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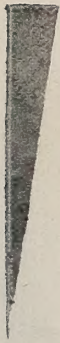

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## PREFACE.

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The long felt need of an intellectual means by which a pupil can exchange literary work and be in touch with all the best schools of this nation prompted us to compile this work at a great expense of time, labor and money. It will give the North an opportunity to learn of the South, of all the beautiful scenery, plants, flowers and fruits. You are in touch with all the best schools of our country, as we solicit only those that we know to be the best.

Our idea is to improve the better schools and benefit the smaller. It is put on an elevated basis, and by the course we are pursuing in exchanging literary work no harm can come from it, but a great deal of good result therefrom. It teaches a pupil how to write and depend upon himself. It will teach him to write an intelligent letter about his own home, the industries of his section of the country, and other important things that all intelligent boys and girls are interested in.

A long and careful study has convinced us that a great deal of good may be derived from a bureau of this kind, and since the plan has been indorsed by some of the best school men of the Mississippi valley we are more firm in our belief than ever. It is something that will interest every pupil in our public schools. It will be a help in the study of geography and history, as well as any particular event of which a pupil may wish to know.

This volume contains the names of all the States of the Union, the counties, the county seats and other large cities. In addition to this the names of superintendents and members of the boards of education for all these places are given, and interesting points of school law from each State.

From various parts of the country are letters written by school children concerning the geography of their section of the country, showing how this subject can be carried on successfully.

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## TO SUPERINTENDENTS.

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If at any time a superintendent wishes to change his location, with the Directory in hand he has all the means he needs to find a vacancy. He can correspond with the Bureau and learn of the most desirable vacancies, or he has the name and address of any one to whom he would wish to write. All those whose names are found in the directory are members of the Bureau, and will gladly furnish any information needed. It is no small matter to be in close touch with school men all over this great country. Man grows, develops, by coming in contact with man. Here is an opportunity to come in contact with the best minds of your country.



## TO SCHOOL OFFICERS.

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Do you want the best teachers in the land? Do you want to know where to find them? The Directory will tell you where you can find teachers who desire to change their location. You can correspond with other school officers and know just what you are getting. In purchasing necessary supplies for your schools you can first know the experience that some other board has had with the supplies, and thus save you not only money but save the schools from being imposed upon by a lot of cheap, unused material. Should you at any time fail to get the desired information the Bureau will gladly assist. There will not be a day in the year that this Directory will not be of use to you.

After June 1st, 1900, we expect to locate in Louisville, Ky., in order that we may be more centrally located. Further information concerning the future location will be given in the future.

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## TO TEACHERS.

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A teacher should know more than he teaches, and should be in close touch with as many different schools and teachers as possible.

The Directory places you in a position that will enable you to be in direct communication with almost every school in the land.

It at once places you in a position that will enable you to secure a better position than you now occupy. It will enable you to command better wages than you are now getting. After having used the Directory one year no teacher would do without it.

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## RULES AND REGULATIONS FOR EXCHANGE OF LITERARY WORK.

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In the exchange of literary work we kindly ask that the pupils' names and addresses be not given. If such should be done we kindly ask that such names and addresses be erased before the communications are handed to the pupils. This work may constitute a part of their school work and may be graded the same as other work.

All letters should be read and signed by the superintendent, principal or teacher. The Directory is placed in the hands of the school officials and not in the hands of the pupils.

In this volume are letters from different parts of the United States which illustrate plainly one important use of the Directory.

These letters are written by pupils of the Eighth Grade, and show what may be accomplished along the line of geography studied in this way.

## RENEWAL OF DIRECTORY.

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Our Directory will not become useless at the end of a year.

We have arrangements by which it will be kept up to date.

Each year all members will be furnished with information concerning any change made in the superintendency of any school in any State. Members can then make entries, as there are spaces left for that purpose.

Every two years information will be furnished concerning changes made in school boards, spaces being left in the Directory for such entries. The Directory will be wholly renewed at the end of five years.

In the meantime we propose to include England, Scotland and Ireland.

While it is a fact that many school boards consist of more than three members, we do not think it necessary to give but three, and in so doing have aimed to give those that would be most beneficial to the members of our Bureau.

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## NATIONAL MEETING OF SUPERINTENDENTS.

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The Superintendents of the National Bureau will meet once a year, in the month of June. The first meeting will be held June 13 and 14, 1900, at Louisville, Ky. At that meeting it will be decided at what place the next meeting shall be held the following year by a vote of the members of the Bureau.

At this meeting of Superintendents papers upon subjects relative to school work will be read by members of the Bureau, and afterward turned over to us that we may publish them in book or pamphlet form. All members may procure copies by paying postage and cost of publication.

Below are given subjects that will be discussed at this meeting.

1. At what point in the course of study should pupils be permitted to specialize?
2. How many years should writing be taught in the schools?
3. In the study of physics, botany and zoology, what portion of the time should be given to laboratory work?
4. What lessons does the history of the schools of Germany have for us?
5. Should German be taught in our public schools?
6. The future of the Mississippi valley as a factor of the world's civilization.
7. What incentive should be presented to pupils to induce them to attend or remain in school?
8. What are the leading defects in the teaching of English in the grades and in the high schools?
9. What are the merits and demerits of high school foot ball games, military companies, club swinging organizations and "red fire" games and organizations in general?

10. What are the merits and demerits of high school State and district oratorical contests?
11. "Professional honor" as applied to superintendents and teachers.
12. What are the essential elements of success in school supervision?
13. To what extent should a superintendent seek to control the habits of pupils?
14. What is the duty of the superintendent toward temperance organizations?
15. To what extent should a superintendent keep silent politically?
16. What are the comparative merits, so far as the schools are concerned, of school and city libraries?
17. The lack of practicability in the public school. Its cause and cure.
18. The common schools in 1950.
19. How can a greater love for classic literature be created in pupils?

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General Purpose: Aside from considerations of personal culture, the serviceableness of drawing to the industrial employments is its chief recommendation. There is hardly any class of persons to whom it is not beneficial, and to many classes it is almost indispensable. To the architect and others whose occupations are based largely on the work of the artist it is absolutely essential.

To train the eye to judge distance and direction, absolute and relative, size, shape, color, and the hand to execute rapidly and accurately the mandates of the mind.

*Our Dear Louisiana Friends:*

PORTLAND, Ind., April 24, 1899.

As we have heard so much of your beautiful, far-away homes, we thought it would be nice for us to enter into a correspondence, telling each other about our country, schools, studies, etc.; so we decided to write the first letter.

We are the pupils of the Seventh Grade, of the East District of Portland, and our class is composed of thirty-five boys and sixteen girls.

Portland is a city of about six or seven thousand inhabitants, and is the county seat of Jay County. It has several very fine buildings which are equal to those of any first-class city, and among these are the Bimel Block and the Cartwright and Headington Building, each covering nearly half a square. In about a year we will have two very magnificent buildings—the new Methodist Church and the County Jail, besides several paved streets.

Portland, although a small city, has a good many of the modern improvements, such as electric lights, water-works, telephone, cement and cut-stone walks, and several others.

Our chief places of amusement are the Public Library, which contains many books, magazines and papers; the Auditorium, a large, beautiful building, containing our spacious Opera-House, and the Lagoon, a small park, which contains an artificial lake, with an island in the center. It has many attractions, such as swings, boats, and, best of all, a toboggan chute.

Portland's pride are her schools, of which she is justly proud, for they are among the best and finest in the State. Our city is divided into four school districts, the east, west, north and south.

Our finest school buildings are the Central School building, in the east district, a large, two-story brick building, containing nine large rooms, two large halls and a large cellar, and the High School building, in the west district, which was built in 1895, and which, together with the play-ground, covers an acre of ground. It contains ten large rooms, two spacious halls and a large cellar, besides a fine laboratory and a large school library, which contains many interesting books.

Portland High School belongs to the State Oratorical Association, and, although it is a small city, and is often called a backwoods town, it has won the laurels twice out of three contests. It also belongs to the Eastern Indiana Association, and here also it has won two out of three contests, which goes to show that what it lacks in quantity it fully makes up in quality.

We study arithmetic, reading, geography, writing, grammar, spelling, general lessons, drawing and music.

Mr. J. H. Davis, our regular teacher, teaches us the first seven studies. He has taught for many years, and is a thoroughly competent teacher, and is liked by all his pupils.

Miss Fannie Bailey, our special teacher, is a highly accomplished young lady. She teaches us drawing and music, and has the respect of all who know her.

Our superintendent is Prof. I. E. Neff, who is, indeed, the right man in the right place.

Our chief industries are manufacturing, agriculture, and the buying and selling of stock and merchandise. The principal manufactories are the butter-tub factory, which turns out butter-tubs, and the S. H. Adams & Co. stave factory, which turns out hoops, staves and buttons for barrels.

If you were to take a drive out in the country near our homes you would find it very interesting, because you would find it very different from the country scenes near your homes, for here you would see large farms of corn, wheat, rye, oats, barley and hay waving to and fro; farther on you would see large orchards of apples, peaches, pears, plums, cherries, quinces and crab-apples, while here and there would be seen large grape-arbors overloaded with delicious grapes, and large patches of strawberries, raspberries, gooseberries, etc., while still further on you would see large pastures of horses, cattle, sheep and swine, feeding on the nutritious grass and watering at the cool, clear springs.

Our spring has been a rather late one, but nearly all our wild flowers are in bud, and many are in bloom.

As there is such a diversity of climate between your country and ours, you will, no doubt, not recognize them.

The most common of our wild flowers are the violet, spring beauty, buttercup, lamb-tongue, jack-in-the-pulpit, Dutchman's breeches, lady's slipper, bleeding heart, bluebell, innocence, and myrtle.

