors developing COA's for redistribution of positions to meet TASS mission requirements

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A/BNCOC Stand-Alone Common Core

- Previous policy required proponents to infuse A/BNCOC Common Core in with their technical MOS phases, while RC implemented Common cores in A/BNCOC in two separate and distinct phases
- Such policy created separate and unequal standards of implementation within AC & RC NCOAs

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
