

Overview of Telephone Interviews

Conducted telephone interviews with points of contact at 26

TRADOC Schools and 3 Centers

- 12 have a current or planned external evaluation program
- 17 do not have a program
- Contacted distance learning coordinators in FORSCOM and PERSCOM: No interest in surveys related to content.



Bases of Current Programs

- 6 current web-based programs
 - 3 course-specific: Intelligence School, Transportation School, and Soldier Support Institute (AG and Finance)
 - 3 generic: Infantry School, Military Police School, and Western Hemisphere Institution for Security Cooperation
- 3 planning web-based course-specific programs: Chemical School, JFK Special Warfare Center and School, and Warrant Officer Career Course
- 3 paper-based programs: Academy of Health Sciences (also moving to web), Defense Language Institute, and Sergeants Major Academy



Trends in Comments

- No enthusiasm for two-pronged survey program (generic and course specific)
- Reasons for no program
 - Lack of staff (virtually unanimous)
 - ODARS sufficient
 - Course revisions driven by equipment/system upgrades
 - Low enrollment
- Favorable opinion of ODARS
 - Cited positively (without prompt) by 8 POCs
 - Illustrates opinion of appropriate level of detail



Trends in Comments (cont.)

- Recurring problems with return rates
 - Need command emphasis
 - Need personnel to follow up
 - Need accessible survey format
- Schools with no program generally think that external feedback would be desirable
 - Not universal agreement: low density, ODARS sufficient
 - Provide stability



ARI's Recommendations

- Raosoft is recommended for the following reasons:
 - Money invested
 - Time investment
 - People investment
 - Proven track record
 - Current work supported
 - Development of Automated Generator and Handbook for
 - on-going work
 - Purchase of "Unlimited Master License within TRADOC"



Software Comparisons

- Approximately 20 software packages were considered, with 10 being ruled out immediately due to their not being able to support things like webbased surveys, inability to branch, and no statistical package.
- In addition to Raosoft, three other software packages were seriously considered based on interview comments:
 - Survey Tracker
 - Survey Pro
 - Perseus



Software Issues

- All software packages were compared to the following:
 - Survey administration by web, diskette, and LAN
 - Prevention from taking survey more than once
 - Branching capability
 - Number of survey templates
 - Number of questions in library
 - Ability to download file to temp directory on PC to create exe.
 - Variable, value labels are created automatically
 - Centering capability
 - Prename fields
 - Page name automatically changes
 - Allows the word "finish" to appear when document is complete
 - Color text
 - If then logic is supported



Software Issues (cont.)

- Statistical package included
- Recoding capability
- Control fonts/colors regardless of html, java, e-mail,
 diskette
- Force responses
- Supports 1500-1800 questions
- Database type




External Evaluation Survey

- Measures satisfaction with Overall Performance, Subject Area Performance, and Task Performance (selected tasks)
- Collects reasons for dissatisfaction with task performance (selected tasks)

Preliminary List of Reasons for Unsatisfactory Task Performance
• Course did not train this task well

- enough
- Course did not train this task at all
- My unit uses DIFFERENT EQUIPMENT than soldiers were trained on in the course
- My unit uses DIFFERENT PROCEDURES than soldiers were trained on in the course
- Soldiers generally lacked the physical strength or endurance
- Soldiers generally lacked the Skill/Knowledge