Our most common trees are the maple, willow, birch, beech, oak, sycamore, walnut, hickory nut, dogwood, wild cherry, cottonwood and evergreen.

We will not try to give you an accurate account of our country, schools, etc., this time, but will do so in our next letter.

Hoping to receive an early answer, telling us all about your country, schools, studies, etc., we will close, remaining

PORTLAND, IND., April 16, 1899.

*Our Dear California Friends :*

As we are desirous of hearing from you in your far away homes, we thought we would write first.

We are the pupils of the Eighth Grade and East District of Portland, and are desirous of knowing more of your country, schools and manner of teaching.

Portland is a city of about six or seven thousand inhabitants and is the county seat of Jay County and although the court house is not an elaborate affair, we soon expect to see it replaced by a new one; the same is true of the jail. The city has also contracted for four paved streets and by next summer we expect to have a bicycle track running from one end of the city to the other.

Portland has an excellent electric light plant as well as water works plant, our water is not hydraulic but is pumped from rock wells.

Our only pleasure resort is the Lagoon which is scarcely deep enough to drown a man. It has a spacious island in the center and, to say nothing of the many other attractions, it is provided with a high toboggan chute.

Portland has eleven churches; the prevailing religion is the Protestant, despite the fact that there are two Mormon priests here from Salt Lake City trying to establish their religion.

The Methodists hold services in the Auditorium as they are building a beautiful new church.

Portland boasts of having one of the best if not *the* best schools in Indiana. We have four buildings, the East, West, North and South districts. Our superintendent is Prof. I. E. Neff, who is indeed an able one, commanding the respect of all who know him.

Our East building is of brick structure and contains nine rooms, though only eight grades.

The enrollment of our rooms is about forty-five, none of these being colored. We study Algebra, Physiology, History, Grammar, Literature, Spelling, Music and Drawing.

Our teacher is W. E. Hutchens, who is also principal of the district. He has taught in the Portland schools for several years and has always been liked by all of his pupils.

We are also provided with a music and drawing teacher, who teaches at our building on Monday, Thursday and Friday.

The High School Building was built in '95, it has three entrances which "show up" very nicely against the brick wall. It has an extensive library and is provided with all the modern improvements. Although our P. H. S. is not great in quantity it is indeed great in quality, for, out of the three years our High School has competed in the State contest, twice it has borne the royal purple home triumphant.

The other cities with which our school competed were wont to look upon us as a sort of a back woods town because it was not so large as the others, but when it comes to contesting they find we are not so far behind the times as they think we are.

Our contestant this year was Earl R. Cartwright of '99; his oration was the "Hero of 59" in which he set forth such traits of his hero, John Brown, that could not fail to touch the heart strings of all his hearers.

Our High School for the past three years has also had a membership in the Eastern Indiana Oratorical Association in which it has also taken first place twice.

Our spring has been a late one and consequently our wild flowers are not yet in bloom; however, there are a few in bud.

Because of the difference of climate we suppose you are not familiar with our wild flowers, hence we shall tell you that the most common of our forest flowers are the spring beauties, sweet Williams, violets, wild bleeding hearts, bluebells, butter-cups, lamb-tongues, lady slippers, jack-in-the-pulpit and innocence.

Probably you might recognize these names if we had used their true names, but we do not know what they are as we are always accustomed to using these terms.

We cannot take time to describe our country very extensively in this letter but will do so at a later date.

*Portland, Ind.:*

Riverside is a small but modern city of about eight thousand inhabitants, situated in the southwestern part of the "Golden State", California, in a large fertile valley surrounded by lofty mountains reaching upward for over 11,000 feet.

The scenery surrounding Riverside is grand. The large gray mountains overlooking the smaller hills make a picture that any artist would be happy to paint.

Riverside is the greatest and most famous orange growing district in the world, both as to quality and quantity. Besides producing the finest of oranges, it brings forth a large amount of grapes, fruit, lemons and limes, luscious strawberries, peaches, pears, plums, apricots and nectarines are grown in abundance and are unexcelled in flavor anywhere. The packing and shipping of these various fruits form one of the leading industries of this section.

The never failing water supply, both for irrigation and domestic use, is a grand feature of which we are especially proud. The high mountains round about, have never failed to afford us an over abundant supply of artesian water, making the Riverside system the best in this part of the state.

Just outside the business center are found many elegant homes, situated in the midst of orange and lemon groves which make an imposing back-ground for the picture they present to the eye of the passer by. We have two large natatoriums which are very much frequented during the heated term.

One has its source in a sulphur spring and the other an artesian well.

Both places are used to a great extent in the evening as well as the day.

The city has two of the most famous avenues in the world, Magnolia and Victoria, which have a combined length of twenty miles. These wide double avenues pass through the great orange belt and many of our finest residences may be seen during a drive throughout their length.

The area within the corporate limits of the city is fifty-six square miles, and the colony or district comprises a territory almost twice as large.

Riverside is entered by two lines of railroad, the Southern Pacific, and the Santa Fé Companies.

A new cream colored brick depot, built on the mission style with tile roofings, has been built on the S. P. track within the last year, which is quite an addition to the city, and it, with its surroundings are so well kept that in the competition for a medal to be given the depot on that line which is kept most neat and in the best condition, this one got the medal which we are going to try to keep. From this quaint little place with its green lawns one may pass through the principal streets of the city by the newly constructed electric railroad, which passes the full length of Magnolia Avenue, and in the near future we hope to have it in operation down Victoria as well.

Our city is furnished with an excellent electric and gas system

Fourteenth, Orange and Main Streets with their handsome homes are the principal streets. Main, Seventh, Eighth and Market Streets are the principal business streets along which large department stores are situated.

There are 160 miles of graded streets within the city limits and the mileage of the whole district is nearly double that.

Eleven miles of the city streets are paved with asphalt and macadam.

The natural roads are among the finest in the world, never muddy and very little dust, making them the delight of the ubiquitous wheelman.

In the city park, with its large lawns and flower gardens, may be seen the largest collection of cacti in America, if not in the world. This is the testimony of experts and travelers, who never fail to visit the grand collection.

The school system of Riverside cannot be surpassed. There are nine large roomy buildings, in which to train the minds of the youthful Riversiders.

The high school building is the largest. It is made of brick, and is three stories high. The first floor is used for the lower grade rooms the office of the supervising principal, and recitation rooms for the eighth grade, which consists of over one hundred students. On the second floor is found the eighth grade assembly rooms, and the high school laboratories for botany, chemistry and physics, which are all fully equipped with the best of modern apparatus. The third floor is used for the high school alone, which consists of about two hundred students.

The Lincoln, Longfellow, Irving and Washington buildings are some of the next in size, with smaller ones in the outlying districts. Sunday is a day of quiet and order in Riverside. The people attend her many churches, nineteen in number, or take a book and lie on the grass in the park while the band gives a pleasing concert in the afternoon.



Riverside cannot boast of having a saloon, but it has a few pool rooms to spoil her fair name.

Our little city is growing rapidly. The pounding of the carpenter's hammer may be heard in all parts of the city.

Riverside is the richest city in the world, per capita, yet it has no millionaires and no paupers. There is an equitable distribution of wealth naturally incident to the character of the industries in which the people are engaged, resulting in almost ideal social conditions. EARL BELL,

EIGHTH GRADE.

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PORTLAND, IND., May 19, 1899.

*Benton Harbor, Mich.:*

Portland is a flourishing city of six thousand inhabitants, situated in the natural-gas belt of Eastern Indiana. Two important railroads furnish means for her commercial interests, and a small stream of water, of no practical use, flows through the southern limits, requiring two railroads and three large road bridges. The streets are broad and straight, and the principal ones will soon be paved, the contract having just been let.

The most important street is Meridian street, running north and south. Located on this street are most of the establishments that supply the wants of the people.

Main street is next in importance to Meridian street. It runs east and west, crossing Meridian street a little to the south of its business center, and forms all the square that Portland affords.

The court-house, a very unpretentious structure for the size and wealth of Jay County, is on this street, and the jail is by its side. The Opera House is about half a square west of Meridian street. It is very nicely finished on the inside, has a well-equipped stage, and seats one thousand persons. The public library, small, but with a flattering prospect, is on the fourth floor of the Bimel block, which was built a year ago at a cost of about \$50,000.

There are eleven churches in the town; the Methodists are now building one that will cost \$30,000. Besides supporting her many honorable business houses, Portland supports nine saloons.

As to the manufacturing interests of the town, there is a hub factory, handle factory, planing-mill and saw-mill in the southern part, a butter-tub and excelsior factory in the southwestern part, and a stove factory, and the Centennial mill, in the northern part.

The school system is exceedingly good for the size of the town. There is a ward building in the southern, eastern, western and northern parts. The High School is located in the western part. It occupies all of the second floor of the High School building, which is worth \$25,000, and is, indeed, a credit to the town.

The Assembly Room seats one hundred and forty pupils, and is adorned with a few pictures and a piano. From the Assembly Room you enter the library, which contains every reference book, and almost all other important works that a High-School student needs. We're proud of our library.

There are four recitation rooms, a mathematics, language, biology and chemistry room. The last two are equipped with all necessary things for good laboratory work. There is also a principal's office on this floor, and a large hall leads into the various rooms, cloak-rooms, and into a storeroom. The third floor is entirely given up to what we now call the attic, but it is earnestly hoped that some time in the near future it will be a gymnasium.

There is an English and Latin course in the High School, but only a few pupils take the English course. Four regular teachers preside over this noted place of learning. The superintendent hears a few recitations, and a music teacher three times a week tries to bring forth a little harmony.

