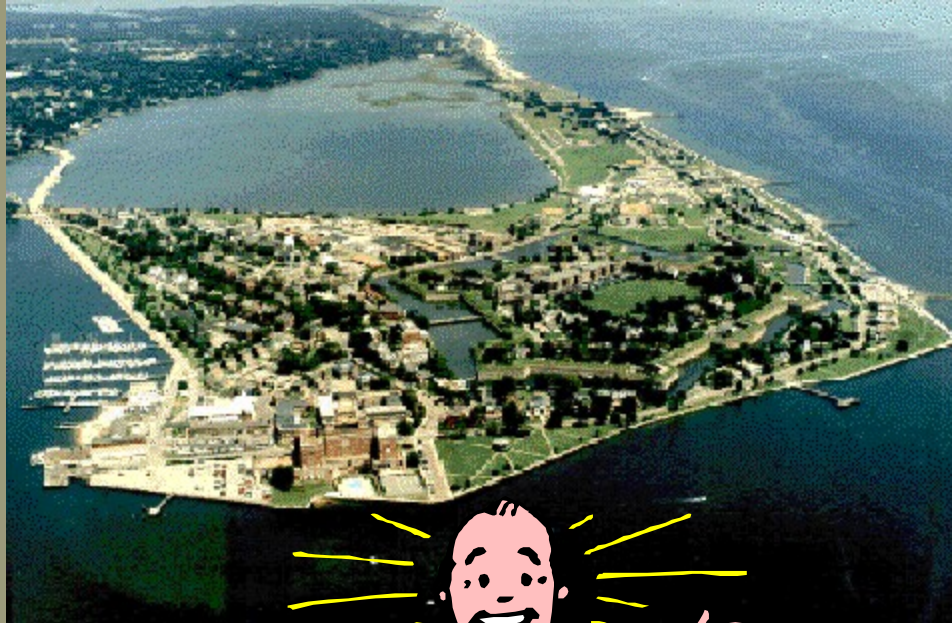

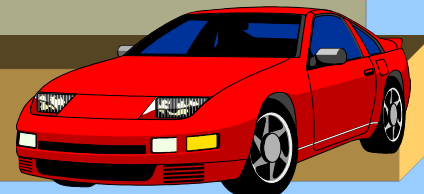

## ***LOCAL ROADWAYS, (Cont..)***

Plan travel in advance. Depart in sufficient time to allow for traffic delays, especially during rush hour.

Tune your car radio to posted information stations when traveling through tunnels or crossing the James and Coleman Bridges.

Highway construction is a common part of Hagerman Roads living. Drivers must stay alert for changing traffic patterns.

Due to the excessive amount of traffic, expect delays to occur at any time. Traffic can stop for no apparent reason.

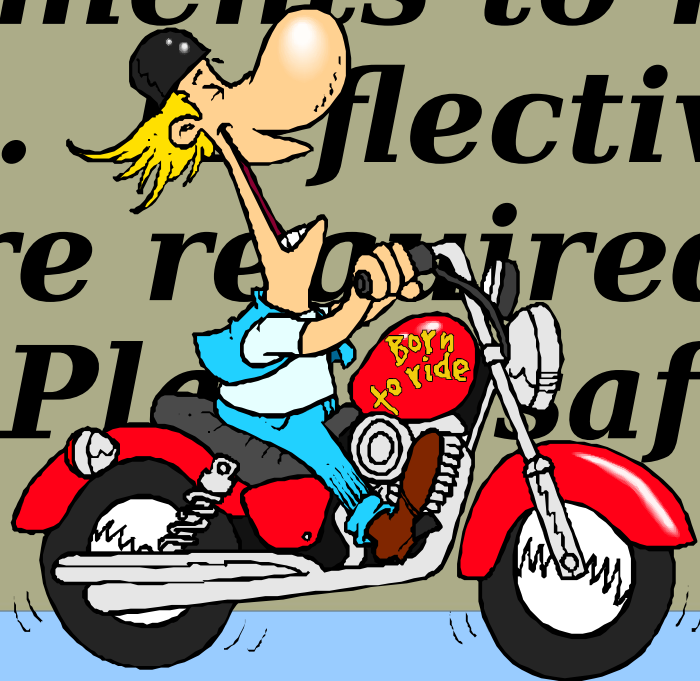
