WHO IS AN AMERICAN INDIAN?

No single Federal or tribal criterion establishes a person's identity as an Indian. Government agencies use differing criteria to determine who is an Indian eligible to participate in their programs. Tribes also have varying eligibility criteria for membership.

To be eligible for Bureau of Indian Affairs services, an Indian must (1) be a member of a Tribe recognized by the Federal Government; (2) 1/2 or more Indian blood of tribes indigenous to the United States; or (3) must for some purpose be 1/4th or more Indian ancestry.

The Bureau of Census counts anyone an Indian who declares himself or herself to be an Indian.

The first Indians came across the Bering Strait from Asia to

Originally, an Indian Tribe was a body of people bound together by blood ties who were socially, politically, and religiously organized; they lived together in a defined territory and spoke a common language or dialect.





Over 550 Federally recognized Tribes exist in the United States, including 223 village groups in Alaska

> Only tribes with more than 100,000 persons are the Cherokee, Navajo, Chippewa, and Sioux



20% reside on 314 reservations, Indian lands, and in Alaska Villages

AMERICAN INDIAN RESERVATIONS

An Indian reservation is land a Tribe reserved for itself when it relinquished its other land areas to the U.S. through treaties. There are approximately 314 Indian land areas administered as reservations.

> Over half of the total U.S. Indian and Alaska Native population now live away from reservations.




Alaska Trivia

1959 - Alaska becomes the 49th State










In 1995, more of the nation's American Indians, Eskimos, and Aleuts lived in Oklahoma than in any other state

By 2025, Oklahoma, Arizona, New Mexico, California, and Washington will be home to about 45 percent of the nation's American Indian, Eskimo, and Aleut population Between 1997 and 2010, the number of American Indian, Eskimo, and Aleut households in the United States is projected to climb from 713,397 to 906,036 The median family income for American Indians is \$21,750 compared with \$35,225 for the total population.

Approximately 31 percent of American Indians live in poverty, compared with 10 percent of all families in the nation.

The Indian population is the "youngest" on this Continent. Over

60% of Indian people are under 19 years of age.



BUSINESS

The number of businesses owned by American Indians and Alaska Natives increased 93% between 1987 and 1992 versus the 26% increase for all U.S. firms; receipts increased 115%