The assembly room, hall and library are lighted by electricity, and the water-works is also piped into the assembly room.

Portland is proud of her High School, proud of her other honorable institutions. With a splendid water-works system, electric light plant, and the council's consent for paved streets, she is fast realizing the advantages of modern improvements, and will soon be a model, though not a great city.

*Dear Portland Friends:*

Your letter at hand, thanking you very kindly for the valuable information received from you. Benton Harbor is situated one mile east of Lake Michigan, its western extremity being separated from the shore of the lake only by the St. Joseph river and a line of sand-hills, which extend some distance northward along the shores.

The ground upon which the city is built is rather rolling; many of the residences are built upon terraces of some height, thus giving the city a look of that rugged grandeur which occurs only in districts made beautiful by the rarest gifts of nature.

Commercially, Benton Harbor ranks as one of the best cities on the lake shore. The city trade is carried on chiefly with Chicago. Fruits are exported very extensively through the summer seasons to Chicago, and such manufactured goods as cannot be procured within home boundaries are imported from that city.

Several factories are located here, fruit-canning factories, besides manufactories of different articles.

The city has a direct communication, also a direct traveling and shipping route to Chicago by water via the boat line, owned by the Graham & Morton Boat Company, upon which line sail the "Chicago" and the "Milwaukee," considered two of the finest lake boats on Lake Michigan.

Benton Harbor has—as natural, being a summer resort, thus constantly being filled with people from all nations—many churches and church buildings, the most imposing of which are the Congregationalist, the Catholic, the Methodist and the Jewish Synagogue.

The Central School building is located about one and one-half squares from the public square, on South Pipestone street. It is rather of large size, of seemingly ancient architecture, being built more upon the Grecian than the Gothic style.

Besides the public schools an academy is established here. It is located on Morton hill; its buildings are of imposing and modern structure, and it ranks among the first of all the schools of its kind in the State. Hoping to hear from you again,

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PORTLAND, IND., July 30, 1899.

*Our Dear Kentucky Friend:*

As we are desirous of hearing from you in your far away homes we thought we would write first.

We are the pupils of the eighth grade and east district of Portland and are desirous of knowing more of your country schools and manner of teaching.

Portland is a city of about six or seven thousand inhabitants and is the county seat of Jay County, and although the court house is not an elaborate affair, we soon expect to see it replaced by a new one; the same is true of the jail. The city has also contracted for four paved streets and by next summer we expect to have a bicycle track running from one end of the city to the other.

Portland has an excellent electric light plant as well as a water works plant. Our water is not hydraulic but is pumped from rock wells.

Our only pleasure resort is the lagoon, which is scarcely deep enough to drown a man; it has a spacious island in the center and to say nothing of the many other attractions it is provided with a high toboggan chute.

Portland has eleven churches; the prevailing religion is the Protestant, despite the fact that there are two Mormon priests here from Salt Lake City trying to establish their religion,

The Methodists hold services in the auditorium as they are building a beautiful new church.

Portland boasts of having one of the best if not *the* best school in Indiana. We have four buildings, the east, west, north and south districts. Our superintendent is Prof. I. E. Neff, who is indeed an able one, commanding the respect of all who know him.

Our east building is of brick structure, and contains nine rooms, though only eight grades.

The enrollment of our room is about forty-five, none of these being colored. We study algebra, physiology, history, grammar, literature, spelling, music and drawing.

Our teacher is W. E. Hutchens, who is also principal of the district. He has taught in the Portland schools for several years and has always been liked by all of his pupils.

We are also provided with a music and drawing teacher, who teaches at our building on Monday, Thursday and Friday.

The high school building was built in '95; it has three entrances which "show up" very nicely against the brick wall. It has an extensive library and is provided with all the modern improvements. Although our P. H. S. is not great in quantity it is indeed great in quality, for out of the three years our high school has competed in the State contests, twice it has borne the royal purple home triumphant.

The other cities with which our schools competed were wont to look upon us as a sort of a back woods town, because it was not so large as the others, but when it comes to contesting they find we are not so far behind the times as they think we are.

Our contestant this year was Earl R. Cartwright of '99, his oration was the "Hero of 59" in which he set forth such traits of his hero, John Brown, that could not fail to touch the heart strings of all his hearers.

Our high school for the past three years has also had a membership in the Eastern Indiana Oratorical Association in which it has also taken first place twice.

Our spring has been a late one and consequently our wild flowers are not yet in bloom; however, there are a few in bud.

Because of the difference of climate we suppose you are not familiar with our wild flowers, hence we shall tell you that the most common of our forest flowers are: the spring beauties, sweet Williams, violets, wild bleeding hearts, bluebells, buttercups, lamb-tongues, lady slippers, jack-in-the-pulpits and innocence.

Probably you might recognize these names if we had used their true names, but we do not know what they are as we are always accustomed to using these terms.

We cannot take time to describe our country very extensively in this letter, but will do so at a later date.

Hoping to hear from you soon and to learn more of the character of your schools, country, etc., we will close.

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CYNTHIANA, KY., Sept. 1, 1899.

*Our Dear Indiana Friend:*

Your letter received and the descriptions of your city and schools are very interesting.

Cynthiana is the county seat of Harrison Co., and has about five thousand inhabitants

The population consists of both white and colored, but they attend separate schools.

The city is lighted by electricity. Coal is used for fuel, which gives the buildings and streets a very dingy aspect.

There is also a telephone plant. The water supply is taken from the Licking River and purified.

Many of the hills around Cynthiana are surrounded by handsome residences.

Red brick is the principal material used for building.

The colored school consisted of only six grades until within the last year a seventh grade has been added.

Prof. Pitts is the principal and it is said that the schools have greatly improved under his management.

The teachers are all colored, but the trustees are white.

Of the white schools I can say nothing, only that they have a large building, but it is very old fashioned.

The court house is old, but has been remodeled and makes quite a good appearance. The first Monday in each month they have what is called court day. A great deal of business is transacted, as most of the farmers are in town.

There are several white churches and three colored, Having torn down the old Christian Church, they are preparing to build a new one.

There are very few factories around Cynthiana and instead one sees only distilleries and tobacco houses. Tobacco is raised in great quantities and tobacco fields are as common as Indiana corn fields.



Harrison County is very hilly and rocky, and many of the hills are of solid rock.

There is only one railroad going through Cynthiana, which is the Louisville and Nashville.

Although a small city Cynthiana is by no means quiet. The streets are narrow and rough, and the pavements are mostly of brick.

Owing to the long dry season the river was very low and it looked as though the water supply was in danger of giving out. The wheat was not very good, the corn was stunted and the tobacco was not doing as well as was expected. The creeks were about dry, and the stock had to be driven to water twice a day.

The large tobacco barns are usually built upon a hill, and instead of being well stocked with machinery, vehicles and numerous other articles, contain only the necessary appliances for tobacco raising.

Cynthiana has no pleasure resort of any kind; but, however, the people do not lack amusement, as there are always camp meetings, picnics and excursions during the summer season, which are largely attended.

I have now given you as good an account of my Kentucky home as is possible under the circumstances. Having not resided there for many years.

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## A SCHOOL TEACHER'S RIGHTS OVER PUPILS.

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**Court of Appeals Decides They Can Preserve Discipline Out of Building.**

St. Louis, Mo., February 22.—The St. Louis Court of Appeals has handed down a decision in the case of S. Beatty vs. J. R. Randall et al., from Barry county, sustaining the lower court's decision that school teachers are empowered to preserve discipline among their pupils, not only while the pupils are on the school premises, but while they are on their way going from their homes to school and in returning. In this case the son of Beatty refused to obey the school teacher, who told him to accompany a pupil home, and was expelled from school. The school board sustained the teacher and the court sustains the school board.

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## BOY MAY DIE.

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**Had a Dose of Pepper Administered by His Teacher.**

John Tripp, the 7-year-old son of Horace Tripp of Derby, Conn., has been at the point of death from the effects of cayenne pepper given to him by his teacher, Miss Mary Comery. Miss Comery is teacher in the primary department of the Shelton public school. Young Tripp gave her more trouble than all the other pupils, and at times was utterly unmanageable. She tried in vain to break him of the habit of whispering. A friend advised her to try putting cayenne pepper in his mouth, and one day last week she took a quantity to school. Several warnings to Tripp went unheeded and Miss Comery called him to her desk. He opened his mouth wide for the pepper, and more of it went in than Miss Comery intended. The lad tried to swallow and was seized with a severe fit of coughing. He was taken to his home, and the physician who was called found him in convulsions. Acute gastritis and a high fever set in.

Miss Comery is nearly distracted with grief over her mistake. She said she had no idea that the pepper would do any more harm than to burn the boy's tongue a little. She is young and attractive, a favorite with her pupils and was regarded as a thoroughly competent teacher.

# SCHOOL LAWS OF OHIO

PASSED BY THE

## SEVENTY-THIRD GENERAL ASSEMBLY AT ITS REGULAR SESSION.

1898.

[Senate Bill No. 8.]

### AN ACT

To amend sections 3915, 3916, 3917, 3920, 3922, 3927, 3978, 3981, 4017 and 4018, and to reënact and amend section 3918 of the Revised Statutes of Ohio.

Section 1. Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Ohio, That sections 3915, 3916, 3917, 3920, 3922, 3927, 3981, 4017 and 4018 be amended, and that section 3918 be re-enacted and amended so as to read as follows :

Townships and special districts.

Sec. 3915. The board of education of each township district divided into subdistricts shall consist of the township clerk, and one director elector [elected] for a term of three years for each subdistrict ; such board shall organize on the third Monday in April of each year by electing one of its members president. The clerk of the township shall be ex-officio the clerk of the board, but shall have no vote except in cases of a tie.

