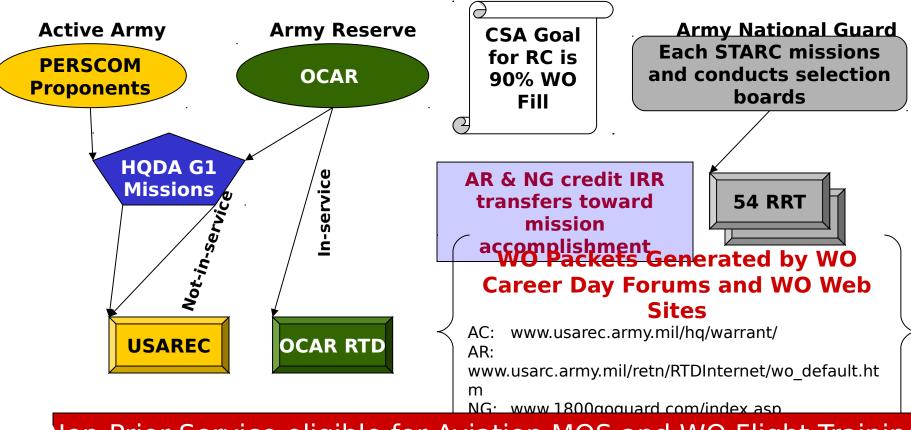

Proponents Control Pre-requisite and Qualification Processes



Non-Prior Service eligible for Aviation MOS and WO Flight Training AKA - "*High School to Flight School*"

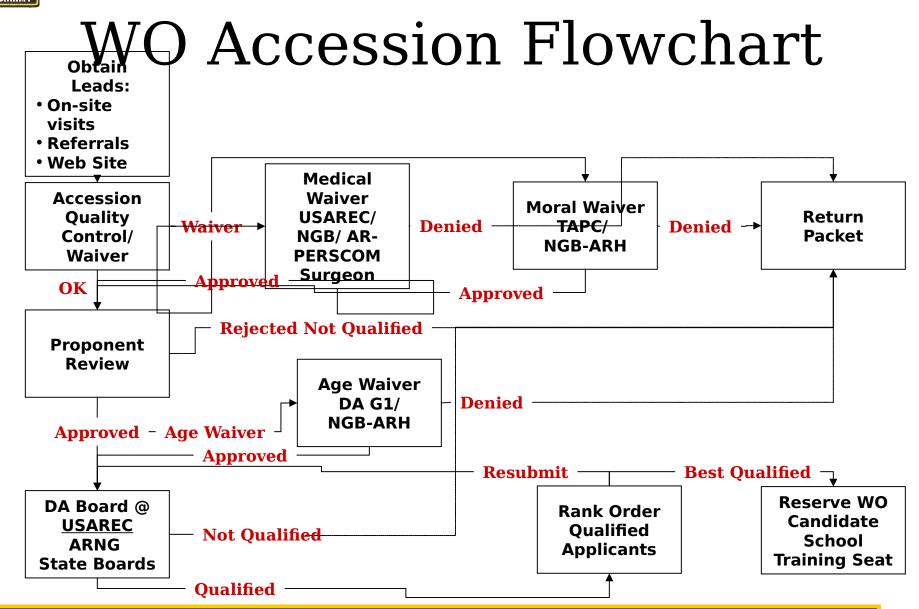


WO Selection Criteria

- All WOs: US citizenship, GT score of 110 or higher, HSGD or GED, secret clearance (interim secret to apply), pass 3 event APFT, and pass appointment/flight physical
- Technical WO: rank of SGT or higher, BNCOC graduate, 4-6 years experience in a feeder MOS, less than 46 years of age, and not more than 12 years AFS (all waiverable by proponent)
- Aviation WO: anyone can apply even civilians, 90 or higher on AFAST, less than 29 years of age (waiverable) on board convene date
- AC and RC AFS/Age waivers go to HQDA G1 (4-6 weeks to process)
- AC and RC moral waivers go to AR-PERSCOM (4-6 weeks to process)
- Board cut-off
 - Technical WO: 1 month prior to board convene date
 - Aviation WO: 1 week prior to board convene date for packets w/o waivers
- Tech WO boards held bi-monthly at USAREC starting in March. Not all MOSs are considered at each board (Out-of-service Aviator Boards held monthly)
- Board results:
 - **Fully Qualified Select (FQ-S)** (Go to school in approximately 2-6 months)
 - **Fully Qualified Non-Select (FQ-NS)** (One-time reconsidered by the next board, may resubmit new packet)
 - Not Competitive-Not Selected (NC-NS) (Packet reconsidered by next board if not selected packet is destroyed. The soldier may reapply no sooner than 1 year from the date signed on application.)











