Purpose

DPG FY04-09 Tasks

- Develop a Training Transformation Implementation Plan by April 2003
 - Leverage existing ranges and virtual planning
 - 25% of major training events must be joint by October 2005
- Establish a Training Transformation Investment Program of up to \$1B for execution by USJFCOM
- Achieve JNTC initial operating capability no later than 1 October 2004
- Establish JNTC Joint Management Office that reports to USJFCOM

Provide dynamic, capabilities-based training for the Department of Defense in support of national security requirements across the full spectrum of service, joint, interagency, intergovernmental, and multinational operations.

Training Transformation (T2) Management Initiative Decision (MID 906)

T2 provides a phased approach for systematical expanding joint warfighter "capabilities" in sure of national security requirements across the full Spectrum of joint, interagency, intergovernment and multinational operations.

Joint National Training Capability Definition

The Joint National Training Capability (JNTC) is a cooperati collection of interoperable training sites, nodes, and even synthesizes Combatant Commander and Service training requirements with appropriate "joint context." Founded u the four pillars of (1) realistic combat training, (2) an ada and credible opposing force, (3) common ground truth (4) high quality feedback, the JNTC underpins a global, information age joint national training capability that adva Defense Department transformation efforts in include ena Multinational, interagency, and intergovernmental network-centric operations.

Implementation

The Commander, US Joint Forces Command (JFCO plans, implements, and executes JNTC activities. JFCOM, in coordination with the Services, approves execution of all JNTC funding, certifies JNTC sites a systems, and supports and accredits all JNTC ever

Accreditation and Certification Event Accreditation

A validation that focuses on the elements of joint context required to execute and assess the joint tasks conducted in a particular training event

Facility and System Certification

A determination that supporting systems and infrastructure located at training sites meet standards for interoperability and functionality, in order to create joint training environments.

OSD (P&R) JNTC Major Thrusts

- 1. <u>Improved Horizontal Training</u>: Build on existing Service interoperability training
- 2. <u>Improved Vertical Training</u>: Link component and joint command and staff planning and execution
- 3. <u>Integration Exercises</u>: Enhance existing joint exercises to address joint interoperability training in joint context
- Functional Training: Provide dedicated joint training environment for functional warfighting and complex joint tasks (conduct further study)_

The Future...


- Need to bring all service equities to the training and to the fight, simultaneously
- Need to combine <u>live</u>, <u>virtual</u> and <u>constructive</u>.
- Need to combine range complexes on the West, the Gulf and the East Coasts.
- Need a comprehensive series of standardized country studies, data bases and enemy orders of battle.

 Need for a coherent flexible and standing JOINT OPFOR headquarters directly follo

The JNTC OPFOR

- Integrated Joint OPFOR is required
- Service and contracted OPFORs will be leveraged
- OPFOR HQ function is required in order to...
 - Provide rigor and enhancements
 - Augment, not replace, service adversarial forces
 - Emphasize planning, resourcing, exercise control and database maintenance.
 - Rather than C2, the standing OPFOR's success is based upon integrating, coordinating and synchronizing.

JNTC OPFOR (functional) Org



Planning Function

 Standard OPFOR planning, but with emphasis on adding elements to the 'joint context.'

Resourcing Function

- Primary functions are to:
 - -Establish priorities for OPFOR needs
 - -Fund/resource enhancements

Higher 'Control' Function

- Enhancements will require focused liaison to ensure integration.
- Control is not as important as <u>coordination</u> and integration.

Emerging Technology Functi

 Key function will be one of cataloging and acquiring access to emerging technology in simulations, replicators, concepts and equipment

- - To provide realistic threat representation across the <u>full spectrum of military</u> operations.
 - To integrate, distribute and manage simulated OPFOR in a distributed network.
 - Serve as the exercise focal point for stressing the Joint forces.

Measures of Success:

- OPFOR supports the full range of required situations forces are expected to face.

<u>Today</u>

- Insufficient focus on joint training requirements
- Joint training focused at Strategic and operational level
- Training ranges and equipment is Service specific
- Service level events lack resources to provide proper environment for joint task execution
- No coherent joint capabilities improvement process in place

- An enabled coherent joint training strategy
- Focused down to the appropriate tactical level
- Linked ranges that can create multiple training environments to meet joint training requirements
- JNTC delivers joint context and appropriate resources to properly carry out joint tasks
- JNTC enables and orchestrates capability improvement strategies for

joint warfighting gaps and 22

JNTC End State

JNTC provides the environment that will:

- 1. Enable us to better exercise forces in Joint tasks
- 2. Measure joint force performance
- Identify specific deficiencies that occur in the gaps and seams
- 4. Develop the DOTMLPF recommended solutions to achieve joint warfighting



Technical Event Bridging Event


Culminating Eve

- -Validate and test technical architectures
- -Determine technical issues and shortfalls
- -Includes modeling & simulation
- Requires no live

- -Prepare sites/events for certification/accreditation
- -Leverage existing exercises/training activities
- -Includes rehearsal/test of operational and technical architectures
- -Requires no live forces; may require HICON elements

- -Conduct and/or complete accreditation and certification
- -Thorough execution and assessment of joint objectives using proper joint context
- -All required live/constructive/virt ual forces participate
- -Joint warfighting issues identified