Township board of education how constituted and organized.

Sec. 3916. There shall be elected by ballot on the second Monday of April, 1893, in each subdistrict, by the qualified electors thereof, one competent person, having the qualifications of an elector therein, to be styled director. Those elected shall be divided upon the third Monday of April thereafter, by lot, into three classes as nearly equal as possible ; the directors of the first class shall serve for the term of one year, the directors of the second class for two years, and the directors of the third class for three years ; and there shall be elected on the second Monday of April, 1898, in each subdistrict, by the qualified electors thereof, two competent persons, having the qualifications of electors therein, to be styled subdirectors. In all subdistricts where directors are elected in 1898, one subdirector shall be elected for the term of one year, and one for the term of two years ; in all subdistricts where directors shall be elected in 1899, one subdirector shall be elected for the term of two years, and one for the term of three years ; and in all subdistricts where directors shall be elected in 1900, one subdirector shall be elected for the term of one year, and one for the term of three years. All elections of directors or subdirectors thereafter shall be held on the second Monday of April, and all directors or subdirectors shall serve until their successors are elected and qualified.

Sec. 3917. The director of each subdistrict shall post written or printed notices in three or more conspicuous places in his subdistrict at least six days prior to the election, designating the day and hour of opening, and the hour of closing the election ; and he shall also designate whether a director or subdirector shall be elected. The election shall be held at the usual place of holding school meetings in the subdistrict ; the meeting shall be organized by appointing a chairman and secretary, who shall act as judges of the election under oath or affirmation, which oath or affirmation may be administered by the director of the subdistrict, or any other person competent to administer such an oath or affirmation, and the secretary shall keep a poll-book and tally-sheet, which shall be signed by the judges, and delivered within five days to the clerk of the township.

Sec. 3918. The directors and subdirectors of each district shall constitute the board of directors, two of whom shall constitute a quorum, and at the meetings of which the director shall preside, and record their proceedings in a book that shall be provided for that purpose by the board of education, together with the minutes of the proceedings of the annual school meetings held in the subdistrict by the electors thereof, which shall be a public record ; all such proceedings when so recorded, shall be signed by the director ; if the director be absent, either of the subdirectors may officiate in his place. The board of subdirectors shall hold regular sessions on the third Saturday of April and August, and may meet as frequently as they deem necessary for the purpose of electing teachers ; but no teacher shall be elected at a meeting of which due notice has not been given to each member of the board of subdirectors, either personally, or by written notice left at his residence or usual place of business.

Sec. 3920. The board of education shall hold regular sessions on the third Monday of April, June, August, October, December and February, at the usual places of holding township elections, or at such place in the immediate vicinity thereof as may be convenient, for the transaction of business, and may adjourn from time to time, or hold special meetings at any other time or place within the township, as it deems desirable, for the transaction of business ; which special meeting may be called by the township clerk, by the president of the board, or by two or more members of the board, but each member of the board must be duly notified thereof personally, or by written notice left at his residence or usual place of business. The president of each board of education at the annual meeting on the third Monday in April shall appoint at least three standing committees, to be styled respectively : (1) committee on teachers and text books ; (2) committee on buildings and grounds ; (3) committee on supplies ; and he may appoint such other committees as may be deemed expedient. It shall be the duty of the committee on teachers and text books to consider the certificates of elections of teachers filed by the board of subdirectors, to recommend such changes in text books or course of study, or addition to school libraries as may be desired from time to time ; it shall be the duty of the committee on buildings

and grounds to have an immediate oversight of all buildings, heating apparatus, furniture, school sites and repairs, and shall make reports in reference to the same from time to time to the board of education ; it shall be the duty of the committee on supplies to consider all matters relating to fuel and ordinary supplies used by the schools of the township and make reports to the board of education from time to time. But no act of any standing committee shall be binding on the board of education without its approval.

Sec. 3922. When the board consolidates two or more subdistricts into a new subdistrict, or establishes a new subdistrict in any other way, it shall call a special meeting of the qualified electors resident in the new subdistrict for the purpose of electing one director and two subdirectors for the same ; at least five days before the time fixed for the meeting, the board shall post, in three of the most public places in the new subdistrict, written or printed notices stating time, place and object of holding the meeting ; the election shall be conducted as provided in this chapter, and a director shall be elected to serve the term which will render the classes of directors most equal, from the annual meeting on the third Monday of April next preceding the organization of the new subdistrict ; and the terms of the two subdirectors shall be determined by lot ; and the terms of office of the directors and subdirectors of subdistricts so consolidated, shall expire at the time such new district is created.

Sec. 3927. When a special district is abandoned, there shall be an election of director and two subdirectors, as provided in this chapter, and for the terms directed in section 3922. The clerk of the special or village district board shall deliver to the clerk of the township board all the books and papers of the special district in his custody, and notify the county auditor, in writing, of the abandonment of the organization of the district ; the treasurer of the special or village district board shall deliver to the treasurer of the township board all the books, papers and money of the special or village district in his possession ; the township board shall complete all unfinished business pertaining to the special or village district ; any debt contracted by the special or village district board shall be paid out of the money transferred to the treasurer of the township board, as herein provided, and out of the money arising from the taxes levied by the special or village district board ; and if such funds are insufficient therefor, the remainder shall be paid by a special tax upon the property of the subdistrict so created.

Sec. 3978. In all cases of tie votes at an election for [director] directors or subdirectors, the judges of election shall decide the election by lot ; and in other cases of failure to elect directors or subdirectors, or in cases of a refusal to serve, the board shall appoint.

Sec. 3981. Vacancies in any board of education, or vacancies in the office of subdirector of any subdistrict arising from death, nonresidence, resignation, expulsion for gross neglect of duty, failure of a person elected or appointed to qualify within ten days

Sec. 4017. Each board of education shall have the management and control of public schools of the district with full power to appoint a superintendent and assistant superintendents of schools, a superintendent of buildings, janitors and other employes, and fix their salaries, and shall fix the salaries of the teachers, which salaries may be increased, but shall not be diminished during the term for which the appointment is made; but no person shall be appointed for a longer time than that for which a member of the board is elected. And, in township districts divided into subdistricts, the board of subdirectors shall elect the teachers in their respective subdistricts, but such election shall be subject to confirmation by a majority of the board of education. Whenever any board of subdirectors elect a teacher, the director thereof shall at once file a certificate of such election, signed by at least two members of such board, with the township clerk, who shall refer such certificate of election to the standing committee on teachers, and such committee shall make a report of the same to the board of education, and the board of education shall confirm or refuse to confirm such election at its next regular meeting after the filing of such certificate of election, with the township clerk. If the board of education fails to confirm the teacher elected by any board of subdirectors, such board of subdirectors shall elect another teacher before the next regular meeting of the board of education; if the board of subdirectors fail to elect a teacher for their school, or if the board of education shall fail to confirm such election on or before the third Monday in August of any year, the board of education shall then employ a teacher for such subdistrict. The board of education may dismiss any appointee or any teacher for inefficiency, neglect of duty, immorality or improper conduct.

Sec. 4018. It shall be unlawful for the township board of education, prior to the annual election on the second Monday of April, and the qualification of the director or directors elected thereat, to employ or contract to employ any [teacher] superintendent for a term to commence after the expiration of the current school year; and said board at the end of any month, or at the end of the term, shall give to the teacher or superintendent employed by them certificates of such employment and of the services rendered, addressed to the township clerk, who, upon presentation thereof, and compliance by such teacher or superintendent with the provisions of section 4051, shall draw orders on the township treasurer for the amounts certified to be due, in favor of the parties entitled thereto, and the treasurer shall pay the same.

Section 2. Sections 3915, 3916, 3917, 3920, 3922, 3927, 3978, 3981, 4017 and 4018 of the Revised Statutes of Ohio as amended (vol. 89, page 93, O. L.) are hereby repealed. This act shall take effect on its passage.

AN ACT

To amend section 3926 (as amended 88 O. L., page 297) of the Revised Statutes of Ohio.

Section 1. Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Ohio, That section 3926 (as amended 88 O. L., page 297), be amended so as to read as follows :

Special school districts.

Sec. 3926. When the electors of a special or village district desire to abandon their organization and become a part of the township district of the township in which such special or village district is located, they make the change in the following manner : Written or printed notices shall be posted in at least five of the most public places in the district, signed by a majority of the members of the board of education, or one of the board, and at least six resident electors of the district, requesting the qualified electors thereof to assemble on a day, and at an hour and place, designated in the notices, which notices shall be posted at least ten days prior to the day designated in them, then and there to vote for or against such change ; the electors, when assembled at the time and place designated in the notices, shall appoint a chairman and two clerks, who shall be judges of the election, which shall continue at least two hours ; those in favor of the proposed change shall have written or printed on their ballots the words, " School—Change," and those opposed thereto the words, " School—No change," and a majority of the ballots cast shall determine the question whether the change be made ; the judges shall within five days after the election make due returns thereof to the board of education of the district ; and if a majority of the votes cast are in favor of the change, the board shall immediately certify that fact to the township board, which shall thereupon assume jurisdiction of the territory, property, and affairs of the special district, and thereafter treat such district as a subdistrict of the township district. Provided, however, that in a special district, which has been created from two or more joint subdistricts, subdistrict or parts of subdistricts if the electors of the territory which formerly composed any one or more of such joint subdistricts, subdistricts or parts of subdistricts desire to withdraw from the special district organization and become a part of the township in which they are situated, they may make the change

Section 1. Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Ohio, That section 3921 of the Revised Statutes be amended to read as follows:

Sec. 3921. A map of each township district shall be prepared by the board, as often as it may be necessary, in which shall be designated the numbers and boundaries of the subdistricts thereof; the board may at any regular session, increase or diminish the number, or change the boundaries of subdistricts, or may, when in its opinion, it will be for the best interests of the pupils in any subdistrict, suspend the school in such subdistrict, and shall provide for the conveyance of said pupils to such other district or districts as may be most convenient for them, the cost of such conveyance to be paid out of the contingent fund of said district; and any such subdistrict which may be established by act of the general assembly shall be governed by the provisions of this title, except that it cannot be changed or consolidated by the board within three years after its formation, unless the written consent of two-thirds of the electors residing in the territory effected by such change is obtained.

