# FRED D. WEST STILL ACTIVE

## His Vessel Sunk and He Was 48 Hours in Open Boat.

That ubiquitous Provincetown boy, Fred Dunham West, has popped up again, this time at Aux Cayes, Haiti, after an encounter with a German submarine and a 48-hour experience in an open boat following the sinking of his vessel by said submarine, says the Provincetown Advocate. Only a few weeks ago friend West was still pegging away at the job that had held him at Miami, Florida, for more than a year—in the employ of the Bower's Southern Dredging company, where he "made good," as was evidenced by his quick rise from deckhand to night superintendent. Since that time he has been at sea, as master, as mate, as acting master, and as master, in turn, and is now mate of a vessel that is loading log-wood at Aux Cayes, for Mobile.

When he left the dredging company's employ it was to take command of a small steamer running between Miami and Nassau, Bahamas, at good pay, but at the end of the first trip, West's steamer was taken over by the government, to be used as a patrol boat.

But on the very next day this "one armed man who is never out of a job" shipped as mate on a steam yacht that was bound to Martinique, for French government duty. That yacht stopped at Porto Rico on the outward passage and from point on friend West was acting captain, for the former master left the craft at Porto Rico.

Arrived at Martinique, the yacht was armed and employed as a tender for the French cruiser M—s. West remained on the yacht for a short time, then shipped on a four masted schooner that was bound to Bordeaux, France. But that craft's trip was cancelled by the government order, 'tis stated, and West was once more without a ship. But only for a little time, for he quickly got a master's berth on a three-masted (English) and had (he writes) "a fine run as far as the Western Islands, and 180 miles north a German submarine blew her up". West and crew were picked up, after spending 48-hours in the small boat, by a Norwegian steamer, which craft landed them at Porto Rico, where West was fortunate enough to get a first mate's position on a vessel whose captain proved to be an old-time friend of his. It was on this craft, he wrote at Aux Cayes, January 21st, relating his recent adventures.

Fred D. West has but one arm. The right arm is buried at Herschel Islands, Arctic Ocean, where it was amputated—at the shoulder—following the receipt of a gun-shot wound. Nevertheless, West is rarely idle for long. Since recovering the injury that seemed likely to "lay him on the shelf" he has spent most of his time at sea, where, as before the time of arm-loss, adventure after adventure of startling nature has come his way. Before he lost his good, right arm, West was a whaleman and seal hunter. The loss of his arm unfitted him, of course, for further active participation in those pursuits, but did not prevent him from sailing as master and mate on sealing craft, or filling mate's position on merchant vessels. Since he lost his arm, West has had more rough experiences at sea than most seamen experience in a whole life time. Within the space of three months two big vessels; the four-master Sagamore (night of April 10, 1917) and the big Maud Sherwood (night of July 16, 1907) were sunk under him, by collision with the Norwegian tramp steamer Eda, and the Baker Palmer, respectively.

Friend West has only one arm, but it is said of him, that he not only succeeded in securing himself by the aid of a "messenger" and hook under the head-stays of the Palmer but he there upheld the shrinking form of his captain's sick wife until, amid the tumult and confusion that attended the crash, and the scramble of the Sherwood's men to the Palmer's deck, "Tom" Smith, boatswain of the Palmer, discovered the plight of the pair and saw that they were taken aboard (and their rescue from the bobstay was not effected until after the Baker's jibboom had been snapped asunder by the down-pull of the springstay of the sinking Sherwood.

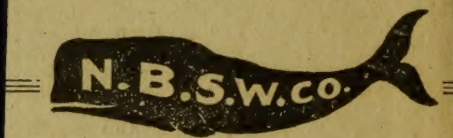
Adventures no end have enveloped big-hearted Fred West through all his sea "scrape" will make good reading when he gets back to his Cape Cod home.
