## P R E F A C E.

THE Utility of an Accurate Defcription of the Roads, is fo obvious to every Perfon who travels, as not to require any laboured Proof; and, as the Preference which the following Work claims before any other of the Kind hitherto publifhed, will be evident on the fighteft Comparifon, we fhall decline enlarging on that Head, and only lay before the Reader what is juft neceffary by Way of Explanation.

By the Plan adopted in executing this Work, it contains all the new Roads down to the prefent 'Time, with the Alterations and Improvements made in the Old ; and exhibits at firft View, the Diftance of each City, 'Town, or Remarkable Village, from London, with a particular Account of the Roads leading to it, meafured from the different Standards in London, according to the MileStones on each Road, and arranged in the following Order, viz.

1. The Kent Roads, meafured from London Bridge.
2. The Croydon, Ryegate, and Epfom Roads, from Wefminfter Bridge.
3. The Kingfon Road, from the Stones End in the Borough.
4. The Brentford Road, from Hyde-Park-Corner.
5. The Uxbridge and Edgeware Roads, from Tyburn Turnpike.
6. The Barnet Road, from Hicks's Hall.
7. The Ware Road, from Shoreditch Cburch.
8. The Effex Road, from Whitechapel Cburch.

The Meafurements, which are taken in Miles, Halves, and Quarters of Miles, are arranged in two Columns, the firf giving the Diftance from one City, Town, or Village to the next; the fecond, the Number of Miles from the Commencement of the Road. And (for the farther Amufement of the Traveller) at the End of each Road is given, a brief Account of whatever is worthy of Obfervation; fuch as Parks, Scats, Caftles, Ruins, ซoc.

To find the Road from London to any City, Town, or Remarkable Village, in England or Wales, look for the Name of the Place in the Index to the Roads from London, and the Figure oppofite to it refers to the Page in which is that Part of the Road containing the Place looked for ; thus, from London to Durhiam, the Index directs you to Page 113 , where you find Durham with its Diftance from London, Esc. though the Defcription of the Road in which it is fituated (being that from London to Edinburgh) begins in Page 110, and ends in Page 114.

In defcribing the leffer Roads branching out from the greater, the laft Remarkable Place on the great Road, or the Spot where the leffer turns off, is firft given, with a Reference to the Page in which you will find the Road fo far as to that Place; and afterwards the Branch is continued: as for Inftance, to find the Road from London to Chertfey, in Surry, the Index refers you to Page 33, where you find it in the following Form, viz.


By which it appears you are referred to Page 21 for this Road, as far as HounNow, (the laft Remarkable Place on the great Road) from thence the Remainder of the Road

to Chertley is given after the above Form in Page 33, 25 directed by the Index. In like Manner for the Roads from Zondon to Afkrig, the Index directs to Page 120, from whence you are referred to Page 112 for one Road as far as Boroughbridge, and to Page 106 for another as far as Settle, the Continuation of each Road being given ir Page 120. -Thefe References are made Ufe of in order to prevent the numberlefs Repetitions which otherwife would unavoidably occur in a Work of this Kind.

In looking for the Crofs. Roads, or Roads in Scotland, Recourfe muft likewife be had to their refpecive Indexes, which are fo plain as to require no farther Explanation than what is given with them in their proper Places.

Having thus, to the beft of our Abilities, fupplied the Traveller with a full-and accurate Defcription of a much greater Collection of Roads than was ever before attempted; yet, as the different Routs which Travellers may have Occafion to take are almoft infinite, and confequently inot comprifable in a Volume of this Size; we have, in order to complete our Plan, compiled, and publifhed feparately, a Second Part to this Work, entitled, A Travelling Dictionary; or, Alphabetical Tables of the Diftances of all the Cities; Borough, Market, and Sea-Port Towns, in Great Britain, from each cther, \&ic. By thefe Tables, the Traveller will find the Compafs he mult make to vifit any Place or Places which he may be defirous of taking in the Courfe of his Journey; and will likewife be enabled, at fetting out, to form an Eftimate of his Time and Expence, by afcertaining the Number of Miles he muft travel, with the greateft Exachers, thould the Tour he propofes to make be ever fo much about, or irregular. Thofe who have experienced how varying, and often contradictory, have been the beft Accounts they could procure of the Diftances of Places on their Journey, and how vexatious in their Confequences, will readily acknowledge the Utilits of a Wrork of this Kind.

The Travelling Dictionary being printed on the fame Size as the Defcription of the Roads, the two bound together make a complete Travelling Companion.
