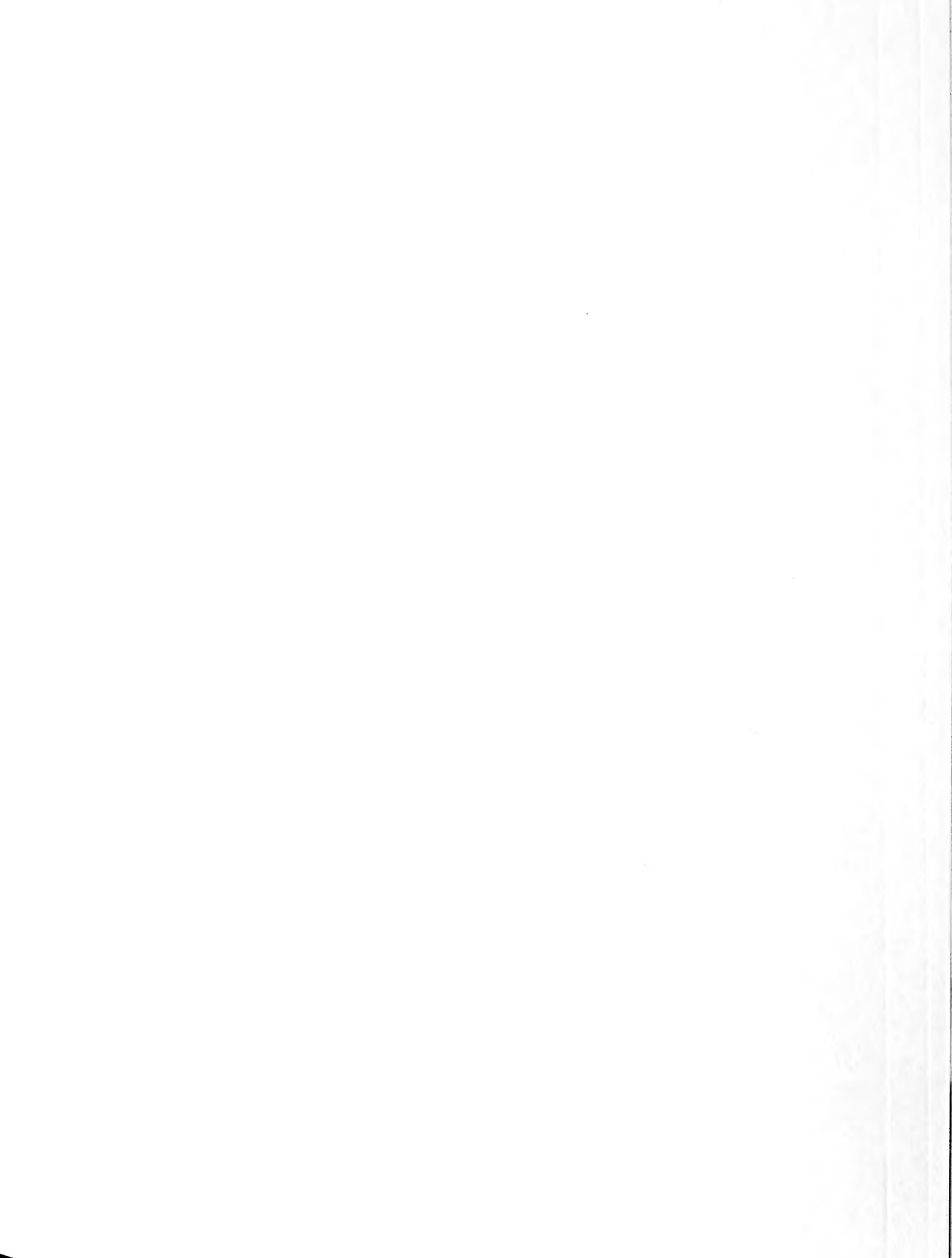

SHIPPING FACILITIES—Being situated on the Pennsylvania Railroad, Main Line, at Malvern, the best facilities are offered for low rates and quick transit, by fast freight lines or express, to all points. We are but one hour from Philadelphia, and in direct communication with New York, Pittsburg and the West. There are six mails a day here.

PACKING.—All articles are packed in a thorough manner in bales or boxes, with damp moss among the roots, at cost of material only for wholesale lots. On retail orders there will be no charge for packing.

TERMS CASH.—I deal direct with the planter, thus saving expenses to both parties. Information in regard to selecting and planting varieties of trees will be freely given when desired. Remittances by draft on Philadelphia or New York, or registered letter, is a safe way, or money orders.

No exaggerated pictures or descriptions; buyers don't have to pay for them here.

REFERENCE.—Persons not acquainted with me can refer to the National Bank of Malvern as to my standing, etc., by enclosing postage for reply.

IN writing give Name, Postoffice, County and State, distinctly written. Several persons can club together and get articles at 100 or 1000 rates.

DIRECTIONS.—Order early; do not leave sending for what is wanted until ready to plant, and then expect the trees or plants in a day or two. Send orders several weeks beforehand, so as to allow time to properly sort, dig and pack them. In the spring especially we are crowded with work.

Make out orders on a separate sheet from letter, so as to be easily read.

SENDING BY MAIL.—Small packages not exceeding four pounds can go to any part of the United States by mail, the postage to be added to bills. To distant points this is the cheapest way to send small packages.
