REO History

- Deputy Under Secretary of Defense (Environmental Security) established REO/ DoD REC concept in 1994
- Army selected as DoD executive agent for EPA Regions 4, 5, 7, and 8
- AEC selected by HQDA to execute REO functions
- Army REOs established in September 1995
- DoD issued charter for REOs (DoDI 4715.2 (1996))

REO Mission

- Coordinate, communicate, and facilitate resolution of regional, state and local environmental issues of importance to Army/DoD installations with federal, state and local officials, the business community and the general public
- Serve as DoD Regional Environmental Coordinator (REC) for assigned regions of responsibility


REO Key Activities

- Track and comment on State legislation and rule-making
- Maintain close working relationships with State regulators and legislators
- Articulate Army/DoD positions
- Facilitate partnering with States
- Coordinate Regional/State/Local environmental issues
- Conduct outreach with National/Regional/State/ Local groups
- Share success stories, innovations, and lessons learned

REO Operational Ground Rules

- Honor the chain of command
- Cannot task installations
- Cannot commit DoD, military departments, or installations
- Cannot establish policy Can provide guidance/ information
- Keep HQDA, IMA, MACOMs, installations informed of developments and in the loop


DoD Regional Environmental Coordinator Structure

- Military departments serve as DoD executive agents for regional environmental coordination Army Executive Agent is DASA(ESOH)
- Executive agents each appoint a DoD Regional Environmental Coordinator to coordinate issues in the assigned regions
- Component RECs coordinate component interests within the region and interface with the DoD REC


Differences Among Service REO's

- Army reports to DASA (ESOH), primary focus is on influencing State environmental legislation & regulation, and protecting Army interests related to environmental matters
- Air Force reports to AFCEE, primary focus is on base compliance and advocacy
- Navy reports to Naval Region Commander (Rear Admiral), primary focus is on base compliance and advocacy



Established DOD-State-EPA Partnerships



DOD-State-EPA Partnerships

- Exist with over half the states (partnerships with signed charters)
- Initial partnership emphasis was on pollution prevention
- Most partnerships now cover all environmental matters
- Current partnership dialog focuses on State environmental legislation & regulation, sustainability, and environmental management systems

Highlights of Recent REO Initiatives/Accomplishments

- Achieved favorable resolution of Georgia air compliance issues during training operations (fugitive dust/opacity limits)
- Obtained Title V air permit exception for tactical support equipment in Alabama, California, and Nevada
- Obtained regulatory variance from California opacity rule for use of obscurants
- Obtained California Air Resource Board variance for military spec fuels, reducing military operational costs and increasing deployability
- Facilitated state of Washington's obscurant use regulation development

Highlights of Recent REO Initiatives/Accomplishments (Cont.)

- Networking/outreach with state regulators/legislators and other state and local government groups to promote support for RRPI
- Helped persuade Massachusetts Department of Environmental Protection to re-review numerical cleanup standard for RDX
- Transitioned original P2 partnerships to sustainability partnerships or military environmental groups in most states
- Sponsorship/key participant in various DoD/State/EPA regional environmental conferences (e.g., Regions 3, 4 & 5)

Highlights of Recent REO Initiatives/Accomplishments (Cont.)

- Obtained Kansas land use control legislative bill favorable to Army
- Assisted in drafting of EPA Region 4 land use control policy
- Drafted legislation that resolved hazardous waste fee payment by military in Georgia
- Obtained exemption for military to NPDES outfall posting rule in Georgia

Summary

REOs are / have:

- Established good working relationships and high level access to State/Federal regulators
- Helping minimize adverse impacts of proposed/existing legislation and regulation on installation operations
- Assisting installations in their working with States, Federal agencies, and Tribal governments
- Achieving cost savings and avoidances
