Definition

Validation is simply quality control of the design and development process

Types of Validation

- Test Validation ----
 - Distinguishes between performers and nonperformers
 - Must be completed prior to course/courseware validation
- Course/Courseware validation includes ---
 - Content Validation
 - Individual Trials
 - Group Trials
 - Operational Tryout

Content Validation

- Is Part of development process
- Determines if the materials ---
 - Are doctrinally/technically correct
 - Include sufficient detail
 - Are written in the Army Writing Style
 - Use language the target audience will understand
 - Performed by SME during reviews/IPRs
 - Focuses SME on the critical characteristics (via job aids, TR 350-70)
 - Eliminates problems early

Individual Trials

- QCs the methods of instruction
- Ensures the learning activities work
- Uses a volunteer (one person) that has the basic characteristics of a student (school/contractor can use in-house personnel)
- QCs a small portion of lesson at a time

Group Trials

- Are intrinsically part of development process
- Are critical to creation of effective training
- Ensure that lessons are statistically valid
- Determine time requirements for lessons
- Add little extra time to the process (if lessons are valid) – Note: Validation of each and every <u>objective</u> is a contract requirement

Operational Tryout

- Is intrinsically part of the process
- Can be conducted during first class (pilot)
- Will probably incur additional costs if it is the only validation activity conducted (waiting to the end of the project to identify and fix problems is not cost effective)

Operational Tryout

During operational tryouts, the team will determine whether or not -

- All the lessons (TLOs) work together to provide sequential and progressive training within the course
- All course resource requirements are identified
- Course materials provide contradictory information/ training
- All problems/inaccuracies are eliminated

Operational Tryout

- Operational tryout is a final validation activity that --
- Exposes class (target audience) to entire course/ phase/module/lesson (whichever is the largest instructional unit being developed)
- Trains course under actual training conditions
- Provides statistical validation data

Group Trials

- Fixed sample method
 - Requires a minimum of 30 volunteers
 - Volunteers must possess critical characteristics of target audience
 - More statistically reliable
- Sequential validation method -
 - Can involve as few as 4 students or as many as 30
 - A minimum of 10 students is recommended for time calculations
 - Volunteers must possess critical characteristics of target audience
 - Less statistically valid
