

#### Early 90s


2 Major Theater Wars (MTWs)

## The Army Reserve - Training Strategy-



#### AT

Mission focused training

#### **Small Units**

(Dets, Teams, DUICs) Mobilize and deploy from home station

Mobilized

(Company and larger) Mobilize and deploy from Mobilization Station

Training and Readiness Continuum Mission Training focused on individuals, CTT, Wpn MOPP, PT, Annual SRP, Mandatory Classes 1st and 2nd level collective technical train



## The Army Reserve - Training Transformation -



- The old way of doing business is insufficient to meet today's and tomorrow's challenges.
- Units trained and manned to standard so they can report within 24 hours and dramatically reduce post-Mobilization training.
- TTHS account will allow units to be manned with a higher level of deployable soldiers.
- USARPERSCOM will manage soldier assignments.

#### - Challenges to Training Transformation -

- Individual Training and Education
  - New courseware for distance learning
  - Assignment to TTHS account for PME
  - Management of TTHS and soldier assignments
- Collective Training
  - Highly specialized and technical force structure
  - Geographical dispersion
  - Limited time available
