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

COUNCIL AUTHORIZATION

The Montana State Council on Vocational Education was established as a required part of a total state system for vocational education by the passage of the 1984 Carl D. Perkins Vocational Education Act. State Councils are required to establish a viable link among the business, industry, labor and education communities.

On March 1, 1985, Governor Ted Schwinden created the State Council on Vocational Education by Executive Order No. 3-85.

The Council is composed of 13 individuals who are broadly representative of citizens and groups within the state

- Initiatives and methods the private sector could undertake to assist in the modernization of vocational education.
- Policies the State should pursue to strengthen vocational education.
- Procedures the sole State agent should pursue to assure access to vocational education programs.

TO LISTEN

 To the general public as concerns and ideas are expressed at public hearings.

TO EVALUATE/ASSESS

- Vocational education delivery system assisted under JTPA and Carl D. Perkins Act.
- Distribution of financial assistance furnished to vocational education programs in Montana under the Carl D. Perkins Act.

TO REPORT

 Recommendations and findings to the Governor, sole State agent, State Job Training Coordinating Council, U.S. Secretary of Education, U.S. Secretary of Labor and the general public.
