

TIE Jackson Mission

TIE-Jackson supports execution of The Army School System (TASS) on a continuous basis across 13 states, Puerto Rico, the Virgin Islands, the District of Columbia and USAREUR to enhance Army readiness and promote soldier preparedness.

TIE-Jackson Goals

1. Assist DCSED in increasing Army readiness by overwatching increased duty MOSQ

- Assist with the development of the Title XI training program and handbook
- Assist DCSED in finalizing all UIC codes and assigning all TIE-Jackson personnel to the TIE-Jackson UIC
- Develop internal SOPs to further enhance efficiency of support to Title XIs
- Expand and refine the TIE-Jackson orientation for new Title XIs

TIE-Jackson Goals contSupporting Objectives

- 4. Continue to focus on accreditation
- Continue to assist Title XIs by maintaining positive regional tri-component relations, providing proactive accreditation support, and facilitating issue resolution
- Continue to provide stringent budget requirements to DCSED and utilize the current reduced budget to fully fund units in the accreditation window; all others receive 50% funding

Significant TASS Issues in TIE-Jackson

- Issue: Impact of proposed TXI cuts____
- **Discussion:**
 - Impact on the TIE Staff functions with the loss of Title XIs
 - Subsequent impact on Title XI support and TASS responsibilities
 - Impact on accreditation process with the withdrawal of the Title XI proponents
- **Recommendation / Impact / Status:** This is a near mission stopper that requires the development of a coherent plan with a hard timeline to minimize the adverse impact upon the Title XI program and TASS.

Significant TASS Issues in TIE-Jackson (cont.)

- ➤ **Issue:** Title XI Schooling
- **Discussion:**
 - Schooling as part of the Title XI training program
 - TAITC, CAS3/CGSC instructor certification, TTC
 - PCS and TDY developmental enroute schooling (outbound)
 - Professional developmental schooling for Title XIs
 - CAS3, Ranger, Pathfinder, Air Assault, Food Service Management
- Pecommendation / Impact / Status: Need a DCSED, TRADOC driven standardized mechanism to

Significant TASS Issues in TIE-Jackson (cont.)

- **Issue:** FY 02 Funding and impending accreditation schedule
- **Discussion:** TIE-Jackson has 30+ accreditations scheduled for FY 02 across Regions B, C, and D.
- **Recommendation / Impact / Status:** The management of the budget will require close attention to cover down on the as of yet unpublished proponent accreditation schedules.
