TERMS OF ADMISSION.

Candidates for admission to the Preparatory Classes, should be familiar with the elements of Geography, English Grammar and Arithmetic. Unless the Student has mastered these subjects, when he enters, he will not be able to complete the preparatory course in the time prescribed. The practice of passing over the elementary subjects hastily, and pressing on to the higher departments without adequate preparation, cannot be too strongly condemned.

Candidates for admission to advanced classes should be familiar with *all* the subjects of the preceding part of the course.

Students secure the largest advantages by entering at the beginning of the year and continuing to the close.

Opportunities are ordinarily not afforded for studying any particular subject, except during the time to which it is allotted in the course of instruction.

To enter the Freshman Class, the student should be at least fourteen years of age; and, except in extraordinary cases, a student under eighteen years of age *should* not enter on the studies of the Junior Scientific Class.

The Modern Languages are not included in the regular courses.

Those pursuing the Scientific Course may take French or German, instead of Latin. Students of the Classical Course may take German instead of Hebrew. Under favorable circumstances, a student may take either French or German, in addition to the regular studies of either course.

Opportunities are offered in the College of taking lessons on the Piano Forte. Facilities for studying Vocal Music, under able masters, are enjoyed in connection with different Musical Associations in the city.

All the students are required to attend the worship of God, daily, in the College Chapel, and to recite Bible lessons once a week. All are likewise required to attend public worship and Bible Class, in some church on the Sabbath. Those who take the Classical course will read exegetically the greater part of the New Testament in Greek, and select portions of the Old Testament in Hebrew. In addition to studying the usual text books on the Evidences of Christianity, and Moral Philosophy, the Seniors will take a brief course in the principles of the Gospel, using Shaw's Exposition of the Confession of Faith, as the text book. This course of religious instruction will be especially valuable to those whose professional studies will not lead them to a careful examination of the facts and principles of the Word of God. Students' Prayer Meetings have been organized; they are well attended. The Faculty regard it as an important part of their work to labor for the moral and spiritual welfare of the Students.

The Degree of "A. B." is conferred upon Students who complete the Classical Course and pass the examinations in the same.

The Degree of "B. S." is conferred upon Students who complete the Scientific Course and pass the examinations in the same.

Ladies are admitted, to both courses, on the same footing with gentlemen.

Elocutionary and Rhetorical exercises are regularly required of all the Students throughout both courses.

ADDITIONAL INFORMATION.

LIBRARY.

The Library contains about one thousand volumes, including five hundred dollars worth of new books, selected expressly for the College. It is accessible to all the Students.

APPARATUS.

An extensive Philosophical and Chemical Apparatus has been procured and is now in successful use. It affords the means for a satisfactory illustration of the most important doctrines in the various departments of Astronomy, Natural Philosophy and Chemistry.

CABINET.

The College has purchased of James Barnett, D. D., Missionary at Cairo, Egypt, an Oriental Cabinet, the result of seventeen years labor in Palestine and Egypt, containing ancient coins, geological specimens from Sinai and regions about the Red Sea, and many articles of interest to the students of Bible history. The College has also procured from the State, a Geological Cabinet, consisting of duplicate specimens from the State Geological Cabinet at Springfield, which has been arranged in appropriate cases, and furnishes the students an opportunity of studying the geological structure of our own State.

LITERARY SOCIETIES.

There are four Literary Societies in the College—the *Philadelphian*, *Eccritean*, *Amateurs des Belles Lettres* and *Aletheorian*—on a good footing, which afford to their members respectively the opportunity of improvement in the branches of learning for the promotion of which they are established.

GOVERNMENT.

It is the aim of the Faculty to secure good order and diligence in study, by the force of moral and religious principles, rather than by direct exercise of authority. Those who persist in neglecting their studies, or in pursuing disorderly courses, or in exerting an evil influence, will not be permitted to remain in connection with the College.

EXPENSES.

Tuition is from \$16 to \$25 per annum, payable in advance at the commencement of each session. There is also a charge of \$1 per session for incidental expenses. This does not include tuition for the French and German languages and Music. Boarding in private families, including lodging and fuel, may be had from \$2.75 to \$3.00 per week. Some students board themselves at a cost of less than \$1.50 per week. Male and female pupils are admitted on the same terms. The payment of all College fees is required in advance.

EXAMINATIONS.

In addition to the usual public examinations there is a private examination by the Faculty, of every class, on each book or subject as soon as completed. This examination is thorough and complete. No student is permitted to advance to higher subjects, until the lower are mastered.

SESSIONS AND VACATIONS.

The present College year will close on Commencement Day—Thursday, June 30th. The first session of the eighth College year will open on Tuesday, September 6th, at 2 o'clock, P. M., and close on Friday, December 23d. The second session will open on Monday, January 9th, at 2 o'clock, P. M., and close on Friday, March 31st. The third session will open on Monday, April 10th, and close on Thursday, June 29th. The Summer vacation will continue about two months, the Winter, about two weeks, and the Spring, about one week.

SCHOLARSHIPS.

Students applying for admission on hired scholarships, must present a certificate from the owner thereof, authorizing them to

use the same. Such certificate should specify particularly the time for which the scholarship has been transferred. *No Scholarship is available until the interest is paid.*

The new College building has been completed, and is now occupied. It is eighty feet long and fifty feet wide. It contains eighteen rooms suited to College purposes. It will accommodate a large number of Students.

Monmouth is a young and rapidly growing city of about three thousand inhabitants, situated on a fine rolling prairie, on the line of the Chicago, Burlington and Quincy Railroad. It is easy of access from every direction. It contains flourishing churches of various Evangelical denominations.
