Sarah Doudney (1841 - 1926)

She was an English novelist, short-story writer and poet, best known for her children's literature and hymns. Doudney's father ran a candle and soap-making business. Doudney was educated at a school for French girls, and started to write poetry and prose as a child. Doudney's first novel, *Under Grey Walls*, appeared in 1871. Doudney continued to live with her parents near Catherington until she was thirty. After the death of her parents, she moved to Oxford in 1893, where she died in December 1926. - from Wikipedia
