

#### **RIGOR**



- Train to Standard

- Doctrine based AAR that guides leaders to accept responsibility
- Stress of all BOS in decisive ground combat operations
- Free thinking OPFOR with an equal chance to win
- A tactical scenario where the outcome is not assured
- The consequences of tactical decisions are fully played



- Operational Environment (weather, terrain, and threat)






# The Future WFX Paradigm



**DEPLOYEX** Intel **Seminar IPC STARTEX Exchanges** Capabilities-Based Threat that uses strategic, operational, and tactical Asymmetry (Information Warfare, Bio, Chemical, Terrorism, etc) **Asymmetrical Warfare is** fundamental & part of our **OPFOR doctrine (FM 100-60's)** 

Mid to High conflict remains the focus



#### **Threat XXI**



- Threat XXI includes the environment in which US forces must operate and the actors opposing those forces to 2010.
- The Threat XXI force is opportunity-driven, capable of operating across the full range of military operations, and employs conventional as well as asymmetrical methods

## **Threat XXI Composition**



- Full range of conventional forces Mechanized, armor, infantry, artillery, MRLs
- 🧓 Includes obsolete to advanced weapons

Retrofit weapons with improved night optics and precision munitions

**Increased number of advanced ATGM systems** 

- Well trained special operations forces
  - Skilled in electronic/information warfare
- Includes mercenary forces, special police and paramilitary organizations
- Chemical capability with an accurate long range delivery means (Tactical Ballistic Missiles)



### **Threat XXI Composition**



- Increased camouflage and deception capabilities
- Aviation assets consist of fixed wing, rotary wing, and UAVs
- Capable of achieving technological surprise GPS jammers

#### **Threat XXI Tactics**

- Combined with simultaneous operations in and out of theater
- Attack US forces anywhere possible
- Coordinated operations between police, paramilitary groups, special forces, guerillas, mercenaries, terrorists, conventional forces, and WMD
- Use diplomacy to limit U.S. military options

#### **Threat XXI Tactics**





#### **Neutralize US Technological Overmatch**

- Attack advanced US weapons through asymmetric means
- Use chemical munitions and ballistic missiles to shut down US airfields
- Increase the number of advanced MANPADs available to SOF
- Deploy advanced air defense systems such as the S-300
- Deploy advanced ATGM with infantry
- Conduct force-on-force battles only when having a significant advantage
- Increase use of UAVs with multiple sensors
- Use mercenary computer operators to attack US information systems



## WFX FOCUS vs Threat XXI - Out of Balance?



#### WFX FOCUS

- Focus on the close fight
- Involve conventional operations
- Stress U.S. strengths
- Include all BOS



#### Threat XXI

- Avoids the close fight Conducts asymmetric and unconventional operations
- Stresses U.S. weak areas
- Limited in some BOS areas
  - Compan terrain



## Challenges



- Replicating Threat XXI and its operational environment with an outdated computer simulation
- Providing the blue force commander and staff with all the details about a specific operational environment for each WFX
- Balancing the full effect of asymmetric operations with blue force training objectives

#### **Bottom Lines**



- BCTP is implementing asymmetric threats within constraints imposed by Exercise Directors