Initial WO Training

1500 Seats per year

AC/RC Three Phase Courses

- Active Army classes: 6 weeks 30 training days
 - Junior Phase functioning in a stressful and changing environment
 - Intermediate Phase skill acquisition and task understanding
 - Senior Phase mentoring and counseling on new role as a Warrant Officer
- Reserve Component classes: 4 weeks 28 training days
 - Junior Phase functioning in a stressful and changing environ 350 Seats
 - Intermediate Phase skill acquisition and task understanding
 - Senior Phase mentoring and counseling on new role as a Warrant Officer

RC course has one unique subject - Supervise Platoon CSS





WO Accession Issues

- WO active duty service obligation 6 years versus 5 years for West Point and 3 years for OCS
- Tenure for CW3's (non-selection for CW4 can result in force out prior to 18 year lock-in)
- Pay compression (Difference in pay SSG-WO1: 1964 - 29%, 2003 - 21%)
- WO not eligible for incentives. HQDA initiatives for WO incentives:
 - Continuation of enlisted incentives
 - Provide a critical skills bonus

Army National Guard - recommends direct WO Appointment Boards and establishing State WOCS

WO Accession Background

- WO Management
 - Warrant Officer Management Act (5 Dec 91)
 - Single promotion system for WO
 - Tenure based upon years of WO service
 - Grade of CW5
 - Warrant Officer Leader Development Action Plan (1992)
 - To ensure Active and reserve WO are appointed, trained, and utilized to a single standard.
 - Establishment of the Warrant Officer Career Center
 - Proponents
 - Set Goals and objectives
 - Establish qualifying criteria for applicant packets
 - Design logical, realistic career patterns

US Army Accessions Command

NO Generic Career Development Training

- Entry level
- Model - Warrant Officer Candidate School @ WOCC (1500 seats)
 - high stress course to test the mental, emotional, and physical stamina
 - provide skills, knowledge, and behaviors required of all WO
 - eligible for appointment but not MOS qualified
- Advanced level (WO1/CW2)
 - Proponent WO Basic Course (must complete within 2 years of appointment) - MOS awarded on successful completion
 - WO Advanced Course correspondence @ WOCC must enroll at between 2 to 4 years of WO service and must complete within 1 year
- Senior Level (CW3/CW4)
 - Proponent WO Advanced Course 6th year of WO service
 - CW4 attend 4 week WO Staff Course @ WOCC 14th year of WO service (450 seats)
- Master Level (CW5)
 - Warrant Officer Senior Staff Course @ WOCC 20th year of WO service (200 seats)
 - Proponent may provide follow-on portion





Advanced WO Training

Warrant Officer Basic Course

- Prerequisite: completion of WOCS
- Length: depends on branch/MOS (15 branches 64 MOS)
- Estimated years of WO service: 0 years

Action Officer Development Course (ST7000)

- Prerequisite: Promotion to CW2
- Length: Must be completed within one year of enrollment; WOCC distance learning course enroll/complete on-line via the Internet
- Estimated years of WO service: Between 24 and 48 months of total warrant officer service
- Training topics: management techniques, communication skills, preparing and staffing documents, meetings and interviews, problem solving, writing, coordinating, briefings, and ethics.





Senior WO Training

Warrant Officer Advanced Course

- Prerequisite: CW3 or CW2 promotable
- Length: depends on branch/MOS (15 branches 64 MOS)
- Estimated years of WO service: 6 years

Warrant Officer Staff Course

- Prerequisite: Must have been selected for promotion to CW4
- Length: 4 weeks resident @ WOCC
- Estimated years of WO service: 14 years
- Training topics: leadership, staff skills, communication per year
 threat update, risk management, training management, military
 history, environmental awareness, and the application toward
 genuine issues and problems.





Master WO Training

Warrant Officer Senior Staff Course

- Prerequisite: Selected for promotion to CW5
- Length: 2 weeks resident @ WOCC
- Estimated years of WO service: 20 years



• Training topics: how the Army Runs, force integration, with the latest information on threat, doctrine, force structure, and policy.

Proponent Warrant Officer Senior Staff Follow-on

- Prerequisite: Completion of Warrant Officer Senior Staff Course
- Length: depends on branch/MOS not all branch/MOS proponents provide follow-on training
- Estimated years of WO service: 20 years