Public schools.

Section 1. Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Ohio, That section 4073 of the Revised Statutes of Ohio be amended to read as follows:



Sec. 4073. The board may grant certificates for one, two and three years from the day of examination, which shall be valid in the county wherein they are issued, except in city and village districts that have boards of examiners, in which they shall not be valid; that in all school districts in the state of Ohio not having a special board of examiners and situated in two or more counties, teachers' certificates obtained from either county so situated shall be held valid in such districts; and the examiners may grant certificates for five years to such applicants as in addition to the necessary qualifications have been for three years next preceding their application engaged in teaching, twelve months of which experience shall have been in one place; and such certificates for five years shall be renewable upon the same condition, but without examination, at the discretion of the examining board; and the examiners may grant certificates for eight years from the date of examination, to such applicants as, in addition to the necessary qualifications, hold or have held a certificate for five years, and have been for three years next preceding their application engaged in teaching, eighteen months of which experience shall have been in one place; and the applicants for such certificates for eight years, in addition to the other qualifications, shall be required to pass a satisfactory examination in botany, algebra, natural philosophy and English literature; and such certificate for eight years shall be renewable upon the same conditions, but without examination, at the discretion of the examining board; and if at any time the recipient of a certificate be found intemperate, immoral, incompetent, or negligent, the examiners, or any two of them, may revoke the certificate; but such revocation shall not prevent a teacher from receiving pay for services previously rendered; and when any recipient of a certificate is charged with intemperance, or other immorality, the examining board shall have power to send for witnesses, and examine them on oath or affirmation touching the matter under investigation. The fees and other expenses of such trial shall be certified to the county auditor by the clerk and president of the examining board, and be paid out of the county treasury upon the order of the auditor.

Section 1. Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Ohio, That sections 3885 and 3886 of the Revised Stat-

utes of Ohio, as amended March 10, 1898, be amended to read as follows :

Classification.

Sec. 3885. The state is hereby divided into school districts to be styled respectively, city districts of the first grade of the first class ; city districts of the second grade of the first class ; city districts of the third grade of the first class ; city districts of the first class ; city districts of the second class ; village districts ; special districts and township districts.

City districts of the first class.

Sec. 3886. Each city having a population of 10,000 or more together with the territory attached to it for school purposes, if any, and excluding the territory within its corporate limits detached for school purposes, if any, shall constitute a school district to be styled a city district of the first class ; cities of the second and third grades of the first class, together with the territory outside of their respective corporate limits, if any, attached to them for school purposes, and excluding the territory within their corporate limits, detached for school purposes, if any, shall constitute respectively school districts to be styled city districts of the second and third grades of the first class ; and each district that has heretofore been constituted a city district of the first class, shall remain such, except as herein otherwise provided.

City districts of the second and third grades of the first class.

Application of existing statutes.

Section 2. All statutes and parts of statutes now in force, which by their terms apply to city districts of the third grade of the first class shall apply to all such districts created by this act ; and all acts heretofore done and proceedings taken in pursuance of such statutes or parts of statutes in any district in a city of the third grade of the first class and hereby constituted a city district of the third grade of the first class as defined in section one of this act, shall be deemed and held to be valid and legal for all purposes, the same as if this act had been passed and in force before such statutes or parts of statutes were enacted.

Repeals.

Section 3. That said original section 3885 and section 3886, as amended March 10, 1898, be and the same are hereby repealed.

AN ACT

To amend sections 3996 and 3998, and to amend and supplement section 3999 of the Revised Statutes of Ohio, as amended April 30, 1891.

School houses and libraries.

Section 1. Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Ohio, That sections 3996 and 3998 of the Revised Statutes of Ohio be amended so as to read as follows:

Levy for libraries in cities.

Sec. 3806. For the purpose of increasing and maintaining

the school library of city districts, except in those city districts containing cities of the first grade of the first class, the board of education may levy annually a tax of one-tenth of one mill on the dollar valuation of the taxable property thereof, to be assessed, collected and paid in the same manner as are the other school taxes of such district.

Sec. 3998. The board, except in city districts containing a city of the first grade of the first class, may appoint a librarian, fix his compensation, and make all needful rules and regulations for the management of the library, to which every family resident in such city district, save as hereinbefore excepted, shall have access.

Board may appoint librarian, etc.

Section 2. That section 3999 of the Revised Statutes of Ohio be amended so as to read as follows:

Sec. 3999. In cities not having less than twenty thousand inhabitants, the board of education having custody of any public library therein may, at any regular meeting, adopt a resolution providing for a board of managers of such library, and shall thereupon elect by ballot two persons to serve as members of such board for a term of three years, two persons to serve for a term of two years and two persons to serve for a term of one year; and annually thereafter two persons shall be elected to serve for a term of three years; all vacancies in such board shall be filled by the board of education by ballot, and a person so elected shall serve during the unexpired term of his predecessor; the president of the board of education shall be a member of the board of managers, ex-officio; and the board of managers shall at all times be amenable to and under the control of the board of education, as to tenure of office and authority, and shall serve without compensation; provided, that in cities of the first grade of the first class upon the expiration of the terms of office of the trustees of the public library therein, heretofore appointed under this section, as amended April 30, 1891, there shall be appointed as successors to said board, a board of trustees of said library consisting of seven persons, as follows: Two by the board of education of the school district within which such city is situated, two by the board having charge of the high schools of such city, two by the directors of the university in such city, one of each of said appointees shall hold his office for two years, and one for three years; and one by the judges of the court of common pleas of the county within which said city is situated, who shall hold his office for a period of three years; and thereafter said boards and said judges shall upon the expiration of the terms of office of said appointees, and each three years thereafter, appoint successors to said trustees. The appointee aforesaid of the judges of the court of common pleas shall succeed in said board of trustees the president of the board of education, who theretofore was, by virtue of his said office, a member of said board of trustees, and thereafter the right of such president of said board of education aforesaid of membership in said board of trustees of said library shall cease. All vacancies in said board of trustees of said library shall be filled by the respective bodies having the power of appointment. Provided, however, that nothing therein shall be construed

in any wise to abridge the term of office or curtail the powers or duties of the trustees of the public library in cities of the first grade of the first class, appointed under this section as amended April 30, 1891, during the terms of office for which they were appointed.

Section 3. That section 3999 of the Revised Statutes of Ohio be supplemented with sectional numbering as follows:

Residents of Hamilton county entitled to use of city library.

Sec. 3999a. Each and every resident of the county within which is situate any city of the first grade of the first class, having therein established a public library, shall be entitled to the free use of such library, reading rooms, and any branch of the same, and all the privileges thereof upon such terms and conditions not inconsistent therewith, as the board of trustees of such library may prescribe.

Powers of trustees in Cincinnati.

Sec. 3999b. The board of trustees of the public library in cities of the first grade of the first class shall have sole and exclusive charge, custody and control of the public library in such city, including all property, both real and personal, used and occupied by such library, whether acquired heretofore or hereafter, and shall have full power to make all rules and regulations necessary for the proper government, maintenance, care and management thereof, and to provide therefor. Said board of trustees shall have power over, and exclusive control of, the library fund hereinafter provided for, and of the expenditure of all moneys collected to the credit thereof. They shall have power and it shall be their duty to establish in said city and throughout the county within which is situated said library, reading rooms, branch libraries and library stations in connection with said library, and to lease and furnish said rooms, buildings or parts thereof as are required for such purposes, and to pay all necessary expenses connected therewith. They shall have power, and it shall be their duty to purchase and pay for all books, periodicals, magazines and other literature and supplies necessary, in their judgment, for said public library, reading rooms, branch libraries and library stations, and to incur the necessary expenditures for the encouragement and advancement of the best use of such library, reading rooms, branch libraries and library stations by the public; all such purchases, payments and expenditures to be made out of said library fund hereinafter provided for. They shall have power, and it shall be their duty, to employ a librarian, assistant librarians, and other necessary assistants for such public library, reading rooms, branches and stations, to fix the compensation of persons so employed, and to pay the same out of said library fund. Said library board may fix the term of any such person employed by them for any period not to exceed one year.

Employment of librarian and assistants.

Tax for library purposes in Cincinnati.

Sec. 3999c. For the purpose of increasing, maintaining and managing the public library in cities of the first grade of the first class, the board of trustees thereof may levy annually a tax of not to exceed three-tenths of one mill on each dollar valuation of the taxable property in the county wherein is situated such city, to be assessed, collected and paid in the same manner as are other taxes levied throughout the county. Said levy shall be certified by said

board of trustees to the auditor of the county in which said city is situated, and shall be placed by said auditor on the tax duplicate and collected as other taxes. The money realized from said levy, and all moneys received or collected by said trustees for the library, shall be placed in the treasury of said county, subject to the order of said board of trustees of said library. Said fund shall be known as the library fund of said county, of which the county treasurer shall be the custodian, and no money shall be drawn therefrom, except upon the requisition of the board of trustees of said library, certified by the president and secretary of said board, directed to the county auditor, who shall draw his warrant upon the county treasurer therefor. Any part of said funds unexpended during any year shall remain to the credit of said library fund.

