

- \$2B programmed from FY00-05, additional \$3B (est.) required to complete plan. Complete necessary procurement by FY07 and conversions by FY09. Approx. \$600M per year required.
- ADRS
 - Reduces risks to Warfighting CINC's.
 - Supports National Military
 Strategy.

DRS Implementation







ADRS PHASE 1 Requiremen

Combination of distance learning, proponent schools, TASS Bus, & civilian acquired skills

Training = \$100.0M (Phase I & II FUND)

- TASS is the mechanism to accomplish ADRS training -not RC specific
- ENL MOSQ reclassification NCO - CASCOM developing transition criteria/courses OFF - CASCOM developing officer qualification criteria
- ATRRS has requirements for FY00-FY02; FY03-FY05 will be validated through the SMDR

- INTENT: TO CONVERT EXISTING LOWER PRIORITY ARNG COMBAT UNITS TO HIGHER PRIORITY SUPPORT FORCES
- IMPACT: TWO PHASE PROGRAM
 - PHASE I FY00-05 6,580 RECLASS TRAINING **REQUIREMENTS**
 - PHASE II FY 03-05 APPROXIMATEKY 9K SPACES
 - 11 MOSs COMPRISE 85% OF THE RECLASS MISSION
- **STATUS:**
 - 100M FUNDED FOR TRAINING THROUGH FY 05
 - 48% OF PHASE I RECLASS REQUIREMNTS CAPTURED IN **ATRRS**
 - REMAINING PHASE I REQUIREMENTS TO BE CAPTURED **DURING SMDR PROCESS**

TASS ADRS STRATEGY

- GOAL: To coordinate the training requirements of the Army Division Redesign Study (ADRS) conversions to ensure the Tricomponent resources are identified, available, and utilized for mission success.
- Courses of Action:
 - TASS BN lead training (Reclass)
 - Mobile Training Teams
 - Distance Learning
 - IDT/ADT
 - Resident training at Proponent Schools
 - Initial Entry Training
 - Reclass

TASS ADRS STRATEGY

(cont.)

- Cornerstone of ADRS mission success is the identification of resources needed and the completion of Cross Component Resourcing MOUs for the following:
 - Equipment
 - Facilities
 - Certified instructors
 - Location/time/date needed
 - Flexibility and cooperation between all three Compos
- Look at Distance Learning (DL) courseware development schedule for the Phase I MOS courses needed and re-prioritize master priority list to ensure needed DL courses are completed as required.



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TASS ADRS STRATEGY (cont)

- Study Proponent Schools and IET slots available and alternate courses of action to include:
 - Expanding present training base
 - USAF, USN, and USMC resources
 - Contract private industry for location/teams
 - Simulation alternatives
- Establish quarterly coordination meeting with USARC, NGB, DIV (IT)s, RTIs, and TRADOC through FY00 to ensure mission success with ADRS Phase I piece of TASS.

CACI ITRM

- ITRM is a DA initiative to capture the "true cost" of individual training and readiness.
- CACI is the DA contractor building ITRM.
- ITRM is a POI-based automated accounting system, with "what if?" capabilities
- ITRM will be used to fund ADRS and is a "key system" in future DA funding decisions.
- Cooperation with CACI staff on inputs to ITRM modules is critical to each MACOM.
