## Miss Ruth Savord, Noted Librarian, Dies In West

Miss Ruth Savord, a native of Sandusky and a nationally known reference librarian, died Friday in Santa Fe, N. M., after a lengthy illness. Miss Savord was a sister of the late Edmond H. Savord, former judge of Erie County common pleas court for 21 years and later on the Toledo district court of appeals.

Miss Savord was graduated from Sandusky High School and the school of library science at Western Reserve University, Cleveland. For 30 years she was librarian for the Council on Foreign Relations in New York City and was active in the American Library Association.

The deceased was a former director and president of the Special Libraries Association, which presented her its professional award in 1954 and elected her to its Hall of Fame in 1960. Miss Savord helped organize the Frick Art Reference Library and general education board library in New York City. She was also noted as an author of books and articles on library work.

Surviving are a sister, Mrs. Frank T. Haffner, Chicago and two nephews, Attorney John E. Savord and Joseph, both Sandusky.

Funeral arrangements are to be announced later by the Charles J. Andres' Sons Funeral Home.