Sec. 3999d. The amount of any fund heretofore raised by a levy or tax by the board of education in such city for school library purposes, and all library funds remaining unexpended, shall be transferred from the respective funds to the library fund herein created, to be expended and paid out as herein provided for funds produced by a levy made by said board of trustees, and any and all funds, bonds, stocks or other species of property held by the board of education of such city, or by any of the departments of such city for the benefit of the public library thereof, shall be transferred to the board of trustees of such public library, to be held and controlled by them subject to the terms of the respective donations.

Section 4. That sections 3996, 3998 and 3999, as amended April 30, 1891, be and the same are hereby repealed.

Section 5. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage.

AN ACT

To empower township boards of education to establish township or joint township high schools, and to discontinue subdistrict schools when too small to justify their continuance.

Section 1. Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Ohio, That whenever ten qualified electors of any township, or twenty qualified electors of any two adjoining townships shall file a petition or petitions with the township clerk, or clerks of two adjoining townships, praying for the establishing of a township high school district, or a joint township high school district, it shall then be the duty of the township board of education, or boards of education, to call a meeting, or meetings, within thirty days thereafter, of the qualified electors of said township or townships embraced in the petition, or petitions, at their usual place

Repeals.

or places of voting, giving ten days' notice, or notices of the time and place, or places, of said election, or elections, to be posted in at least five conspicuous places in the township, or both townships, requiring said electors to vote for or against the proposed establishing a township or joint township high school district, and the building of a township or joint township high school building, and shall also at the same election submit to the electors of the township, or joint township high school district proposed, the question of levying taxes for buying site, or sites, and building a township or joint township high school house, or either of them, and the further questions whether the levy shall be made from year to year thereafter, and what amount shall be levied each year until the actual cost of such site, or sites, the erection of such high school house, or houses, is raised, and their opinions, the said electors, shall be expressed on their ballots which must be provided by the board, or boards of education, to-wit: For township, or joint township high school district: "Yes." For levying taxes for site, or sites, and building township, or joint township high school house: "Yes." For township, or joint township high school district: "No." For levying tax for site, or sites, and building township, or joint township high school house: "No." Which ballots shall be counted and returned by the judges and clerks of elections as in such cases made and provided.

Counting of ballots and returns of election.

Levy to be certified to auditor, who shall place same on duplicate for collection.

Section 2. Should there be a majority of the votes cast in favor of establishing of a township or joint township high school district, and in favor of levying taxes for buying site, or sites, and building township, or joint township high school building, or buildings, or either of them, of continuing the levy from year to year thereafter, and for the amount to be levied each year, the board shall certify the levy annually to the county auditor, who shall place the same upon the tax duplicate in the same manner that other taxes certified by such board are required to be placed thereon; and when the townships are divided by a county line, the levy shall be certified, collected and paid in the manner provided in sections thirty-nine hundred and sixty-one, and thirty-nine hundred and sixty-two, as supplemented by this act, in the case of levies for joint subdistricts, or joint township high school districts.

Townships divided by county line; how levy certified and collected.

Purchase or renting of suitable building; when question of levy not required to be submitted.

Section 3. Should there be a subdistrict school house suitably located in the township, or joint township high school district, petitioned for, or should there be any other building favorably located that the board of education could buy for five hundred dollars, or less, or rent the same, then the board of education need not submit to the voters the proposition of a tax levy, but submit only the proposition of establishing the proposed township, or joint township high school district, and if a majority of the votes cast are for such measure, then the board of education shall go on and establish the township, or joint township high school district, and use such building, or buildings, as are available for the township, or joint township high school district then established.

Employment of teacher.

Section 4. Whenever the board of education has provided a building for a township, or joint township high school district, it shall then be the duty of the township board of education to hire a

teacher who may be recognized as a township, or joint township high school superintendent, who shall be required to teach all the branches now required to be taught in the subdistrict schools, as well as natural philosophy, algebra, bookkeeping and physical geography. And the board of education shall hire an assistant or assistants as the township, or joint township school may require.

Assistant teachers.

Section 5. The township boards of education are hereby empowered to discontinue any subdistrict school whenever the enumeration falls below fifteen (15) pupils and assign the pupils to the surrounding subdistrict schools until such a time as the discontinued subdistrict school has a bona fide enumeration of twenty scholars not eligible to attend the township, or joint township high school, if then established in the township.

When subdistrict school may be discontinued.

Section 6. Joint township high school districts, established under the provisions of this act, shall be governed and controlled by the laws now in force governing and controlling joint subdistricts with the laws or different sections amended or supplemented so as to read after the words, a joint subdistrict, or joint township high school district.

Laws governing such school districts.

Section 7. The following sections of Ohio school laws are hereby amended or supplemented so as to read as follows, to-wit:

Joint subdistricts.

Sec. 3928. When the better accommodation of scholars makes it desirable to form a joint subdistrict, or joint township high school district composed of parts, or all, of two or more townships, the board of education of the townships interested, may, by mutual agreement, at a joint meeting held for the purpose, establish the same, and fix the boundaries thereof; if there is no suitable school house within such boundaries, or if there is one, but it is not suitably located, the board shall designate a site whereon to erect such building; but if there is a suitable school house within such boundaries, properly located, the school shall be held therein; a chairman and secretary shall be chosen at such meeting, and the secretary shall make a memorandum of the proceedings had thereat; a copy of such memorandum, signed by the chairman and secretary, shall be transmitted to the clerk of each of the boards, who shall record the same in his record of proceedings of the board; and the secretary shall transmit a like copy of the proceedings to the auditor of each county having territory embraced in the joint subdistrict, or township, or joint township high school district.

Township boards may establish by mutual consent.

Sec. 3929. The school in a joint subdistrict, or joint township high school district, shall be under the control of the board of education in the township in which the school house is situate, of which board the director of the joint subdistrict, or joint township high school district, shall be a member, or members; but such school shall be supported from the school funds of the townships having territory in the joint subdistrict, or joint township high school district, in proportion to the enumeration of youth, as provided in sections thirty-nine hundred and sixty-one and thirty-nine hundred and sixty-two and thirty-nine hundred and sixty-three, as amended by this act.

There shall be taken in each district, annually, during the two weeks ending on the fourth Saturday of May, an enumeration of all unmarried youth, noting sex, between six and twenty-one years of age, resident within the district, and not temporarily there, designating also the number between six and eight years of age, the number between eight and fourteen years of age, the number between fourteen and sixteen years of age, the number between sixteen and twenty-one years of age, and the number residing in the western reserve, the Virginia military district, the United States military district, and in any original surveyed township or fractional township to which belongs section sixteen, or other land in lieu thereof, or any other lands for the use of public schools, or any interest in the proceeds of such lands.

Section 2. Section 4030 (as amended 87 O. L., page 80), be and the same is hereby repealed.

Section 3. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage.

To authorize cities of the fourth grade of the second class to levy a tax for maintenance of a free public and school library.

Section 1. Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Ohio, That in any city of the fourth grade of the second class, and in which city there is established and maintained by a public library association duly incorporated, but not organized for profit, a public library, free to all the inhabitants of such city, the



board of education shall levy or cause to be levied an annual tax, in addition if need be to the annual amount of taxes limited by law for school purposes, of not less than three-tenths and not to exceed five-tenths of a mill on all taxable property within such city and school district, to be called "a public library fund," which shall be certified to the county auditor of the county and placed on the tax duplicate of the county, and collected as other taxes.

Section 2. Said tax when so levied and collected shall be paid over by the treasurer of the board of education to the treasurer of said library association, to be used only in the purchase of books, pamphlets, magazines or newspapers, and for general library expenses of said library association.

Section 3. Said board of education shall require said library association to render an account as often as it shall deem proper of all taxes so received by it, and how the same have been expended, and power to levy a tax under this act shall continue only so long as said association shall keep up and maintain in a public place in such city a public library free to all the inhabitants thereof and to all persons residing within said school district.

Section 4. The tax so levied shall be in lieu of all other taxes levied for school library purposes, and no other levy shall be made for such purpose; provided, however, that nothing herein shall prohibit the board of education from purchasing all necessary philosophical or other apparatus for the schools and making necessary levies therefor.

Section 5. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Ohio, That on and after the passage of this act the institution for the education of the deaf and dumb shall also be open to receive such blind and deaf children, residents of the state, as the trustees and superintendent judge from reliable information and examination to be suitable persons to receive instructions therein, and the superintendent is hereby authorized to employ a suitable teacher or teachers, and nurse, or nurses, and to make all necessary arrangements for the instruction and care of such blind and deaf children as may be admitted. The compensation of said teachers and nurses shall be fixed by the trustees. No such deaf and blind child shall be admitted under four years of age, or shall remain more than twelve years, or such a part thereof as the

To provide for public day schools for the deaf in the city districts of the first and second grades of the first class.

Public day schools for deaf children in city districts of first and second grade of the first class.

Section 1. Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Ohio, That boards of education in city districts of the first and second grade of the first class shall establish and maintain public day schools for deaf children and those defective in speech and unable to attend the public schools provided for children that can hear.

Annual report by board of education.

Section 2. The boards of education in such city districts shall report annually on or before September 1 of each year to the governor of the state such facts as may be required concerning such school, together with an enumeration of all the deaf children between the ages of three and twenty-one years, which enumeration shall be sworn to by the clerk of such board of education.

Annual apportionment and payment by state treasurer to treasurer of such board of education.

