
Descriptive Terms

People prefer Asian American (without hyphen) because using the hyphen describes foreign affairs kind of things: "Asian-American trade talks". The lack of the hyphen stresses that Asian Americans are not foreigners.

Oriental

Oriental -- A general rule of thumb is "Oriental is for rugs, not people"

In Washington state, local and state lawmakers are prohibited from using the term "Oriental" in statutes, codes, rules, and regulations!





Socio-Economic Factors

While the average Asian/Pacific Islander (API) family enjoys the highest median family income, they also have one of the highest rates of poverty in urban and rural areas

An estimated 27% of API families earn approximately 1/4 of the poverty level for a family of four

In San Francisco, 29% of the API population live below the poverty line; in New York City, 43% of API children are born into poverty; and in Minnesota, API children are three times as likely (37%) to live in poverty as other children






