

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ECLIPSES IN 1834.

There will be five Eclipses this year; three of the SUN, and two of the MOON, as follows:

OF THE SUN,

I. The first will be on the 9th of January, 6h. 24m. in the evening, therefore invisible.

II. The second will be on the seventh of June, 5h. 14m. in the morning, and invisible.

III. The third will be on the 30th November, visible as follows, viz.

Digits eclipsed $10^{\circ} 30' 1\frac{1}{2}'$ on the Sun's southerly limb.	
This will be the largest solar eclipse which has happened since 16 June, 1806, excepting the one of 12 February, 1831.

MORNING AND EVENING STAR. The Planet Venus [♀] will be the Morning Star till 8th March; the Evening Star till 21st December; then Morning Star the remainder of the year.

DESCRIPTION OF NEW-HAMPSHIRE.

NEW-HAMPSHIRE is situated between 42 deg. 40 min. and 45 deg. 16 min. north latitude, and between 4 deg. 30 min. and 6 deg. 15 min. east longitude from the city of Washington. Its length is 168 miles, and its greatest breadth is 90 miles, and its whole area is 9491 square miles. It is bounded N. by Lower Canada, E. by the Atlantic Ocean, S. by Massachusetts, and W. by the western bank of Connecticut river, on which lies the State of Vermont.

New-Hampshire has been called the *Granite State*, from the quantities of that rock quarried within it; and the *Switzerland* of America, on account of its wild and picturesque mountain scenery, its lakes, cascades, &c. The largest collection of water within the state is Lake Winnepiseogee, [Pronounced Win-ne-pe-sok'-e] which is one of the most varied and beautiful in the United States, and has for several years, been a favorite resort of travellers. A new steam boat called the BELKNAP, made her first excursion across this lake on the 4 July, 1833. New lines of Stages have been established at each extremity of the lake, and an active communication between the lower and upper part of New-Hampshire and a portion of Vermont, is anticipated as the result.

Besides this, are Connécticut, Ossipee, Umbagog, Squam, Sunapee and Massabesick lakes, which afford fish and fowl. Their borders are commonly distinguished for their varied excellence, and their surface is not covered by bulrushes and other aquatic vegetables which so frequently deform the small lakes of other countries in low latitudes. Hardly any thing can be more delightful to the eye of the traveller than these fine pieces of water. The streams of New-Hampshire are sufficiently large and numerous for manufacturing and other purposes. Five of the principal rivers in New England have their sources within its borders. The air is pure and salubrious, and the climate, though severe, very healthy. The soil is generally fertile, and mostly capable of cultivation. Some of the best lands are those bordering the rivers, which are enriched by the annual floods. The hills afford excellent pasture. By far the greatest part of the inhabitants is engaged in agricultural pursuits.

The mountains of New-Hampshire deserve attention. The White Mountains, which are the most celebrated, are situated in the lower part of the county of Coos. These have among

them some of the highest peaks in the United States. Mount Washington towers above all the rest, having an altitude of 6,634 feet. An avenue has lately been cleared to its summit, which will render the access comparatively easy. Moosehillock, in the east part of Coventry, has an elevation of 4,500 feet, and the Grand Monadnock in Jaffrey and Dublin, 3,253 feet.

The state abounds with fine grained granite, of which large quantities are transported to Boston, New-York, and some to the southern states. Iron and copper ore of excellent quality, are found at Franconia; and very good plumbago, or black lead at Bristol. Our limits do not permit us to speak of the internal improvements, and of the manufacturing establishments at Dover, Great Falls, Lamprey River, Meredith, Nashua and other places.

New-Hampshire is divided into 8 counties and 223 towns, and these with the population, according to the census of 1830, are comprehended in the following tables.