Section 3. The state treasurer is hereby authorized and directed to apportion and pay out of "the state common school funds" annually to the treasurer of the board of education of any such district, in which a school or schools shall be established in accordance with the provisions of this act, the sum of one hundred and fifty dollars for each deaf child, and those defective in speech and unable by reason of said defects to attend the public schools provided for children that can hear within such districts, as is shown by the enumeration provided for in the preceding section, and whatever fund may be necessary in excess of the amount received from the state treasurer for defraying expenses of such school provided by such boards of education, shall be paid out of the general fund levied and collected for maintaining the public schools in any such city districts of the first and second grade of the first class.

Fund for support of schools for the deaf.

Section 4. The money received from the state treasurer as provided in section three of this act, shall be kept separate and distinct from all other funds by the treasurer of such board of edu-

cation and shall be known as "the fund for the support of schools for the deaf," and shall be paid out for no other purpose than for the establishment and maintenance of schools for the deaf, as herein provided.

Section 5. The board of education of such district is hereby authorized and directed to set aside annually from "the fund for the support of schools for the deaf," a sum of money sufficient to pay car fare for deaf children who are unable to attend such school on account of being unable to pay their way to and from such school, and the same shall be distributed to such children in such manner and to such extent as the board of education of such district may provide.

Car fare of deaf children to be paid by board.

Section 6. Except as provided in this act, such schools shall be controlled in all respects in accordance with an act entitled "An act to provide for the reorganization of boards of education in the city districts of the first and second grade of the first class," passed March 8, 1892, with all the amendments thereto.

Schools to be controlled by what laws.

Section 7. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage.

AN ACT

Authorizing school districts managed by boards of education or school councils to establish and maintain day schools for the deaf, and authorizing payment therefor from state common school funds.

Section 1. Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Ohio, That upon application by a board of education or school council of any school district of this state to the state commissioner of schools, he shall grant permission to such board of education or school council and such board of education or school council shall thereupon be empowered to maintain within its limits one or more day schools, having an average attendance of not less than five pupils, for the instruction of deaf persons over the age of three and under fifteen years, residents of the state of Ohio.

Day schools for deaf children.

Section 2. Such board of education or school council, which shall maintain one or more day schools for the instruction of the deaf, shall report to the state commissioner of schools annually, and as often as such state commissioner shall direct, such facts concerning such school or schools as he may require.

Annual and other reports by board of education.

Section 3. The county auditor in each county is hereby authorized and directed to apportion and the county treasurer to pay out of the state common school fund received by such county, to the treasurer or other financial officer of such board of education or school council, maintaining such school or schools for the in-

Annual payment to treasurer of school board by county treasurer.



struction of the deaf, the sum of one hundred and fifty dollars for each deaf pupil, resident of such county, instructed in any such school for at least nine months during the school year and a share of such sum proportionate to the term of instruction of any such pupil, as shall be so instructed less than nine months during such year. If no such school shall be maintained in any county, but persons residing in such county shall attend such school in another county, then the county treasurer of the county not maintaining such school shall apportion and pay to the financial officer of the board of education or school council of such other county the amount above specified for each pupil attending such school in such other county.

Payments to be made by county treasurer.

Section 4. The sums provided in the next preceding section shall be paid by such county treasurer as soon as may be after the receipt by him of the state common school fund in each year, upon satisfactory proof being made to him by the president or clerk of such board of education or school council maintaining such school, of the number of pupils instructed in such school or schools, and their residences, and the period of time each such pupil shall have been so instructed in such school or schools for the preceding school year.

Teachers to be appointed by school commissioner; removals.

Section 5. All teachers in such schools shall be appointed by the state commissioner of schools upon application of the board of education or school council of the school district maintaining such school or schools; the state commissioner of schools to have the power to remove such teachers for cause. No person shall be appointed to teach in any such school who shall not have first obtained a teacher's certificate as provided by law, and who shall not have received specific instruction in the teaching of the deaf for a term of not less than one year.

Qualifications of teachers.

Inspection of schools.

Section 6. The state school commissioner shall select some competent person to inspect all day schools organized under this act, or by other authority and shall cause an inspection to be made of said schools at least twice a year, and said person so appointed shall make a written report to the state commissioner of common schools of the buildings in which said schools are being held, the method of instruction and all other matters which may seem to be of interest and profit to the education of the children in said schools.

Section 7. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage.

AN ACT

To amend section 2834a of the Revised Statutes of Ohio.

Levying taxes.

Section 1. Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the

State of Ohio, That section 2834a of the Revised Statutes of Ohio be amended so as to read as follows:

Sec. 2834a. The trustees of any township, the board of education of any school district, except in cities of the first class, and the commissioners of any county, for the purpose of extending the time of payment of any indebtedness which, from its limits of taxation, such township, school district, board of education or commissioners, for the best interest of said township, school district or county, shall have power to issue bonds of such township, school district or county, or borrow money, so as to change but not to increase the indebtedness, for such length of time in such amounts, and at such a rate of interest as the said trustees, board of education or commissioners may deem proper, not to exceed six per cent per annum, payable annually or semi-annually; provided, however, that no indebtedness of any township, school district or county shall be funded, refunded or extended unless such indebtedness shall first be determined to be an existing, valid and binding obligation of any such township, school district or county by a formal resolution of the trustees, board of education or commissioners of any such township, school or county, which resolution shall so state the amount of the existing indebtedness to be funded, refunded or extended, the aggregate amount of bonds to be issued therefor, their number and denomination, the date of their maturity, the rate of interest they shall bear, and the place of payment of principal and interest. And for the payment of the bonds issued under this section, the township trustees, the board of education or commissioners shall levy a tax in addition to the amount otherwise authorized, every year during the period the bonds have to run, sufficient in amount each year to pay the bonds falling due within the year and the accruing interest.

Section 2. This act shall take effect from and after its passage.

AN ACT

To amend section 2834b of the Revised Statutes of Ohio, as passed April 27, 1896.

Section 1. Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Ohio, That section 2834b, as passed April 27, 1896 (92 O. L., page 341), be amended so as to read as follows:

Sec. 2834b. The commissioners of any county, the trustees of any township and the board of education of any school district, except in cities of the first class of first, second and third grade, shall enter into no contract, agreement, or obligation involving the expenditure of money, nor shall any resolution or order for the appropriation or expenditure of money be passed by any board of

county commissioners, township trustees or board of education, except in cities of the first class, of first, second and third grade, unless the auditor or the clerk thereof shall first certify that the money required for the payment of such obligation or appropriation is in the treasury to the credit of the fund from which it is to be drawn, or has been levied and placed on the duplicate, and in process of collection and not appropriated for any other purpose; which certificate shall be filed and immediately recorded, and the sums so certified shall not thereafter be considered unappropriated until the county, township or board of education, except in cities of the first class, of first, second or third grade, is fully discharged from the contract, agreement or obligation, or so long as the order or resolution is in force, and all contracts, agreements or obligations, and all orders or resolutions entered into or passed contrary to the provisions of this section shall be void. Provided that none of the provisions of this section shall apply to the contracts authorized to be made by other provisions of law for the employment of teachers, officers, and other school employes of boards of education.

Contract authorized by other provisions of statute not affected.

Repeals.

Section 2. That original section 2834b (92 O. L., page 341), of the Revised Statutes of Ohio, as passed April 27, 1896, be and the same is hereby repealed.

Section 3. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage.

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An important case was decided by the Supreme Court of Vermont in 1876. The decision was to the effect that the committee of a school district had authority to exclude children from school for absence contrary to the rules thereof, although such absence was in obedience to the command of Catholic parents, and their priest, and for the purpose of attending religious services. The priest of a Catholic church in Brattleboro, on the morning of June 4th, 1874, sent to the committee of Brattleboro this note:

“You will confer a favor on us Catholics by exempting the Catholic children from attending school on all holy days. I should have called and explained our reasons, but have not had opportunity as yet.”

The committee replied as follows:

“Your note is just received. To comply with your request involves closing two of our schools, and greatly interrupting several others. This we never have done, and cannot do. We have great pride in our schools, in which the Catholic children are as well treated as any.”

The 4th day of June, 1874, was called “Holy Corpus Christi Day,” and considered and set apart by the Catholic Church as a holy day. Catholic parents were directed by their spiritual adviser, their priest, to attend services on that day, and have their children do so. On the day before the Catholic children informed their teachers that they should not attend school on the next day, that it was a holy day,

and they had been directed by their priest to attend services at church on that day. The teachers replied that they could not be excused for that purpose. On the morning of the 4th of June five or six of such scholars called on the committee, and saying they had heard that the committee would not excuse them if they were absent to attend church on that day; to whom the committee replied that they had not been requested to excuse them, and that they could not have done so if they had been requested. The children then went to their priest, and soon returned with the note from him above recited. Some sixty Catholic children, by direction and command of their parents, were kept from school to attend religious services. When they applied for admission to the schools they were told by the committee that, as they had absented themselves without permission, and in violation of the rules of the school, which they well understood, they could not return without an assurance from their parents or their priest that in future they would comply with the rules of the schools. The committee assured the children, their parents, and also the priest, that if the schools would not again be interrupted in like manner, they would gladly admit the children to them. The priest and parents refused to comply with this proposal, and that on all days which they regard as holy they could, as matter of right, take their children from the schools, without any regard to the rules thereof.

For more than ten years there had been a rule, required by the committee, that those registered as scholars, for a given term should be constant and regular in their attendance, and not be absent, except by permission of the teachers or the committee, on reasonable cause shown. The committee claimed the right which they had exercised to suspend from school, during the remainder of the current term, scholars who violated the rule. The parents asked the Supreme Court to restrain the committee from excluding their children from school, and based their claims upon two grounds:

First. "Their constitutional right to worship God according to the dictates of their own consciences, without being abridged in the enjoyment of their civil rights."

