

PRE-EXECUTION CHECKLIST

- Current "paper based"
 - Filled out at the unit level
 - Verified by the unit commander
 - Hand carried to training sites by soldier
 - Required by the training BN for in processing
- Future "automated"
 - Merged with the ATRRS application process
 - Verified by the unit commander with instant feedback
 - The application process will validate the soldier meets the course prerequisites listed in ATRRS
 - No requirement to provide the training BN any information regarding prerequisites



STATUS OF TITLE XI CUTS



- No new cuts on the horizon

TATS-C VERSUS RC3




- One of our benchmarks for measuring TASS implementation

TATS-C: RC LNO INVOLVEMENT

POIs are sent to RCs for review after completion. If there is a problem, it is identified after completion rather than during the design.