[New-Hampshire was settled in 1623, by Edward and William Hilton, brothers, from London, and David Thompson, from Scotland. During the first 18 years after the settlement, the people in the several plantations were governed by Agents appointed by the Proprietors, or by Governors chosen by themselves. In 1641, they became united to Massachusetts, and so continued until 1680, when New-Hampshire became a royal Province; and, excepting an interregnum from 1689 to 1692, continued a provincial government until the Revolution. Massachusetts was made a Province in 1692, and the same governor was over that and New-Hampshire, from 1699, until 1741, when a separate governor of New-Hampshire was appointed, and all connexion with Massachusetts ceased.]

The number of Lawyers in New-Hampshire in 1767 according to Mein & Fleeming's Register of New-England for 1768, was only eight, or one to every 6600 inhabitants. Wm. Parker, who died 5 June, 1813, at the age of 82, was the last living of the eight. Six years afterwards the number had more than doubled. In 1787, there were 29 practising attorneys in New-Hampshire, or one to every 4600 inhabitants.—

Of these only two are living, the Hon. JEREMIAH SMITH, LL. D. of Exeter, and the Hon. WILLIAM PLUMER, of Epping. In 1800, the number of Lawyers practising at the Superior and Inferior Courts, was 80, or one to every 2300 inhabitants. More than half of this number have since died. In 1810, the number was 123, or one to every 1800 inhabitants. More than half this number have since died or left the practice. Thirty-seven of this number have died and eight are now out of the state. In 1820, the number was 198, or one to every 1200 inhabitants. Of the one hundred and ninety-eight, thirty-two have died, nineteen others have left the state, and thirty have retired from practice. In 1830 the number was 232, (not including 13 who had retired from practice) or one to every 1100 inhabitants. The present number in practice may be estimated at about 207. The whole number of lawyers who have been settled in practice in this state is 476. Of this number, 183 were graduated at Dartmouth College, 104 at Harvard, 13 at Bowdoin, 6 at Middlebury, 6 at Williams, 3 at Brown, and one at each of the Union, New-Jersey, Vermont, and the Roman Catholic College. One hundred and forty-eight did not graduate, although a number of them were members of College before commencing their legal studies.

For admission into the Freshman Class, it is required that the candidate be well versed in the Grammar of the English, Latin and Greek Languages, in Virgil, Cicero's Select Orations, Sallust, the four Gospels, Jacob's Greek Reader, or an equivalent, Latin and Greek Prosody, Arithmetick, Ancient and Modern Geography, Algebra, to the end of Simple Equations, some abridged System of Rhetorick, & some History of

the United States; and that he be able accurately to translate English into Latin.

The Honorary degree of M. D. was conferred on Thomas Belcher Desrisay, of Dartmouth, Nova Scotia, and A. G. Smith, of Louisville, Kentucky.

LITERARY FUND. The act to establish the Literary Fund passed the Legislature, 29 June, 1831. It declares that it "shall be for the sole use and purpose of endowing or supporting a college" for instruction in the higher branches of science and literature, and that it "shall not be disposed of, or applied to any other use or purpose whatever." The fund arises from a tax on the several banking corporations of one half of one per cent. on the amount which shall at the time constitute the actual stock of the said banks. The fund having increased to \$55,000, an act was passed 31 December, 1828, directing the Treasurer of the state to pay over to the several towns, for the support and maintenance of common free schools, or to other purposes of education their equal share or proportion of the whole of said fund, and that he distribute the whole amount of sums which may be hereafter received to the several towns, annually in the month of June. 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MINISTERS IN NEW-HAMPSHIRE.

I. OF CONGREGATIONAL CHURCHES.

The Congregationalists are the most numerous denomination of Christians in New-Hampshire. The earliest church formed, takes its date from the year 1638, from which time to the present, there have been organized in this state more than 150 churches, although several of them have become extinct. The new wing of the prison has been completed the past year, at an expense of \$17,648. The exterior building is of granite, and is 127 feet long, 37 feet wide and 2 stories high. It contains 120 solitary cells. The whole building required 8,500 sq. ft. of stone for the foundation 18,790 cub. ft. for exterior building, and 11,349 superficial feet for floor, &c. 332,000 of brick, 300 casks of lime, 20, 000 lbs. of iron, 60, 000 ft. timber, plank and boards, and 38,000 of shingles.