Second. "Right to exercise parental authority and government over their children as regards their moral training and culture."

The court held at the outset, that the parents were not the proper parties to the suit; but, in view of the importance of the subject, they considered it on a broader ground, by supposing the children to have been substituted for the parents.

The "rights of conscience" article in the Constitution of Vermont is: "That all men have a natural and inalienable right to worship Almighty God according to the dictates of their own consciences and understandings, as in their opinion shall be regulated by the word of God; and that no man ought to, or of right can, be compelled to attend any religious worship, etc., contrary to the dictates of his conscience; nor can any man be justly deprived or abridged of any civil right as a citizen on account of his religious sentiments or peculiar mode of religious worship; and no authority can or ought to be vested in or assumed by any power whatever that shall in any case interfere with, or in any manner control, the right of conscience in the free exercise of religious worship; nevertheless, every sect or denomination of Christians ought to observe the Sabbath or Lord's Day, keep up some sort of religious worship, which to them shall seem most agreeable to the revealed will of God."

The following are extracts from the opinion rendered by the court:

"Art. III. (above recited) was not designed to subjugate the residue of the Constitution, and the important institutions and appliances of the government provided by the enacted laws for serving the highest interests of the public as involved in personal condition and social relations, to the peculiar faith, personal judgment,



individual will or wish of any one in respect to religion, however his conscience might demand or protest. In that respect it is implied that while the individual may hold the utmost of his religious faith, and all his ideas, notions and preferences as to religious worship and practice, he holds them in reasonable subserviency to the equal rights of others, and to the paramount interests of the public as depending on, and to be served by, general laws and uniform administration.

“Let it be granted that parents and others may, upon their own respective reasons, control the attendance of the scholars, as against the official right of the committee in that behalf, and practically the ground of system and order and improvements has no existence. \* \* \* If a Catholic citizen should be serving on a jury in the midst of a trial when divine service in his church on holy Corpus Christi should be in progress, would it be a violation of his rights under said Art. III. to compel him to keep his seat, and serve through the trial? The same may be asked of the Jew or the seventh-day Baptist, who should be required to do like services on Saturday. The same may be asked of a devout Methodist, when a camp meeting or a love-feast should be in progress in his vicinage. If either, or all, should refuse to serve, would their rights of conscience under Art. III. be a valid defense in prosecution for the penalty in such case provided. \* \* \* \*

“Let it be repeated then, that that article in the Constitution was not designed to exempt any person or persons of any sect, on the score of conscience as to matters of religion, from the operation and obligatory force of the general laws of the state, authorized by other portions of the same instrument, and designed to serve the purpose contemplated by such other portions; it was not designed to exempt any persons from the same subjection that others are under to the laws, and their administration, on the score that such subjection at times would interfere with the performance of religious rites, and the observance of religious ordinances, which they would deem it their duty to perform and observe but for such objections.

“It remains now to be considered whether the bill can be maintained on the other ground, namely, the prerogative of parents to control their children as scholars, such as against the prerogative of the committee to make and enforce the rule in question.”

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## COMPULSORY EDUCATION LAW.

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AN ACT entitled an act amending an act concerning the education of children. Approved March 8, 1897, and declared an emergency.

Section 1. Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Indiana, That every parent, guardian, or other person in the State of Indiana, having control or charge of any child or children of the ages of six and fifteen years, inclusive, shall be required to send such child or children to a public, private, or parochial school or to two or all of these schools, each school year, for a term or period not less than that of the public schools of the school corporation where the child or children reside; provided, however, that any of the aforesaid children shall be of the ages of thirteen and fourteen inclusive, and be actively and regularly employed for their own support, or the support of those dependent upon them, they shall not be required to attend the aforesaid schools for a longer period or term than twelve weeks consecutively in any one school year; provided, that any and all children that have completed the first eight years' work of the common schools of the State

of Indiana, and have received certificates of graduation from the common schools, shall be exempt from the provisions of this act; provided, that children who are physically or mentally incapacitated for the work of the common schools are exempt from the provisions of this act; but the school authorities shall have the right and duty, where such exemption from the provisions of this act is claimed by any parent, guardian or custodian of such child or children, to cause an examination of such child or children, by a physician or physicians employed for such purpose by such officers, and if such physician or physicians hold that such child or children are capable of doing the work in the common schools, then such child or children shall not be exempt from the provisions of this act.

Sec. 2. The county superintendents of schools of a county, together with the secretary of the state board of charities and one member of the state board of education designated for such purpose by said board, shall constitute a board of truancy, whose duty it shall be to appoint one truant officer in each county. This truant officer shall see that the provisions of this act are complied with, and when from personal knowledge or by report or complaint from any resident or teacher of the township under his supervision he believes that any child subject to the provisions of this act is habitually absent from school, he shall immediately give written notice to the parent, guardian or custodian of such child that the attendance of such child at school is required, and if within five days such parent, guardian or custodian of child does not comply with the provisions of this section, then such truant officer shall make complaint against such parent, guardian or custodian of such child in any court of record for violation of the provisions of this act; any such parent, guardian or custodian of child who shall violate the provisions of this act, shall be adjudged guilty of a misdemeanor and upon conviction thereof shall be fined in any sum not less than five dollars (\$5.00) nor more than twenty-five dollars (\$25.00), to which may be added, in the discretion of the court, imprisonment in the county jail not less than two nor more than ninety days.

Sec. 3. A city having a school enumeration of five thousand or more children, may, in the discretion of the board of truancy, constitute a separate district for the administration of this act, and the truant officer or officers of such city shall be appointed by the superintendent of schools of such city, secretary of the state board of charities, and one member of the state board of education designated for such purpose by said board. Cities containing a school enumeration of ten thousand children or less shall have but one truant officer. Cities containing a school enumeration of more than ten thousand and less than twenty thousand children may have two truant officers. Cities containing a school enumeration of twenty thousand and less than thirty thousand children may have three truant officers. Cities containing a school enumeration of thirty thousand and less than forty thousand children may have four truant officers. Cities containing a school enumeration of more than forty thousand children may have five truant officers. The truant officers of cities shall enforce the provisions of this act, in the manner and under such penalties as are prescribed by section 2 of this act.

Sec. 4. The truant officers provided for in this act shall receive from the county treasury two dollars for each day for actual service, to be paid by the county treasurer upon warrant signed by the county auditor; provided, that no county auditor shall issue a warrant on the county treasury for such services until the truant officer shall have filed an itemized statement of time employed in such service; and such statement shall have been certified to by the superintendent of schools of the corporation in which such truant officer is employed; provided, further, that no truant officer shall receive pay for more days than the average length of school term in the county or city under his supervision.



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Sec. 5. All school officers are hereby required to make and furnish all reports that may be required by the superintendent of public instruction, or by the board of school trustees or commissioners of the city or incorporated town with reference to the workings of this act.

Sec. 6. If any parent, guardian or custodian of any child or children is too poor to furnish such child or children with the necessary books and clothing, with which to attend school, then the school trustee of the township, or the board of school trustees or commissioners of the city or incorporated town where such parent, guardian or custodian resides, shall furnish temporary aid for such purpose, to such child or children, which aid shall be allowed, and paid upon the certificate of said officers by the board of county commissioners of said county. Such township trustee or board of school trustees or commissioners, shall at once make out and file with the auditor of the county a full list of the children so aided, and the board of county commissioners, at their next regular meeting, shall investigate such cases and make such provisions for such child or children as will enable them to continue in school as intended by this act.

Sec. 7. School commissioners, trustees and boards of trustees are empowered to maintain either within or without the corporate limits of their corporations a parental home for incorrigible and truant children. Any child or children not being over twelve years of age who shall be truant, or incorrigible, may, with the common consent of the school trustee, or board of school trustees, or commissioners and parent, guardian or person having charge of such child or children, be compelled to attend such parental home for an indeterminate time. If the parent, guardian or person having charge of such incorrigible or truant child or children, shall refuse his consent to the attendance of such incorrigible or truant child or children at such parental home, the superintendent of schools or the principal, supervisor or teacher of any school, may file complaint in the Circuit or Superior Court of the county, and such court shall have the power, upon the hearing of the case, to order the compulsory attendance of such incorrigible or truant, in such parental home for an indeterminate time, not longer than one hundred and twenty (120) days.

Sec. 8. For the defraying of the increased expenditure necessary for the carrying out of the purposes of this act, trustees of school townships, boards of school trustees or commissioners of cities and towns, and boards of school commissioners, are hereby empowered to levy in addition to any and all sums heretofore provided by law, any amount of special school revenue not exceeding ten (10) cents on the hundred (100) dollars of taxable property, such taxes to be levied and collected as all other special school revenue.

Sec. 9. If any child or children live more than two miles from the nearest public school, he shall not be subject to the provisions of this act, unless free transportation to and from school is provided for such child.

Sec. 10. In order that the provisions of this act may be more definitely enforced it is hereby provided that the enumerators of school children in taking the annual school census shall ascertain and record the place and date of birth of every child enumerated, and the parent, guardian or custodian of such child shall subscribe and take oath or affirmation that such record is true. The enumerator is hereby empowered to administer such oath or affirmation, and any parent, guardian or custodian of any child who shall refuse to take such oath or affirmation shall be adjudged guilty of a misdemeanor, and upon conviction thereof shall be fined any sum not less than one dollar.

Sec. 11. Whereas, an emergency exists for the immediate taking effect of this act, the same shall be in force from and after its passage.



















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
