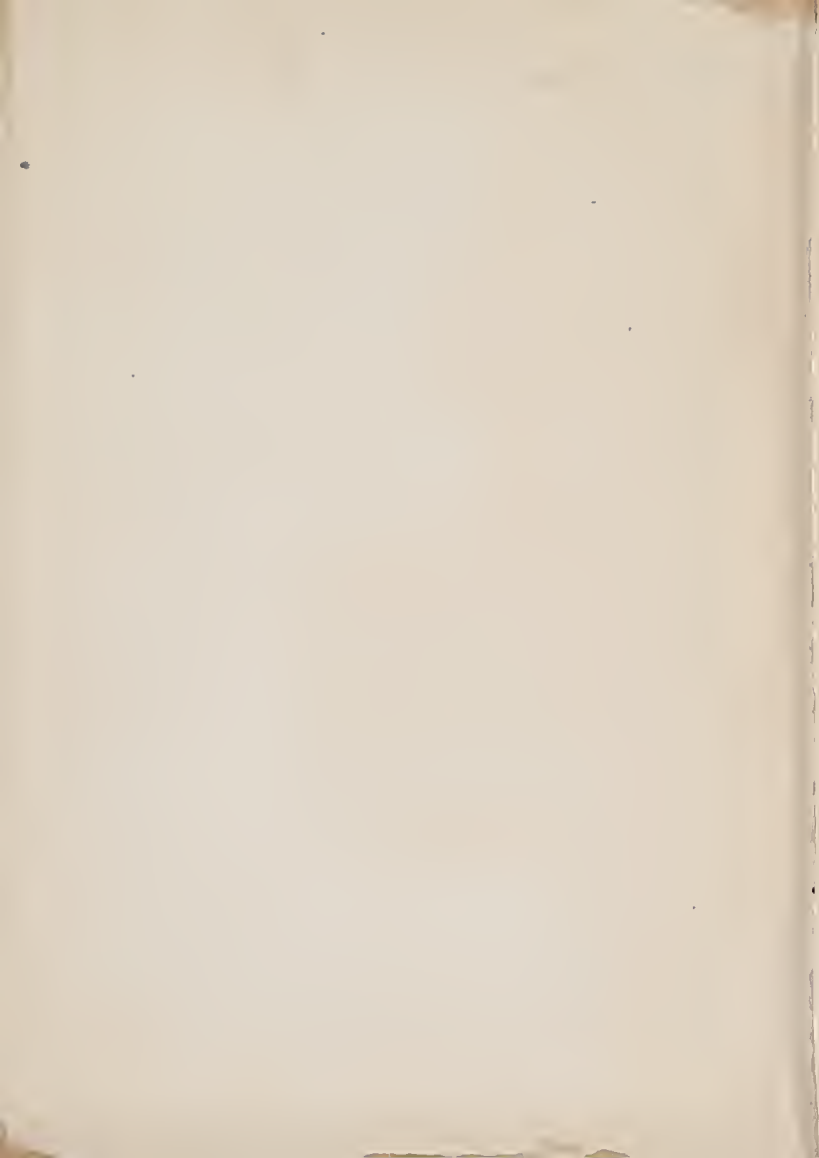

Insurance:—A mailable parcel on which the postage is fully prepaid may be Insured against loss in an amount equivalent to its actual value, but not to exceed U. S. \$100, on payment of a fee of 3 cents in stamps for \$5.00; 5 cents for \$25.; 10 cents for \$50.; 25 cents for \$100. stamps to be affixed. C.O.D. Parcels may be sent from Shanghai to U.S.A. up to value of \$100.00.

MONEY ORDERS:—Money orders are issued for payment in the United States and its island possessions (Guam, Hawaii, Porto Rico, and Tutuila, Samoa) and in Bermuda, British Guiana, British Honduras, Canada, the Canal Zone, Cuba, Mexico, the Philippine Islands, and certain of the West Indies.

International parcels may be insured up to \$500.00 with a fee of 30 cents per \$120.00 or fraction thereof. Domestic parcels are charged at single, double, treble, quintuple or sextuple rates, according to the routes followed. A return receipt may be obtained on payment of an additional fee of 5 cents in the case of domestic parcels, and 10 cents in the case of international parcels.

Parcels taxed with trade charges—limited to \$500—are accepted for transmission between Parcel Insurance Offices on payment of a 2 per cent fee of the amount to be collected.

MONEY ORDERS, variable, may be ascertained at the issuing Office. Minimum charge, 5 cents per order. Limit of one Order, \$200 between Money Order Offices Aa., and \$100 between offices A, or A and Aa; \$50 between Offices B, or B, and A, or Aa.
